## Residents, Students of Webi area suffer due to inadequate battery backup system in BSNL Towers

Webi, Sept. 27: BSNL towers at Webi is plagued with its inadequate battery backup system, which is badly affecting its service during power cuts in the region.

Since there are repeated power cuts in the region, BSNL not having adequate battery back-up required to meet the challenge in the event of power failure is unable to provide an uninterrupted service to the subscribers. As a result, people are suffering a lot; and most importantly, the school students are the worst affected.

Talking to Andaman Sheekha the residents said, "Our Children's online studies are being severely affected because of the BSNL's erratic service which largely depends on the electric power supply,



there is no signal/internet as soon as the electric supply goes off; on the other hand, there is no alternative arrangement to run the transmitter at the BSNL Office" they residents rued.

It has been more than six months they made complaints to the AE, BSNL, Webi but to no avail, there is no improvement in the situation. On the other hand, there are exams on 28<sup>th</sup> Sept which will be conducted online, and if this is the con-

dition then how their children will write the exams, they pointed out. Besides, many students of Jawaharlal Nehru Vidyalyaya who are studying at home now, are facing the wrath of this appalling situation. The residents of this area are now urging the administration to intervene in the matter so as to facilitate BSNL to provide uninterrupted internet service at least for the sake of the students, they said.

## MESSAGE

World Rabies Day is observed in these Islands on 28 September this year. It will mark the 16th World Rabies Day. This year's theme 'Rabies: One Health, Zero Deaths' highlights the deep connection between the environment and the living beings- both people and animals. The COVID-19 pandemic has demonstrated that an integrated approach to health and collaboration across sectors can minimize the loss of lives.

Rabies is a zoonotic disease and is almost invariably fatal. The infectious agent is a virus which affects the central nervous system, and the disease is dreadful due to the horrifying nature of symptoms suffered by the patient before death. Humans mostly contract the disease from rabid dogs. Globally an estimated 59,000 human rabies death occur annually in over 150 countries, with 95% of cases occurring in Africa and Asia. India accounts for 59.9% of rabies deaths in Asia and 35% of deaths globally. The spread of the disease can be prevented only through vaccinating dogs and other susceptible pets and zoo animals. Prophylaxis in humans is the only available immunization.

Rabies control programmes offer a great example for One Health implementation, and the structures and trust that underpin these are crucial for other zoonotic diseases as well, including those that are pandemic-prone.

Andaman and Nicobar Islands are one of the only regions in India which are still free from this disease. We can continue to maintain this exemplary performance in future through strict disease surveillance and the contribution of all the stakeholders. I exhort all of you to be vigilant and create pet awareness among the masses, including the pet owners. I extend my best wishes towards the endeavour.

Secretary of Andaman and Nicobar Administration. In his letter he mentioned that today members of Tribal Council of Car Nicobar Islands have met him and discussed several problems of the Islands with him.

Following issues were taken up by the Member of Parliament of Andaman and Nicobar Islands with the Chief Secretary.

**1) New Islanders' Card/ Smart Card Issue:** The Member of Parliament pointed out that since a long time new Islanders' Card has not been issued for the people of Car Nicobar Island.

In this issue he requested the Chief Secretary to send a team of officials to Car Nicobar for the issuance of New Islanders' Cards / Smart Cards.

**2) Aadhaar Update:** The Member of Parliament added that a large number of people of Car Nicobar Island are waiting to update several information about their Aadhaar Card for which it is often not possible for all people to come to Port Blair, which is a time consuming and expensive matter.

In this matter he requested to send a team of officials to Car Nicobar Islands for atleast two weeks for necessary Aadhaar update works for the Islanders of Car Nicobar Island.

**3) Demand for Electricity Site office at Sawai and Big Lapathy areas of Car Nicobar Island:** The Member of Parliament mentioned that due to absence of a electricity site office in Sawai and Big Lapathy areas, during any electricity line fault, the residents of the region fail to lodge complaint on time and hence they have to suffer power cut for long hours.

In this regard he requested to open Electricity Site Offices at Sawai and Big Lapathy villages of Car Nicobar Islands with 24 hours manning.

