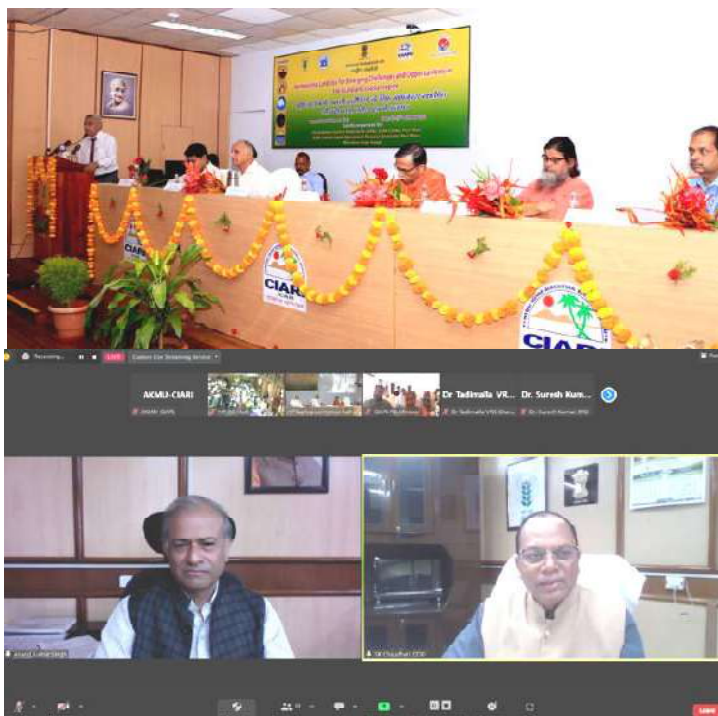

National Symposium by Andaman Science Association, CIARI and Bharatiya Kisan Sanghgets underway

Port Blair, Oct 12: A two day National Symposium on "Harmonizing Land Use for Emerging Challenges and Opportunities in the Island and Coastal Region" jointly organized by the Andaman Science Association (ASA), ICAR-Central Island Agricultural Research Institute (CIARI), Port Blair and Bharatiya Kisan Sanghgot inaugurated today at Dr. T. R. Dutta conference hall, Garacharma Research Complex of ICAR-CIARI, Port Blair.

Speaking on the occasion the Chief Guest Dr. A. K. Singh, Deputy Director General, (Horticulture Science), ICAR, New Delhi, appreciated the efforts taken by the ICAR-CIARI, Port Blair, and the association in conducting the National Symposium addressing the five most vital component of the nature (Air, Water, Fire Earth and the Space) i.e. Panchmahabhoot. Russia's recent wave of attacks on Ukraine may have violated the laws of war and would amount to war crimes if civilians were deliberately targeted, the United Nations said Tuesday.

"These strikes may have violated the principles of the conduct of hostilities under international humanitarian law," Ravina Shamdasani, a spokes-



woman for the UN human rights office, told reporters in Geneva, adding that intention-

all existing labour laws with a view to deny even the basic rights of working class. If these Labour Codes are implemented, among other things, workers have to work 12 hours per day instead of the present 8 hours.

He called upon the delegates attending the CITU Conference to educate the working class to support the Left candidates in the Parliament and local body elections in the islands.

He further said that privatization, contractorisation and outsourcing of government work have become the policy of the BJP government. He said that world over; the working class is facing difficulties created by the ruling capitalist parties. He expressed confidence that a joint movement by farmers and mazdoors will definitely throw away the autocratic and corporate-friendly Modi government in the next Lok Sabha election.

Mr. D. Ayyappan, Secretary, CPI (M) State Secretary while addressing the CITU Zonal Conference called upon the workers to strengthen the CITU to fight for their genuine

President Droupadi Murmu unveils first National Law University centre in Tripura

President Droupadi Murmu on Wednesday inaugurated the newly-built Tripura judicial academy and unveiled a model of the Tripura's first National Law University to mark her maiden visit to the state after assuming office.

On the first day of her visit, President Murmu also interacted with authorities and workers of the Central Tea Processing Factory at Durgabari Tea Estate, nearly 20 km from state capital Agartala.

The President is also expected to virtually inaugurate a newly-built MLA hostel and launch a bunch of projects from Rabindra Shatabarshiki Bhawan before attending an event at the Agartala townhall in the evening.

