New Delhi, July 5

The Prime Minister, Shri Narendra Modi inaugurated the Digital India Week 2022, whose theme is 'Catalyzing New India's Techade' in Gandhinagar yesterday. During the programme, he also launched multiple digital initiatives aimed at enhancing the accessibility of technology, streamlining service delivery to ensure ease of living and giving a boost to startups. He also announced the first cohort of 30 Institutions to be supported under the Chips to Startup (C2S) Programme.

Addressing the gathering, the Prime Minister said, the programme gives a glimpse of continuously modernizing India in the 21st century. Through Digital India, India has exemplified how revolutionary the correct use of technology is for the growth of humanity. "I am glad that this campaign, which started eight years ago, has been expanding itself with the changing times", he said.

The Prime Minister said "With the passage of time, the country which does not adopt modern technology, time moves ahead leaving it behind. India was a victim of this during the Third Industrial Revolution. But today, we can proudly say that India is guiding the world in the fourth industrial revolution, Industry 4.0. The Prime Minister



praised Gujarat for taking the lead in this regard also.

Remembering the conditions of 8-10 years ago. The Prime Minister said that from the situations of lines for birth certificate, bill payment, ration, admissions, result and banks, India has removed all these lines by getting online. So many services like, life certificate, reservation, banking etc. have become accessible, fast and affordable. Similarly, through technology, under Direct Benefit Transfer, more than 23 lakh crore rupees have been directly transferred in the accounts of the beneficiaries, in the

last 8 years. "Due to this technology, 2 lakh 23 thousand crore rupees of the country have been saved from falling into the wrong hands", he added emphasizing role of Digital India in curbing corruption. He said Digital India has brought the Government to the doorsteps and phones of the citizens. More than 1.25 lakh Common Service Centres and Grameen Stores are now taking e-commerce to rural India, he said. Similarly, property documents for rural properties are being provided by use of technology.

On the use of technology during the pandemic, the Prime Minister said that the power that Digital India has created in the country in the last eight years has helped India a lot in combating the Corona global pandemic. "We have transferred thousands of crores of rupees to the bank accounts of crores of women, farmers, labourers of the country at a single click. With the help of One Nation One Ration Card, we have ensured free ration to more than 80 crore countrymen." As per data available, a total of 6,83,916 doses of vaccine have been administered to beneficiaries in the age group of 18 and above so far. Similarly, 23,588 beneficiaries have been vaccinated in the age group of 15 to 18 years. 24,562 beneficiaries in the age group of 12 to 14 years have been administered both doses of vaccine.

The number of beneficiaries administered precautionary dose of vaccine so far stood at 27,736.

vaccine doses have been administered and certificates given, said the Prime Minister.

Furthermore, the Prime Minister said "India's FinTech endeavour is truly a solution by the people, of the people, for the people. The technology in it is India's own i.e. by the people. The countrymen made it a part of their life i.e. of the people. It made the transactions of the countrymen easy i.e. for the people." 40 percent digital transection at global level takes place in India, the Prime Minister added. "There is scale, security and democratic values in our digital solutions", he said.

The Prime Minister informed about the focus of skilling, upskill and reskilling the 14-15 lakh youth for Industry 4.0 in the coming 4-5 years. He said "be it space, mapping, drones, gaming and animation, many such sectors which are going to expand the future of digital technology, they have been opened for innovation. In women's cricket, India thrashed Sri Lanka by 10 wickets in their second ODI match at Pallekele to take an unassailable 2-0 lead in the three-match series. Put in to bat first, hosts Sri Lanka scored 173 runs in the stipulated 50

overs with the help of Ama Kanchana's 47 and Nilakshi de Silva's 32 runs. For India, Renuka Singh claimed four wickets while Meghna Singh and Deepti Sharma took two wickets each.

In reply, Indian openers Shafali Verma and Smriti Mandhana achieved the target in just 25.4 overs. Mandhana remained unbeaten on 94 while Shafali contributed 71 runs.

The third and final match will be played on Thursday at Pallekele International Cricket Stadium at Kandy. Earlier, India also won the T20 series against Sri Lanka.

England defeat India by seven wickets in rescheduled 5th Test match at Edgbaston

Birmingham, July 5

In cricket, England have defeated India by seven wickets in the rescheduled 5th Test match at Edgbaston in Birmingham today. An unbeaten stand of 269 runs between Joe Root and Jonny Bairstow for the fourth wicket helped the hosts chase down a 378-run target in the fourth innings.