**4) Overflow of Septic**

**Tanks of Permanent Shelters:** He added that the septic tanks of most of the permanent shelters are full and there is no arrangement of cleaning the septic tank and hence the Member of Parliament requested the CS to issue instructions to concerned department to carry out the septic tank cleaning task.

**5) Old Water Pipelines:** He added that most of the water pipelines of APWD in Car Nicobar Islands are old and rusted and hence this is raising serious concern of water contamination. Hence the MP has requested to carry out a survey in this regard and lay new water pipelines.

**6) Soil Erosion in Mus Village:** The soil erosion of Mus Village is a major issue and there is a long pending demand of construction of a sea wall in the coastal area of Mus Village. He requested the Chief Secretary to initiate the work for the protection of land in Mus Village from erosion.

**7) Deplorable Road Conditions:** Most of the road stretches of Car Nicobar Island are in bad shape hence the Member of Parliament requested the CS to order repair works of all roads of Car Nicobar Islands for the convenience of the public.

**8) Helipad at Kakana Village:** There is long pending demand for construction of a Helipad at Kakana Village for the Car Nicobar Island, hence he requested to complete the project for the benefit of the islanders of Car Nicobar Island.

**9) Posting sufficient School teachers:** Most of the schools of Car Nicobar lack sufficient numbers of teachers and hence the Member of Parliament requested to post sufficient numbers of school teachers in Car Nicobar Island.

**10) Huge shortage of desks and benches in all schools:** He pointed out that most of the schools of Car Nicobar do not have suffi-

cient desks and benches and hence he requested the Chief Secretary to supply a sufficient number of desks and benches for all the schools of Car Nicobar Island.

**11) Repair of Nursing Home of BJR Hospital:** There is a growing demand for repair of the Nursing Home of BJR Hospital of Car Nicobar, hence he requested to intervene in this matter and repair the nursing home.

**12) Setting up Blood Bank and starting dialysis at BJR Hospital:** He added that the members of Tribal Council of Car Nicobar have demanded for setting up a blood bank at BJR hospital of Car Nicobar similarly they also demanded to start dialysis at Car Nicobar. The Member of Parliament requested to look into these crucial issues.

**13) Fight connectivity for Car Nicobar Island:** Earlier on two different occasions Islanders have seen flights connecting Car Nicobar Island with Port Blair. Hence he requested the CS to restart the flight connectivity between Port Blair and Car Nicobar atleast once in a week.

**14) Providing Kerosene for outboard engines of fishing boats:** Fisheries department has provided outboard engines for fishing boats of Nicobar District, which runs only in Kerosene. As there is a curb in supply of kerosene, fishermen of Car Nicobar are finding it difficult to get kerosene for their fishing dinghies. Hence he requested the CS to make kerosene available at Car Nicobar through the open market.

**15) Sailing of an all-port ship for all major islands of Nicobar District via Hut Bay once every 10 days:** The Member of Parliament mentioned that Shipping Services is the lifeline of Andaman and Nicobar Islands, especially for the people of the Southern Group

of Islands. Thousands of Nicobari brothers and sisters are living scattered in different Islands of Nicobar District, who have a strong link with other but presently due to unavailability of connecting ships, they are forced to come to Port Blair and wait for several weeks to get a ship for any other Island of Nicobar District and they have to undergo similar hardship in their return journey.

For this journey from one Island of Nicobar District (Including Little Andaman Island of South Andaman District) to another Island of Nicobar District and vice versa via Port Blair they have

to incur heavy expenditure and go through tremendous mental agony. Not only this, such a journey via Port Blair is also very time consuming.

He added that all port ships are also required to supply fresh vegetables, fish and meat from Little Andaman to Car Nicobar and other Islands of Nicobar District, where a large number of tribal population and government servants and their families reside. The Member of Parliament requested to provide one sailing of an all-port ship for all major islands of Nicobar District via Hut Bay once, in every 10 days.

test transfer to verify your account number, then they will contact you over phone to do a test transfer to their QR code to verify their account too. This time they will be sending probably a malicious QR code, but they will insist to pay the total amount of the product to his Gpay account as they are unable to pay cash as it is an army or defence account and his boss

has told to transfer the entire amount which is the total cost of the product and they will send a army cheque to you on which his salary is credited ( for e.g if the product value is Rs 5000/- since you have transferred already Re1/- they will ask you to send Rs 4999/-) now with this you may get into their trap. They might even ask part by part as a test transfer. If you

track the number it may be from Haryana or some other states.

