LINKTHAT THREATENS TO DELINK LIFE



A dilapidated bridge over a croc infested stream becomes a bane for villagers of UrmilapurPanchayat

RANGAT, OCT 13/--/ A dilapidated bridge over a crocodile infested nallah at Urmilapur in Middle Andaman stands testimony to the apathy of g o v e r n m e n tauthorities towards ensuring safety of villagers living in remote pockets of the region. Due to indifference of the authorities concerned, the rickety link has become so fragile that it might collapse any moment. That, however, has not stopped people from risking their lives and

using it. "The unstable bridge provides connectivity to many families from different villages of UrmilapurPanchayat. dilapidated The structure is a threat to children and old, especially because the stream under it is infested crocodiles. During rains, the water levels in the nallah swells and a minor mistake could prove to be a fatal fall for the villagers. Despite pleas, the local authorities have failed undertake necessary repair and renovation of the bridge even though

several people use it on a daily basis," said a villager of Urmilapur.

"For the past many years, we have been running from pillar to post to get the vital link reconstructed, but the authorities concerned are not serious about the plight of people. **Authorities concerned** should take immediate steps to undertake repair and renovation works of the bridge to avoid any major tragedy here," echoked some other villagers.

Modi launches rural roads scheme, lays foundation of hydel projects in Himachal

State Cong dubs PM's visit as election gimmick

CHAMBA, OCT 13 /--/ Modi on Thursday launched the Pradhan Mantri Gram Sadak Yojana-III in Himachal of rural roads, saying the government wants to build roads in every village of the state. Sofar, the double-engine government of the BJP has built 12,000 km of rural roads in eight years in Himachal Pradesh, he said at a rally here. The Prime Minister governments at the Centre, sayingformerchiefministers PK Dhumal and Shanta Kumar used to make rounds of Delhi to get even small projects sanctioned. Now, he added, the Himachal Pradesh $chief minister comes \ to \ Delhi$ to inform about the completion of projects. "I feel contented while serving you as you have given me this opportunity by voting the BJP to power," the Prime Ministersaid, Healsosaid the double-engine government has made domestic gas connections available for every home.

Modi added that 100 per cent piped water coverage has been made in tribal areas of Lahaul-Spiti and Kinnaur under the 'Har Ghar Jal Yojna'. Refering to grant of the Scheduled Tribe status to the Hatti community, he said it showed the government cared for the tribal people. The Prime Minister also laid foundation stones of two hydropower projects - the 48 MWChanju-IIIhydro-electric project and the 30 MW Deothal Chanju hydroelectric project - in Chamba.

Earlier, Modi addressed a public meeting at the IndiraGandhi stadium in Una district after flagging off the inaugural run of the new Vande Bharat Express. He $also \, laid \, the foundation \, stone \,$ of a Bulk Drug Pharma Park and inaugurated the Indian Institute of Information Technology (IIIT) Una. Meanwhile, Opposition Congress termed the Prime Minister's visit to the state a mere "election gimmick",

saying it was "terribly scared" of losing the upcoming Assembly elections. The state is scheduled to go to polls by the end of this year. "The BJP's countdown began with bitingthedust in the by-polls,' state Congress president Pratibha Singh said in a statement. In the by-polls held in the state on October 30 last year, the BJP had lost the Mandi parliamentary seat and three Assembly seats of Fatehpur, Arki, and Jubbai-Kothkai to the Congress. Calling Modi's visit to Una and Chamba an "election gimmick", Singh said Chief Minister Jai Ram Thakur was bringing the prime minister to inaugurate and lay foundationstonesforprojects in a hurry as he and the BJP were "terribly scared" about losing the Assembly polls.

Uddhav Sena writes to EC over symbol and name, alleges bias

Shiv Sena on Thursday alleged bias by the Election Commission in the allocation of party symbols and name as it battles for control of the organisation with the group led by Maharashtra Chief Minister Eknath Shinde.

several communications and the actions of the Hon'ble Commission have given rise to a serious apprehension of bias in the mind of the Respondent," the Thackeray faction of the Shiv Sena said in a letter to the Election Commission through its lawyer Vivek Singh. Last week, the Commission had barred the rival factions of the Shiv Sena from using the party name and the 'bow and arrow' symbol, pending the settlement of the dispute over the "real Shiv Sena". Earlier this week, the Commission had allotted 'Shiv Sena-Uddhav Balasaheb Thackeray' as the name and 'flaming torch' as the election symbol for the Thackeray faction. The Shinde faction got the name 'Balasahebanchi Shiv Sena' and 'two swords and a shield' as the election symbol. Singh, the lawyer for the Thackeray faction, contended that the Commission did not grant the party adequate time to file its reply on Shinde's claims to the bow and arrow' symbol for the Andheri East by-poll in

The Thackeray faction also alleged that the Commission had uploaded its letter conveying the preference for poll symbols and party names on the poll authority's website, making it accessible to everyone, including the rival faction. "This was done even before a decision was taken by the Commission regarding allocation of symbols and possibly even before the Petitioner had submitted his own list of proposed symbols and names, thus giving the Petitioner and his group a clear unfair advantage over the Respondent," Singh said. He claimed that the Shinde faction had "very tellingly" given the same first choice of name, and the same first and second choice of the symbol as of the Thackeray faction.

"This could not have happened but for the fact that the Hon'ble Commission shared a privileged communication from the Respondent herein on its public website. This onesided and unfair disclosure gave the Petitioner information that he immediately used to his advantage by ensuring that his preferences regarding name and symbol blocked the Respondent from being allotted his first preference," Singh said. The Commission's letter allotting the 'flaming torch' to the Thackeray faction did not carry the image of the poll symbol, while the letter to the Shinde faction contained a large pictorial representation of the 'two swords and a shield' poll symbol, the letter said. "The same is again giving an unfair advantage to the Petitioner," the Thackeray faction said. (PTI)

Tiger stays inside Bhopal tech institute for 11th day, pugmarks spotted

BHOPAL, OCT 13 /--/ The presence of a tiger on the sprawling 65-acre campus of the prestigious Maulana Azad National Institute of Technology (MANIT) in Bhopal in Madhya Pradesh entered the 11th day on Thursday even as forest department officials waited for the big cat to move out of the premises and closely monitored its movement.

