New Delhi, Jan. 31

He said, the most important resolution related to this foundation is the creation of inclusive and self-reliant India.

Addressing the joint sitting of both the Houses of Parliament today, the President lauded the various schemes and initiatives of the Government for the welfare of people. He said, India has once again become one of the fastest growing

economies of the world due to relentless efforts of the Government. He said, India has attracted 48 billion dollar worth of investment in the first seven months of the current financial year and the global investors are assured of India's development. He said, Goods and Service Tax collection has consistently remained above one lakh crore rupees during the last several months.

He said, India's foreign exchange reserves exceeded 630 billion dollars and the country's exports are also growing rapidly, breaking several past records. He said, the Government has launched 14 key

Production Linked Incentive schemes with an outlay of more than one lakh 97 thousand crore rupees to fully realize the potential of the manufacturing sector and to create new opportunities for the youth. He also said, these PLI schemes will

not only help transform India as a global manufacturing hub but also create over 60 lakh jobs. Stressing on the role of MSMEs in India's prosperity, he said, they have been the backbone of the country's economy and a driver of Atmanirbhar Bharat.

The President pointed out that infrastructure is the foundation for development in any country. He said, investment in infrastructure not only generates lakhs of new jobs, but also facilitates ease of doing business

Port Blair, Jan. 31

Shri Suneel Anchipaka, Director, Panchayat and Municipal Elections conducted an all political party meeting at the Conference Hall of the Office of the Deputy Commissioner, South Andaman.

The DPME, A & N Islands Election briefed the party representatives that the Election Commission for UTs intends to hold General Elections in constituencies of all Gram Panchayats (except Gram Panchayats of Netaji Nagar and Hutbay), Panchayat Samities, Zilla Parishad, South Andaman and Zilla Parishad, North and Middle Andaman and all wards of Port Blair Municipal Council, the



notification of which shall be issued on 4th of February, 2022 by the Administrator of the Union Territory of Andaman and Nicobar Islands.

It was further informed that with the Model Code of Conduct has been enforced from the date of announcement of election schedule by the Election Commission and shall be operational till the process of election is over and further requested all to

abide by the principles embodied in the Model Code of Conduct and also to respect and observe it in its letter and spirit. It was briefed that the complete set of Electoral rolls may be collected from the Office of the Director, Panchayat and Municipal Elections on 04.02.2022. Flat Bay Water Supply Scheme - Sustainable water supply to Port Blair Municipal Area, Mithakhari, Chouldari & Namunaghar

Plans afoot for construction of embankment from Tapping Point on Mithakhari side to Flat Bay through Oyster Island

Geo Technical Investigation of the Project begins; estimated to yield 65 MLD of water

Port Blair, Jan. 31

Flat Bay Water Supply Scheme has been planned as a long-term project for sustainable water supply to Port Blair Municipal Area as well as the adjoining areas of Mithakhari, Chouldari and Namunaghar. It is planned to construct an embankment from Tapping Point on Mithakhari side to Flat Bay through Oyster Island. A spillway is planned over Oyster Island. Construction of embankment shall prevent drainage of runoff water from various streams like Dhanikhari, Chouldari, Bachhra Pahar, Port Mout Nallah to sea. This water shall be stored in the reservoir for public use after technical investigations for existing runoff during



monsoon, saline water in the reservoir shall be replaced with fresh runoff water over a period of two years.

M/s WAPCOS Ltd., Pune has been engaged as consultant for the project. On 30.01.2022, the consultant has begun geo-technical investigations for this work. The agency



concerned has started first boring at B-2 location. It is expected that the agency shall be able to complete EIA report is under boring at proposed 20 finalization. Once CRZ locations within 1.5 months' mapping is completed, period. Samples from boring proposal for EIA and CRZ shall simultaneously be sent to laboratory for submitted for this project. Survey projects 8-8.5 GDP growth for FY 2022-23

New Delhi, Jan. 31

India will witness GDP growth of 8 to 8.5 per cent in 2022-23, supported by widespread vaccine coverage, gains from supply-side reforms and easing of regulations, robust export growth, and

availability of fiscal space to ramp up capital spending.

