This enabled the transfer of an amount of more than Rs. 20,000 crore to more than 10 crore beneficiary farmer families. During the programme, Prime Minister also released equity grant of more than Rs. 14 crore to about 351 Farmer Producer Organizations (FPOs), which will benefit more than 1.24 lakh farmers. Chief Secretary inspects entire stretch from Corbyn's Cove to Flag Point

Issues instructions to make the stretch more beautiful & amiable to residents as well as tourists

Port Blair, Jan. 1

The Chief Secretary, A&N Administration, Shri Jitendra Narain inspected the entire stretch from Corbyn's Cove to Flag Point along with Secretaries, Police Officers and Engineers of PBMC and APWD last Thursday. Various instructions were given by the Chief Secretary to make the entire stretch more beautiful and amiable to the residents of Port Blair as well as tourists.

In Corbyn's Cove, directions were issued to shift the private boats so that the beach area is not damaged. Further, the floating jetty which was lying on the beach was directed to be removed. Apart from this, it was instructed that kiosks may be constructed and utilized for opening eateries. He also directed that various encroachments and illegal shops along the route and parking areas should be removed so as to send a strong message as well as to utilize the area for the local residents and tourists. Apart from the above, the Chief Secretary also observed that the land of various Departments has been left vacant. He said, all such land should be surrendered back to the Administration and utilized.

The Chief Secretary directed that wrought iron benches may be placed along the road near Corbyn's Cove so that visiting public/tourists can enjoy the scenic view. He directed the



APWD and PBMC to complete all the pending works at the earliest. Along the road, flowering plants such as mossanda were directed to be placed, which could become the hallmark of this area.

The Chief Secretary desired that various points along the route can be developed as places of recreation for the public such as areas opposite the Science Centre, Goodwill Estate, ANIIMS and next to Corbyn's Cove entrance. The development of the above areas would require landscaping, pruning of trees and removal of bushes. Further, to better utilize the natural scenery next to the sea, he directed that wherever possible, stairs should be



constructed so that the public can reach the sea from the road side.

The Chief Secretary also issued directions to PWD to construct a road along the coast from Flag Point to Hornbill Resort so that it can be developed as having various centers of activities. He directed that this road should be completed by December 2022. Directions were also issued to construct spider roads to improve the connectivity and to give a boost to the economy and tourism. To accomplish the above, Officers of Administration as well as Police were made in-charges of various areas to oversee the planning and development of the same, a press release from Secretary (APWD/PBMC) said.

Farmers' Corner- A Knowledge Hub Resolving the mystery of Cinnamon

Cinnamon or daalchini is one of the oldest known spices to the mankind. This spice has been adored for its vast applications in flavouring and pharmaceuticals. It is one of those spices which have traditionally been employed in the preparation of various formulations in Indian Systems of Medicine. It is also a component of decoctions/ kadha recommended for boosting the immunity during pandemic times by practitioners around the world. However, health benefits of this spice could be availed only when the right material is used. The true cinnamon, also known as Ceylon cinnamon is obtained from the inner bark of botanical species *Cinnamomum verum*. This spice is generally obtained after scrapping out the outer rough bark and careful peeling of inner bark, followed by hygienic drying. Good quality true cinnamon is light brown coloured produce which melts in the mouth leaving sweetish aromatic flavour. It should not be thicker than a thick paper, so it is easily breakable and is generally available in rolled form (quills). The spice is quite costly and hence is used in flavouring high value products. In contrast, most of the produce sold in the Indian markets possesses outer rough bark, is dark brown, thicker, difficult to break and pungent in taste. Most of this produce is not the real cinnamon but is actually the bark of Chinese cinnamon or cassia. Yes, so most of us who are regularly buying such produce in the name of true cinnamon could be actually buying cassia. Chinese cinnamon is known to contain higher quantities of coumarins, which are known to have health hazards and hence should be restricted in use. Planting material of superior varieties of true cinnamon can be obtained from Horticultural Plants Propagation Unit of ICAR-CIARI, Port Blair.

Benefit: Considering the availability of suitable agro-climatic conditions in the islands and good quality of produce, cinnamon cultivation could be promoted in open as well as intercrop in the existing coconut and arecanut gardens. .

The SEP scheme under DAY-NULM is focusing on financial assistance to individuals/groups of urban poor for setting up gainful self-employment ventures/micro enterprises, suits to their skills, training and aptitude. This scheme also support SHGs of urban poor to access easy credit from bank and avail interest subsidy on SHG loans and plays a major role in urban economy.