The behaviour of the tiger, T-123-4, has defied common perception that big cats move out of one place in seven to eight days, officials admitted. MANIT authorities had earlier announced a mid-term break for 5,400 undergraduate students from October 11 to 30, while classes for 600-odd students in post-graduation courses continued, its public relations officer Dr Amit Ojha told PTI. "The tiger is still on the campus on the 11th day. Usually, as per tiger behaviour studies, the big cat moves from one place to another in seven to eight days. Today, we spotted pugmarks. We have placed 11 cameras to monitor its movement. Five more cameras will be installed soon," Bhopal divisional forest officer (DFO) Alok Pathak told PTI.

"The tiger today came close to the cage kept with bait, but did not enter. We want it to move out of the campus naturally, on its own. Since October 3, it has killed two cows," he added. The official said a tiger marks a territory of around 25 square kilometres and then moves in it, killing and resting. "The livestock has been moved out of the MANIT campus completely. Now we think it will move out. Around 50 forest personnel are monitoring the movement of the tiger. It is currently in a low-lying area like a ravine spread over 300-400 acres connected to the campus," Pathak added. He said the some 5,000 hostelers and 1,000 kin of staff live on the campus, some 100 acres of which is covered by thickets. Tigers from Ratapani Wildlife Sanctuary, spread in Raisen and Sehore districts close to Bhopal, sometimes move into the Kerwa area of the state capital. This time, one of them, identified as T-123-4, has strayed into the educational facility, he said. (PTI)

NEW DELHI, OCT 13 /--/ AAP Gujarat unit chief Gopal Italia was on Thursday detained by Delhi Police after he appeared National the Commission for Women (NCW) for his alleged comments against Prime Minister Narendra Modi amid protests by party members outside the women's panel's office here.

Reacting to police action against the AAP leader, Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal said detention had triggered massive anger in the Patel community across Gujarat. Taking to Twitter, the AAP national convenor also asked why "entire BJP" was after Italia. Kejriwal's deputy Manish Sisodia termed Italia's detention as "BJP politics" and alleged that he had been detained because he belonged to a party that knew how to transform schools. NCW Chairperson Rekha Sharma had summoned Italia for using "abusive and indecent language" against the Prime Minister and said his comment was "gender biased, misogynist and had to be called to restrain condemnable".

Nehru's 'insertion' of Article 370 caused Kashmir issue, Modi resolved problem, says Shah



Union Home Minister Amit Shah on Thursday blamed India's first prime minister Jawaharlal Nehru for the issues plaguing Kashmir and credited the Narendra Modi government for solving them by removing

Speaking at an event to flag off the Bharatiya Janata Party's 'Gaurav Yatra' in poll-bound Gujarat, Shah also said the Congress used to taunt his party over the construction of the Ram Temple in Ayodhya, but work on it was now in progress.

"Due to the mistake of Jawaharlal Nehru of inserting Article 370, Kashmir was in a mess. It could not be properly integrated with the country. Everybody wanted the removal of Article 370. Prime Minister Narendra Modi removed it in one

stroke and completed the integration of Kashmir with the country," Shah said. Incidentally, Modi had also blamed Nehru for the issues plaguing Kashmir while addressing a gathering in Gujarat earlier this week.



Speaking on the Ram Temple in Uttar Pradesh's Ayodhya, Shah said the Congress used to mock the BJP with slogans like 'Mandir wahi banayenge par tithi nahi batayenge' (the temple will be built but can't say when). "But the dates were declared, the ground breaking ceremony was completed and a grand temple is coming up at the promised place," the Union Minister pointed out. Hitting out further at the Congress, the senior BJP leader said curfews were a routine occurrence when the former ruled Gujarat, but the advent of the Modi dispensation in the state ensured that "those days are gone now"

"Out of 365 days, curfew would be in force in 200 days in parts of Gujarat when the Congress was ruling the state. They (Congress) thought they would benefit if people fought each other. Those days are gone now," he said.

"After Narendra Modi came to power in Gujarat, curfew has not been imposed in the state for the last 20 years," he claimed.

Gehlot is on path of rebellion: BJP's Malviya

NEW DELHI, OCT 13 /--/ claimed on Thursday that Rajasthan Chief Minister Ashok Gehlot is on the "path of rebellion" from the Congress as he shared a short video of him in which he is seen praising the work public undertaking Coal India and some decisions of Union Coal Minister Pralhad

The video shows the veteran Congress leader addressing an event. "Make no mistake. Gehlot is on the path of rebellion. After inviting Gautam Adani,

despite Rahul Gandhi's derision, he now heaps and minister Pralhad Joshi, for helping Rajasthan at critical times. This is in sharp contrast to Congress's belligerence," BJP's IT department head Malviya claimed. The three-time Rajasthan chief minister has been a vocal critic of the BJP but he appeared to have strained his ties with the Congress leadership after his loyalist MLAs held a separate meeting in Jaipur in defiance of the party's directive for a meeting of the legislative party.

It was then believed that Gehlot will contest the Congress presidential poll with the tacit support of the Gandhi family, and a new leader will replace him at the helm in Rajasthan. However, the turn of events resulted in the party leadership Mallikarjun Kharge to contest the poll, where Shashi Tharoor is also in the with suspense continuing over Gehlot's fate as chief minister. Assembly polls are due in Rajasthan in the second half of 2023. (PTI)

SC to hear today pleas challenging electoral bond scheme

NEW DELHI, OCT 13 /--/ The Supreme Court is scheduled to hear on Friday a batch of pleas challenging laws permitting funding of political parties through the electoral bond scheme.

