Chief Secretary directs Health Deptt. to ensure creation of Health IDs for entire population by Jan.15, 2022

Patients visiting G B Pant Hospital requested to bring Health ID card or COVID Vaccination Certificate for linking health records with Health IDs

Port Blair, Nov.15

The National Digital Health Mission (NDHM) was launched as a pilot in six UTs including Andaman & Nicobar Islands on 15.08.2020. The scheme was later extended to the entire country on 27.09.2021 and renamed as Ayushman Bharat Digital Mission (ABDM). ABDM aims to develop the backbone necessary to support the integrated digital health infrastructure of the country. It will bridge the existing gaps amongst different stakeholders of health ecosystem through digital



highways. One of the components of ABDM is creation of Health IDs by all the citizens so that the health IDs can be linked to their health records. The citizens with health ID can access their health records through the Personal Health Record (PHR) app, which

can be downloaded from google play store as 'NDHM Health Records'.

In A&N Islands, 2,60,000 Health IDs have been created so far. The Chief Secretary, Andaman & Nicobar Administration, Shri Jitendra Narain has directed the Health Department to ensure that the Health IDs are created for the entire population by 15.01.2022. The Health IDs can be created by visiting the website healthid.ndhm.gov.in and submitting basic details. Those citizens who have created their

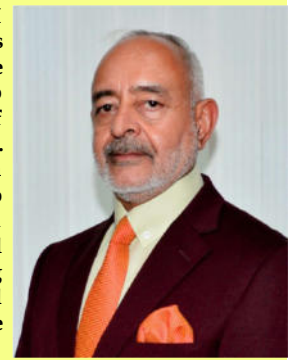


MESSAGE

Free LPG connections to low-income families under PMUY

Directorate of CS& CA urges women belonging to economically weaker family to apply for new connection

Port Blair, Nov.15

The Pradhan Mantri Ujjwala Yojana (PMUY) is an ambitious scheme providing LPG connection to women belonging to economically weaker section. The main beneficiaries of the scheme are women belonging to poor families not having LPG connections in their

household. The majority of the rural population and families belonging to this section are still using fossil fuel to cook their meals. The usage of fossil fuel results in serious health hazards for women of such families.

In the first phase, the Govt. of India covered a population of 8 crore households till 1st May,

2016. To cover the remaining households eligible under the scheme, the Govt. of India in the Union Budget for 2021-22 kept the provision for an additional coverage of one crore eligible households under the PMUY scheme which will be implemented in a time bound manner by IOCL in co-

ordination with their authorized LPG distributors in this UT. The Ujjwala 2.0 aims to provide deposit-free LPG connections to those low-income families who could not be covered under the earlier phase of PMUY. Along with a deposit free LPG connection, Ujjwala 2.0 will provide

Inspections conducted at food vending establishments in city to check TPC in cooking oil

Stakeholders warned to refrain from repeated use of cooking oil and adhere to hygienic practices

Port Blair, Nov. 15

A team of Food Safety Officers of the South Andaman, District Administration today inspected a number of food vending establishments around the city and carried out tests to check the Total Polar Compounds (TPC) in cooking oil used for preparation of food articles.

During frying, oil undergoes degradation due to their exposure to elevated temperatures



which results in changes in the physio-chemical & nutritional properties of the oil and TPCs are formed in the oil. The toxicity of these compounds are associated with several

diseases such as hypertension, Alzheimer diseases and liver diseases. FSSAI has fixed the maximum permissible limit of TPC at 25%, beyond that the oil shall

not be used. Therefore, it is essential to monitor the quality of vegetable oil during frying. During the tests, no vendors were found using oil beyond the permissible limit. The team also sensitized all vendors regarding ill effects of repeated use of oil and safe disposal of used cooking oil.

Farmers' Corner- A Knowledge Hub

Heliconia longissima commonly known as Red Wings

Heliconia longissimais commonly known as Red Wings. This species is native to Columbia and grows luxuriantly in tropical humid condition. Well adapted to partially shaded condition. This is an evergreen, perennial, rhizomatous, herbaceous species growing to a height of 3.0 -4.0 m. The upper portion of the leaf is glabrous and have waxy coating in the base of the leaf. The species is characterized by long pendulous inflorescence which is highly attractive. Inflorescence is generated on a robust peduncle which is a drooping terminal spike with red wavy rachis with 15-30 red wavy bracts. The species is propagated by rhizomes or division of clumps. Flowering is initiated one year after planting. Flowering is observed during October-December. Vase life of the spike is about 2 weeks.

