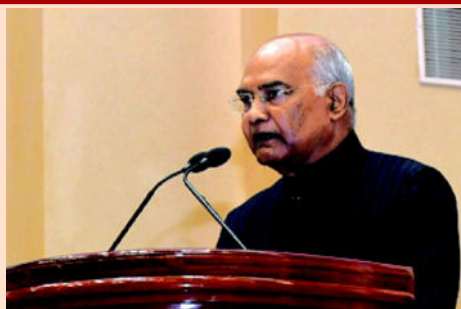


## Justice gets strengthened if Judiciary, Legislature and Executive are in harmonious existence: President

New Delhi, Nov. 27

President, Shri Ram Nath Kovind today said that justice gets further strengthened if the three institutions of the state namely, Judiciary, Legislature, and Executive are in harmonious existence. He was addressing the valedictory function of the Constitution Day Celebrations organized by the Supreme Court of India. He complimented the Indian Judiciary for the achievement that people repose faith in the judiciary. President further stated that it is incumbent on the



judges to exercise utmost discretion in their utterances in the courtrooms. He said that indiscrete remarks even if made with good intention give space for dubious interpretations to run down the judiciary. Shri Kovind hoped to see increased access to legal aid and advisory services for all. He said that it can

take the form of a movement or a better-institutionalized mechanism. He also

highlighted the issue of long pendency of cases, gender balance in the judiciary and spoke about appointments in the judiciary. The Prime Minister, Shri Narendra Modi today chaired a comprehensive meeting to review the public health preparedness & vaccination related situation for COVID-19. PM was briefed about the global trends on COVID-19 infections and cases. Officials highlighted that countries across the world have experienced multiple COVID-19 surges since the onset of the pandemic. He also reviewed the national situation relating to COVID-19 cases and test positivity rates.

Prime Minister was apprised of the progress in vaccination and the efforts being made under the 'Har Ghar Dastak' campaign. He directed that there is a need to increase the second dose coverage and that states need to be sensitised on the need to ensure that all those who have got the first dose are



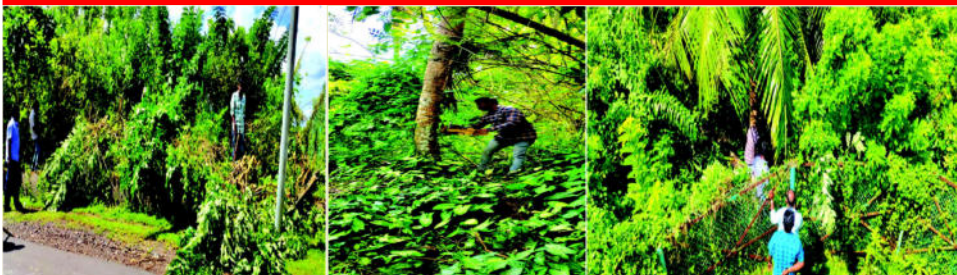
given the second dose timely. PM was also given details about the sero-positivity in the country from time to time and its implications in public health response.

The District Administration in its drive against encroachment on Government revenue land in the South Andaman District has been carrying out eviction drives. In this connection, unauthorised occupation on an area measuring 2000 sq. mtrs out of Sy.No 203/P, situated at Teylarabad village under Port Blair Tehsil in the shape of plantation comprising coconut and temporary fencing has been removed today by the Revenue Officials of Port Blair

be provided to individuals/ SHG's/ Co-operatives/ Farmer Producers Organizations (FPOs).

The scheme adopts 'One District One Product' (ODOP) approach to reap the benefit of scale in terms of requirements of input, availing common services and marketing of products. The ODOP identified for the South Andaman District is Marine based Fish products and for Nicobar and North & Middle Andaman District is Coconut based products.

One of the major components of the scheme is to provide Support to Individual Micro Enterprises. Eligible Individual Micro Enterprises would be provided Credit-linked Capital subsidy @ 35% of the eligible project cost with a maximum ceiling of Rs. 10 lakh per unit. District Resource Persons have been engaged for each district to provide handholding supports to micro-food processing enterprises in preparation of Detailed Project Report, training for preparation of supporting documents and certification, up-gradation of existing units and assistance in getting bank loan.