Electoral bonds have been pitched as an alternative to cash donations made to political parties as part of efforts to bring transparency in political funding. A bench of Justices B R Gavai and B V Nagarathna is likely to take up the PILs by NGO, Association for Democratic Reforms, Communist Party of India (Marxist) and other petitioners. Advocate Prashant Bhushan, appearing for the NGO, on April 5 had mentioned the matter before the then CJI N V Ramana saying the issue was critical and needed an urgent hearing. The apex court had agreed to list the NGO's plea for hearing but it did not come up before any court.

Earlier, Bhushan had sought an urgent listing of the PIL from the apex court on October 4 last year seeking a direction to the Centre not to open any further window for sale of electoral bonds during the pendency of a case pertaining to funding of political parties and alleged lack of transparency in their

The NGO, which had filed the PIL in 2017 on the alleged issue of corruption and subversion of democracy through illicit and foreign funding of political parties and lack of transparency in the accounts of all political parties, had filed an interim application in March this year before the assembly polls in West Bengal and Assam seeking that window for sale of electoral bonds be not reopened.

The NGO, in its fresh application filed in the pending petition, had claimed that there is a serious apprehension that any further sale of electoral bonds fore the uncoming Assembly elections including in West Bengal and Assam, would further increase illegal and illicit funding of political parties through shell companies.

On January 20 last year, the apex court had refused to grant interim stay on the 2018 Electoral Bonds Scheme and sought responses of the Centre and the Election Commission on an interim application by the NGO seeking stay on the scheme. The government notified the Electoral Bond Scheme on January 2, 2018.

According to provisions of the scheme, electoral bonds may be purchased by a person, who is a citizen of India or incorporated or established in India. An individual can buy electoral bonds, either singly or jointly with other individuals.

Only political parties registered under Section 29A of the Representation of the People Act, 1951 and which secured not less than one percent of votes polled in the last general election to the House of the People or the Legislative Assembly of the State, are eligible to receive electoral bonds. According to the notification, electoral bonds shall be encashed by an eligible political party only through a bank account with an authorised bank.

The apex court had in April 2019 declined to stay the Centre's Electoral Bond Scheme 2018 and made it clear that it would accord an in-depth hearing on the pleas as the Centre and the EC have raised 'weighty issues" having "tremendous bearing on the sanctity of the electoral process in the country". The Centre and the EC had earlier taken contrary stands in the court over political funding, with the government wanting to maintain anonymity of donors of bonds and the poll panel batting for revealing names of donors for transparency. The ashes Samajwadi Party patriarch have been kept safely in urns as the family prepares for post-cremation rituals.

Family sources here said that now the post-cremation rituals like immersion of ashes and 'shanti yagya' will be taken up. There are plans to take the ashes to Prayagraj or Haridwar for immersion but the details are yet to be finalised, sources said, adding once the date and place is final, it would be made public. SP founder Mulayam Singh Yadav (82) who had died in a Gurugram hospital on

Monday was given a tearful farewell in Saifai, his native village, with tens of thousands of people turning up at the funeral of a leader who influenced politics far beyond his home state.

The former UP Chief Minister was cremated with full state honours on Tuesday near the place where his first wife Malti Devi was cremated. His son Akhilesh Yadav had lit the

funeral pyre in the Saifai's mela ground, where people had begun gathering hours in advance filling up all available space.

SP state unit president Naresh Uttam Patel has, through a letter, instructed the grieving workers and supporters to organise programmes to pay tributes to Mulayam Singh Yadav on October 21. The letter was sent to presidents of district, city units, MPs, former MPs,

Uncertainty over India-UKFTA

A cloud of uncertainty hangs over the proposed India-UK free trade agreement (FTA) which is in its final stages as the UK seems to insist on restrictive policies on migration. Data localisation and UK companies being allowed to bid for Indian government contracts are among the issues causing a possible deadlock in the final stages of the FTA negotiations. A deadline was set to complete the draft by Diwali, an important Indian festival, falling this year on October 24. But, two key "sticking points" to a comprehensive deal are data localisation rules that prevent foreign companies taking data out of India and allowing the UK firms to bid for public sector contracts. The likelihood of a so-called "thin" trade deal within the symbolic Diwali deadline and a bigger deal at a later stage appears like a more likely outcome at the moment. The stumbling block has been created by the Department for International Trade (DIT), which has reiterated the British government stance that any FTA would be agreed only if it meets the UK's interests. An indication to this effect came from UK Trade Secretary KemiBadenoch. "We remain clear that we won't sacrifice quality for speed and will only sign when we have a deal that meets the UK's interests," a UK government spokesperson said this week, without mincing words.

It follows a week of controversial interventions that cast a shadow over the prospect of a wideranging bilateral trade agreement, with Indian origin UK Home Secretary SuellaBraverman expressing reservations over New Delhi being offered some sort of open borders visa concessions. She said in clear terms that India-UK FTA can't happen if it means more Indians in Britain. India, on its part, has strongly countered the Braverman's claims that a Migration and Mobility Partnership (MMP) between the two countries had not "worked very well" in tackling visa over stayers. Strategic experts suggested that the wrangles may well end up in a diluted trade pact. They say whether in a thin deal or a thick one, if the UK insists on restrictive policies on migration, India should walk away. In view of this uncertainty, the prospect of Prime Minister NarendraModi's UK visit towards the end of the month to sign an FTA draft around Diwali is also seen as shaky at this stage. It now appears likely that the prospective UK-India FTA under the Liz Truss government will not be as substantive nor as comprehensive as envisaged by the previous Boris Johnson government, as negotiations on key issues of mobility/migration and tariffs can be expected to continue towards a non-time bound second-phase of the agreement. But, it will still enable both governments to claim political victory, even though its economic impact may not be as per expectations.