Benefit: *Heliconia longissima is used for mass planting in landscape horticulture. The flowers are highly attractive with bright red colour and hence holds a space in vases and back drop arrangements.*

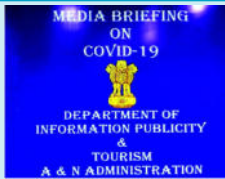

Media briefed on COVID-19

No positive case detected during test conducted on incoming flight & inter-island bound passengers: Director (IP&T)

Port Blair, Nov.15

The Director (IP&T), Shri Alok Kumar informing about COVID-19 status today stated that during the RT-PCR test conducted on 543 passengers who arrived here yesterday, no positive case has been detected. Today, 11 flights with 1878 passengers arrived, out of which, 1340 were vaccinated with both doses while RT-PCR test was conducted on 538 passengers and the reports are awaited. RAT was conducted on 126



passengers bound for North & Middle Andaman at Ferrargunj and no positive case has been detected. At Mohanpura Bus Terminus, test was conducted on 76 passengers and all were found negative. At Helipad 6 passengers were tested with RAT and all were found negative.

At Phoenix Bay Jetty, 60 passengers were tested with RAT and all were found negative. RTPCR was done on 14 crew members of MV Strait Island and the reports are awaited. Today, till 3 pm, 571 beneficiaries were vaccinated, out of which, 536 were in the age group of 18-44.

The Director, ANIIMS, Dr. A.K Mandal informed that the number of COVID cases admitted in GB Pant Hospital is four and no patient is on oxygen / ventilator.

Union Health Ministry notifies new protocol for Post-Mortem procedure

Post-Mortem can now be preformed after Sunset in Hospitals with adequate infrastructure

Move to benefit those mourning the deceased and organ receivers

New Delhi, Nov.15 (PIB)

In response to the multiple references that have been received by the Union Health Ministry from various sources and in line with the Government's commitment to promote ease of living by reducing burden imposed due to compliance to government processes, changes have been made in the post-mortem protocols to allow for the procedure to be conducted after sunset effective from today. Apart from friends and relatives of the deceased, this new procedure also promotes organ donation and transplant as organs can be harvested in the stipulated time window after the procedure.

These aforementioned representations to the Ministry in this regard

were examined by a technical committee in the Directorate General of Health Services, Union Ministry of Health & Family Welfare. It was ascertained that some institutes are already performing night-time post-mortem. In view of the rapid advancement and improvement in technology, especially availability of required lighting and infrastructure required for post-mortem, performing night time post-mortem in hospitals is now feasible. The protocol stipulates that post-mortem for organ donation be taken up on priority and be conducted even after sunset at the hospitals which have the infrastructure for conducting such post-mortem on a regular basis. The fitness and adequacy

of infrastructure etc., shall be assessed by the hospital-in-charge to ensure that there is no dilution of evidentiary value. It is also to be ensured by the facility that video recording of post-mortem shall be done for all post-mortem conducted in the night, to rule out any suspicion and preserved for future reference for legal purposes.

However, cases under categories such as homicide, suicide, rape, decomposed bodies, suspected foul play should not be subjected for post-mortem during night time unless there is a law and order situation. All concerned Ministries/ Departments and all State Governments and Union Territories have been notified of the change in protocol.

Vaccination- shield against the virus

5,21,024 doses of vaccines administered to beneficiaries in Isles so far

Port Blair, Nov. 15

Due to the vigorous effort made by the Health Department, the number of cumulative doses vaccines administered to beneficiaries vaccinated so far in A&N Islands has reached 5,21,024.

A total of 2702 people were vaccinated today in

A&N Islands. 1998 beneficiaries were vaccinated in South Andaman District, out of which, 113 beneficiaries were in the age group of 18-44 years. Similarly, 602 beneficiaries were vaccinated in North & Middle Andaman District, out of which, 16

beneficiaries were in the age group of 18-44. 102 beneficiaries were vaccinated in Nicobar District, out of which, 3 beneficiaries were in the age group of 18-44. A total of 1,74,505 eligible people in the age group of 18 to 44 years have been vaccinated till date, a press release from DHS said.

DOs & DON'Ts FOR LIGHTNING SAFETY



- Listen to radio or TV weather reports for warning & advice and be alert.
- Identify safe shelters in your area. These should be cyclone resistant and also find the closest and safe route to reach them.
- All your family members should know the safe routes to nearest shelter/raised pucca buildings.
- Keep your emergency kit and basic food supply, medicines, torch and batteries etc. ready in waterproof bags. Drink preferably boiled water. Keep your food items covered.
- Doors, windows, roof and walls should be strengthened/checked before the cyclone season through retrofitting and repairing. Store adequate food grains and water in safe places.
- If your area is flood-prone, consider suitable flood resistant building materials.
- Do not let children and pregnant woman remain empty stomach.
- Put furniture, clothing and valuable items etc. on a higher platform so that they can be shifted safely/easily.
- Do not use electrical appliances, which are in flood water.
- Do not go into water of unknown depth and current.
- Do not allow children to play in, or near flood water.
- Do not venture into the sea if so advised. Stay Indoors under the strongest part of the house/if not moved to the cyclone shelter.
- Remain indoors until informed that weather has improved.
- In case of cyclone alert, do not go out, till officially advised that it is safe. If evacuated, wait till advised to go back. Use the recommended route to return to your home. Do not rush/panic.
- Be careful of broken/uncovered power lines, damaged roads and houses, fallen trees etc.
- Be careful of snakes, as snake bites are common during floods.