A total of 257 individual applications and 4 SHGs applications were placed before the Task Force Committee by Port Blair Municipal Council for screening and to recommend it to bankers for availing benefits of the scheme for the applicants, a press release received from PBMC said.

Union Government has said that a total of one thousand 431 cases of Omicron variant of Covid-19 have been reported so far in the country. Out of these total cases, 488 patients have already recovered and migrated. Maximum number of 454 cases have been reported from Maharashtra followed by Delhi wherein 351

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Health and Family Welfare Ministry today said, over 145 crore 16 lakh doses of COVID vaccines have been administered in the country under the national wide vaccination drive. The Ministry said, more than 58 lakh 11 thousand Covid

vaccine doses were administered in the last 24 hours to the beneficiaries.

said that they used to do this work earlier also, but now there work is being recognized. "This year we will complete 75 years of our independence. This is the time to start a new vibrant journey of the country's resolves, to move forward with renewed vigour", he said. Elaborating on the power of collective effort, the Prime Minister pointed out "when 130 crore Indians take one step, it is not merely one step but it amounts to 130 crore steps."

Speaking about economy, the Prime Minister said that on many parameter, Indian economy is looking better than pre-COVID days. He pointed out that "today the growth rate of our economy is more than 8%. Record foreign investment has come to India. Our forex reserves have reached record levels. Old records have also been surpassed in GST collection. We have also set new records in the matter of exports, especially in agriculture." He said that in 2021 transaction of more than 70 lakh crore rupees was done on UPI. More than 50 thousand start-ups are working in India out of these 10 thousand came up during last six months.

Year 2021, the Prime Minister said, was also the year of strengthening India's cultural heritage. It was an year of optimism for the Matra-Shakti also. Sainik Schools were opened for girls along with the doors of National Defence Academy. In the year just gone by, attempts were initiated for raising marriage age for girls be raised to 21, equal to boys. Indian sports persons also brought glory to the nation in 2021. India is making unprecedented investment in the sporting infrastructure of the country, the Prime Minister informed.

Leading the world against climate change, India has also set a target of Net Zero Carbon Emission in front of the world by 2070. Many records of renewable energy, the Prime Minister said, are being met by India before time. Today India is working on hydrogen mission, taking lead in electric vehicles, he pointed out. The Prime Minister continued and said that PM Gatishakti National Master Plan is going to give a new edge to the pace of infrastructure construction in the country. "Giving new dimensions to Make in India, the country has implemented ambitious plans for new sectors like chip manufacturing, semiconductor", he added.

The Prime Minister summarized the mood of today's India saying "devoting to the nation with the spirit of 'Nation First', is becoming the sentiment of every Indian today. And that is why, today there is unity in our efforts and in our resolutions. There is impatience for accomplishment. Today there is consistency in our policies and farsightedness in our decisions."

The Prime Minister said that PM Kisan Samman Nidhi is a big support for India's farmers. If we include today's transfer, more than 1.80 lakh crore rupees have been transferred directly to the accounts of the farmers, he said. The Prime Minister said that through FPO's small farmers are feeling the power of collective strength. He pointed out five benefits of FPOs for small farmers. These benefits are increased bargaining power, scale, innovation, risk management and adaptability to the market conditions. Keeping in mind the benefits of FPO's the government is promoting them at every level. These FPOs are getting help of upto 15 lakh rupees. As a result, FPOs like Organic FPOs, Oil Seed FPOs, Bamboo clusters and Honey FPOs are coming up all over the country. "Today our farmers are benefitting from the schemes like 'One District One Products' and markets, both nation and global, are opening for them", the Prime Minister said. He said that reliance on imports is being reduced by schemes like National Palm Oil Mission with a budget of 11 thousand crore rupees.

The Prime Minister talked about the milestones that were achieved in the agriculture sector in the recent years. Food grain production touched 300 million tonnes, similarly Horticulture and floriculture production reached 330 million tonnes. Milk production also increased almost 45 per cent in last 6-7 years. About 60 lakh hectare land was brought under micro irrigation; more than 1 lakh crore were given in compensation under Prime Minister Fasal BimaYojna, whereas premium received was just 21 thousand crores. Ethanol production increased from 40 crore litres to 340 crore litres in just seven years. The Prime Minister also informed about the Goberdhan Scheme to promote bio-gas. If there will be value in cow dung, he said, the non milatching animals will not be burden on farmers. The Government has established Kaamdhenu Commission and is strengthening dairy sector infrastructure.

