Vaccination Update

Port Blair, Jan 02: The vaccination drive is continuing smoothly in A&N Islands. As per data available, a total of 5,93,063 beneficiaries have been vaccinated so far in A&N Islands. A total of 188 people were vaccinated in South Andaman District on Saturday. 183 beneficiaries were vaccinated in South Andaman District, out of which 17 beneficiaries were in the age group of 18-44 years. Similarly, 5 beneficiaries were vaccinated in North & Middle Andaman District out of which 1 beneficiary was in the age group of 18-44.

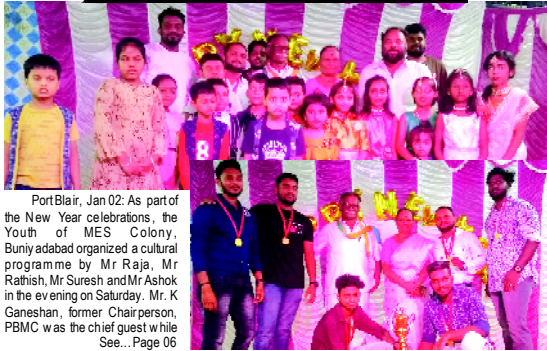
1000 mtrs of revenue land encroached upon at Bathubasti, Revenue dept clueless



Port Blair, Jan 02: Rampant encroachment on government land is posing a serious threat to the islands. While the revenue department has been conducting encroachment drives on a regular basis, clearing encroachments from government lands, there are still clusters where government land is still being encroached. Several temporary structures have come up in the cluster of areas, which have been encroached. Many individuals have constructed RCC buildings in the land encroached upon. One such area where people have encroached upon government land is Bathubasti. About 1000 mtrs of vacant government lands at Bathubasti near the site where sand is sold has been encroached by some individuals. They have converted the government land into a construction site where they make RCC ring materials used to prepare borewells. Complaints have already been registered with the Revenue department, but no action to evict the encroachment has been made by the department. These encroachers have already been provided with electric and tap connections. Encroachers have occupied huge clusters of revenue land laying vacant for years with authority clueless about the land. Construction is going on in the encroached land and when some revenue decide to check this activity, they are silenced by political pressure. Even reports of these encroaching revenue land changing hands have also been reported. Despite several media reports, till today revenue officials have turned a blind eye to it. Many hectares of government land has been encroached by the encroachers and RCC building constructed in revenue land. Because of rampant encroachment, the entire area has been converted into a big colony with no drainage, toilets and improper disposal of wastes. The rampant encroachment is posing a serious threat and authorities concerned are yet to take any serious efforts to put an end to the problem. Several RCC houses have come up in the cluster of Bathubasti areas, which have been encroached.

COVID-19 status in A&N Islands

Port Blair, Jan 02: During the RT-PCR test conducted on 401 passengers who arrived here yesterday, 5 positive cases have been detected. 15 flights with 2455 passengers arrived on Saturday, out of which, 1925 were vaccinated with both doses while RT-PCR test was conducted on 522 passengers (includes 36 international travellers) and the reports are awaited. During RAT conducted on 111 passengers bound for North & Middle Andaman at Ferrargunj, all were found negative. Happy New Year

As the old year was giving way to the new, in this age of the image, two videos seemed to tell a story. In the first, Union Home Minister Amit Shah, giving an election speech in Moradabad in poll-bound UP, exhorts his audience to vote for his party's "nizam (ruling order)" which he says, is different from that of its rival. He speaks out the difference. In the SP's nizam, N is for Nasimuddin, I for Imran Masood... In other words, for all the BJP's publicity and claims on governance, its senior leader and minister seemed to be once again framing the same bare and impoverished choice in UP 2022—us versus them, one faith versus another. The sense that the BJP could be preparing to run a joyless, leading campaign, weighed down by resentments, is a dispiriting thing to carry into the new year. Now, cut to the second video. Women in a house in Tumakuru, the walls festooned with balloons, are eloquently and forcefully telling off some men, Hinduva vigilantes, who were apparently trying to disrupt their Christmas celebrations. You don't need to know the language the women speak to understand what they say. The brave women of Tumakuru who refused to be bullied, not the politician in the polarising campaign, is the apt freeze-frame on which to end the year that saw farmers speak back to their government.