The Diwali timeline for an FTA was announced thusiastically by former prime minister Johnson during his visit to India in April. The governing Conservative Party in the UK has since been thrown into turmoil and his embattled successor at Downing Street, Liz Truss, is believed to be very keen to score her big win by clinching a trade deal with one of the world's fastest growing economies a process she had initiated as former trade secretary. The focus of the FTA negotiations is on reducing the barriers to trade, cutting tariffs, and supporting easier imports and exports into each other's markets. According to official UK government data, India-UK bilateral trade currently stands at around GBP 24.3 billion a year and the aim is for that to be at least doubled by 2030.

India can become a \$25 trillion economy in 25 years from now

As India celebrates its 75th year of independence this year, several roadmaps are being laid for it to become a developed economy in the next 25 years when India would celebrate its 100th year of independence in 2047. Some of us might not be alive to witness it but ever optimist Veteran banker K V Kamath, who is chairman of National Bank for Financing Infrastructure, said recently that he expects India to be a \$25 trillion economy in 25 years. Presently India is around \$3.7 trillion economy and recently overtook Britain, India's colonial masters, to become a fifth largest economy in the World. But India is far behind topmost economic power United States, which is now a \$26 trillion economy followed by China a \$21 trillion economy.

India might have come a long way since independence in 1947 from an impoverished to a vibrant economy and is now among the fastest growing economies in the world. But it is still a long way to go to become a developed economy. Kamath feels a 7-8 per cent growth if achieved on a sustained basis, India would double its GDP every nine years and a 10-11 per cent growth annually will make India the third largest economy in the next nine years. All these statistics are fine but the fact is India is far behind the target of \$5 trillion economy by 2023-24 set by Prime Minister NarendraModi

India's commerce Minister PiyushGoyal is talking of preparing a five-year road map through a new trade policy to aim \$1 trillion goods exports and additional \$1 trillion services exports by 2027-28. In reality, India is yet to achieve \$500 billion goods exports originally planned to be achieved by 2015-16 by the previous UPA government. Nevertheless Kamath's optimism arises from the fact that Covid had helped in cleaning up Corporate balance sheets as well as that of Indian banks. Corporates have now become more frugal and thereby more efficient. The Indian

banks NPAs situation too has steadily improved. The overall liquidity and lending capacity too is better. But monetary tightening due to inflationary pressure might pose some short-term problems and these are not insurmountable. Digitalisation and India's efforts to get into hardware manufacturing besides rollout of 5G technology in telecom offered great prospects for the country to leapfrog in economic development

Infrastructure is still a problem. Corruption, delays in getting clearances and other logistics and political impediments makes the improvement in ease of doing business a big joke. Many foreign companies still do not consider India to be an investment friendly destination. However the slowing down of Chinese economy, geopolitical situation and increasing labour costs in China makes India an exciting option with its large market and large pool of trained and skilled manpower with majority of 1.4 billion population being youth below the age of 35

Situation is just ripe for India to take off rapidly. India is also a vibrant democracy with a sizeable English speaking population and it also has by and large stable laws with attractive taxation system and a competent judiciary. These are all big positives but the flip side: democracy is also a slow process of polity and many multinationals prefer authoritarian regime as there is a sort of single window and quick clearance despite manifold risks. On

balance though there are some difficulties, India's time has at last come for it to march ahead with all cylinders firing and prospects seem to be exciting for agriculture, Industry and services sectors to just boom from now on. There is of course recession in some of the advanced economies, China is slowing down rapidly, commodity prices particularly oil

There is global inflationary pressure and global trade is slowing down. These are challenges but it is also an opportunity for India. India's investments as percentage of GDP is rising and slowly getting back to 35 per cent mark. This meant animal spirits among corporates are getting

FDI inflow is likely to cross \$100 billion for the first time this year. Private investments are looking up with excess capacity vanishing. Global recession may in a way be helpful as it may give that much time to build capacity and fix infrastructure problems. With the twin balance sheet problem behind us that is the balance sheet problem in Indian companies as well as Indian banks, things have started looking up. The two years of covid had in a way helped the corporates and the banks to deal with bad loans problem to a considerable extent. These are welcome developments along with several global companies exploring to have a second manufacturing hub to ward off supply disruptions.

More than anything else, digitalization and India's prowess in software and hardware designs and R&D. make the coming years very exciting and the prospects look unstoppable for India. Here it is important, the Government, corporates and bureaucracy act in unison to ensure that this time around India does not miss the bus. Though there are certain fixing required. Kamath may not be way off the mark. Indian economy is poised for a takeoff. (IPA)

Kanam Rajendran gets third term as Kerala State Secretary of CPI The Cassandras have ended up with egg on

their faces. The prophets of doom have been embarrassed beyond mention. predictions. all dire KanamRajendran has been re-elected unanimously as the Communist Party of India (CPI)'s Kerala state secretary for a third term.

The most positive upshot of the State conference of the CPI has been a resonant message of unity. The anti-Left press, rubbing its hands as it were in malicious glee, has been administered a stinging snub by the party leaders and cadres who. once again, laid accent on left unity in the State. The positive outcome of the conference will impart a new energy and strength to the battle against the forces of communalism led by the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) and the negative politics of the Congress-led United Democratic Front

The conference also witnessed a generational shift with the exit of party veterans K E Ismail and C. Divakaran from the State Council. Ismail will, however, continue to be a member of the National Council until the 24th party congress from October 14 to 18.. Senior assistant secretary K PrakashBabu, has retained his state council membership. CPI leader from Idukki E S Bijimol, who had voiced her reservation on some issues in a Facebook post, has not made it to the council.