The eligibility criteria for individual beneficiaries to avail these benefits are as follows:

- Existing and new Food Processing Unit oriented towards ODOP and other value-added food products.
- Willingness to contribute minimum 10% of the project cost.
- Shall be above 18 years of age and should possess education qualification of at least 8<sup>th</sup> standard pass.
- Existing Micro Food Processing Enterprises with investments under 100 lakhs.
- Must have credit link support from scheduled banks and recognised financial institutions.

## Torch ginger (Etlingera elatior) - a new addition to flower basket

Torch ginger (Etlingera elatior) belonging to the family Zingiberaceae is a popular cut flower known for its versatility and durability. The extravagant and showy inflorescence with bright colour of the species makes it highly suitable to be used as cut flower. The clumps are vigorous, with the emission of vegetative and floral stems in the periphery and in the center of the clump. It shows robust growth, when planted in moist and shady condition. The inflorescences show colors that vary from red and pink to white, which grow directly from the rhizome. In the Island, three accessions namely red (Accession 1), pink with red tinge (Accession 2) and baby pink (Accession 3) and all the three performed well in partial shade condition. The species is commercially propagated by clumps and planted at a spacing of 1.5 to 2.0 m. Flowering is initiated one year after planting. Number of flowers per clump per year ranges from 25- 55 and maximum was observed in accession 3 (Baby pink) followed by accession 1 (Red). Flowering is not seasonal however, during summer flower production is less. The shelf life of harvested flowers ranges from 3 to 5 days and remains for about 10 days while intact with plant. The stalk length ranges from 50 to 70 cm and suitable for packing to export market. The flowers are to be harvested at fully opened stage.

**Benefit:** The tropical humid climate of Island is highly congenial for growing this cut flower by both amateurs and entrepreneurs. Commercial cultivation of this species can also be exploited owing to the growing tourism industry in the Island.

masking & social distancing. PM highlighted the need for monitoring all international arrivals, their testing as per guidelines, with a specific focus on countries identified 'at risk'. PM also asked officials to review plans for easing of international travel restrictions in light of the emerging new evidence.

PM was given an overview of the sequencing efforts in the country and the variants circulating in the country. PM directed that genome sequencing samples be collected from international travellers and community as per norms, tested through the network of labs already established under INSACOG and early warning signal identified for Covid-19 management. PM spoke about the need to increase the sequencing efforts and make it more broad-based.

He also directed officials to work closely with State Governments to ensure that there is proper awareness at the state and district level. He directed that intensive containment and active surveillance should continue in clusters reporting higher cases and required technical support be provided to states which are reporting higher cases presently. PM also asked that awareness needs to be created about ventilation and air-borne behaviour of the virus.

Officials briefed PM that they are following a facilitative approach to newer pharmaceutical products. PM instructed officials to coordinate with states to ensure that there is adequate buffer stocks of various medicines. He asked officials to work with the states to review the functioning of medical infrastructure including pediatric facilities.

keep the corona virus at bay. As per data available, the cumulative beneficiaries vaccinated with first dose so far is 2,96,557 (103.69%) while cumulative beneficiaries vaccinated with second dose so far is 2,52,509 (85.15%). In order to restrict the entry of COVID virus in isles, the passengers coming from mainland are screened at Airport. The total number of incoming passengers screened at VSI Airport from May 25, 2020 to Nov. 20, 2021 stood at 405004 while the number of outgoing passengers was 406600 during the same period.

2195 beneficiaries were vaccinated in South Andaman District, out of which, 97 beneficiaries were in the age group of 18-44 years. Similarly, 344 beneficiaries were vaccinated in North & Middle Andaman District, out of which, 12 beneficiaries were in the age group of 18-44. 37 beneficiaries were vaccinated in Nicobar District, out of which, 1 beneficiary was in the age group of 18-44. A total of 1,75,521 eligible people in the age group of 18 to 44 years have been vaccinated till date, a press release from DHS said.

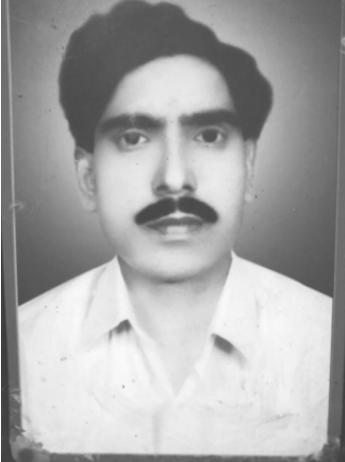