Just thought of sharing the experience with all the intention of creating awareness and caution not to fall prey to tricks of such scamsters. If any scamsters call you better to inform the cyber cell and request everyone to be aware of such frauds.

## Even after nearly...

1956/57, and now it has been almost 60 years, but till date there is no proper means of access to this segregated, marooned and neglected area.

Talking to Andaman Sheekha, the denizens of this region said that they have been silently withstanding the troubles and misfortunes since their settlement.

Nishchintapur is a cluster of hamlets and the prime inconvenience is their transportation & communication which is in awful state. The village is bifurcated by a deep creek called Kalighat Nallah, which is infested with crocodiles.

And this perilous tidal inlet is bridged with wooden structure across the creek which acts as the sole access system in terms of connectivity and which is also often washed away by flood waters especially in the rainy season.

"We use dinghy to make to and fro movement but it is also not feasible in peak monsoon as the Kalighat Nallah takes the horrendous form" they lamented. People of this part depend on the market or bazaar of Kalighat for their every rudimentary needs like essential commodities, health service etc. And in severe situations like serious patients of snake-bite, pregnant women requiring immediate medical aid, people of this neglected part find themselves in extreme helpless state when they find the said tidal inlet

over-flooded and the wooden structured bridge broken or washed away leaving no access for them to cross the perilous creek and reach hospital.

Instances are there that a number of people lost their lives in Nishchintapur due to this reason. Twenty years ago, one Mr. Narayan Bairagi got his leg bitten by a poisonous snake, who couldn't be transported to hospital in time and as a result he had to get his leg amputated.

A woman of the village who became a fire victim died as couldn't be taken to hospital. Two women of this region consumed poison and they too lost their lives since they couldn't be shifted to the hospital.

Many people were reportedly killed by crocodiles in this creek. These people met their untimely death only due to this extremely fragile transport and communication system in the region, they rued.

Besides, most alarmingly, the new born babies/infants & children of these hamlets are deprived of their timely vaccines due to these reasons, they said. "This is how, we the inhabitants of this isolated part are being deprived of and neglected in many respects for years together but our voice has been unheard so far" they alleged. In wake of this grievous situation, the consideration of constructing a bridge across the said creek is the only solution to the prolonged pangs and troubles of the

residents of Nishchintapur, they believe.

"In fact, the proposed bridge steel/bailey or any other permanent form will undeniably serve our purpose; many aspirants and students from this wretched place will be able to try their luck once this connectivity is developed in the shape of a bridge" they opined.

According to them, the entire community of this area will find a new avenue to prosper their life. Less people will die once a bridge is constructed over the creek. Rehabilitated people will be able to ward off the troubles and wretchedness they have been enduring and witnessing since 1956.

Amid this, a PRI member of this region reportedly raised these issues in the meeting held on the Chief Secretary's recent visit to Diglipur. The PRI member also said that the creek in question is infested with crocodiles that killed many people of Nishchintapur village. The Chief Secretary was aghast to listen this, and said that it is not at all good that crocks are taking lives this way and then instantly wanted to know the current status of this proposed project from concerned departments and officials who apprised him that it is almost in the final stage and it is expected that there will be a bridge and rural road which will be a great relief for the denizens of the remote area, a source said.

Regarding parking space for vehicles at Kalapathar beach, the Chief Secretary said, the issue may be sorted out after proper demarcation of land. The request for creation of proper trekking route will also be looked into.

On the demand for starting water sports activities at Kalapathar Beach, the Chief Secretary directed the concerned Officer to conduct survey of the area and accordingly demarcate the area for specific activities, keeping in mind the fragile marine life. He also directed that toilet facility at Kalapathar beach should be opened by 5 am as tourist visits the spot early in the morning and it may be handed

over to Panchayat for its proper maintenance. The Chief Secretary directed to widen the footpath at Kalapathar Naya Basti to facilitate the residents with motorable path.
