## Chief Secretary orders raid into fortification of wheat flour under PDS

Port Blair, Aug. 21

Upon receiving repeated complaints regarding inadequate fortification of wheat flour under PDS as per the FSSAI (Food Safety and Standards Authority of India) standards, the Chief Secretary/ Chief Vigilance Officer, A&N Administration, Shri Jitendra Narain ordered collection and testing of samples from the premises of the agencies authorised for fortification of flour to be distributed under PDS.

Flour is fortified by adding nutrients in excess to quantities lost during milling or adding additional nutrients to improve its nutritive value. This is the most effective, simple and an inexpensive strategy for providing important vitamins and minerals to large segments of the population without requiring change in food habits or dietary pattern. Regular consumption of fortified wheat flour with adequate levels of easily absorbed nutrients results in a significant reduction in the prevalence of micronutrient deficiencies among women and children, particularly among the poor sections of the population.

A team led by the SP (Anti-Corruption Unit)

conducted raids in the premises of the authorised agency in Port Blair and collected samples. The samples will now be tested by the designated Food Testing Laboratories. Various records/ documents pertaining to the matter are also being scrutinized.

Prima facie, it seems that requisite quantity of vitamin/ mineral mix required for preparing the daily output of fortified wheat flour was not being purchased/ procured. The duration of purchase was also found only once in a while. This seems to suggest that proper fortification of wheat flour was not taking place.

Preliminary report also indicates that premix feeder machine for fortification was not in working condition. Premix for fortification was not being added in atta or flour distributed under PDS. This is perhaps why atta under PDS required to be sieved repeatedly before use.

The Administration today is more committed than ever to take strict actions against the concerned, a press release from A&N Administration said.

Scheme of Assistance to Disabled Persons for Purchase/Fitting of Aids/ Appliances (ADIP Scheme) is one of the major initiatives of the Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment, Govt. of India to assist the needy Divyangjan in procuring durable and scientifically manufactured standard

aids and appliances to promote their physical, social and psychological rehabilitation. Assistive devices are given to PwDs with the aim to improve their independent functioning, to arrest the extent of disability and occurrence of secondary disabilities.

A person with disabilities (PwDs) fulfilling the conditions

mentioned would be eligible for assistance under ADIP Scheme viz. an Indian citizen of any age, holds a 40% Disability Certificate, his monthly income from all sources not exceeding Rs. 20,000/- per month. In case of dependents, the income of parents/

guardians should not exceed Rs. 20,000/- per month. The quantum of assistance under the scheme are; income upto Rs. 15,000/- per month will be provided full cost of Aid/appliance and income from Rs. 15,001/- to Rs. 20,000/- per month

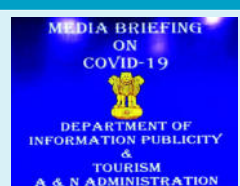
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## Media briefed on COVID-19

### One positive case detected during RT-PCR test conducted on flight passengers: Director (IP&T)

Port Blair, Aug. 21

The Director (Education), Shri Kamlesh Kumar currently holding the charge of Director (IP&T) briefing the media persons on COVID-19 status in the Islands held in the conference hall of IP&T here this evening stated that during the RT-PCR test conducted on 602 passengers who arrived here yesterday, 1 positive case was



detected. Today, 5 flights with 745 passengers arrived and the RT-PCR reports are awaited. He further disclosed that RAT was conducted on 471 passengers bound for North & Middle Andaman at Ferrargunj

and no positive case was found. Similarly, RAT was conducted on 82 persons at Phoenix Bay Jetty travelling to Swaraj Dweep and here too, all were found negative.

The Director further informed that at Mohanpura Bus Terminus, 174 passengers were tested and all the reports were negative. At helipad, 6 persons were tested and

### 1, 22,742 eligible people in the age group of 18 to 44 years inoculated

The safety of the citizens is the foremost priority of the Administration, especially during this pandemic time. To shield its citizens from the corona virus, the vaccination of eligible beneficiaries is being initiated by the Administration in different parts of the Islands.

