35 yrs on, Baludera villagers STILL AWAIT FOOTPATH

Port Blair, Nov 10: After numerous failed promises by political parties, villagers of Baludera village under Kasulayanagar Panchayat in the Middle Andaman have now lost their hopes of a village footpath connecting their village to the main road. About 20-25 families living in the Baludera village have approached almost every authority, including the PRL members of their area. The villagers have also been requesting the Pradhan for taking up the construction of the village footpath to connect their remote village with the main road as they had to face a lot of difficulties during rainy days. While the Govt Authorities shy away stating that the villagers are residing in encroached land for which funds cannot be sanctioned for the footpath, PRL members have given only



promises and assurances to the villagers. Till date no steps have been initiated by any of the agencies to construct the footpath connecting their village. Repeated attempts to convince the Pradhan for the construction of the footpath have failed and villagers have to live in pathetic

conditions. "Except assurance, the villagers of this area have not seen any work on ground. Since last many years, the Pradhan has been giving us assurance and during election time, political parties come begging for votes. However, once the elections are over,

these promises are never fulfilled", said some villagers. "We have been staying here for almost 35 years. When votes are sought, we are always asked to vote, but when we demand facilities, we are asked to wait", said another villager.

MP demands uninterrupted power supply in South Andaman

Port Blair, Nov. 10: The Member of Parliament of Andaman and Nicobar Islands, Shri. Kuldeep Rai Sharma has requested the Hon'ble Lt Governor of Andaman and Nicobar Islands to issue necessary directions to the Electricity Department to provide uninterrupted power supply and to find the faults and take necessary measures to stop such power cuts. In a letter addressed to the Hon'ble Lt. Governor, the Member of Parliament mentioned that due to frequent power cuts, electronic equipment in their homes are

getting damaged and they are unable to carry out normal daily chores at home. He added that thousands of students in different schools are also suffering heavily due to frequent power cuts in the South Andaman region during school hours, considering the hot and humid season. The Member of Parliament mentioned that power cuts are also causing huge problems in G B Pant Hospital as due to insufficient power backup many medical equipment and expensive machines could not be operated in the desired manner,

which could be a threat to the patients. He pointed out that small and Medium business owners, who can't afford generators, are also equally hit by frequent power cuts as they are witnessing heavy loss in business because during power cuts they are unable to operate computers and other machines. He added that people of every sector are going through huge problems due to such frequent power cuts, which amounts to around 8 to 10 power cuts a day, combined with voltage fluctuations. Even If Draft Criminal Rules Have Not Been Adopted, Accused Has Right to Receive Document in Possession Of Prosecution- SC

Port Blair, 10th Nov, 2022: The Supreme Court by a 2:1 majority held that an accused has the right to receive the list of the statements, documents, material, etc. in the possession of the prosecution even if Draft Rules of Criminal Practice are not yet adopted. The Bench of CJJ Uday Umesh Lalit and Justice S. Ravindra Bhat disagreed with Justice Bela M. Trivedi who, while dismissing the Criminal Appeal, observed that this right to receive the documents is only available after the Draft Rules are brought into force. The prosecution is expected to comply

with the Draft Rule no. 4 pertaining to the supply of documents, as and when the said



set of Draft Rules are adopted by the High Courts and State Governments, giving them a

statutory force," Justice Trivedi observed. In this case, the appellant along with the other eight accused were convicted and sentenced by the City Civil and Sessions Court, Chennai for the offences punishable under Section 120-B, 109, 341, 302 read with section 34 of IPC, and some of them were awarded death sentence. Their appeal before the Madras High Court is pending and, in this appeal, they challenged an order of the High Court directing the counsels appearing for the parties to proceed with the hearing of the

Trump, kinda Trumped

It was a poor night for American pollsters, who predicted a right-wing wave in US midterm elections. Low presidential approval ratings almost always drag down the incumbent party in the US midterms. Indeed, the Obama-Biden team suffered so painfully in their first midterms that the former called it a shellacking. This time what pumped up Republican prospects even more was inflation, with US fuel prices up 60% since Biden took office. Yet it would be very unwise of incumbents across other major economies/democracies to deduce that economy doesn't matter.