This is their highest successful chase in the final

innings of a Test. The hosts resumed their innings at the score of 259 for 3 and got home quite comfortably as Root and Bairstow tore apart the Indian bowlers. On Day 4, England got a target of 378 to win the fifth Test after India were dismissed for 245 in their second innings shortly after lunch.

Interventions for Communicable Diseases at AB-HWCs

- The primary health care team at SHC-AB-HWCs facilitate seamless linking of community and facility level interventions for vector borne disease control. The ASHA supported by the Village Health Sanitation and Nutrition Committees (VHSNCs) and Mahila Arogya Samitis (MAS) enable community health education on personal protective measures, undertaking measures for vector control or distribution of insecticide treated bed-nets.
- AB-HWCs also facilitate home, community and facility-based interventions for chronic communicable diseases such as Tuberculosis (TB) and Leprosy.
- ASHAs undertake active case finding for both TB and leprosy through Community Based Assessment Checklist (CBAC) which also serves as a way of enhancing community awareness.
- For TB, AB-HWC teams undertake home visits, counselling, contact investigation, sample collection and transportation, dispense anti TB medication, ensure referrals for testing for existence of conditions such as diabetes/HIV, linkages to Antiretroviral Therapy (ART) centres/DRTB centres, as required, collection of bank account details, to facilitate cash entitlements under the Nishay Poshan Yojana, monitor for treatment adherence and facilitate follow up.
- ASHA based surveillance system for leprosy is being implemented through AB-HWCs
- SHC-AB-HWCs are being equipped with all the medicines for TB and has access to telemedicine for consultation as required.