The Prime Minister once again pushed for promotion of natural farming. He said that chemical-free farming is a major way of protecting the health of soil. Natural farming is a key step in this direction, he said. He asked for making every farmer aware of the processes and benefits of natural farming. The Prime Minister concluded by calling upon the farmers to keep on doing innovation in farming and support the movement like cleanliness.

She further stressed that organic farming practices reduces human and animal health hazards by reducing level of residues in the product and helps to preserve the fragile ecosystem.

Dr. Y. Ramakrishna, Head urged the participants to create more awareness on organic agricultural practices of organic matter recycling, enrichment of organic manures by use of bio fertilizers and management of pest through plant extracts.

Experts Dr. N.Bommayasamy, Course Director, Dr. Kiruba Shankar, Dr. B.K.Nanda, Dr. Zacharia George, Dr. Pooja Kapoor and Dr. Nitu Sindhu also addressed the trainees and interacted with them about importance of organic farming, sustainable agricultural practices for organic fruits, vegetables, spices and tuber crops production, organic nutrient, pest and disease management of field and horticultural crops, organic fish production, water budgeting and homestead gardening. A total of 15 in-service candidates from Department of Agriculture, Fisheries and Rural Development and Block Development Officers, Ferrargunj and Protharpur block participated, a press release from KVK, CIARI said.

needs to develop to ensure continuous and lifelong learning. He also reinforced that the habit of reading, if inculcated at an early age, helps in brain development and enhances imagination and provide a conducive learning environment for children.

Shri Pradhan emphasised that reading is the foundation of learning, which motivates students to read books independently, develops creativity, critical thinking, vocabulary and the ability to express both verbally and in writing. It helps children to relate to their surroundings and real life situation, he added. COVID-19 status in A&N Islands

3 positive cases detected during RT-PCR test conducted on flight passengers

Port Blair, Jan. 1

During the RT-PCR test conducted on 401 flight passengers who arrived here yesterday, 3 positive cases have been detected. Today, 15 flights with 2455 passengers arrived, out of which, 1925 were vaccinated with both doses while RT-PCR test was conducted on 522 passengers (includes 36 international travellers) and the reports are awaited.

During RAT conducted on 111 passengers bound for North & Middle

Andaman at Ferrargunj, all were found negative. At Mohanpura Bus Terminus, test was conducted on 37 passengers and all were found negative. At Phoenix Bay Jetty, 5 passengers were tested with RAT and all were found negative. At Helipad, test was conducted on 1 passenger and was found negative.

Today, till 3 pm 63 eligible beneficiaries were vaccinated out of which 54 were in the age group of 18-44 years, a press release from DHS said.

Madam,

Under the instructions of my client named above, in addition to replying the legal notice sent by you to my client, I am to write to you as follows:

1. Contents of para 1 of your notice dated 30.03.2021 is not disputed.
2. Contents of para 2 of your notice is not accepted as you never expressed to my client about your alleged financial need. It is a fact that you offered to sell the land in question to my client for a sale consideration of Rs. 28 lakhs and my client accepted the same. It is further stated to you that on 12.04.2018 a sale agreement was entered between you and my client whereby you agreed to sell land bearing Survey No. 354/5 measuring 0.5460 hectares, classified as paddy land situated at Namunagar village, under Ferrargunj Tehsil, South Andaman for a total sale consideration of Rs. 28,00,000/-. My client paid an advance of Rs. 2,00,000/- to you vide cheque dated 19.04.2018. On your subsequent demands, my client paid altogether Rs. 11 lakhs to you including the advance amount. Rs. 2 lakhs was paid on 19.04.2018, Rs. 2 lakhs on 10.09.2018, Rs. 1 lakh on 24.01.2019, Rs. 1 lakh on 24.01.2019, Rs. 2,50,000/- on 08.03.2019 and Rs. 2,50,000/- on 29.03.2019. Though it was mentioned in the agreement that balance consideration amount of Rs. 26,00,000/- shall be paid at the time of registration of sale deed, on your demand my client paid Rs. 9 lakhs more vide different cheques of different dates in addition to Rs. 2 lakhs. Subsequently you handed over documents required for registration of sale deed to my client, sale deed was duly prepared and submitted to the Sub-Registrar Office for Registration.