The key takeaway from the US is that when inflation is a big negative for the incumbent, a robust job market can take some of the sting away. US unemployment rate is near a 50-year low. US voters, like voters elsewhere, may not care about the macroeconomy but plentiful jobs are as much of a personal experience as high inflation is. In India, the coming Gujarat/Himachal polls may be the first test of inflation's impact on voters. A CSDS-Lokniti survey a month ahead of Gujarat polls has found price rise (51%) to be on top of voters' minds, unlike in March polls in Punjab (2%), Goa (3%), Uttarakhand (6%) and UP (6%). And in India, most low-income voters are not experiencing a robust job market. But here as in the US, the impact of inflation will depend on how other factors play out – free food mitigates high prices, for example.

Perhaps, a bigger lesson is that high-pitched rhetoric and extreme ideological positions don't always play well. Exit polls indicate that the share of US voters who felt abortion rights were the most important issue was almost as large as those who flagged inflation. So, a right-wing wave fizzled out because of a court ruling that pleased the right-wing no end. The low returns from politics of polarisation are also evident via Donald Trump. His oversized role throughout the Republican candidate selection and campaign didn't play out to plan. In various tight races the anti-abortionists and election-deniers propped up by him bit the dust. The defeat of TV celebrity Dr Oz who called abortion at any stage of pregnancy "murder" was the most notable example of this. And this sort of echoes what happened in Brazil, where the more extremist option ended up getting beaten in a close contest. Pragmatism and centism are not dead – not by any means.

matter on October 17, 2022. Advocate G. Sriam appearing on behalf of the appellant submitted that they had sent a letter addressed to the Inspector (Law and Order) E-4 Abiramapuram Police Station, Chennai, asking him to produce certain documents, stating therein inter alia that the said documents were required for fair adjudication of their case. It was further submitted that till the copies of the said documents were furnished to them it was not possible for them to proceed with the hearing of the appeals and the Reference case and relied heavily upon the case of Manoj and others Vs. State of Madhya Pradesh, Criminal Appeal No. 248-250 of 2015 and Rule 4 of Draft Rule of Criminal Practice. Justice Bela M. Trivedi rejected the contention of the appellant and held that the prosecution is expected to comply with Draft Rule No. 4 pertaining to the supply of documents, as and when the said set of Draft Rules are adopted by the High Courts and State Governments, giving them a statutory force. Justice Trivedi further held

that "the said Draft Rule no.4 as and when brought into force after following the due process of law could be pressed into service by the accused only during the course of investigation and during the course of trial, and not at the appellate stage before the High Court or the Supreme Court." The Majority Opinion of CJI Lalit and Justice Bhat-Both CJI UU Lalit and Justice S. Ravindra Bhat noted that the accused has a right to a fair trial and reiterated that this right is manifested in the fair disclosure statement. The Bench observed, "That some High Courts or governments of the States/ Union Territories have failed to comply with this court's order and are delayed in adopting the Draft Rules or amending the concerned police/practice manuals, cannot prejudice the right of an accused, which has unequivocally been recognized.... the circumstances in which the request was made – through the letter after appeal was set down for hearing despite repeated opportunities, was not justified." Accordingly, the Court dismissed the appeal. (Source: Verdictum.in)

FED UP YOUNG CLIMATE ACTIVISTS: "ADULTS AREN'T LISTENING"

The climate change generation is saying officials are talking too much, listening too little and acting even less. And they are fed up.

Instead of talking about how to solve the climate crisis, they negotiate about how to continue polluting, said Mitzy Violeta, a 23-year-old indigenous activist from Mexico. Youth movements are realising the solution isn't going to be in international gatherings, like the one taking place in Egypt.

We're upset with the inaction that's being done, said Jasmine Wynn, 18, of the environmental group Treeage.

With decades of warmer and extreme weather ahead of them, young climate activists envision a future that has them frustrated and anxious, according to more than 130 activists questioned by The Associated Press.

Most of them said they think their strikes and protests are effective. But lately in high-profile, attention-grabbing actions, a handful of activists have gone beyond skipping school to targeting art work, tires and fossil fuel depots.

Experts and funders expect these in-your-face actions to escalate.

They will do whatever is non-violently necessary. They're on fire, said Margaret Klein Salomon, a clinical psychologist who runs the Climate Emergency Fund that financially backs some of the in-your-face protest events. They're so passionate. Some of that comes from youth, sure. But it is powered by reality, by having a sort of confrontation with the truth.