The new 101-member Council sports a younger image. As many as 33 members

were dropped from the existing 96-member council. Among those who have not made it to the council are Central Control Commission chairman Pannian Ravindran Central Secretariat member Binoy Viswam. There are 13 women among the 38 new faces in the Council. The antileft press had forecast a fierce controversy over the party's decision to make mandatory the age cap of 75 years for leaders in the State council and executive members. The prediction was that the decision was meant to oust senior leaders Ismail and Divakaran. But that has been proved to be nothing but mere conjecture as it was Ismail who proposed Kanam's name as the state secretary

As for Divakaran, the stalwart himself said he would abide by the party decision on the age cap. It may be mentioned that the CPI National Council had taken a decision to bring in the upper age limit to ensure greater representation of youngsters in leadership positions. Since it was the decision of the National Council, it could not be interpreted as being against the party constitution. The party's mass base has expanded with the membership having gone up from a mere 34,600 in 1971 to

1,77,600. The branch committees have gone up from 8,500 to over 11,000. Of course, there is scope for further improvement. It was after the Malappuram conference that the party saw a surge in membership.

In his acceptance, speech, Kanam dismissed rumours of factionalism in the party. That is the product of the not so fertile imagination of the left-hostile media. "The party has no group. Communists stand as one. Comrades have the right to voice their opinion in their respective party forums. It is not an era of slavery. However, the party's decision-making is always consensual and concordant in the tradition of democratic centralism," affirmed Kanam.

An important feature of the conference was that despite the party's reservations and apprehensions, criticism of the Left Democratic Front (LDF), especially the Home department under the control of Chief Minister PinaraviViiavan, has been softened in the party reports presented to the state conference. The major criticism was against the Kerala Government's use of the Unlawful Activities Prevention Act (UAPA) against student leaders Thaha and Allen for possessing Maoist brochures besides the killing of Maoists at Attappady

in November 2010. In both these incidents, the CPI said the LDF Government had deviated from the known stand of the left parties. The state government's resort to the draconian law, the CPI felt, would considerably weaken the Left parties' stand obnoxious pieces of legislation such as UAPA. The Conference also called for frequent consultations within the LDF and evolving a consensus in the functioning of the LDF Government.

The political report voiced the CPI's reservations on the SilverLine project. The CPI has all along been of the firm view that such mega projects should be implemented only after taking the people into confidence. The report also referred to the ongoing protest against the Vizhinjam port project. The conference stressed the importance of drawing up coastal conservation plans.

Significantly, Kanam has become the fourth leader from the party to secure three terms as state secretary. The other leaders have enjoyed three terms are NE Balaram, Vasudevan Nair VeliyamBhargavan. Strengthening the party at the grassroots level is the major challenging Kanam is facing. True, the party has recorded growth. But as a party leader said, much more remains to be done. For instance, the CPI has party units in all panchayats and majority of the wards. The immediate task is to ensure the party's presence in all wards. No less important is the need to keep the CPI's identity intact in the LDF. (IPA)





Previous Congress govt was like ATM for party high command: Bommai



HUVINA HUDAGALI, OCT 13/--/Karnataka Chief Minister Basavaraj Bommai on Thursday alleged that the previous Congress government in the State was like an ATM (any time money) for its high command, and money from the State was taken in suitcases by that party to fight elections elsewhere. He accused Congress president Sonia Gandhi of betrayal, recalling that she had fought and won the Lok Sabha elections from Ballari in 1999 by making false promises, and then giving up the seat in favour of the Gandhi family bastion of Amethi in Uttar Pradesh, the other constituency from where she had contested and won that polls that

"They (Cong) allege BJP government here is giving money to its high command. The former Chief Minister (Siddaramaiah) is saying such things out of his experience, as he has had the practice of giving money to Congress high command for five years in the past (2013-18). Such a culture doesn't exist in the BJP, if there is such a tradition and history it is in the Congress party and its high command," Bommai said. Addressing a rally as part of BJP's 'Jana Sankalpa Yatra' here, he said the Congress government in Karnataka was like an ATM for the party high command for five years, and if there were elections elsewhere, money was taken in suitcases from here. "Looting Karnataka, the then Congress government sent money as tribute offering to its high command, with what morality are they speaking? They should be ashamed. Having involved himself in such a transaction, your State party president (D K Shivakumar) is facing inquiry today. I pity him, he is going through things for trying to protect your (Congress) high command," he added. Bommai, along with BJP strongman B S Yediyurappa, is on a Statewide tour in the run-up to Assembly polls next year, and the duo is scheduled to cover 52 Assem-

bly segments till December 25. Noting that the Congress' Bharat Jodo Yatra led by Rahul Gandhi is reaching Ballari on Friday, the Chief Minister, while recalling Sonia Gandhi winning Lok Sabha election from there and then giving it up, said, " After taking votes from people this region, she never turned back, she made false promises and did injustice to you. Now they (Cong) are coming back, shouldn't you question them and give them a message that their false promises and betrayal will not work

anymore?"
Recalling that people during 1999 Lok Sabha election had sought all-round development of Ballari region, and that Sonia Gandhi and the Congress, which was then in power, had promised Rs 3,000-crore package, he said, "Where is Rs 3,000 crore? What development? Other than Rs 1,500-crore thermal plant which was for the entire State nothing was done to Ballari...With what face are you coming?"

The Chief Minister at the rally made BJP ticket aspirants of Huvina Hadagali Assembly constituency take a pledge that they would unitedly work for the party's victory, irrespective of whoever among them is fielded as the candidate during 2023 polls. SC delivers split verdict on Karnataka hijab row

Matter to be placed before CJI to set up appropriate bench

 $\bf NEW\ DELHI,\ OCT\ 13\ /\text{--/}$ The Supreme Court on Thursday delivered a split verdict on the hijab ban in Karnataka's educational institutions, with one judge holding permitting a community to wear its religious symbols will be an "antithesis to secularism" and the other insisting that wearing the Muslim headscarf should be simply a "matter of choice". While Justice Hemant Gupta dismissed the appeals challenging the March 15 judgement of the Karnataka High Court which had refused to lift the ban, Justice Sudhanshu Dhulia held there shall be no restriction on the wearing of hijab anywhere in the schools and colleges of the state. With the apex court delivering a split verdict, the high court's judgement still holds the field. However, the split verdict held off a permanent resolution of the vexed row over hijab as both judges suggested placing the matter before a larger bench for adjudication. Writing a separate 73-page judgement, Justice Dhulia said: "By asking the girls to take off their hijab before they enter the school gates, is first an invasion on their privacy, then it is an attack on their dignity, and then ultimately it is a denial to them of secular education."