Last year, the farmers agitated and won. In November 2020, protesting farmers, mainly from Punjab and Haryana but also from elsewhere, had reached Delhi's borders to protest in the open against the Centre's three farm laws pushed through amid a pandemic. In November 2021, when Prime Minister Narendra Modi finally took to television to announce his government's decision to repeal the laws, it had become clear that the issue was not their merit—they were reformist in intent, and by all accounts and indices, Punjab's agriculture is crying out for change.

Of course, 2021 was also the year of other stories. The heartrending loss suffered by so many, seemingly abandoned by a rudderless government and unprepared administration, in that second deadly surge of Covid in April-May. And, by year-end, the formidable and impressive success of the vaccination programme, which now hopefully gives India brace for a possible third wave of the mutated virus with the largest population of vaccinated people in the world. Yet, amid the challenges and the continuing pandemic, is a hope for 2022 that draws from the unmarked spirit of the farmers and the women. The people will speak and the powerful will be compelled to listen. Happy New Year.

From Dilip Kumar to Bipin Rawat to Desmond Tutu, the Icons Who Left Us in 2021

Friends and colleagues described a man who hunched deeply about the stories he covered, carrying out meticulous research before embarking on assignments and always focusing on the people caught up in the news. In recent months, his searing photographs capturing the coronavirus pandemic in India have spread across the world. He became a journalist after a Master's degree in mass communications from Jamia Millia Islamia University.

Surekha Sikri: The National Award winning actor died of a cardiac arrest on July 16. The 76-year-old actress was also suffering from complications of two brain strokes. The veteran actress delivered fine performances in a career spanning over four decades. Not just in TV, the screen legend was a performer par excellence in theatre and films. It was in 2008 when Sikri added a marmalade note to her acting journey. The audiences loved her as Kalyani Devi, hestern matriarch in the popular television show, *Baaki Vadhu*. She was last seen in 2018 film *Badhaai Ho*, alongside Neena Gupta, Gajraj Rao, Sanya Malhotra and Ayushmann Khurrana.

Kalyan Singh: The former Uttar Pradesh chief minister and BJP veteran died on August 21 at the age of 89. He was hospitalised due to a cardiac arrest on August 10. The consciousness level on July 4. He was the CM of UP when Babri Masjid was demolished in 1992. Kalyan Singh left the BJP for a brief time before returning to the party five years before his death.

Maki Kaji: The 64-year-old creator of the popular numbers puzzle *Sudoku* died on August 10. Kaji's life's work was spreading the joy of puzzles.

Charlie Watts: The self-effacing Rolling Stones drummer died on August 24 at the age of 80. He helped anchor one of rock's greatest rhythm sections and used his day job to support his enduring love of music.

Syed Ali Geelani: The icon of disputed Kashmir's resistance against Indian rule died on September 1 at the age of 90. He was a top separatist leader who became the emblem of the region's defiance against New Delhi.

Sidharth Shukla: The Big Boss fame actor's sudden demise on September 2 sent shockwaves through the entertainment industry. He was probably the most popular TV figures of recent times, having tasted success from his very first show. Shukla started his acting career with the TV show *Babli Ka Aangan Chodhe Na* (2008), where he played a benevolent rich man who falls in love with a girl from a middle class family. He married her with a promise to share her responsibilities towards her dependent family members. In 2012, Sidharth entered the long-running show *Balki Vadhu* as district collector Shivraj Shekhar.

Chandan Mitra: The former BJP MP who switched to the TMC in 2018, died on September 2. He was also the editor of *The Pioneer*, but recent reports stated that he resigned as printer and publisher of the new paper in June. Several leaders, including Prime Minister Modi, defence minister Rajnath Singh, West Bengal chief minister Mamata Banerjee as well as President Ram Nath Kovind condoned his death.

Kamla Bhasin: Prominent women's rights activist, poet and author Kamla Bhasin died on September 25. She was 75. Bhasin was a prominent voice in the women's movement in India and other South Asian countries. The former Algerian president died at the age of 84 on September 17. He fought for independence from France, reconciled his conflict-ridden nation and was then ousted amid pro-democracy protests in 2019 after two decades in power.

