

## Despite reopening of Dairy Farm junction road, no respite from traffic snarls



Port Blair, Sept 12: Despite opening of roads at Dairy Farm junction, leading from Junglighat PO to Lambaline for vehicles, traffic chaos is far from over. Motorists complain that during any busy day, it takes about one hour for their



vehicles to cross this junction. Choked junctions, bumper-to-bumper traffic and complete chaos on this road is a common sight for road users. Even as the traffic congestion has reached an abysmal proportion on this road, the Traffic Department is yet to come out with a good solution. Lack of coordination between traffic Police and APWD has been contributing to the traffic snarls on this road. To add to the woes, this stretch of road is in a dismal condition. With rain eroding the little bitumen that was left, the condition of this road has gone from bad to worse.

The massive traffic chaos and abysmal conditions of this road is giving the daily commuter a headache besides playing havoc with the suspension of his vehicle.

Motorists complain that they use that route many times in a day and these potholes are frustrating. They also cause all traffic to slow down here which leads to further delay. The road was in a better condition before the repair work was started, but it has now become a hell. The motorists who have been waiting for the opening of this road said that it is very unfortunate and sorry state of affairs that this road

After remaining closed for over six months, the reopening of this road provided the much needed relief to the motorists. Due to closure of this road, for over three to four months, vehicular traffic was diverted to the Vijay Baugh road

resulting in a lot of inconvenience to the motorists as this area witnessed heavy rush during the peak hours. After the completion of the culvert project, vehicular traffic was allowed on this road. But the increasing population of vehicles and the dismal road conditions has been causing a lot of inconvenience to the motorists. Now motorists have demanded that movement of heavy vehicles and buses should be stopped on this road. Heavy vehicles and buses should be asked to ply in the alternate road via Vijay Baugh road. As only light vehicles should be allowed to ply in this Dairy Farm junction road to ease the rush of vehicles on this road.

## MP demands extension of last date for submitting application for seat distribution in Mainland Colleges

Port Blair, Sept 12: Referring to a recent press note by the Development Section IV of the Secretariat wherein the Education Department invited applications for seats, reserved for students of A&N Islands in the mainland institutions for the academic session 2021-2022, the Member of Parliament has requested the Lt. Governor to extend the last date for submitting applications.

In a letter addressed to the Lt. Governor, the MP mentioned that in view of the limited avenues of higher education in the islands, every year the Government of India and various State Governments, Universities and Institutions allocate seats for the students of A&N Islands in various Professional, Technical and Non-Technical courses. The Member of Parliament pointed out that though the last date for submission of online forms was August 30, 2021, a large number of students could not fill the forms within that date due to extremely bad internet in rural pockets, especially in the Inter Islands. Apart from this, another reason for not filling the form is that the result of NATS was declared on Sept 8 and of JEE phase 4 on Sept 10, 2021.

He said that this is the reason why a lot of good students have not filled the forms for the mainland institution seats. There are 272 seats that will be distributed through this process. Under these circumstances, the MP requested the Lt. Governor to instruct the Education Department to extend the dates by a week, i.e. from September 13 to 19, 2021 so that all those who qualified in different entrance tests may get an opportunity to get a seat in the Government Colleges on the mainland, as distributed by the A&N Administration.

### People back to work

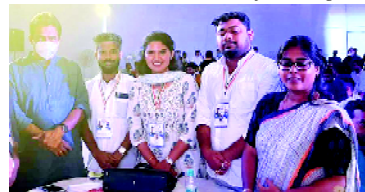
It seems like yesterday when, as most working people suffered salary losses and professional precarity, and tried to thread the needle of "work-life balance" while being trapped at home, tech companies across the world were celebrating "the new normal". Now, the biggest IT giants in the world—who saw their profits soar in the last two years as the demand for digital products and services soared—are facing a bit of an HR problem. It turns out that there is no normal any more when it comes to workplaces. And since Silicon Valley set the template for work-from-home during the early days of the Covid-19 pandemic, how it deals with return-to-office will be closely watched. While many companies have decided to postpone return to office until next year, others—including Zoom—are trying to come up with some sort of hybrid model. After all, for the longest time, tech companies promoted the idea that innovation was significantly accelerated by informal interactions in professional settings. This is why the offices of Google and Facebook provide recreational activities for their employees. Unfortunately, two years on, most workers have gotten used to the rhythm of working from home and the old theory of "office breeds innovation" has fewer and fewer takers. The problem, really, is this: The new normal has indeed become normal. Struggling through domesticity while trying to be professional certainly took a toll and now that the challenge has been overcome, the long commutes to work don't look all that inviting. In fact, even for the bottom line, it's likely cheaper to pass on the overheads of running workspaces—electricity, canteens, etc.—to the worker. Why, then, many are asking, should they return to work, especially given the fear around the Delta variant? Some sociologists have a cynical answer: It's the managers who need workers, not the other way around. After all, if the office is empty, what's the point of being the boss?