At one of the more traditional protests in New York City in September, 14-year-old Truly Hort said she was scared about the future: I've always had all these dreams, and now I'm like God, I can't do that.

The trouble, she said, is that leaders talk about what they hope to

do, but it's not a lot of people taking action.

Also mentioning her anxiety at the same protest 16-year-old Lucia Dec-Prat said, it's one thing to worry about the future and it's another to get out there and do something about it.

But protesting only does so much, Dec-Prat said: I honestly feel that adults aren't listening.

Governments and international organisations are advancing too slowly to fight climate change, many of those interviewed said about climate conferences. A vast majority of activists asked agreed with Greta Thunberg's characterisation of climate negotiations as all talk and no action, or blah blah blah, as the Swedish activist put it in a speech last year.

So rather than just making noise to contribute to the blah blah blah, make noise for action. I think that has to be the critical thing," said 25-year-old Jevanic Henry of St. Lucia in the Caribbean. We are driving action.

Money doesn't matter because we're not going to have anywhere to live, said Aniva Clarke, a 17-year-old activist from Samoa. And that's probably the biggest issue that a lot of world leaders aren't really focusing on.

While many youth activists don't feel they are being listened to, United Nations Secretary-General Antonio Guterres credited the world's youth for spurring negotiators to do more.

University of Maryland social scientist Dana Fisher, who studies the environment movement and youth activists, said they've testified before Congress and spoken before the United Nations and at past climate negotiations.

Young people have gotten a lot more say than they did in any other time during my adult life, Fisher said. I think a lot of them felt like because they were invited and given these

opportunities that meant everybody's going to snap and change policy."

And she said that's not what happens, which then causes them to get frustrated.

Speaking at a London cultural event, Thunberg said annual climate conferences like the one in Egypt will not bring about meaningful change. Unless, of course, we use them as an

historically have emitted more greenhouse gases than poorer ones. Rich countries have pledged to pay poor ones to adapt against the hurricanes, droughts and floods made worse by climate change, but so far they've not fulfilled their USD 100 billion promise.

While investors on Wall Street continue pouring money into funds that call themselves 'green', many young climate activists blame free-market capitalism itself for adding heat-trapping gasses to the atmosphere something that adult analysts and officials often ignore as a factor.

Most of those interviewed called targeting corporations and businesses with more pressure,

protests, and shaming like a recent New York demonstration staged inside financial investment firm BlackRock's headquarters an effective tactic in fighting climate change.

Minutes before they marched past the famous Wall Street bull statue and near the site of the Occupy Wall Street movement, 17-year-old Oscar Gurbelic squarely blamed the free market system and big business.

Inherently climate change and capitalism are intertwined, Gurbelic said.

Many say they're willing to make changes to their own lives to take responsibility for reducing emissions. They fly and drive less, and walk more. A large chunk of activists questioned say they would likely have fewer children because of climate change.

Most said they don't take part in certain activities at least once per week because it is wasteful or polluting.

We no longer want to live in a world in which we only seek to consume and use things and discard them, said Violeta of Mexico.

Similar to other protest movements, there are differences in thought over whether to work inside or outside the system. Some activists that AP spoke with collaborate with governments, international organisations and non-profit groups to raise awareness of climate risks facing their communities. Others strictly work at the grassroots level, fighting the powers that be.

Experts studying youth climate activists say that while the generation they belong to is the most educated in history, many want to pause their education to focus on climate action. Others, like Jevanic Henry, want to merge their professional lives with climate activism. He's worked for governments and non-profits on climate issues.

I'm trying to remain optimistic as much as I can, Henry said in an interview, but he said it's tempered by a fear that socioeconomic collapse will come if action is not taken across the board.

But hope only goes so far. More and more people are going to be upset and frustrated and willing to take more aggressive action, University of Maryland's Fisher said. And the problem is that at some point that can become violent.