Finance Minister, Smti Nirmala Sitharaman tabled the Economic Survey 2021-22 in Parliament on Monday, which states that the year ahead is

well poised for a pick-up in private sector investment with the financial system in a good position to provide support to the revival of economy. The growth projection for 2022-23 is based on the assumption that there will be no further debilitating pandemic related economic disruption, monsoon will be normal, withdrawal of global liquidity by major central banks will be broadly orderly. Referring to First Advance Estimates, the Survey states that the Indian economy is estimated to grow by 9.2 per cent in real terms in 2021-22, after a contraction of 7.3 per cent in 2020-21. Dwelling on the sectoral aspects, the Survey states that Agriculture and allied sectors have been the least impacted by the pandemic and the sector is expected to grow by 3.9 per cent in 2021-22 after growing by 3.6 per cent in the previous year. In the current year, food grains production for the Kharif season is estimated to post a record level of 150.5 million tonnes. (Source: india.gov.in)

and promotes economic activities. He said the Government has integrated different Ministries to work in a synergised manner under the Pradhan Mantri Gatishakti National Master Plan to accelerate infrastructure development.

Talking about India's efforts during the COVID-19 pandemic, the President said, the vaccination programme has proved India's capabilities in the fight against it. He said, the country has crossed the milestone of administering more than 150 crore vaccine doses in less than a year. More than 90 percent of adult citizens in the country have received the first dose of the vaccine, while more than 70 percent have received both the doses. He said, indigenous vaccines are playing a vital role in making the whole world free from the pandemic and saving the lives of crores of people. He lauded the contributions of health and frontline workers in the fight against the COVID-19 pandemic.

Highlighting the various initiatives of the Government, the President said, Pradhan Mantri Ayushman Bharat Health Infrastructure Mission will not only help in meeting the present health needs, but also prepare the country for any crises situation in future. He said, due to the sensitive policies of the Government, now health services are easily accessible to the common man in the country. More than 80 thousand Health and Wellness Centers are functional and crores of Ayushman Bharat cards have helped the poor. He added that the Government has reduced the cost of treatment by making medicines available at affordable prices through more than eight thousand Jan Aushadhi Kendras.

Reiterating the Government's mantra of Antyodaya, he said, the Government is giving free ration every month to all the poor under the Pradhan Mantri Garib Kalyan Anna Yojana. He said, Jan Dhan-Aadhaar-Mobile (JAM) trinity has empowered citizens. He said, crores of beneficiaries have got the benefit of direct cash transfer during the pandemic due to the connectivity of more than 44 crore poor countrymen with the banking system.

Talking about the success of Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojana, the President said, more than two crore pucca houses have been provided to the poor under the scheme. He said, Jal Jeevan Mission has started making a big difference in the lives of the people. Shri Kovind said, the Government is working relentlessly to empower the rural economy and the farmers of the country and the Government has made a record government procurement of food grains. He said, the country's agricultural exports have also increased at a record level due to the efforts of the Government. He said, agriculture exports have registered a growth of more than 25 percent in the year 2020-21. He highlighted that more than 11 crore farmer families received one lakh 80 thousand crore rupees under the PM-KISAN scheme. He said, in order to ensure remunerative prices to farmers for their crops, it is necessary that their products reach the right market. In this direction, the Government has endeavoured to open new avenues of prosperity for the farmers by launching Kisan Rail Seva. He said, the Government is also making investments for developing infrastructure near farmlands. He added, thousands of projects have been approved under the Agriculture Infrastructure Fund with the corpus of one lakh crore rupees.

On the celebration of Azadi ka Amrit Mahotsav on the occasion of the 75th year of the country's Independence, the President said, special events related to great personalities of the country are inspiring people. He said, the Government is celebrating the sacred occasions of the 400th Prakash Parv of Guru Tegh Bahadur Ji, the 150th birth anniversary of Sri Aurobindo, the 150th birth anniversary of V.O. Chidambaram Pillai and the 125th birth anniversary of Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose with grandeur. He saluted freedom fighters who gave highest priority to their duties and secured the rights of India. He said, the Government believes that remembering the past and learning from it are equally important for a secure future of the country. Observance of 'Veer Bal Diwas' on 26th December in the memory of sacrifice of Sahibzadas and 'Vibhajan Vibhishika Smriti Diwas' on 14th August is a reflection of this thinking. The Government also decided to celebrate the birth anniversary of Bhagwan Birsa Munda on 15th November as 'Jan-jatiya Gaurav Diwas' as a tribute to him. (Source: india.gov.in)