Justice Gupta, who was heading the bench and wrote a contrary verdict running into 133-pages, answered the 11 questions framed by him for consideration in the matter and said the constitutional goal of fraternity will be defeated if the students are permitted to carry their apparent religious symbols with them to the classroom. While pronouncing the judgement on

a batch of 26 petitions, Justice Gupta said at the outset: "There is divergence of opinion." "In view of the divergent views expressed by the bench, the matter be placed before the Chief Justice of India for constitution of an appropriate bench," the apex court said. In his verdict, Justice Gupta said the arguments advanced by the counsel for some of the appellants that this matter involves a substantial question of law and should be referred to a five-judge bench is "not tenable".

Both the judges referred to the state government's February 5, 2022 order which banned wearing clothes that disturb equality, integrity, and public order in schools and colleges. Justice Gupta noted the government order "promotes an equal environment". "Accordingly, I do not find that the government order impinges on the constitutional promise of fraternity and dignity. Instead, it promotes an equal environment where such fraternal values can be imbibed and nurtured without any hindrance of any kind," he said. On the other hand, Justice Dhulia set aside the High Court verdict and also quashed the February 5, 2022 government order. "Under our constitutional scheme, wearing a hijab should be simply a matter of choice. It may or may not be a matter of essential religious practice, but it still is, a matter of conscience, belief, and expression," he said. Justice Dhulia further said the "unfortunate fallout of the hijab restriction would be that we would have denied education to a girl child." He referred to the four questions

formulated by the high court, including whether wearing hijab or headscarf is a part of essential religious practice in Islamic faith protected under Article 25 of the Constitution. "In my opinion, the question of Essential Religious Practices, which we have also referred in this judgement as ERP, was not at all relevant in the determination of the dispute before the court. I say this because when protection is sought under Article 25(1) of the Constitution of India, as is being done in the present case, it is not required for an individual to establish that what he or she asserts is an ERP," Justice Dhulia said.

"It may simply be any religious practice, a matter of faith or conscience! Yes, what is asserted as a right should not go against 'public order, morality and health,' and of course, it is subject to other provisions of Part III of the Constitution," he said. Justice Dhulia said in his opinion, courts are not the forums to solve "theological questions". "Courts are not well equipped to do that for various reasons, but most importantly because there will always be more than one viewpoint on a particular religious matter, and therefore nothing gives the authority to the Court to pick one over the other," he said. In his verdict, Justice Gupta noted that some of the appellants had also made a comparison with the rights of the followers of the Sikh faith by arguing that since 'Kirpan' is allowed in terms of Explanation I to Article 25, therefore, the students who want to wear headscarf should be equally protected as in the case of the followers of the Sikh religion. Will always support uniforms in schools; no hijab or other dresses, says BJP

Matter will continue to attract SC's attention: Cong

NEW DELHI, OCT 13 /--/ The BJP on Thursday asserted that it will always be opposed to students wearing hijab or any dress other than uniforms in schools, and said religious freedom cannot be used to promote "separatism".\ Soon after the Supreme Court gave a split verdict on the ban on hijabs in Karnataka educational institutions, BJP national general secretary C T Ravi, a senior party leader from the state, said it will not be appropriate for him to comment on the judgement. But he will always speak against the "separatist mindset" that, Ravi claimed, promotes the use of Muslim headscarf in schools. "Uniform in schools is meant to promote uniformity among students. I believe that separatism is promoted in the garb of issues like promotion of burqa or hijab. This mindset was the reason behind India's partition. This separatism progressively morphs into extremism which can be a source of terrorism," he claimed. Rules mandating wearing uniform in Karnataka schools have been in force since 1965, he said. Citing popular protests in Iran, an Islamic country, against the mandatory use of hijabs, the BJP leader claimed that religion freedom in India cannot mean promotion of "separatist" designs. He added that the issue is not about wearing or not wearing hijab but what to wear in schools. And there should be no hijab or other dresses in schools but only uniforms, Ravi said. Meanwhile, the Congress said the Supreme Court's split verdict in the hijab case means the matter will continue to attract the apex court's attention. And the Bharat Jodo Yatra, it added, will keep demanding accountability from Prime Minister Narendra Modi on issues such as economic inequality. "The Supreme Court's split verdict in the hijab case means that the matter will continue to attract that court's attention. Meanwhile, the Bharat Jodo Yatra will continue to demand accountability from Prime Minister Narendra Modi on rising economic inequality, social polarisation and political dictatorship," Congress general secretary Jairam Ramesh said in a tweet in Hindi.

TMC, Cong criticise Dhankhar for his remarks on Bengal; BJP, CPM come out in support

KOLKATA, OCT 13/--/Theruling TMC and Opposition Congress in West Bengal Thursday criticised Vice President Jagdeep Dhankhar for his comments on West Bengal's law and order situation saying they are not befitting for the post he holds. The BJP state unit came out in support of Dhankhar and said it is good that he is portraying the "true picture' of the state. The Vice-President speaking at a programme in New Delhi on Wednesday said "Law of the ruler, not the rule of law, is the bane of human rights in the state (West Bengal)". He was speaking at a programme of the NHRC in New Delhi where he recalled that a fact finding committee of the National Human Rights Commission (NHRC), formed on the order of the Calcutta High Court over petitions related to alleged post-poll violence in 2021, had said in a report that law of the ruler and not the rule of law prevailed in West Bengal. Dhankar was the Governor of the state for nearly three years before his elevation as the vicepresident of India and had on many occasions engaged in tussles with the Mamata Banerjee government over the law and order situation and other issues in the state. Senior TMC leader Sougata Roy said that it was wrong on Dhankhar's part to make such criticisms. "The comments by Dhankhar do not behove the post he holds ... It was wrong on his part to nave made such comments and we had opposed him back then too (when Dhankhar was the governor), as we do now." the veteran TMC MP added, TMC MP Santanu Sen said it seems Dhankhar is yet to avoid his anti-Bengal views. 'Whatever post he may hold, it seems he is vet to shun his anti-Bengal views. We condemn his remarks," Sen said. TMC had abstained from the Vice-Presidential election as it did not agree with the process the candidate was decided upon without keeping the party in the loop and had



