Port Blair, Dec 06: The vaccination drive is continuing smoothly in A&N Islands. As per data available, a total of 5,61,334 beneficiaries have been vaccinated so far in A&N Islands, out of the target beneficiaries of 2,81,603 (approx.). A total of 1,76,175 eligible people in the age group of 18 to 44 years have been vaccinated till date. A total of 251 people were vaccinated on Sunday in these islands. 98 beneficiaries were vaccinated in South Andaman District, out of which 3 beneficiaries were in the age group of 18-44 years. Similarly, 153 beneficiaries were vaccinated in North & Middle Andaman District out of which 3 beneficiaries were in the age group of 18-44.

ANTVDWU writes to MP, seeks intervention for extension of validity of vehicle documents

Port Blair, Dec 06: The A & N Tourist Vehicles Drivers Welfare Union (ANTVDWU) has urged the Member of Parliament, Andaman and Nicobar Islands to take up the issue of extension documents pertaining to permit, fitness and all related tourist vehicle documents till March 31, 2022. In a letter to the Member of Parliament, members of the association sought his intervention for COVID Testing report airport, allotment of tourist vehicles parking place in city, free parking for tourist vehicle operators in the city and fresh drinking water and drivers waiting shed at COVID testing centre at ITF.



In September this year, the Member of Parliament of Andaman and Nicobar Islands, Mr. Kuldeep Rai Sharma had called on the Chief Secretary, Mr. Jitendra Narain and requested him to extend the permit period for all the Tourist Vehicles to 31st March 2022. He stated that because of Covid-19 Pandemic and lockdowns, the Tourism Industry of Andaman Nicobar Island suffered a heavy blow. He added that one of the sections in Andaman Nicobar Tourism Industry, the vehicle Drivers and owners who have taken loans from banks to operate tourist vehicles have especially suffered heavy financial loss during this crisis time because in the last one and half year, they couldn't operate their tourist vehicles. The Member of Parliament mentioned that the fitness period of tourist vehicles was set to expire on 30 September 2021 after which tourist vehicle owners have to apply for fresh fitness and for this entire process, they will have to pay nearly Rs. 35,000 to Rs. 50,000 for fitness of their vehicles. Considering the last one and half year, which was a severe loss period, it is impossible for any of the tourist vehicle owners to pay such a huge amount for renewal of tourist permit, the MP mentioned. He added that most of these tourist vehicle operators had taken loans from the banks and are under tremendous pressure from banks to pay the EMIs, adding that they are facing a huge challenge to run their family in this present situation. Many of these tourist vehicle drivers and owners are unable to pay room rent and going through extreme financial crisis. Considering all these problems the Member of Parliament requested the Chief Secretary to extend the permit period for all the Tourist vehicles to 31st March 2022 so that in this coming tourist season, See... MP introduces Private Member's Bill in Parl for 100 per cent job reservation for islanders

Port Blair, Dec 06: Shri Kuldeep Rai Sharma, Member of Parliament of Andaman and Nicobar Islands on 3rd December 2021 (Friday) introduced a Private Member's Bill titled The Reservation of Posts in Government Establishments of Andaman & Nicobar Islands Bill, 2019b provide for reservation in government establishments in Andaman & Nicobar Islands for residents of Andaman & Nicobar Islands to improve their standard of living through employment.



The Bill proposes to reserve hundred percent jobs for local candidates who have resided in the Union Territory of Andaman & Nicobar Islands for at least 10 years & holds a valid domicile certificate before the commencement of this act. The bill intends to provide legislative backing to residence based reservations for locals of Andaman & Nicobar Islands who have resided in the islands for at least 10 years. The rationale behind enactment of this bill is to tackle the menace of unemployment which

has seen a rise due to implementation of online recruitment. Through 100 percent reservation for local candidates, the rising unemployment can be addressed as the locals will be entitled to post under the government as per his qualification. The bill also has penal provisions to regulate any wrong doing through fake certificates & claims for availing reservations meant for deserving local candidates. Further, it also has a provision to designate a liaison officer in every government establishment who shall be responsible for ensuring that the provisions of the act are administered as per rules and in a fair manner. This bill seeks to provide adequate opportunities to locals of Andaman & Nicobar Islands who don't have sufficient representation in government establishments. This bill will encourage the residents of Andaman & Nicobar Islands to apply for recruitment in government posts and it will facilitate the development of the islands as reservation for locals will aid in increasing the standard of living of the local candidates.