Accordingly, the vaccination began with administering of COVISHIELD vaccine

for Health Care Workers followed by frontline workers and vulnerable population with comorbidities. Subsequently, the vaccination for 45 and above was initiated followed by 18 to 44 years which is currently underway.

Meanwhile, the vaccination drive is continuing smoothly in A&N Islands. As per data available, a total of 3,34,151 beneficiaries have been vaccinated so

## India to add 35 more Earthquake Observatories by end of this year and 100 more by 2026: Dr. Jitendra Singh

New Delhi, Aug. 21 (PIB)

Union Minister of State (Independent Charge) Science & Technology; Minister of State (Independent Charge) Earth Sciences; MoS PMO, Personnel, Public Grievances, Pensions, Atomic Energy and Space, Dr. Jitendra Singh said that India is going to have 35 more earthquake Observatories by end of this year and 100 more such Observatories in next five years. He pointed out that in last six and a half decades since Independence, the country had only 115 Earthquake Observatories but now with the Prime Minister at the helm, there is going to be a quantum leap in the number of Earthquake Observatories in the country.

Addressing the inaugural ceremony of Joint Scientific Assembly of International Association of Geomagnetism and Aeronomy (IAGA) - International Association of Geomagnetism and Aeronomy (IAGA) - Physics of the Earth's Interior (IASPEI) today,



the Minister said that the Indian subcontinent is considered as one of the world's most disaster-prone areas in terms of earthquakes, landslides, cyclones, floods, and tsunamis and the Government is taking all necessary steps to meet these challenges. Seismology and the Physics of the Earth's Interior (IASPEI) will act as a catalyst in bringing on board a greater number of researchers and practitioners from global community to work on issues related to rendering science to society.

He said that it is a fitting environment for the two scientific communities to come together to forward research in their niche as well as pursue new avenues of cross disciplinary investigations. The Minister said that the linkage between the deep earth structure and geomagnetism, and the role of fluids in earthquake nucleation are a few examples to emphasize the significance of the Joint Scientific Assembly of these two Associations to promote cross-disciplinary research.

## India's first COVID vaccine for children above 12 years gets approval for emergency use in the country

New Delhi, Aug. 21

The Central Drugs Standard Control Organisation (CDSCO) has approved DNA COVID-19 vaccine ZyCoV-D of Cadila Healthcare for restricted use in emergency situation in India for 12 years and above. It was approved after evaluation of interim Phase III clinical trial results in consultation with Subject Expert Committee of CDSCO. The vaccine has

efficacy of 66.6 percent and it is to be stored at 2 degree Celsius to 8 degree Celsius. The vaccine is needle free to be administered intradermally in three doses at day 0, 28 and 56. Prime Minister said, India is fighting COVID-19 with full vigour and the approval for world's first DNA based ZyCoV-D vaccine of Zydus Cadila is a testimony to the innovative zeal of India's scientists.

In a tweet, PM said, it is a momentous feat indeed. Health Minister, Shri Mansukh Mandaviya said, double good news for the nation as CDSCO approves the 1st DNA-based, needle-free COVID19 vaccine in the world - ZyCoV-D of Zydus Cadila. He said, in making children of India COVID-safe, this vaccine can be used for individuals aged 12 and above. (Source:india.gov.in)

will be provided 50% of the cost of Aid/appliance. A PwD should not have received assistance during last 3 years for the same purpose from any source. However, for children below 12 years of age, this limit would be one year. It is also to mention that Income Certificate of beneficiaries staying in orphanages and half-way homes etc. will be accepted on certification of District Collector or Head of the organization concerned.