The newer tactics, such as throwing soup or mashed potatoes on famous art work which has glass protecting them from damage is born from that frustration, Climate Emergency Fund's Klein Salomon said.

eligible Citizen, who is going to attain the age of eighteen years on any of the subsequent qualifying dates in the year 2023, that is to say, the 1st April, 2023, the 1st July, 2023, or the 1st October, 2023, may also file his or her claim for inclusion of his or her name in the Electoral Roll, in Form-6, in advance, and the same shall be considered and decided in the respective quarter of the year with reference to the respective qualifying date. Similarly, data of any eligible PwDs voters in A&N Islands should also be shared with the Electoral Officers for inclusion. Any issues or grievance can be addressed to the Electoral Team, the CEO said. CEO also urged representatives of political parties

to urge voters to check and verify the data provided and if any changes are to be made it can be intimated to the respective BLAs. BLOs have been directed to conduct awareness camps and nukkadnaaks among general public regarding the special summary revision for its wide publicity. As per the draft roll published, the A&N Islands has 3,04,413 voters, out of which 1,59,923 are male voters, 1,44,479 are female voters and 11 are transgenders. The gender ratio is 903. The CEO while explaining the schedule of the Special Summary Revision-2023 informed that the publication of Integrated Draft Electoral Roll commenced today and the period for filing claims and

objection is from Nov. 9 to Dec. 8, 2022 while the Special Camps will be held on Nov. 26 & 27 and Dec. 3 & 4, 2022. Disposal of claims and objections will be held on Dec. 26, 2022 and final publication of electoral roll will be on Jan. 5, 2023. He said, to have a correct electoral roll, the Special Summary Revision - 2023 is important. He said, all applications received on CEO's website on day to day basis shall be shared with recognized Political Parties in order to bring more transparency in the process of electoral registration. The CEO also handed over copies of the draft electoral rolls to the representative of recognized political parties who were present during the meeting.

2,192 days and still no answers on demonetisation

New Delhi, Nov. 10: A five-judge constitution bench on Wednesday expressed displeasure over the Union government's unparalleled request for adjourning the hearing on a batch of petitions challenging the demonetisation announced by Prime Minister Narendra Modi in 2016. "Normally, a constitution bench never adjourns like this. We never rise like this once we have started. It is very embarrassing for this court," Justice B.V. Nagarathna remarked when attorney-general R. Venkataramani made the unusual statement at the commencement of the proceedings that the affidavit was not ready. Tuesday was the sixth anniversary of the demonetisation announcement by Modi. By the time the constitution bench assembled on Wednesday, 2,192 days had passed since the recall of high-denomination notes was sprung on the country. No veteran associated with the court could recall another occasion when an adjournment had been sought before a constitution bench. Usually, the Supreme Court benches sit in a combination of two judges and, at times, three judges. Only on matters relating to constitutional validity, a five-



there was no precedent when an adjournment was sought before a constitution bench. "As far as I am aware, it has been the practice of this court that when a constitution bench is hearing a matter, the practice is not to ask for an adjournment. Each one of us here is aware of it. A constitution bench has the highest priority. Therefore, when the attorney-general makes a request such as this, it is something unusual. I am in an awkward position and I do not know how to respond," Divan

submitted. The senior counsel said despite the Centre's request, the bench can continue with the proceedings and hear the arguments. Venkataramani conceded that such requests are not made before a constitution bench. "I admit that all of us are aware that we do not make a request like this before a constitution bench. But there are some serious issues on account of which we are making the request. Therefore, I have made this request," Justice S.A. Nazeer, heading the bench, said the court would grant a short adjournment of one week. The other judges on the bench are Justices B.R. Gavai, A.S. Bopanna and V. Ramasubramanian, besides Justice Nagarathna. On October 12, the bench had directed the Centre and the RBI to file comprehensive affidavits to justify the decision to demonetise Rs 500 and Rs 1,000 currency notes as it rejected the government's argument that the 2016 decision had only academic interest and the hearing was a "waste of the court's time". The constitution bench is expected to answer several questions that have swirled around the demonetisation all these years. (Source: telegraphindia.in)

Tata Motors on Wednesday reported a net loss of Rs 898 crore

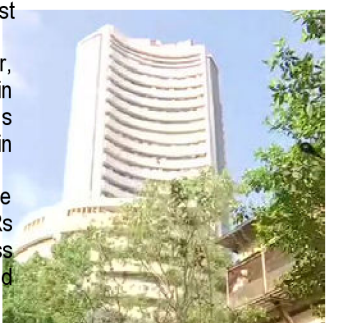
for the second quarter ended September 30, 2022.