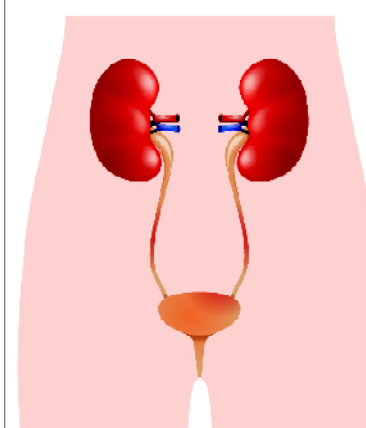
Question paper lengthy, difficulty level moderate says students, teachers

Compensate farmers of N&M farmers for losses sustained in heavy rains: MP

Port Blair, Dec 06: Highlighting the problems of cultivators of paddy and vegetables, the Member of Parliament of Andaman and Nicobar Islands, Mr. Kuldeep Rai Sharma has requested the Lt. Governor of Andaman and Nicobar Islands to direct the concerned departments to assess the damage to crops in the entire North and Middle Andaman region and pay necessary compensation to the farmers, who have suffered losses due to damage of crops because of heavy rain.

In a letter addressed to the Lt. Governor of Andaman and Nicobar Islands, the Member of Parliament mentioned that very recently due to low pressure formation in the South Andaman region and also because of other natural causes the North and Middle Andaman region witnessed heavy rain, which has caused large scale damage to the standing paddy crops. In many villages vegetable cultivators have also suffered heavy loss due to heavy rainfall, he added. The Member of Parliament mentioned

that in Andaman and Nicobar Islands most of the farmers are completely dependent on paddy cultivation for their need of rice for the entire year while some portion of the rice is also sold in local markets. He informed the Lt. Governor that because of the heavy rain now many cultivators of paddy and vegetables, who have invested heavily for seeds, fertilizers and insecticides have lost source of income for the coming months due to damage to their standing crops.

Regulatory Deficit

Last week, the Lok Sabha passed the Assisted Reproductive Technology (ART) Regulation Bill that sets standards and codes of conduct for fertility clinics and sperm banks in the country. The piece of legislation caters to a longstanding need. In the past 20 years, the increase in the number of ART clinics in India has been amongst the highest in the world. They cater to a burgeoning medical tourism industry and significantly, to a growing section of the country's population that is turning to ARTs such as gamete donation, intrauterine dissemination, in-vitro fertilisation and intracytoplasmic sperm injection to have children. Because of declining fertility rates, a substantial section of Indians marrying later than the generation before them, and the increasing provenance of single parenthood, the use of such technologies is bound to grow. At the same time, more than 80 per cent of clinics in the country offering ART facilities are reportedly unregistered. The ethical as well as safety-related issues germane to this regulatory deficit have been a part of conversation for two decades. The ICMR had laid down guidelines for ART clinics in 2005. But these protocols did not have any legislative backing. If the ART Bill becomes a law, it would be incumbent on clinics to ensure that commissioning couples, women and gamete donors are tested according to the established protocols. It also provides for a database of ART clinics in the country. In spite of the broad scope of the Bill it would be, however, pertinent to see legislation in the area as a work in progress — it will demand more sensitivity from lawmakers in dealing with changing social, demographic and medical trends.

The Bill does tick several right boxes in stipulating that the clinics provide counselling about the chances of success, costs, side-effects and risks, including that of multiple pregnancies. Importantly, it talks of informed consent of donors and legalises ART procedures for live-in couples and single women. However, as several members pointed out in the debate in the Lok Sabha, the bill discriminates against LGBTQ and single male parents. It goes against the spirit of the Supreme Court's landmark verdict in Navtej Johar v Union of India and assumes a formalistic position on the rights of same-sex couples to raise a family.

It seems that the heteronormative line of thinking of the Surrogacy Bill passed by the Lok Sabha in 2019 — the Rajya Sabha referred it to a select committee — has driven the ART Bill when it should have been the other way around given that the ART sector is more expansive than the surrogacy sector. The Upper House must take the conversation further and make sure that the law keeps up with the inclusive potential of reproductive technologies.

WHY IS US WORRIED ABOUT POSSIBLE CHINESE MILITARY BASE IN EQUATORIAL GUINEA?

China's massive investments in Africa were in the news recently, thanks to an airport in Uganda. There was speculation Beijing may take control of the Entebbe International Airport if Uganda failed to service a \$200 million loan.

China rejected the claims.

However, the issue highlighted the scale of China's investments, and influence in various African countries.

On Sunday, The Wall Street Journal reported US intelligence believed China was intending to build a "permanent military presence" in the tiny African nation of Equatorial Guinea.

Such a facility would be significant as it would give China its first base on the Atlantic Ocean. This would mean "Chinese warships would be able to rearm and refuel opposite the East Coast of the US—a threat that is setting off alarm bells at the White House and Pentagon," The Wall Street Journal reported.