On Thursday, she is scheduled to inaugurate two passenger trains, including the extension of Guwahati-Kolkata Express from Agartala and the



Agartala-Jiribam-Agartala Jan Shatabdi Express till Manipur's Thangsang. Later, she will visit Tripurasundari temple in Gomati district and then head to Assam. Meanwhile, the CPM declared a boycott of her event alleging that their leaders and activists were assaulted under the Bharatiya Janata Party regime since 2018. "Different programmes were organised including a civic reception on the occasion of visit of President Droupadi Murmu on October 12. CPM state secretary, incumbent legis-

lators and former parliamentarians were invited for the event. We welcome her but decided to boycott the event," a press communique signed by CPM state secretary Jitendra Chaudhury read. "There has been no rule of law in the state since the last four-and-a-half years. There are constant attacks on personal freedom and civic rights... We hope that the President will get to witness the real situation in the state and will take initiatives to revive rights of the citizens," the CPM circular further stated.

'Kerala human sacrifice accused, once CPI(M) worker, likely influenced by wife'

The ruling Communist Party of India (Marxist) on Wednesday said the one of the key accused in Kerala human sacrifice case could have been influenced by his wife. The killing of two women in an alleged case of human sacrifice in Kerala's Pathanamthitta has sent shockwaves across the nation.

The CPI(M)-area committee secretary, Pathanamthitta, said that one of the accused, Bhagaval Singh, who was once a worker of the party, but not a member might have been influenced by his wife to commit the crime. "He (Bhagwal Singh) was once a progressive man. After his second marriage, he became a religious person. It might be the influence of his wife (Laila)," the CPI(M) area secretary added.

Pradeep, CPI(M)-Area Commmtt.Secy, Pathanamthitta on 'Human sacrifice' case accused Bhagwal Singh.

Singh, his wife Laila and one Mohammad Shafi are the key accused in the killing of the two women - P Padma and Roselie, who worked as lottery ticket sellers - for prosperity. Roselie was a native of Kalady while P Padma was from Kadavanthara. Both the victims were in their early 50s.

Shafi, the main accused, was involved in many criminal cases and was accused of sexually assaulting a 75-year-old woman in Kolencherry Pathanamthitta two years ago, according to police. This latest incident started eight months ago when Shafi put out an advertisement in a local newspaper where he could conduct rituals that made people rich. Singh and Laila saw the advertisement and responded. As time passed, Shafi became close to the couple and convinced them that a human sacrifice would settle their financial issues and bring prosperity

to their lives.

In June, Shafi first lured Roseile to come to the couple's house for some work. She was tied to a bed and murdered on June 6 and her body parts were buried in the courtyard of their house. When the couple complained to Shafi that there was no improvement in their situation even after the killing, Shafi convinced them that another human sacrifice had to be done to get rid of a curse that had befallen them. Shafi then brought Padma to the couple's house on September 26. She was murdered too and her body parts were buried in the courtyard of the house. Singh, Laila and Mohammad Shafi have been sent to 14-day judicial custody. Addressing a press conference, Kochi city police commissioner CH Nagaraju said that Shafi is the main conspirator in the case. "Prime accused Shafi is a pervert. We're investigating whether there are more accused and if more such cases have happened," Nagaraju said, adding body parts of the two victims have been found.

dences of the region.

As per report, a number of buses of the STS Unit, Rangat is under inoperative condition and which in turn is compromising its service. "The STS buses are outdated, most of the buses are with roof leakages and water drips from the roof of the buses in rainy season while seats are in cruelly broken condition that are not all seating worthy, in fact, we have to undergo nightmarish experiences on board the STS buses", a passenger lamented.

Breakdown of STS buses is a common issue in Rangat area. Passengers travelling by these buses have to face great difficulties in such events, they bemoaned.

In fact, the same is the condition of the bus service of the other STS Units at

Nimbudera, Bakultala Billiground, Kadamtala and Mayabunder

the passengers of N & M Andaman, rued.

When contacted, an official of the STS Department said that the buses are no doubt a little old but the condition of the ATR Road is so bad that the STS buses are getting damaged soon after their repair.

As per norms, a bus after its maiden launch should fairly run 04 Lakhs Kilometer in its maximal capacity, while most of the buses have overrun of its limit by 6 more lakhs km and this is one of the prime reasons of this situation, the official further revealed.
