

GST collection for October 2021 registered second highest since implementation of GST

Rs. 1,30,127 crore gross GST revenue collected in October

New Delhi, Nov. 1

The gross GST revenue collected in the month of October 2021 is Rs. 1,30,127 crore of which CGST is Rs. 23,861 crore, SGST is Rs. 30,421 crore, IGST is Rs. 67,361 crore (including Rs. 32,998 crore collected on import of goods) and Cess is Rs. 8,484 crore (including Rs. 699 crore collected on import of goods). The Government has settled Rs. 27,310 crore to CGST and Rs. 22,394 crore to SGST from IGST as regular settlement. The total revenue of Centre and the States after regular settlements in the month of October 2021 is Rs. 51171 crore for CGST and Rs. 52,815 crore for the SGST.



The revenues for the month of October 2021 are 24% higher than the GST revenues in the same month last year and 36% over 2019-20. During the month, revenues from import of goods was 39% higher and the revenues from domestic transaction (including import of services) are 19% higher than the revenues from these sources during the

same month last year.

The GST revenues for October have been the second highest ever since introduction of GST, second only to that in April 2021, which related to year-end revenues. This is very much in line with the trend in economic recovery. This is also evident from the trend in the e-way bills generated every month since the second wave. The revenues would have still been higher if the sales of cars and other products had not been affected on account of disruption in supply of semi-conductors. The revenues have also been aided due to

Various steps initiated to control Air Pollution due to bursting of crackers

Ambient Air Quality Monitoring Stations set up to monitor different parameters during Deepawali

Bursting of fire crackers allowed only between 8 pm & 10 pm

Port Blair, Nov. 1

Air Pollution is a great concern in today's world especially for people who suffer from respiratory health issues. Awareness about air pollution is important for the citizens against pollution caused due to the use of fire crackers that may aggravate the menace of COVID-19 pandemic, causing higher danger to lives and health of the vulnerable groups.

In compliance of the orders of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India and Hon'ble NGT Order Dated 23-10-2018 in the matter of O.A No.728 of 2015, the Andaman & Nicobar Administration has taken various steps to control the Air Pollution due to bursting of fire crackers by restricting the timing only to two hours between 8 pm to 10 pm during Deepawali.



Ambient Air Quality Monitoring Station set up at Aberdeen Bazaar

As per the directions, Andaman Nicobar Pollution Control Committee, Department of Science and Technology is carrying out short term monitoring of different parameters for 15 days. ANPCC has setup two Ambient Air Quality Monitoring Stations at PBMC office, Aberdeen Bazar and at Dollygunj (near Shiv Temple) during Deepawali 2021. The Ambient Air Quality including Noise Level monitoring has started from Oct. 28 and will be done till Nov. 11 on 24 hour

basis. The monitoring parameters include PM10, PM2.5, SOX, NOX, metals like (PB, Ni & As) in PM10 and (Al, Ba & Fe) in PM2.5. The Ambient Air Quality is calculated by Air Quality Index (AQI). The AQI has six categories from Good to Severe to define Air Quality and to

AQI	Possible Health Impacts
Good (0-50)	Minimal impact
Satisfactory (51-100)	Minor breathing discomfort to sensitive people

Poor (201-300)	Breathing discomfort to most people on prolonged exposure.
Very Poor (301-400)	Respiratory illness on prolonged exposure
Severe (> 400)	Affects healthy people and seriously impacts those with existing diseases.

Farmers' Corner- A Knowledge Hub

Heliconia psittacorum commonly known as Parrot Flower

Heliconia psittacorum is an evergreen, perennial, rhizomatous erect herbaceous upright small and exotically tropical plant. The species resembles an ornamental plant known commonly as bird-of-paradise. This species was first commercially cultivated at Denmark in 1980's and later spread to other countries. They bloom abundantly all year. "Flower" heads appear to be hand painted and glow with brilliant colours and greenish yellow flowers with black spot near apex. It is indigenous to the Amazon rainforest. *Heliconia psittacorum* flowers are actually highly modified leaves and bracts growing up to 2.5 m height. The long-pointed leaves are shiny green. The pinkish-red bracts arise from a central point on the stem. The spike length ranges from 20-30 cm. Beautiful frosty cream colored bracts, shading from pinkish-red to mauve to the tips. Its sepals are cream colored with green-black bands. The number of spikes per clump per year ranges from 25-40. The varieties under this species are Tropics, Golden Torch, Petra Orange, Sassy and Lady Di. Moist humid tropical condition is highly suitable for growing this crop. The flowers are long lasting with shelf life upto 2 weeks. Alkaline soil is not suitable for this crop and the plant may develop chlorosis symptoms. **Benefit:** *Heliconia psittacorum* is the fastest growing ornamental plant and is highly suitable in landscape horticulture as flower bed and mass planting in parks. **Contact person with Name, Designation e-mail and phone no: Dr. V. 'Ayurveda for Poshan'

KULATTHA RASAM (Horse Gram Rasam)

Ingredients	Quantity
Cooked horse gram	- 2 cups (60 gm)
Tamarind / lemon juice	- 20 gm/ 1 spoon
Tomatoes	- 1 chopped
Curry leaves	- 5-6 (5 gm)
Garlic paste	- 2 tea spoons
Pepper-cumin seeds paste	- 2 tea spoons
Mustard seeds	- 1 tea spoon
Salt	- to taste (1 tea spoon)
Cooking oil	- to season (5 ml)

No. of servings: 2-3 bowls (300-400 ml)

Method of preparation
Clean wash and soak horse gram for 4 hours. Steam, cool and drain the substrate. Heat 1 tea spoon of oil/ghee in a pan, add mustard seeds, curry leaves and red chillies, allow to splutter. Add chopped tomatoes and sauté till they are soft. Add 2 tea spoons of garlic paste and sauté till raw smell goes off, add tamarind and salt and boil. Jaggery, black pepper, cumin seeds, lemon juice, curry leaves are optional. Add horse gram substrate. When the mixture boils and cooks remove from the flame mash well and serve hot.

Health benefits
It is high in iron, calcium, and provides ¼ of total protein required in a day per serving. It is low in fat and high in fibre content so helps to lower LDL levels and body fat. It is diabetic-friendly food and keeps you warm on a cold winter day. Horse gram is recommended in urinary calculi. The raw seeds of horse gram have flavonoids and polyphenols, these compounds confer protective properties towards the liver and gall bladder.

BESAN SUJI PANCAKE

Ingredients	Quantity
Besan (gram flour)	- 1 cup
Suji/Rawa (semolina)	- 2 cups
Butter milk	- Sufficient to make batter
Capsicum (or any other vegetable of choice)	1
Onion	- 1
Garlic	- 4 cloves
Ginger	- 1 inch piece
Tomato	- 1
Green chill	- 1
Coriander leaves	- 2-3
Ghee/oil	- For spreading on pan

Total quantity: 4 pieces

Method of preparation

Mix gram flour and suji with butter milk and make a batter. Keep the mixture for 15 minutes. Cut all the vegetables in small pieces and make a paste of ginger and garlic. Mix the vegetables and ginger garlic paste in the batter. Heat the pan and spread 1 spoon oil over it, pour the batter on heated pan and spread it evenly. Once cooked from one side then reverse and cook properly from both the sides.

Sugar	- 1 spoon
Water	- As per need

Roast the Sesame on low flame. Do not over heat or burn it, mix all the ingredients and grind it.