### Vaccination drive continuing smoothly in A & N Islands

Port Blair, Sept 12: The vaccination drive is continuing smoothly in A&N Islands. As per data available, a total of 3,83,786 beneficiaries have been vaccinated so far in A&N Islands, out of the target beneficiaries of 2,81,603 (approx.). A total of 21,544 people were vaccinated yesterday in A&N Islands. A total of 15,028 eligible people in the age group of 18 to 44 years have been vaccinated till date 11-09-2021. 1388 beneficiaries were vaccinated in South Andaman District, out of which 670 beneficiaries were in the age group of 18-44 years. Similarly, 392 beneficiaries were vaccinated in North & Middle Andaman District out of which 260 beneficiaries were in the age group of 18-44. 374 beneficiaries were vaccinated in Nicobar District, out of which 39 beneficiaries were in the age group of 18-44 years.

# CHANDRAYAAN-2 ORBITER PAYLOADS MADE DISCOVERY-CLASS FINDINGS, SAYS ISRO

The observations of the Chandrayaan-2 orbiter payloads have yielded discovery-class findings, according to the Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO).

There were eight scientific payloads hosted on the orbiter craft. They are: Chandrayaan-2 Large Area Soft X-ray Spectrometer (CLASS), Solar X-ray Monitor (KSM), Chandra's Atmospheric Composition Explorer 2 (CHACE2), Dual Frequency Synthetic Aperture Radar (DFSAR), Imaging Infra-Red Spectrometer (IIRS), Terrain Mapping Camera (TMC 2), Orbiter High Resolution Camera (OHRC), and Dual Frequency Radio Science (DFRS) experiment.

Earlier this week, ISRO opened up its scientific discussions on Lunar Science to the people of the country, to engage the Indian academia, institutes, students, and people from all disciplines and walks of life, in the form of a two-day 'Lunar Science Workshop & Release of Chandrayaan-2 Data'.

The workshop commemorated the completion of two years of the Chandrayaan-2 orbiter in the lunar orbit. The events were conducted in a virtual mode. ISRO Chairman and Secretary in the Department of Space (DoS) K Sivan inaugurated the workshop and released the documents on Chandrayaan-2 science results and data products for utilisation by the scientific community.



"The lunar workshop delivered the big news of bunch of discovery-class findings by Chandrayaan-2," the Bengaluru headquartered India's national space agency said.

The mass spectrometer CHACE-2, in its pursuit to conduct first-ever in-situ study of the composition of the lunar neutral exosphere from a polar orbital platform, detected and studied the variability of the Argon-40 at the middle and higher latitudes of the Moon, depicting the radiogenic activities in the mid and higher latitudes of the Lunar interior, it said.

The discovery of Chromium and Manganese on the lunar surface, which are available in trace quantities, by the CLASS payload was announced. The observations of microclimates of the Sun, during the quiet-Sun period, which provide important clues on the coronal heating problem of the Sun, were made by the XSM payload.

The first-ever unambiguous detection of the hydration features of the Moon was achieved by Chandrayaan-2 with its infra-red spectrometer payload IIRS, which captured clear signatures of Hydroxyl and water-ice on the lunar surface, ISRO said.

The DFSAR instrument could study the subsurface features of the Moon, detected signatures of the subsurface water-ice, and achieved high resolution mapping of the lunar

morphological features in the polar regions, it was stated.

"The observations (of Chandrayaan-2 orbiter payloads) have been yielding intriguing scientific results, which are being published in peer-reviewed journals and presented in international meetings," Sivan said.

Chandrayaan-2, ISRO said, has the feat of imaging the Moon from 100 km lunar orbit with "best-ever" achieved resolution of 25 cm with its OHRC.

The TMC 2 of Chandrayaan-2, which is conducting imaging of the Moon at a global scale, has found interesting geologic signatures of lunar crustal shortening, and identification of volcanic domes, the ISRO said.