Indian Coast Guard to celebrate its 46th Raising Day today

Port Blair, Jan. 31

Indian Coast Guard will be celebrating its 46th Raising Day on 1st Feb 2022. From a modest beginning with just 7 surface platforms in 1978, ICG has grown into a formidable force with 158 ships and 70 aircraft in its inventory and is likely to achieve targeted force levels of 200 surface platforms and 80 aircraft by 2025.

As the fourth largest Coast Guard in the world, Indian Coast Guard has played a significant role in securing the Indian Coasts and enforcing regulations in the Maritime Zones of India. To its credit, the



force has saved 1226 lives at sea in last one year and 11082 lives since inception which translates into saving of one precious life at sea every second day. In addition, ICG also saved 339 people in last one year and overall 12934 personnel have been rescued till date by the service during various 'Aid to Civil Authority' operations viz., Assistance provided to civil authorities during

Floods, Cyclones and other natural calamities; most recently during the recent floods in Maharashtra, Karnataka and Goa. Despite the restrictions imposed by the 'COVID-19' pandemic, Indian Coast Guard has maintained 24x7 vigil in the Exclusive Economic Zone, by deploying about 50 ships and 12 aircraft daily, a press release from ICG HQ said.

A&N Police cracks blind murder case; accused arrested

A 50 yr old lady named P. Mariamma, working as vegetable vendor and staying alone at Calicut was found murdered inside her house. Upon this, a case U/s 302 IPC was registered at PS Pahargaon on Jan. 27, 2022. Two teams under the supervision of Insp Girish Kumar, SHO PS Pahargaon & Insp D Jagdishwar Rao along with SI PK Pandey, SI Dinesh Meena, SI Mohd. Rahil Islam, SI Manish Narayan, SI Samiran Mridha, ASI Tarak Nath, HC/V.C. Shekar, PC/Sandeep, PC/Amit, PC/Santosh,

PC/Manikandan, PC/Sudeep Kumar, PC/Sini Raju were formed under the supervision of Shri Saurabh Chandra, SDPO(SA) for search and arrest of unknown accused person. During investigation, several witnesses were interrogated, technological surveillance was stepped up and meticulously scrutinized, besides gathering human intelligence. Showing professional acumen and relentless field efforts, the blind murder case was solved after continuous rigorous efforts of 72

hours by Police team of PS Pahargaon. The accused identified as Uttam Sardar, S/o Robin Sardar, 32 yrs, Pvt. Labour, R/o Lal Mitti, Calicut was arrested. He admitted to his guilt. The accused was an acquaintance of the victim and attacked her in a fit of rage. Meanwhile, the general public have been requested to pass credible information regarding any anti-social activities noticed in their locality to phone 100, 03192-250525, 9434280100. Identity of the informer will be kept secret, a press release from SP (SA) said.

viz. enforcement team for strict implementation of Model Code of Conduct, Flying Squad shall be deployed to monitor violations ahead of election to local bodies and the team will videograph all their inspections and track poll code violations apart from monitoring of all political activities.

The DPME requested the representatives of political parties that bare minimum supporters along with candidates shall be allowed at the time of filing nomination and only candidates, election agents, a proposer shall be allowed on the day of filing nominations following all COVID protocols.

The DPME informed that advance permission for holding meeting by political parties should be obtained by the candidates as well as political parties and further that there shall be prohibition on defacement of public property and candidates should refrain from such activities during campaigning. A dedicated 24X7 Control Room has been set up to attend to receive complaints during the election process.

The DPME, A & N Islands briefed that the training for Returning Officers/Assistant Returning Officers and to the master trainers shall commence from 01.02.2022 at the Green Building Conference Hall at DBRAIT, Dollygunj.

The representatives of political parties also shared their views and sought clarifications from the Director, Panchayat & Municipal Elections which was redressed in the meeting, a press release from DC (SA) said.