The publication noted principal deputy US national security adviser John F. Tierney visited Equatorial Guinea in October on a mission to persuade President Teodoro Obiang Nguema Mbasogo to reject China's overtures for such a project.

The Joe Biden administration had conveyed to the Mbasogo government any Chinese activity would "raise national security concerns".

The report speculated China would consider building a military facility in the portcity of Bata. Beijing had built a deep-water commercial port in Bata. General Stephen Townsend, commander of the US Africa Command, had warned the Senate in

April about the risk of China having a naval facility on the Atlantic coast.

"I mean something more than a place that they can make port calls and get gas and groceries. I'm talking about a port where they can rearm, with munitions and repair naval vessels," Townsend was quoted as saying by The Wall Street Journal.

The previous Donald Trump administration had also attempted to dissuade Equatorial Guinea from allowing China to build a military facility. The Wall Street Journal noted the Biden administration is attempting to woo the Mbasogo regime with offers of cooperation.

The latest Pentagon report on China's military modernisation had warned China was considering military facilities in Kenya, Tanzania and Angola. In 2017, China formally opened its first overseas military base in Djibouti, on the Indian Ocean. The facility has since seen expansion of infrastructure to accommodate ships such as submarines and aircraft

carriers. Unlike nations such as Kenya, Tanzania and Angola, a facility on the Atlantic Ocean would have considerable practical and symbolic implications as it directly challenges US hegemony over the region.

In addition, a facility in Equatorial Guinea is expected to provide options to deploy forces to protect Chinese investments in the west coast of Africa.

Highlighting the intertwined nature of economic and military goals China has pursued, The Wall Street Journal report noted, "Chinese state-owned companies have built 100 commercial ports around Africa in the past two decades..." China's plans for a new facility on the Atlantic Ocean also shed light on the rapid expansion of its navy. The latest Pentagon report had noted the People's Liberation Army Navy (PLAN) was now the world's largest navy, "with an overall battle force of approximately 355 ships and submarines, including approximately more than 145 major surface combatants."

Study finds daytime meals may reduce health risks linked to night shift work

Port Blair, 6th Dec, 2021: A small clinical trial supported by the National Institutes of Health has found that eating during the nighttime—like many shift workers do—can increase glucose levels, while eating only during the daytime might prevent the higher glucose levels now linked with a nocturnal work life.

The findings, the study authors said, could lead to novel behavioral interventions aimed at improving the health of shift workers — grocery

one of two meal schedules. One group ate during the nighttime to mimic a meal schedule typical among night workers, and one group ate during the daytime.

The researchers then evaluated the effects of these meal schedules on their internal circadian rhythms. That's the internal process that regulates not just the sleep-wake cycle, but also the 24-hour cycle of virtually all aspects of our bodily functions, including metabolism.

The researchers found that nighttime eating boosted glucose levels — a risk factor for diabetes — while restricting meals to the daytime prevented this effect. Specifically, average glucose levels for those who ate at night increased by 6.4 percent during the simulated night work, while those who ate during the daytime showed no significant increases.

"This is the first study in humans to demonstrate the use of meal timing as a countermeasure against the combined negative effects of impaired glucose tolerance and disrupted alignment of circadian rhythm resulting from simulated night work," said study leader Frank A.J.L. Scheer, Ph.D., professor of medicine at Harvard Medical School and director of the Medical Chronobiology Program at Brigham & Women's Hospital in Boston.

The current study shows that, in particular, mistiming of the central circadian clock with the fasting/feeding cycles plays a key role in boosting glucose levels. The work further suggests the beneficial effects of daytime eating on glucose levels during simulated night work may be driven by better alignment between these central and peripheral "clocks."

To translate these findings into practical and effective meal timing interventions, the researchers said more study is needed, including with real-life shift workers in their typical work environment.

IT department detects black income of Rs 100 crore after raids on Kolkata group

Kolkata, 6th Dec, 2021: The Income Tax Department has detected unaccounted income of about Rs 100 crore after raiding a Kolkata-based group engaged in manufacture of TMT bars and construction material, the CBST said Monday.

The searches were carried out on December 1 at over 20 premises linked to the unidentified group in West Bengal and Odisha.

A number of "incriminating" evidences in the form of documents and digital data demonstrating high-

value unaccounted cash payments, unaccounted cash purchase and sales, suppression of production, etc. have been seized, the Central Board of Direct Tax (CBDT) said in a statement.

The policy-making body of the income tax department said preliminary analysis of these evidences found that many paper or shell companies are run by the group to provide accommodation entries (bogus entries) to its flagship concerns.

"These shell entities were

found to have routed back their unaccounted money in the guise of share capital/unsecured loan into books of account. "Such money was being admitted by one of the key persons of the group," it claimed.