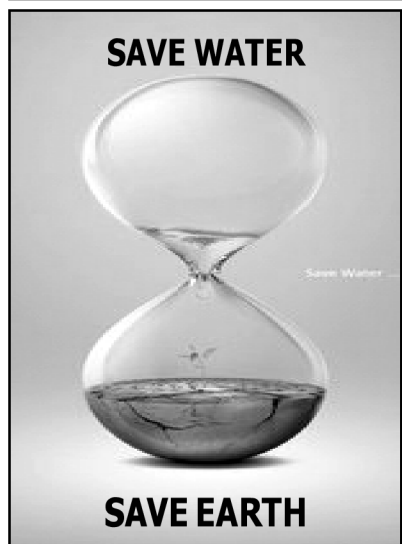
The auto major had reported a net loss of Rs 4,416 crore in the July-September period of the last fiscal.

QATAR AGAIN DENIES CLAIM OF CASH OFFERS TO WORLD CUP VOTERS

A longstanding whistleblower allegation that Qatar offered cash to voters during its winning bid to host the World Cup was denied again by officials in a Netflix documentary released Wednesday.

The four-part show FIFA Uncovered directly put the question to key Qatari official Hassan Al-Thawadi the bid campaign leader in 2010, now heading the World Cup organizing committee of whether he took part in offering \$1.5 million to each of three FIFA voters from Africa.

Whistleblower Phaedra Almajid has claimed for more than a decade she was in the room with Al-Thawadi at a hotel in Angola in January 2010 when money was offered to the three men, who were among 24 voters set to pick the 2018 and 2022 World Cup hosts later that year.

My reaction, especially on the Phaedra situation, it's frustration, Al-Thawadi bid interviewers for the Netflix show. They are inherently false and there are facts on the ground that prove they are

false.

Almajid's claims added to a cloud of suspected wrongdoing hanging over Qatar long after it won the vote by FIFA's executive committee in December 2010. Qatar's bid team has always insisted it followed campaign rules set by FIFA.

The alleged offers to African voters were detailed in May 2011 by a British parliamentary hearing which received evidence from The Sunday Times newspaper. They implicated, and were denied by, Issa Hayatou and Jacques Anouma plus a third man, Amos Adamu, who were suspended by FIFA for financial misconduct before the World Cup votes.

Almajid was in Angola working on the bid's international media relations but was fired soon after. She later testified to a FIFA-appointed investigation of the 2018-2022 bidders led by Michael Garcia, a former U.S. Attorney in New York and now a judge in state courts.

Garcia's report in 2014, which FIFA did not publish in full until 2017, dismissed Almajid's evidence. It concluded she was wrong about another Qatari bid official witnessing the offers and suggested she had altered her evidence.

Almajid repeated her claims to FIFA Uncovered and said the cash was offered to Africans' national soccer bodies and not the men personally.

US visa processing time likely to fall by mid-2023: Official

The waiting period for issuance of American visas is expected to see a significant fall by summer of 2023 and the number is projected to reach around 1.2 million, a senior official of the US embassy said on Thursday.

"India is the number one priority for Washington (for issuance of visas). Our aim is to

bring the situation to the pre-Covid-19 level by the middle of next year," the official said.

India has been one of the very few countries where applications for US visas saw a major upswing after coronavirus-related travel restrictions were lifted.

Considering the long wait time for the grant of visas, the US

is also rolling out a series of initiatives including the hiring of more personnel and increasing the "drop box" facilities, the official said.

The plan is to issue around one lakh visas every month.

The official said the US has already identified H (H1B) and L category visas for Indians as its priority and nearly 1,00,000 slots were released recently for those wanting to renew the visas.

The wait time for certain categories has already been brought down to around nine months from earlier 450 days.

The official said the wait time for B1, B2 (business and tourism) visas are also being brought down from around nine months.

The official also said India is expected to move to the number two place from the current number three in terms of the number of

visas being issued by the US. Currently, Mexico and China are ahead of India.

The official said priority is also being accorded to cut the waiting time for the students' visas, especially for those looking for a renewal of their visas.