Abdelaziz Bouteflika: The former Algerian president died at the age of 84 on September 17. He fought for independence from France, reconciled his conflict-ridden nation and was then ousted amid pro-democracy protests in 2019 after two decades in power.

Ghanshyam Nayak: He was best known as 'Nattu Kaka' on long-running show *Tarak Mehta Ka Oltah Chashma*. He died after a long battle with cancer on October 3. He was 77. Nayak started as a child artist in 1960 and went on to have a career in film and television. He played the role of a grandfather in the popular Hindi film *Sholay* and the Gujarati stage. He even lent his voice as a playback singer, teaming up with Asha Bhonsle and Mahendra Kapoor.

Puneeth Rajkumar: The South Indian actor died on October 29 from a cardiac arrest. He was 46. Saddened by the Kannada film star's untimely death, ad-hoc hand-died by suicide in Karnataka, while

two suffered heart attacks. Chief minister Basavaraj S. Bommai condoned the death of Rajkumar and announced that full state honours would be accorded during the actor's funeral. His untimely demise sent shockwaves across the country. The youngest son of Kannada movie star Rajkumar, Puneeth was referred to as 'Power Star' and 'Appu' by fans. Puneeth started his acting career as a child artist along with his father. He won the National Film Award for Best Child Artist for his role of Ramu in *Bettada Hoovu* (1985). Puneeth also won the Karnataka State Award for Best Child Artist for his performances in *Chalisava Modagalu* and *Yeradu Nakshatragalu*.

Umer Sharif: One of Pakistan's most beloved comedians died on October 28 at the age of 66. Many Indian comedians, including Shekhar Suman and Kapil Sharma, considered this Punjabi Pakistani theatre actor and comedian their inspiration. In the days of the video cassette, his state show *Bakra Qistari* put him a household name across South Asia and the diaspora.

Abdul Qadeer Khan: He was a controversial figure who died at the age of 85 on October 10. He was known as the father of Pakistan's nuclear bomb. **Colin Powell:** The trailblazing soldier and diplomat died on October 18 at the age of 84. His sterling reputation for service to Republican and Democratic presidents was stained by his faulty claims to justify the 2003 invasion of Iraq.

FW de Klerk: South Africa's last apartheid president died on November 11 at the age of 85. He shared the Nobel Peace Prize with Nelson Mandela and oversaw the end of South Africa's white minority rule.

Stephen Sondheim: The songwriter died at the age of 91 on November 26. He is known to have reshaped the American musical theatre in the second half of the 20th century with his intelligent, intricately rhymed lyrics, his use of evocative melodies and his willingness to tackle unusual subjects.

Virgil Abloh: The leading

designer died of cancer on November 28 at age of 41. His groundbreaking fusions of streetwear and high fashion earned him one of the most celebrated tastemakers in fashion and beyond.

Vinod Dua: The senior journalist died due to prolonged illness on December 4. He was 67. A pioneer in broadcast Hindi journalism, he held stints in Doordarshan and NDTV. Dua, who was hospitalised with Covid-19 earlier this year, lost his wife, radiologist Padmavati Chinnai Dua, to the virus in June.

He and his wife were in a hospital in Gurgaon when he second Covid wave was at its peak. The journalist's health had suffered ever since and he had been in and out of hospitals. The couple's two daughters, a clinical psychologist.

CDS General Bipin Rawat and wife Madhulika Rawat: A shocking incident, India's first chief of defence staff General Bipin Rawat was killed in a chopper crash near Coimbatore in Tamil Nadu. Along with Gen Rawat, his wife Madhulika and 12 other defence personnel were also killed. The incident took place on December 8. Known to be forthright, fearless, and blunt at times, the 63-year-old Gen Rawat strongly backed a policy of not pursuing dealing with cross-border terrorism and militancy in Jammu and Kashmir when he was the army chief between 2016 and 2019.

He was an alumnus of National Defence Academy and was commissioned into the 11 Gorkha Rifles in December 1978. Born in Pauri, Uttarakhand, Gen Rawat's family has been serving in the Indian Army for four generations.

His wife Madhulika was the daughter of a police officer. Migendra Singh and a native of Shahdol in Madhya Pradesh. She completed her studies in Delhi and her graduation in psychology from Delhi University.