supported the opposition candidate Margaret Alva. The decision was not unexpected given the acrimonious relationship that Dhankhar, who was the NDA nominee in the Vice-Presidential poll shared with the party in West Bengal The Congress too slammed Dhankhar and its leader in Lok Sabha Adhir Ranjan Chowdhury wondered why he was silent on the worsening law and order situation in the BJP-ruled states. "It seems he is perturbed about the law and order situation in West Bengal. But why is he silent on the poor law and order situation in the BJP-ruled states? Despite holding a top constitutional post, it seems he is yet to shrug off his bias towards the BJP," Chowdhuty, who is also the president of Congress in the state, said. Supporting Dhankhar, West Bengal BJP MP Locket Chatterjee said "It is good that despite being the vice president, he has not forgotten West Bengal. It is good that he (Dhankhar) is portraying the true picture of West Bengal before the nation," she said. "The entire country should know the atrocities the TMC had unleashed on political opponents in West Bengal (after the state election)," Chatterjee added. CPM Central committee member Sujan Chakraborty said Dhankhar had spoken the truth. (PTI)

Earlier govts did not give Indians facilities available elsewhere even in previous century: Modi

UNA/CHAMBA, OCT 13 /--/ Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Thursday accused the past governments of not providing facilities that were available to people elsewhere in the world even in the previous century and in his home state Gujarat a few years back.

Ahead of the Assembly polls in Himachal Pradesh by the year-end, he launched a slew of development projects in Una and Chamba. In Una, Modi flagged off a Vande Bharat Express, the fourth train in the series. Addressing public meetings, he hoped that the state will break the trend this time of electing different parties every election. The Prime Minister also stressed the benefits of the "double-engine" government, a reference to the BJP being in power both in Himachal Pradesh and at the Centre. "We will provide you facilities of the 20th as well as the 21st centuries," he said, addressing a rally at the Indira Gandhi stadium in Una. "Our government is fulfilling the aspirations of 21st-century India. New India is overcoming challenges of the past and growing rapidly," Modi added. "Earlier governments at the Centre and in the state failed to understand your needs. My government is not only fulfilling the needs of the people, but is doing it with full strength," the Prime Minister said. Modi also hit out at the Opposition, saying 'Dev Bhoomi' Himachal has the grace of nature but previous governments did not work to fill the development gap. "After coming to power, we not only filled that gap but also wrote a new chapter of development," he said. In an apparent reference to the "double-engine" government, Modi said earlier, Himachal BJP chief ministers PK Dhumal and Shanta Kumar had to go to Delhi with BJP workers to seek approval for even small projects. Now, he added, the chief minister goes to Delhi to inform about the completion of projects. Modi recalled a saying that the youth and the water in the hills is of little use locally, a reference to migration and the flow of water downhill. The Prime Minister said his government has changed the proverb. Modi further said the BJP's double-engine government has made domestic gas connections available for every home. Hundred per cent piped water coverage has been made in tribal areas of Lahaul-Spiti and Kinnaur under the 'Har Ghar Jal Yojna', he said. (PTI)

You can't be an administrator forever, but it's been fun doing both and seeing both sides of the coin. I will go for bigger things in future," Ganguly said on the sidelines of an event related to Bandhan bank. "I was a cricketer's administrator. Yes you had to make decisions because there's so much cricket happening, there's so much money around. There's women's cricket, there's domestic cricket. Yes you had to take calls at times as an individual," he added. Ganguly was keen to continue as the BCCI chief, but things did not pan out that way, even as Jay Shah is set to continue as the secretary. "For me, life is about faith. After his name did not feature among options for the top post during a meeting of senior administrators with political clout in New Delhi last week, the Trinamool Congress (TMC) accused the BJP of "trying to humiliate" the former India skipper for not joining the party. "Since the BJP floated such propaganda during and after the 2021 polls, it will surely be the responsibility of the party to respond to such speculations (that politics is behind Ganguly not getting a

BJP is trying to humiliate Souray," TMC spokesperson Kunal Ghosh said. TMC MP Santanu Sen tweeted: "Another example of political vendetta. Son of @AmitShah can be retained as Secretary of #BCCI. But @SGanguly99 can't be. Is it because he is from the State of @MamataOfficial or he didn't join @BJP4India? We are with you Dada!" Ganguly first got into cricket administration as a secretary under Jagmohan Dalmiya at the Cricket Association of Bengal (CAB), before heading the state body after the veteran's death in September 2015. Speaking of achieving success, the former skipper cited the example of Prime Minister Narendra Modi. "Life, achievements and progresses are about small goals, you don't become a Sachin Tendulkar, or an Ambani or Narendra Modi in one day. "You have to spend your life, time, days, weeks, months working towards it. That's the key to success. If you decide that this is my job, this is my life, give everything you have for the rest of your life to be the best," the