The DFRS experiment onboard Chandrayaan-2 has studied the ionosphere of the Moon, which is generated by the solar photo-ionisation of the neutral species of the lunar tenuous exosphere, it was noted.

The science data archived in Indian Space Science Data Centre (ISSDC) at Bylalu, near here, are being disseminated to public through its 'PRADAN' portal. The questions received from the academia, institutes and students were addressed by the ISRO scientists during the two-day deliberations. A panel discussion provided the opportunity to academia, institutes and students to interact with the ISRO scientists on lunar science and Chandrayaan-2, ISRO said.

Chandrayaan-2 is the second

spacecraft in the Indian series of Lunar exploration satellites. It comprised an orbiter, lander named Vikram and rover named Pragyan to explore the unexplored South Polar region of the Moon. It was launched on July 22, 2019 from the Sriharikota spaceport by GSVLV Mk-III. It was inserted into a lunar orbit on August 20, 2019, with firing of thrusters on the orbiter.

The orbiter and lander modules were separated as two independent satellites on September 2, 2019.

Later, Vikram lander's descent was as planned and normal performance was observed up to an altitude of 2.1 km from Lunar surface on September seven, 2019. Subsequently, communication from the lander with the six-wheeled Pragyan rover accommodated inside it was lost and the lander had a hard landing on the lunar surface.

A successful soft-landing would have made India the fourth country after the erstwhile Soviet Union, the United States, and China to do so, according to ISRO officials.

The orbiter, placed in its intended orbit around the Moon, will enrich our understanding of the Moon's evolution and mapping of minerals and water molecules in polar regions, using its eight advanced scientific instruments, according to ISRO. The precise launch and optimised mission management have ensured a long life of almost seven years for the orbiter instead of the planned one year, it said.

## Twin trainings conducted by KVK Port Blair



Port Blair, Sept 12: ICAR-Central Island Agricultural Research Institute, Kishu Vigy an Kendra, Port Blair conducted two training programs on "Design and construction of cost effective poly house" and "Quality planting materials production techniques on fruit crops production" from 8<sup>th</sup> to 10<sup>th</sup> September, 2021 at Ferrargun Gram Panchayat and Shoal Bay Gram Panchayat at hall, under Ferrargun block, at total of 50 farmers and farm women were benefited. During the trainings Experts from KVK, CIARI elaborated different types of poly houses suitable for the farming communities of these islands and the structural design procedure of construction of a cost effective poly house made with the locally available material and also highlighted the recent advances in design of poly house including the green house, automation for irrigation, installation of drip and sprinkler irrigation system inside poly house and various climatic factor control mechanisms and also interacted about the cropping schedule for various crops grown inside a naturally ventilated poly house, different processes involved in poly house cultivation including soil fumigation, bed preparation and biofertilizer application, insect pests and crop residue management. On the second training demonstration cum interaction with the trainees about the need of production of quality planting materials of fruit crops for achieving sustainability in fruit production in these islands and also described the different processes involved in plant propagation involving sexual and asexual methods with their advantages and disadvantages, media for preparation of plants in nursery, potting and repotting, selection and raising of root stocks, selection criteria of scion stocks, preparation of plant material for potting. The trainings were conducted under the active guidance of Dr. Eaknath B. Chakurkar, Director, ICAR-CIARI, Port Blair.

# GAS IMPORTER PETRONET PLANS FLOATING TERMINAL ON ODISHA COAST

Petronet LNG Ltd, India's largest gas importer, is looking to reclaim the lost opportunities of the past decades as it seeks to set up a floating LNG import facility on the east coast.

Oil Secretary Tarun Kapoor, who is also the chairman of Petronet, in the firm's latest annual report said the company is looking at setting up a floating terminal at Gopalpur port in Odisha and "is embarking upon a major diversification drive to broaden its business activity and is exploring to have an ethane/propane import facility at Dahej terminal".

Petronet had some years back planned to set up a terminal at Gangavaram in Andhra Pradesh for import of supercooled gas in ships. The company management stopped pursuing that terminal in 2015-16 on grounds that there isn't enough demand to justify a 5 million tonnes/year import facility.

Gangavaram would have been the first terminal on the east coast as Petronet owns and operates facilities at Dahej in Gujarat and Kochi in Kerala.

Soon after that, Adani Group began work to set up a 5 million tonnes/year import terminal at Dhamra port in Odisha.