The CBDT said Rs 75 lakh cash and jewellery valued at Rs 2.26 crore was seized while some bank lockers were put under restraint. "The search action, so far, has led to the detection of total unaccounted income of around Rs 100 crore," the CBDT said.

In the light of the above, you are earnestly requested to kindly look up the issue with the Civil Aviation Ministry to resume chartered flight services in the Port Blair-Chennai sector in the month of December 2021 to enable devotees visit the pilgrimage between Jan 1 to 8, 2022.



SCIENTISTS DEVELOPING CHEWING GUM THAT COULD CUT COVID TRANSMISSION

Scientists are developing a chewing gum laced with a plant-grown protein that serves as a "trap" for the SARS-CoV-2 virus, which causes COVID-19, reducing viral load in saliva and potentially lowering transmission.

The researchers noted that people who are fully vaccinated can still become infected with SARS-CoV-2 and can carry a viral load similar to those who are unvaccinated.

"SARS-CoV-2 replicates in the salivary glands, and we know that when someone who is infected sneezes, coughs, or speaks some of that virus can be expelled and reach others," said Henry Daniell at the University of Pennsylvania in the US.

"This gum offers an opportunity to neutralise the virus in the saliva, giving us a simple way to possibly cut down on a source of disease transmission," said Daniell, who led the study published in the journal Molecular Therapy.

Prior to the pandemic, Daniell had been

studying the angiotensin-converting enzyme 2 (ACE2) protein in the context of treating hypertension.

His lab had grown this protein, as well as many others that may have therapeutic potential, using a patented plant-based production system.

This system has the potential to avoid the usual obstacles to protein drug synthesis: an expensive production and purification process, the researchers said.

The receptor for ACE2 on human cells also happens to bind the SARS-CoV-2 spike protein, which the virus uses to infect the cells, they said.

Previous research has shown that injections of ACE2 can reduce viral load in people with severe infections.

Another line of work by Daniell and colleague Hyun Koo has involved research to develop a chewing gum infused with plant-grown proteins to disrupt dental plaque.

Pairing his insights about ACE2 with this technology, Daniell wondered if such a gum, infused with plant-grown ACE2 proteins, could neutralise SARS-CoV-2 in the oral cavity.

To test the chewing gum, the team grew ACE2 in plants, paired with another compound that enables the protein to cross mucosal barriers and facilitates binding.

The researchers incorporated the resulting plant material into cinnamon-flavoured gum tablets.

Incubating samples obtained from nasopharyngeal swabs from COVID-positive patients with the gum, they showed that the ACE2 present could neutralise SARS-CoV-2 viruses.

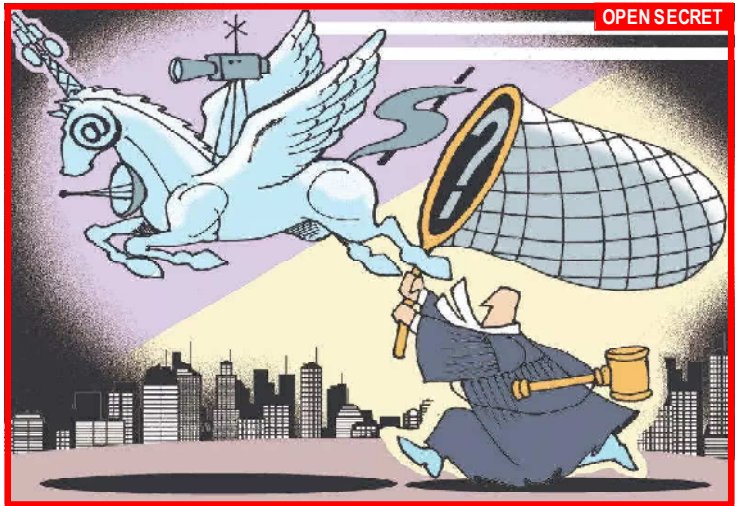
They then modified viruses, less pathogenic than SARS-CoV-2, to express the SARS-CoV-2 spike protein.

The scientists observed that the gum largely prevented the viruses or viral particles from entering cells, either by blocking the ACE2 receptor on the cells or by binding directly to the spike protein.

Finally, the team exposed saliva samples from COVID-19 patients to the ACE2 gum and found that levels of viral RNA fell so dramatically to be almost undetectable.

The research team is currently working towards obtaining permission to conduct a clinical trial to evaluate whether the approach is safe and effective when tested in people infected with SARS-CoV-2.

If the clinical trials prove the gum is safe and effective, it could be given to patients whose infection status is unknown, to reduce the likelihood of passing the virus to caregivers, the researchers added.