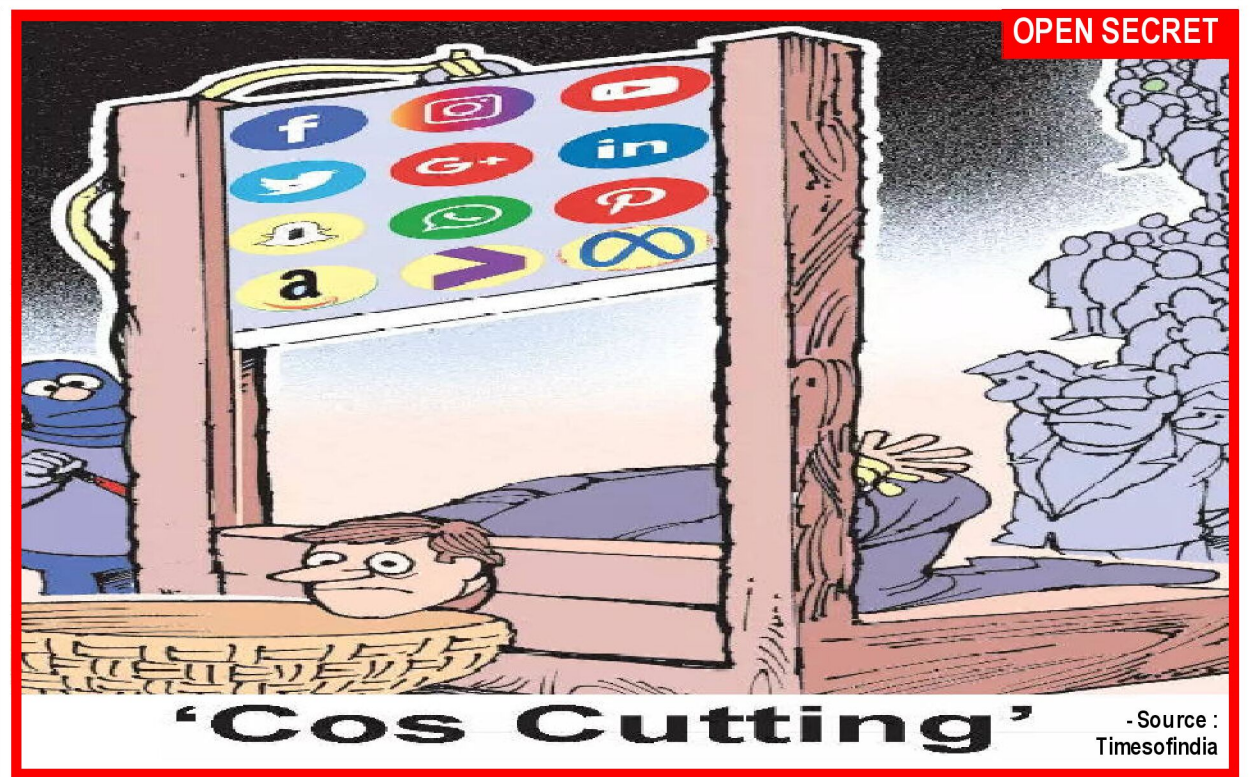
The process used to apply for renewal of a US visa without a visa interview is known as the drop box facility.

Broadly, the applicants having a US visa within a span of the last four years are eligible for drop box facility.

The US issued around 82,000 visas in the last year. "We are looking at 1.1-1.2 million visas to Indians by next summer," said the official.

India has been taking up with the US the issue of long waiting periods for US visas.

T20 World Cup: England crush India by 10 wickets to storm into final

A thoroughly professional England annihilated an out-of-sync India by 10 wickets to sail into the World Cup final as Alex Hales and Jos Buttler's relentless hitting mortified Rohit Sharma's clueless attack, in Adelaide on Thursday.

England seemed to have saved their best for the grand stage as they reduced the semifinal to a lop-sided affair, courtesy a splendid bowling effort which they complemented with some breathtaking stroke-making.

It was Hardik Pandya (68 off 33 balls), whose fearless hitting took India to 168 for six but it was just about a par-score at the Adelaide Oval. England captain Buttler (80 not out) set the tone with three boundaries off Bhuvneshwar Kumar's opening over but it was Hales (86 not out off) who butchered the Indian attack into submission.

The target was achieved in just 16 overs as England batting line-up clicked for the first time in the tourney and what a day it chose to bring its A game to the fore.

