

## Administration fully prepared to protect the PVTGs from impending Cyclone

Port Blair, Mar. 20  
The A&N Administration is alert to the safety of its tribes especially the Particularly Vulnerable Tribal Groups (PVTGs) to deal with the situation arising out of impending Cyclone. The Chief Secretary, Shri Jitendra Narain took a high level meeting and emphasized that the safety, security, protection and

wellbeing of the tribes is paramount to the Administration. As part of the disaster preparedness, the Directorate of Tribal Welfare constituted teams of field functionaries of Andaman Adim Janjati Vikas Samiti (AAJVS) for all PVTGs settlements. The team visited all camps and sensitized the tribes about the impact of cyclone and preparedness. The

tribal population living near coast have been shifted to interior and safe places by the team. Onge tribe has been shifted to School and Community Hall at Dugong Creek. Jarawa tribe living in Lewaital, Badabalu has been shifted to Middle Strait. As part of proactive measures, sufficient ration articles have been distributed among all tribes by the AAJVS.

The Director (Tribal Welfare)/ Executive Secretary, AAJVS visited the Jarawa camps to ensure prompt preparedness of the disaster plan for the safety of PVTGs. The Director also interacted with Jarawa tribes and held community awareness campaign on how to deal with the cyclonic situation. The field functionaries including

Paramedical staff of AAJVS have been kept on standby to ensure safety of tribes from anomalous situations. They have been directed to work in close co-ordination with officials of Police/Forest/ Health Departments. Boats, dinghies and vehicles have been put in place to deal with any emergency situation, a press release from Directorate of Tribal Welfare said.

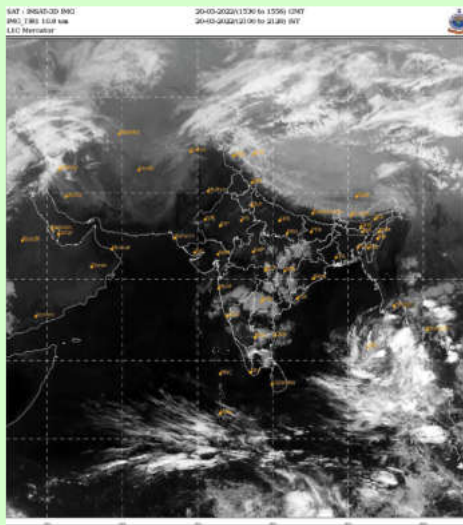

## Weather warning for A&N Coast

**Low-pressure area over Bay of Bengal & South Andaman Sea; likely to intensify into a depression and cyclonic storm**  
**Gale winds likely to prevail over A&N Islands on March 21; Local Cautionary Signal-III hoisted at Port Blair port**

Port Blair, Mar. 20  
Heavy to very heavy rain (7-20 cm) at few places with extremely heavy rain (>20 cm) at one or two places is very likely to occur over North Andaman Islands. Gale winds with speed reaching 65-75 kmph gusting to 85 kmph are very likely to prevail over Andaman and Nicobar Islands on March 21. Squally winds with speed reaching 40-50 kmph gusting to 60 kmph is likely to prevail over North Andaman Islands on March 22.



Due to depression over Southeast Bay of Bengal and adjoining South Andaman Sea and its likely intensification to cyclonic storm, fishermen have been

advised not to venture into the sea till March 22. Local Cautionary Signal-III has been hoisted at Port Blair port.

As per the Indian Meteorological Department (IMD), the impending cyclone is likely to intensify into a deep depression and cyclonic storm on 21<sup>st</sup> March, 2022. The District Administration along with all line Departments is working 24 x 7 to mitigate the impact of the impending cyclone.

In this connection, the Deputy Commissioner (SA), Shri Suneel Anchipaka, ADM (SA), AC (S) and the AC (U/T) made an inspection visit to Nayashahar and Guptapara area. They inspected the trees which may fall due to the impact of the cyclone and may cause danger to life



and property. The team interacted with the family members of those houses near which these trees are standing dangerously and he instructed the Tehsildar and his team to attend to these problems on priority. The officials

of the Forest, APWD and Fire were given instructions to cooperate in addressing these issues so that no loss to life and property is caused.

## SAFETY TIPS ON CYCLONE PREPAREDNESS

(For Cyclone, Heavy Rain, Water Logging, Flash Flood etc.)