Suresh Jadhav: The executive director of vaccine maker Serum Institute of India died on December 8 at the age of 72. He was suffering from cancer. He was associated with Serum Institute, maker of the Covid-19 vaccine Covishield among others, since 1979 and looked after manufacturing and quality control.

PT Thomas: The Kerala



Congress working president and four-time MLA died on December 22 due to pancreatic cancer. He was 71. The quintessential firebrand leader's last wish was that there should be no wreaths or funeral at church or even religious service on his death, but the evergreen film song *Chandrabalam charcha urangam theeram* should be played during a public service.

Belonging from a Catholic family, he married Uma, a Hindu Brahmin, who did not convert to Christianity against the wishes of many. He did not even insist that his sons be baptised at birth, leaving the choice to them as adults.

Thomas was the sitting MLA from Tririkkara in Ernakulam, from where he won in 2016 and 2021. He was also elected MLA from Thodupuzha twice from 1991-96 and 2001-2006.

Anne Rice: The novelist died on December 11 at the age of 80. Her lush, best-selling Gothic tales, including *Interview With the Vampire*, reinvented the blood-drinking immortals as tragic antiheroes.

Beil Hooks: The groundbreaking author died at the age of 69 on December 15. The explorations by the educator and activist of how race, gender, economics and politics intertwined helped shape academic and popular debates over the past 40 years.

Joan Didion: The revered author and essayist died on December 23 at the age of 87. Her social and personal commentary in such classics as *The White Album* and *The Year of Magical Thinking* made her a clear-eyed critic of turbulent times.

Archbishop Desmond Tutu: South Africa's Nobel Peace

Prize-winning icon, an uncompromising foe of apartheid and a modern-day activist for racial justice and LGBT rights, died on December 26 at the age of 90. He worked passionately, tirelessly and non-violently to tear down apartheid South Africa's brutal, decades-long regime of oppression against Black majority that ended in 1994.

Nicknamed the Arch, the diminutive Tutu became a twining figure in his nation's history, comparable to fellow Nobel laureate Nelson Mandela, a prisoner during white rule who became South Africa's first Black president. Tutu and Mandela shared a commitment to building a better, more equal South Africa. The Nobel Peace Prize in 1984 highlighted his stature as one of the world's most effective champions for human rights. Tutu also campaigned internationally for human rights, especially LGBTQ rights and same-sex marriage.

Jean-Marc Vallée: The Emmy-winning director of *Big Little Lies* died on December 27. He was 58. The director and producer, whose 2013 drama *Dallas Buyers Club* earned multiple Oscar nominations. Vallée was acclaimed for his naturalistic approach to filmmaking, directing stars including Reese Witherspoon, Nicole Kidman, Amy Adams and Jake Gyllenhaal over the past decade. He became a sought-after name in Hollywood after *Dallas Buyers Club*, featuring Matt Damon, McConaughey and Jared Leto, and earned six Academy Awards nominations, including best picture. He directed *Whispering Willows* in 2014, and re-teamed with her to direct the first season of *Big Little Lies* in 2017, and directed Adams in 2018's *Sharp Objects*.

Environment 2021: Slow decisions in the face of accelerating climate change

In terms of the environment, the year that is now coming to an end, he started dressed in blue. January 2021 marked the beginning of the Decade of Ocean Sciences for Sustainable Development, proclaimed by the United Nations, which will last until the end of 2030.

The director of the Institute of Marine Sciences (ICM-CISC) Josep Lluís Pelegri Llopert has explained to us the objective of this initiative: to promote management of the oceans and coasts based on scientific knowledge, which makes healthy oceans one of the pillars for the progress of all mankind.

It will be difficult, if not impossible, to achieve sustainable development with sick seas.

They harbor enormous biodiversity, play a determining role in rainfall, are the great repositories and distributors of solar energy, and regulate greenhouse gases.

The beginning of this decade has inspired the Oceans 21 series. In it, over the last few months, we have published numerous articles that describe the situation in the main oceans of the world and talk about some of the main problems they face, such as noise pollution and climate change. In August, the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC) released its most comprehensive report on the science of climate change since 2013. The evaluation presents new evidence that blames human activities for climate change. The analysis confirms that warming is accelerating, as is rising sea levels, and that extreme weather events (heat waves, torrential rains, periods of drought) have increased

in frequency and intensity due to man.