PRESS NOTE

Last general elections to Gram Panchayats, Panchayat Samitis, Zilla Parishads and Port Blair Municipal Council in the Union Territory of Andaman and Nicobar Islands were held in September, 2015. The duration of five years of these PRIs and Urban Local Body from the date appointed for their first meeting has already expired. Due to spread of pandemic of COVID-19 and other compelling reasons during 2020-21 general elections to these local bodies were postponed.

Rule 29 of the Andaman and Nicobar Islands (Panchayats) (Preparation of Electoral Rolls and Conduct of Elections) Rules, 1995 states that 'a general election shall be held for the purpose of constituting a new Panchayat on the expiration of its duration or on its dissolution'.

Rule 18 of the Andaman and Nicobar Islands (Municipal) (Preparation of Electoral Rolls and Conduct of Elections) Rules, 1995 states that 'a general election shall be held for the purpose of constituting a new Municipal Council on the expiration of its duration or on its dissolution'.

Keeping in view the above legal provisions, the Election Commission, Andaman and Nicobar Islands, intends to hold the next General Elections to all Gram Panchayats (except Gram Panchayat Netaji Nagar and Hut Bay), all Panchayat Samitis, Zilla Parishad-South Andaman, Zilla Parishad-North & Middle Andaman and Port Blair Municipal Council, in the Andaman and Nicobar Islands as per the schedule given below:-

b)	Issue of notifications for general elections to all Gram Panchayats (except Gram Panchayat Netaji Nagar and Hut Bay), all Panchayat Samitis, Zilla Parishad-South Andaman, Zilla Parishad-North & Middle Andaman and Port Blair Municipal Council by the Election Commission	04.02.2022 (Friday)
c)	The last date for making nominations	11.02.2022 (Friday)
d)	The date for the scrutiny of nominations	12.02.2022 (Saturday)
e)	The last date for the withdrawal of candidatures	14.02.2022 (Monday)
f)	The date, on which a poll shall, if necessary, be taken	06.03.2022 (Sunday)
g)	The date of counting of votes	08.03.2022 (Tuesday)
h)	The date before which the elections shall be completed	11.03.2022 (Friday)

The provisions of the Model Code of Conduct for the guidance of Political Parties and Candidates in Elections to Panchayats and Municipalities in the Andaman and Nicobar Islands, issued by the Election Commission, Andaman and Nicobar Islands on 13th October, 1999 and subsequent instructions issued by it on the subject from time to time, shall apply to these elections. Further, instructions issued by the Election Commission of India on Model Code of Conduct from time to time shall also be followed.

After the onset of COVID-19, Ministry of Home Affairs, Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, Govt. of India, as well as the Andaman and Nicobar Administration, have issued guidelines/SOPs from time to time. These guidelines/SOPs shall be observed scrupulously during these General Elections. Further, Election Commission, Andaman and Nicobar Islands, has also issued broad guidelines separately based on the Election Commission of India's guidelines and Standing Committee of All India State Election Commissioners' recommendations for conduct of General Elections/Bye-Elections during the period of COVID-19 with respect to conduct of elections. These guidelines shall also be observed scrupulously during these General Elections.

The Commission has also decided to increase the duration of polls by two hours so as to ensure complete compliance with the Covid-19 guidelines and social distancing norms to ensure public safety.

The Model Code of Conduct comes into force with immediate effect. All concerned are requested to observe the Model Code of Conduct scrupulously.



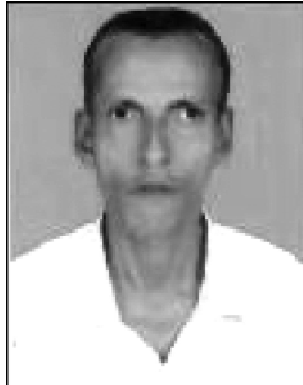

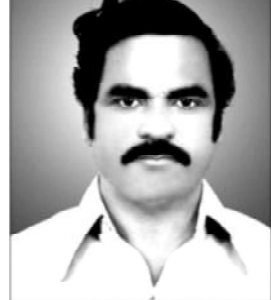