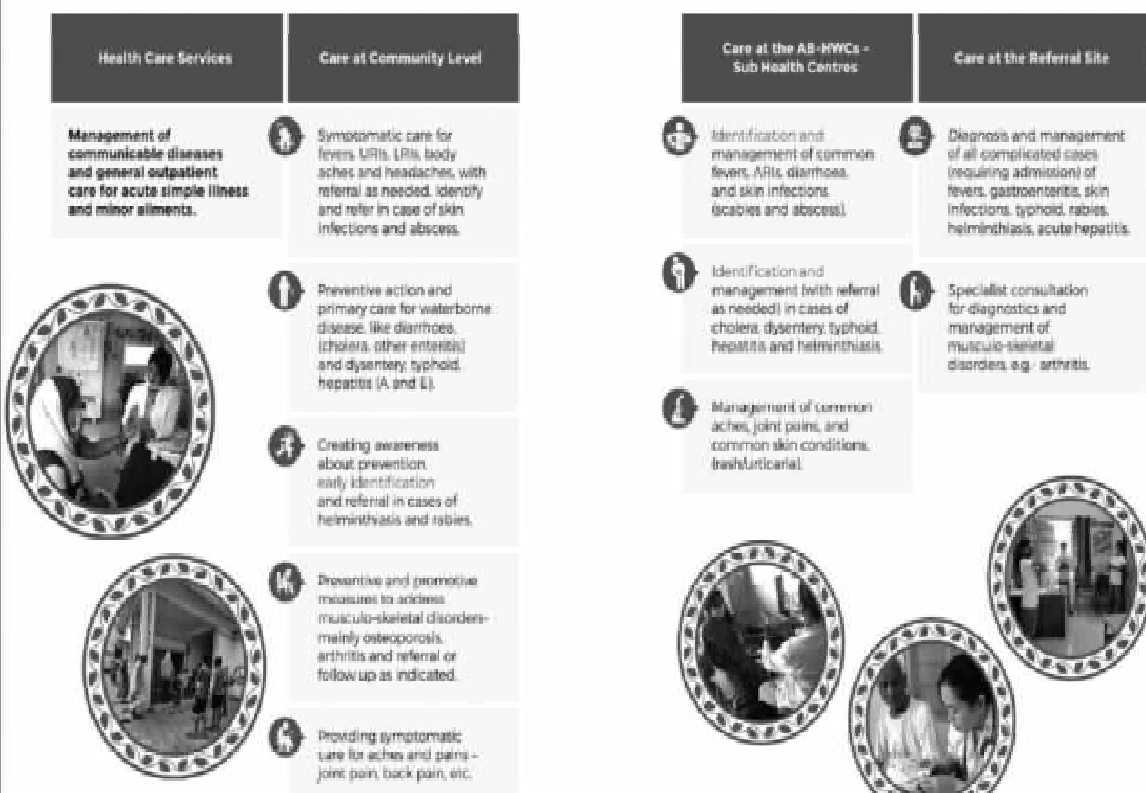

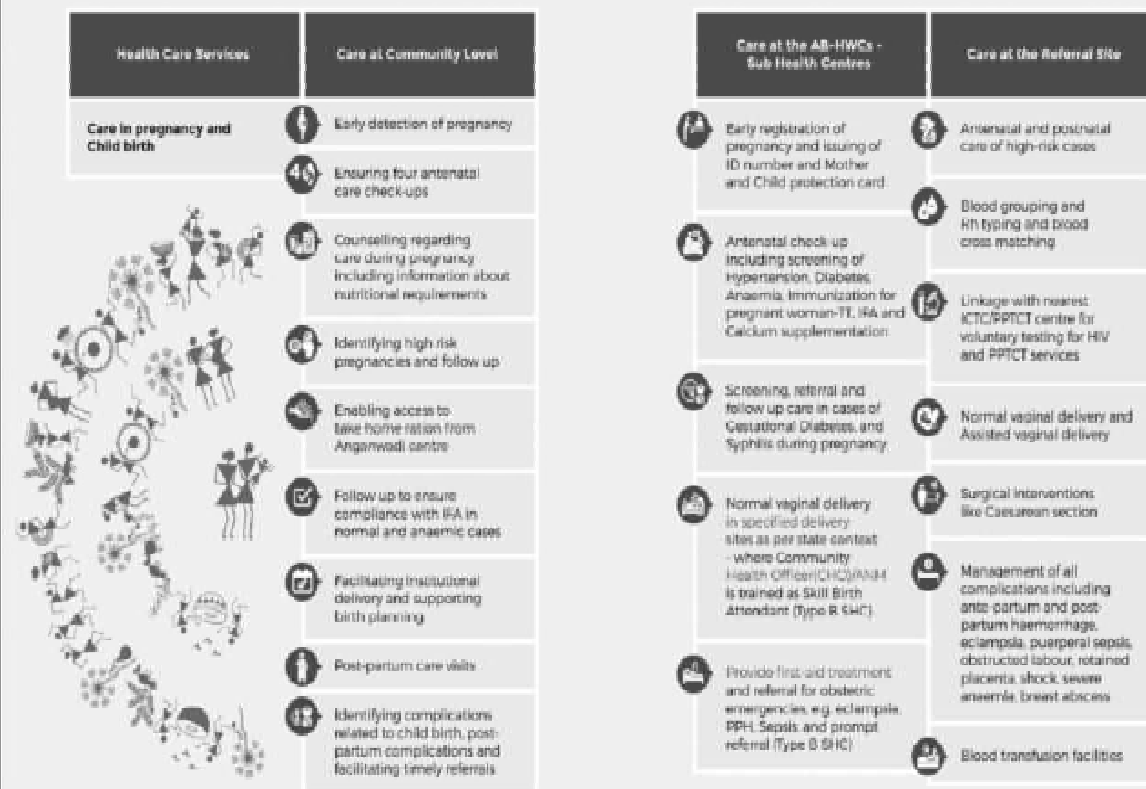

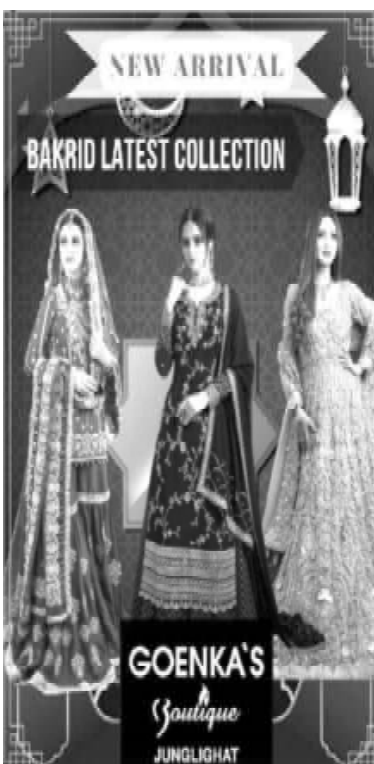