The documents required for availing the benefits under ADIP Scheme are recent colour Passport size photograph (2 Nos), Disability Certificate (photo copy) and original for verification and entry purpose, Ration Card/Voter ID/Driving License (any one photo copy)- (of Parents/beneficiaries), Aadhaar Card (photo copy) for (beneficiaries/parents), valid mobile number (for beneficiaries/parents) and photocopy of Income Certificate. The e-income certificate is issued by the Village Officer or Tehsildar of concerned area will be valid for getting assistance under this scheme.

The aids & assistive devices provided under ADIP Scheme for Locomotor Disability are Tricycle, Wheel Chair (Adult), Wheel Chair (child), Auxiliary crutch (Large), Auxiliary crutch (Medium), Elbow crutch (Large), Rollator (Child), Walking stick, CP Wheel Chair and Corner chair. For hearing impairment the equipments provided are Moderate class (BTE), strong class (BTE), and Extra strong class (BTE). For visual impairment, the devices provided are Smart cane, universal Braille slate, Braille slate, Tylors frame, Abacus, Hand Magnifier, Cricket ball, Daisy player & Android tablet. Under intellectual disability, the aids provided are Teaching Learning Material (TLM) for 0-3 years, Teaching Learning Material (TLM) for 4-6 years, Teaching Learning Material (TLM) for 7-11 years and Teaching Learning Material (TLM) for 12-18 years.

Composite Regional Centre (CRC), Port Blair is implementing ADIP Scheme in this UT which is situated in Brookshabad opposite to Pondicherry University. So far, 165 beneficiaries have been assisted during 2019-20 and 2020-21 and no target has been fixed by the MoSJ&E. The Centre has facilities for providing Clinical psychological services like intellectual assessment, cognitive assessment, and Behaviour therapy etc. speech therapy, physiotherapy, vocational training, prosthetic and orthotic assessment and special education assessment.

## ANIIMS for YOU

### All you need to know about different types of COVID tests?

As testing for COVID-19 has become a regular part of everyday life, especially when it comes to travelling, making sure you get the correct test is of the utmost importance. When faced with the need to get a COVID-19 test, it's important to know that not every test is created equal, with different levels of accuracy as well as the time it takes to get results back. Some countries will only accept RT-PCR tests considered the most accurate while others will accept proof in any form of negative test to enter.

#### RT-PCR TEST:

This is the gold standard of COVID-19 tests, with the most accurate results available. A RT-PCR test (or Reverse transcription polymerase chain reaction) uses Nucleic Acid Amplification Tests (NAAT) to detect genetic material. NAAT's can be performed with a nose swab- with something that looks like a long Q-tip- or with a throat swab. The NAAT procedure works by first amplifying or making many copies of the virus's genetic material that is present in a person's specimen. Amplifying or increasing the copies of nucleic acids enables NAATs to detect very small amounts of SARS-CoV-2 RNA in a specimen, making these tests highly sensitive for diagnosing COVID-19.

Corona viruses have RNA or ribonucleic acid as their genetic material. However, swabs from patients yield only a tiny quantity of RNA, which is not adequate for the testing process. To overcome this problem, the RNA - a single-strand molecule - is converted into a two-strand DNA using an enzyme. This is known as reverse transcription and hence the name derived.

Researchers select specific areas in the genome that do not mutate rapidly as the virus evolves, and create copies of these using the PCR (polymerase chain reaction) process. The time duration for the testing process is around four to eight hours, but results may take up to a day to arrive because of the time taken to transport samples to labs.