1. Listen to radio or TV weather reports for warning & advice and be alert.
2. Identify safe shelters in your area. These should be cyclone resistant and also find the closest and safe route to reach them.
3. All your family members should know the safe routes to nearest shelter/raised pucca buildings.
4. Keep your emergency kit and basic food supply, medicines, torch and batteries etc. ready in waterproof bags. Drink preferably boiled water. Keep your food items covered.
5. Doors, windows, roof and walls should be strengthened/checked before the cyclone season through retrofitting and repairing. Store adequate foodgrains and water in safe places.
6. If your area is flood-prone, consider suitable flood resistant building materials.
7. Do not let children and pregnant woman remain empty stomach.
8. Put furniture, clothing and valuable items etc. on a higher platform so that they can be shifted safely/easily.
9. Do not use electrical appliances, which are in flood water.
10. Do not go into water of unknown depth and current.
11. Do not allow children to play in, or near flood water.
12. Do not venture into the sea if so advised. Stay Indoors under the strongest part of the house/ if not moved to the cyclone shelter.
13. Remain indoors until informed that weather has improved.
14. In case of cyclone alert, do not go out, till officially advised that it is safe. If evacuated, wait till advised to go back. Use the recommended route to return to your home. Do not rush/panic.
15. Be careful of broken/uncovered power lines, damaged roads and houses, fallen trees etc.
16. Be careful of snakes, as snake bites are common during floods.

- > Use the recommended route to return to your home. Do not rush.
- > Be careful of broken power lines, damaged roads and house, fallen trees etc.

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Check weather forecast before outdoor activities.</li> <li>• Keep ready an Emergency survival kit with important medication, dry foods etc.</li> <li>• Postpone outdoor activities and stay inside for at least 30 minutes after you last hear thunder or see lightning.</li> <li>• Avoid metal structures and get off elevated areas such as hills, mountains ridges or peaks.</li> <li>• If you are caught in an open area, act quickly to remove yourself from danger.</li> <li>• Get out of and away from ponds, lakes, and other water bodies.</li> <li>• If you are in open places, sit down by closing your ears properly with joint feet.</li> <li>• Rubber soled shoes and car tyres do not offer protection from lightning.</li> <li>• Keep away from all utility lines and objects that conduct electricity (telephone, power, metal fences, overhead wires, etc. tree and hilltops).</li> <li>• Unplug any electrical/electronic equipment/appliances such as TV, computer, fans etc. and turn off Air Conditioner well before the storm arrives.</li> <li>• Use battery operated radio for news updates.</li> <li>• Find a house, building or a car with a solid roof.</li> <li>• Stay away from broken power lines and report them immediately.</li> <li>• Help people who may require special assistance such as infants, children, women and elderly.</li> <li>• Provide immediate medical treatment if someone near you have been struck.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Do not go outside during adverse weather especially for working in agriculture field, grazing cattle, fishing and plying boats.</li> <li>• Do not take shelter under electric or telephone poles or trees.</li> <li>• Do not use metallic items and stay away from bikes.</li> <li>• Never use mobile phones during lightning.</li> <li>• Do not use umbrellas with iron rods.</li> <li>• If you are in forest area, take shelter under small and dwarf trees.</li> <li>• Do not lie on concert/marble floors and do not lean against concert walls.</li> <li>• Avoid contact with electrical equipment or cords.</li> <li>• Avoid shower, take a bath, wash dishes or use any other water source.</li> <li>• Do not swim or be close to water bodies.</li> <li>• Do not go under or near tall trees.</li> <li>• Don't lie on the ground.</li> </ul>

## India's COVID-19 vaccination coverage crosses 181 Crore 21 lakh mark

New Delhi, Mar. 20

Over 181 crore 21 lakh doses of COVID vaccines have been administered in the country under the nationwide vaccination drive so far. The Union Health and Family Welfare Ministry today said, more than 15 lakh 34 thousand COVID vaccine doses were administered to the eligible beneficiaries yesterday.

The country reported over one thousand seven hundred new COVID

cases in the last 24 hours. Currently, India's active caseload stands at over 26 thousand. Over three thousand COVID patients have recovered during the last 24 hours and the national recovery rate stands at 98.74 per cent. More than four crore 24 lakh patients have recovered from COVID-19 in the country so far. The Ministry said, more than 78 crore 26 lakh COVID-19 tests have been conducted so far.