The England opening duo gave India's star-studded line-up a lesson in how to build a T20 innings: that there is only one way, the offensive way.

It was one match that was decided in Powerplay as India managed only 38 runs in six overs as the archaic style of safety-first approach hurt them terribly.

In complete contrast, England's top order which looked shaky throughout the league



stage, smashed 63 in their six overs. The match was won and lost then and there.

Hales hit as many as seven sixes in his 47-ball knock and his approach showed that there were no demons in the track. He deployed the old-fashioned 'Sanath Jayasuriya school' of hitting in the first six overs.

When Virat Kohli and Rohit Sharma were batting, they were looking to hit through the line unlike Hales and Buttler.

Against lesser opposition like Bangladesh, they could make it up with a total of 168 but it was never enough for a side like England which has reinvented the grammar of T20 batting.

Bhuvneshwar and Arshdeep Singh didn't get enough swing up front and team management's fascination to play Axar Patel (0/30 in 4 overs) and Ravichandran Ashwin (0/27 in 2 overs) ahead of Yuzvendra Chahal backfired badly.

The success England spinner Adil Rashid (1/20 in 4 overs) on the same track added insult to the injury. By the time,

Buttler hit Mohammed Shami (0/39 in 3 overs) down the ground for one of his three sixes, the Adelaide Oval stands wore a desolate half-empty look. And the over-throws and the dropped catch by Suryakumar Yadav typified a day when everything that could go wrong went wrong for India.

This Indian team never had all its bases covered and paid the price. But even in this defeat, the T20 captain-in-waiting Pandya revelled in the role of a finisher with a sensational knock that gave India a chance to fight.

Virat Kohli (50 off 40 balls) occasionally displayed his regal array of strokes but it was the flamboyant Baroda man whose unbelievable end-over pyrotechnics took India to a fighting total, which had looked distinctly impossible after the first 10 overs.

In the last four overs, India scored 58 runs, courtesy four fours and five astonishing sixes from Pandya with a drop-dead gorgeous flick behind the square off Chris Jordan (3/43) being the stand out one.

KL Rahul's (5) abject failure against bigger teams looked even more pronounced as Chris Woakes exposed his shortcomings with extra bounce in the second over.

But if India scored at least 20 runs less, blame it on skipper Rohit Sharma (27 off 28 balls) and the first 10 overs that yielded only 62 runs. In a semifinal, consuming 42 dot balls (effectively 7 maiden overs) doesn't paint a pretty picture.

Had it not been for the sixes that Hardik hit off Sam Curran (0/42) and Jordan, India would have ended with a below-par score as Kohli, despite his fourth half-century in the tournament, couldn't put the ante.

There are times it seems that Kohli is on a mission to be better than the best. The six over extra cover off Woakes was simply unbelievable. The head position, the stillness and transfer of weight, everything in sync.

There was a short arm bowler's back-drive over Liam Livingstone's head even as Rohit struggled at the other end. The back-to-back boundaries off Curran through mid-wicket region and similar shot over extra cover for a one-bounce boundary of Jordan's deliveries were the only three convincing shots from the India skipper.

Not even the slog sweep for four off Rashid looked like he was in control and the final outcome wasn't certainly what people expected in a big-ticket game from Rohit. - Source : Timesofindia

Elon Musk ends remote work for Twitter employees; asks them to be ready for tough times

In his first mail to Twitter employees after taking over as the CEO of the social media giant, Elon Musk asked them to be ready for "difficult times ahead."

He discontinued work from home and said employees will be expected to be in the office at least 40 hours a week, reports

Bloomberg News.

Twitter had a remote working model before Musk's takeover after Covid-19 necessitated work from home. Musk had earlier clarified that he was not in favour of remote work.

He noted that there is "no way to sugarcoat the message" about the bleak economic

outlook and its impact on advertisement revenue.

"The road ahead is arduous and will require intense work to succeed," the email from the new Twitter owner read. In another mail, he said over the next few days, the "absolute top priority" of the company is "suspending any verified bots/trolls/spam."

After Musk took over Twitter Inc for \$44 billion he brought in a slew of changes, including a subscription programme and a new verification system. He also sacked the company's four top executives, including CEO Parag Agrawal and legal executive Vijaya Gadde.