#### Advantages of RT-PCR testing:

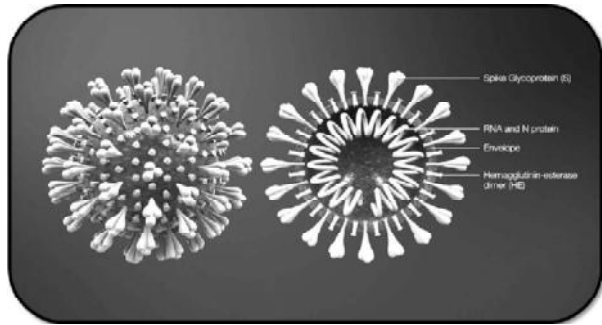
- **Swift, sensitive and specific:** They can deliver a reliable diagnosis in three hours. That said, the process on average takes around eight hours to produce a conclusive result.
- **More accurate, less prone to contamination:** This is because the test - start to finish - is carried out in an enclosed tube, inside a specialised, automated machine.
- **Severity of infection can be estimated:** A standard real-time RT-PCR set-up usually goes through 35 cycles, which means that, by the end of the process, around 35 billion new copies of the sections of viral DNA are created from each strand of the virus present in the sample.

#### Limitations of RT-PCR testing:

- **Only detects ongoing infection:** The main limitation of RT-PCR testing is that it cannot be used to detect a past infection with SARS-CoV-2, which is important for understanding the development and spread of the virus, as viruses are only present in the body for a specific window of time. Other methods are necessary to detect, track and study past infections, particularly those which may have developed and spread without symptoms. Once you have recovered, the virus is eliminated and these tests can no longer tell if you've been infected. This creates significant uncertainty, especially if someone has self-isolated due to mild and unclear symptoms.
- **Requires specialised equipment, training:** Unlike antibody testing, which requires a kit and medical/paramedical personnel trained in using the kit, RT-PCR testing needs specific instruments in a laboratory, which makes it more time-consuming. Even if the test itself takes just a few hours, the process of collecting and labelling samples, transporting them to a lab, and processing the samples in bulk ensure that it is days before the results from a single sample are known.
- **Quality control is not a guarantee:** In a pandemic, the use of even very accurate diagnostic tools is more error-prone than daily diagnostic tests. RT-PCR, while a revolutionary tool in diagnosis, can also be easily misused or misinterpreted. It depends on a reliable existing DNA sample of the virus, as a reference, to find the pathogen in a test. It is also sensitive enough to pick up on contamination as a false positive. The validity and accuracy of a test depend entirely on the laboratory's quality.

#### RAPID ANTIGEN TEST:

Antigen tests seek out specific proteins (spike protein of COVID virus) only found in the virus, which the body's immune response recognises as 'foreign'. Most COVID-19 antigen tests target the 'spike protein' that studs the surface of the corona virus. A swab from the nose is collected for this test, where there's a high likelihood of virus particles being present. The swab is then dipped in a solution that inactivates the virus, and then transferred onto a test strip. The test strip houses antibodies that bind to corona virus proteins and hold them in place as the fluid spreads. If the sample is positive for corona virus, coloured lines will show up on the paper strip in 15-20 minutes.



#### Some key advantages of antigen testing:

It reduces the burden of relying on just RT-PCR tests to identify COVID-19 patients. Antigen testing is useful because even if it's less sensitive, it is rapid and the results that are positive will be positive. So, patients who test positive can get into isolation faster. Antigen tests remove about half of the positives from the testing load. Antigen tests are also inexpensive compared to RT-PCR, costing less than RTPCR per test.

They are very useful to screen a patient with symptoms, because, if a patient has symptoms, it is likely they have a sufficient viral load to be detected, but it is only recommended for patients within 5-7 days of symptom onset to have the maximal viral load. They are also useful to screen asymptomatic patients in a repetitive manner, such as for patients who live in close quarters such as nursing homes or dorms since an outbreak can be detected more quickly this way. All antigen tests require a follow up confirmatory PCR test if they are negative in a patient with symptoms or if they are positive in an asymptomatic patient, because of the risk for false negative or false positive results. In other words if the test result does not match the clinical impression, confirm with a PCR test.