Petronet now sees that there is demand for gas in the eastern region and despite the Dhamra LNG terminal, it is now looking for a facility at Gopalpur, a source said.

Similarly, the company is trying to recapture the lost opportunity in the petrochemical sector.

Petronet's long-term contract for import of liquefied natural gas (LNG) from Qatar provided for supply of 5 million tonnes a year of rich gas or gas containing ethane and propane, compounds used to make petrochemicals.

That rich gas was supplied to Oil and Natural Gas Corp (ONGC), which, after

stripping it of ethane and propane, re-supplies to Petronet for onward sale to power plants, fertilizer units and other customers.

The source said ONGC uses the rich gas at its petrochemical plant to make value-added chemicals.

Now, Petronet is looking to use the same model.

Petronet "has also planned for setting up of a petrochemical complex based on imported propane at Dahej LNG Terminal", Kapoor said in the annual report. "The foray into petrochemicals would be a forward integration of our strategy as the same planned to get synchronised with our upcoming third jetty project and available land bank at Dahej."

secretary, Ministry of Petroleum and Natural Gas.

Kapoor said Petronet is exploring the possible business opportunities from harnessing the cold energy from its re-gasification terminals at Dahej and Kochi.

"Harnessing LNG's cold energy not only maximises re-gasification terminals' potential but also offers an opportunity to cut emissions in the cold warehousing chain, simultaneously adding value and improving energy efficiency," he said.

After establishing a presence in the southern and western parts of the country, Petronet is now planning to set up a floating LNG terminal at Gopalpur port in Odisha with a view to establishing its presence on the eastern coast of India, he said.

"The LNG terminal will help meet the increasing gas demand of the eastern and central part of the country," he said.

He added that Petronet has already completed the pre-project studies and is in process of preparing the detailed feasibility

report (DFR) for 4 million tonnes per annum floating storage and re-gasification (FSRU) terminal, followed by a pre-feasibility report for a 5 million tonnes land-based terminal in future. Petronet, he said, "has signed MoU (memorandum of understanding) with Gopalpur Ports Ltd and is in discussion with them to finalise the key technical and commercial terms of the agreement". Without giving investment details or timelines for the project implementation, he said the firm is in process of obtaining the final investment decision for the project.

Dahej terminal is the largest import facility in the country, with a nameplate capacity of 17.5 million tonnes per annum. Kochi terminal has a 5 million tonnes nameplate capacity but it operates at a fraction of capacity in absence of pipelines to take the fuel to customers.

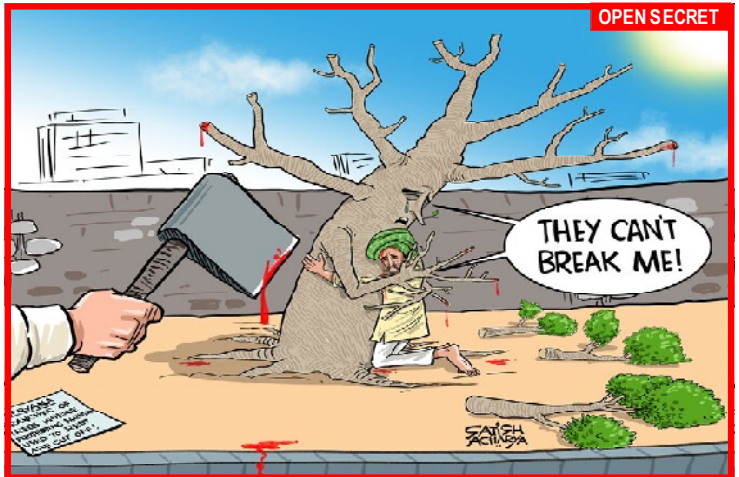


He, however, did not give details of the planned petrochemical complex including investment and size of the plant.

Petrochemicals—made using crude and natural gas as feedstock—form raw material for plastics, packaging material and personal care products. In terms of volume, the petrochemical market in India stood at 42.50 million tonnes and is estimated to reach 49.62 million tonnes by 2025, expanding at a compound annual growth rate (CAGR) of 6.14 per cent between FY 2021 and FY 2025.

Using ethane, plastics and detergents can be made, while propane can give plastic.

Petronet is 50 per cent owned by state-owned refiners Indian Oil Corp (IOC) and Bharat Petroleum Corp Ltd (BPCL), gas utility GAIL (India) Ltd and oil and gas producer ONGC. The four companies sit on the board of the company, which is headed by the