For Ferrando Villadamas, from the National Museum of Natural Sciences, reducing greenhouse gas emissions requires slowing down economic development, reorganizing and limiting energy generation, transforming transportation, reducing intensive agriculture and livestock, and transforming cities.

But reversing the process is increasingly complicated. Manuel

there are no protocols to deal with these phenomena.

The other protagonists of the summer have been the fires. Increasingly voracious and difficult to extinguish, the current ones are considered sixth generation.

They release such an amount of energy that they are capable of developing their own behavior and generating erratic winds that allow them to spread in an unpredictable way," alerts Rosa María Canals, professor of Agricultural Engineering and Rural Areas at the Public University of Navarre.

Researchers Pedro Linares (Comillas Pontifical University), Anna Traveset (IMEDEA - CSIC - UIB), Cristina Linares and Julio Daz (Carlos III Health Institute), Gemma Durn Romero (Autonomous University of Madrid), Roberto Alvarez Fernandez (Nehru University) and Victor Resco de Dios (University of Lleida) gave us an assessment of the summit and the resulting Climate Pact, signed by 197 countries.

The meeting has represented some steps forward. Countries have been urged to review their emission reduction commitments. Good intentions have also been declared in terms of economic aid to the poorest regions, investment in health projects and forest protection.

But the meeting has left some questions up in the air. One of them is the climate finance plan and the list of contributors. On the other hand, although it was proposed to end coal and aid for fossil fuels, no firm measures have been established. The next few years will be decisive for all these aspects: to take shape. For now, the countries have agreed to meet in November 2022 in Egypt to present more ambitious commitments to reduce emissions. We will see if then they arrive with their homework done.

GST collection up 13% in December at Rs 1.29 lakh crore

GST revenues in December 2021 grew 13 per cent to over Rs 1.29 lakh crore, mainly due to pickup in economic activity and anti-evasion steps, the Finance Ministry said on Saturday.

Though the collection was lower than Rs 1.31 lakh crore mopped up in November, December is the sixth month in a row when the revenues from goods and services tax rendered stood at over Rs 1 lakh crore.

"The gross GST revenue collected in December 2021 is Rs 1,29,780 crore, of which CGST is Rs 22,578 crore, SGST is Rs 28,658 crore, IGST is Rs 69,155 crore (including Rs 37,527 crore collected on import of goods) and cess is Rs 9,389 crore (including Rs 614 crore collected on import of goods)," the Finance Ministry said in a statement.

The revenues for December 2021 are 13 per cent higher than the GST revenues in the same month

last year (Rs 1.15 lakh crore) and 26 per cent higher than December 2019. The average monthly gross GST collection for the third quarter (October-December) of the current year has been Rs 1.30 lakh crore against the average monthly collection of Rs 1.10 lakh crore and Rs 1.15 lakh crore in the first

and second quarters, respectively.

"Coupled with economic recovery, anti-evasion activities, especially action against fake billers have been contributing to the enhanced GST. The improvement in revenue has also been due to various rationalisation measures undertaken by the Council to correct inverted duty structure," the ministry said. It hoped that the

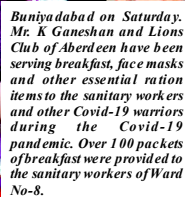

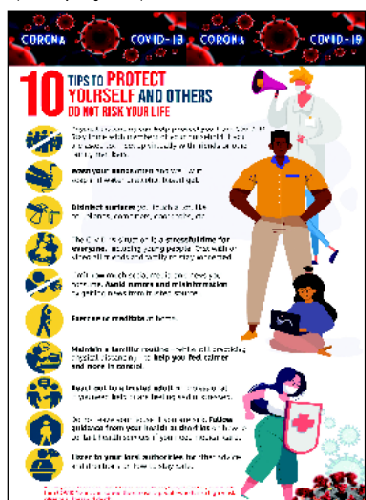
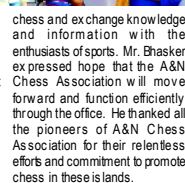