#### Limitations of antigen testing:

An antigen test can only reveal whether a person is currently infected with SARS-CoV-2. Before or after the infection has passed, antigens won't be present. Since antigen testing doesn't involve any processes of amplifying the virus or its genetic material, a swab sample may have too little antigen to be detected. This could produce a false negative result. As a precaution, a negative test should be followed up by the more accurate RT-PCR test, to confirm a true negative for COVID-19. Accuracy is the single largest problem with antigen tests, which are much less sensitive than RT-PCR as a diagnostic tool.

#### Which one is better?

The rapid antigen test comes in handy only while detecting patients who are quite symptomatic. Though the results can be revealed within 30 minutes, this test is not considered accurate, as it may not read into vital proteins that are part of Coronavirus at the initial stages.

Even if your rapid antigen test turns negative, it is recommend you wait for a couple of days, before confirming the presence of infection. If you happen to notice the symptoms of COVID-19, go for an RT-PCR test for better results.

#### Q. What about the new variant strains with mutations of the viral genome?

In recent days we hear more about delta variant or delta plus variant so we may have a doubt regarding whether they can be detected by RT PCR test or not?

Most of the RT PCR tests, particularly the "non-rapid" tests, evaluate several of the viral genes, so mutation of one gene will not cause a false negative result. Rapid tests, however, are more likely to query only a small portion of the viral genome or a single gene, and if the area that is being queried is mutated, the test may not detect it. Three rapid molecular tests have been identified by the FDA that may be impacted by the known mutations, but thus far, the impact has not been significant.

#### COVID ANTIBODY TESTS:

COVID Antibody tests, also known as serological tests, detect whether a person has antibodies to the virus or not. Antibodies are naturally produced by the body's immune system to fight off infections.

For the Antibody Rapid test, we collect a few drops of blood and the sample is placed on a cassette or cartridge that contains the SARS-CoV-2 proteins. If the blood samples contain antibodies against the virus, they will immediately bind to the viral proteins. The positive result is indicated in the form of lines, like a pregnancy test kit.

Enzyme-Linked Immunosorbent Assay (ELISA) to detect COVID antibody, is designed specifically for screening large numbers of specimens at a time, is suitable for detecting the spread of the disease in a large population within a short span of time.

Antibody tests can be useful to carry out surveys in the community to check whether a population has been exposed to the virus or not. These are currently only being used for research and surveillance purposes. Antibody tests cannot be used to diagnose Covid-19, but can reveal whether a person was recently exposed to the virus.

#### TRUE NAAT TEST:

True- NAAT system is used for screening and confirmation of COVID-19. The chip based test works by detecting the SARS-CoV-2 E-gene, which helps to build the envelope that holds the components of the corona virus together, and the gene for the RNA-dependent RNA polymerase. Unlike traditional RT-PCR tests, the sample preparation in True-NAAT tests is automated, and the results are available within half an hour to an hour.

The advantage of this test is that it is quick and portable. This allows teams to set up mobile testing centers or kiosks in containment zones, instead of having to transport samples to labs.

True-NAAT is an indigenously developed, portable version of CB-NAAT or Cartridge Based Nucleic Acid Amplification Test, also known as the Gene-expert test. Both these tests were initially developed for testing and diagnosing multi drug resistant tuberculosis. On 19th May 2020, ICMR approved it to use as a tool to diagnose and confirm COVID 19 in adjuncts to RT PCR and Antigen test.

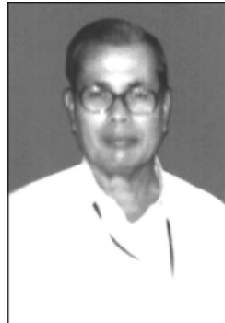

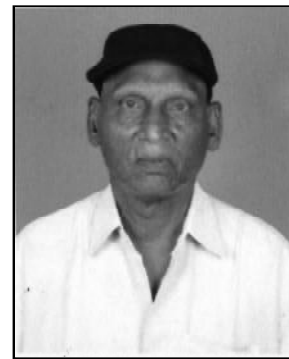