China accuses US of 'Cold War thinking' in security strategy

BEIJING, OCT 13/--/The Chinese government on Thursday accused Washington of "Cold War thinking" and appealed for efforts to repair strained relations after President Joe Biden released a national security strategy that calls for "out-competing China" and blocking its efforts to reshape global affairs. The foreign ministry also accused Washington of trade protectionism after Treasury Secretary Janet Yellen said the United States would reinforce its global supply chains to guard against "geopolitical coercion" by China, Russia and other governments. Biden's document Wednesday accused China of trying to erode US alliances and create more permissive conditions for its own authoritarian model. It called for outcompeting China in political alliances and global governance as well as business, technology and military affairs. US-Chinese relations are at their lowest level in decades, strained by disputes over technology, security, Taiwan and human rights. "Cold War thinking and zero-sum games, sensationalising geopolitical conflicts and great power competition are unpopular and unconstructive," said Foreign Ministry spokesperson Mao Ning. She called on Washington to meet China halfway and promote China-US relations back to a healthy and stable track

The White House document calls for the United States to maintain a competitive edge over China, which has antagonised Japan, India and other neighbours with an increasingly assertive foreign policy and growing military. China's multibillion-dollar Belt and Road Initiative to build ports, railways and other infrastructure across Asia and Africa has fed concern in Washington, Moscow and other capitals that Beijing is trying to build its strategic influence and undermine theirs. China, with the second-largest global economy and military, is the only competitor with both the intent to reshape the international order and, increasingly, the economic, diplomatic, military and technological power to do it, the document says.

Mao, speaking at a regular news briefing, said China was a defender of the world order and rejected sensationalising geopolitical conflicts and great power competition. Mao criticised the "weaponisation of economic and trade issues after Yellen said Wednesday the United States was trying to reduce reliance on China and other Asian suppliers of semiconductors, electric vehicle batteries, solar panels and other technology. President Xi Jinping's government is spending heavily to reduce its need for US and other Western technology by developing its own creators of processor chips, artificial intelligence, aerospace and other know-how. Beijing is pressing Chinese companies to reduce reliance on global supply chains by using domestic vendors whenever possible, even if that

UK PM Liz Truss under pressure over tax cuts

LONDON, OCT 13/--/The Cabinet is attempting to rally behind embattled British Prime Minister Liz Truss on Thursday as her Conservative Party backbenchers are up in arms against her tax-cutting economic policies, which



they see as favouring the rich amid a cost-of-living crisis and giving the Opposition Labour Party a lead in opinion polls

Foreign Secretary James Cleverly warned that it would be a disastrously bad idea to think about replacing Truss as the Tory leader, just over a month after she was elected by the party membership in

a leadership battle with former Chancellor Rishi Sunak on September 6. Since then the government's mini-budget tabled at the end of last month has unleashed turmoil in the financial markets due to fears of unfunded tax cuts introduced by Chancellor Kwasi Kwarteng, despite a forced U-turn on abolishing the top rate for the wealthiest in the country. We have got to recognise that we do need to bring certainty to the markets, Cleverly told the BBC with $reference \,to \,the \,financial \,turmoil.\,I\,think\,that\,changing\,the$ leadership would be a disastrously bad idea, not just politically but also economically, and we are absolutely going to stay focused on growing the economy, he said.

It will be seen as a clear warning to the Conservative Party against plotting Truss' overthrow, just weeks after being elected as party leader and taking charge at 10 Downing Street. Truss is facing growing calls within her own party to scrap all or part of her economic programme, to be finalised with a fiscal statement scheduled at the end of the month, to shore up the UK's economic position ahead of a difficult winter.

Under the Tory party rules, Truss technically cannot face a leadership challenge until 12 months unless the powerful 1922 Committee of backbench MPs votes to change their rules. At a meeting to win over the committee attended by Truss on Wednesday evening, the backbenchers are believed to have made their disapproval of the new leader's policies abundantly clear. (PTI)

India desires normal relations with all its neighbours, including Pakistan: MoS Lekhi at CICA summit in Astana

Thursday that it desired normal relations with all its neighbours, including Pakistan, and advised Islamabad to create a conducive atmosphere, including by taking "credible, verifiable and irreversible actions" to stop cross border terrorism against it and enable the two countries to engage and address issues bilaterally. Describing Pakistan as the "global epicentre of terrorism," Minister of State for External Affairs Meenakashi Lekhi said the neighbouring country continues to be the source of terrorist activities, including in India. Lekhi's strong statement came after Pakistan Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif raised the Kashmir issue in his address to the 6th Summit of the Conference on Interaction and Confidence Building Measures in Asia (CICA) in Astana, Kazakhstan.

In his address, Sharif said that he was willing to engage with India, but asserted that the onus remains on New Delhi to take the necessary steps for meaningful and result-oriented engagement . He also accused India of human rights violations in Kashmir, Hitting back, Lekhi said Pakistan has no locus standi to comment on India's internal affairs. "Pakistan's remarks today constitute gross interference in India's internal affairs, sovereignty and territorial integrity..., she said.

"Pakistan continues to make no investment in human development but provides their resources for creating and sustaining infrastructure of terrorism." she told the summit. In her address, Lekhi said India desired normal relations with all its neighbours, including Pakistan, "Pakistan is thereby advised to walk the talk by creating a conducive atmosphere, including by taking credible, verifiable and irreversible actions to not allow any territory under its control to be used for cross border terrorism against India in any manner, she said. This will enable the two countries to engage and address issues bilaterally rather than distract this important international forum from its agenda of cooperation, she said.

She said it was unfortunate that Pakistan has "chosen to once again misuse the CICA platform to propagate false and malicious propaganda against my country and distract from the theme and focus of todav's discussions and cooperation among Member

She said the Union Territories of Jammu and Kashmir and Ladakh have been and will remain an integral part of India. She also asked Pakistan to immediately cease anti-India cross-border terrorism and shut down its infrastructure of terrorism. "It will do well to stop the grave and persistent

ASTANA, OCT 13/--/India said on human rights violations in Pakistan occupied Jammu, Kashmir & Ladakh (PoJKL); refrain from effecting any further material changes in the status of PoJKL; and vacate the Indian territories that are under its

"The frequent instances of attack and vandalism on the places of worship of minority communities in Pakistan and the countless cases of abduction, forced conversion and marriage of minor girls from minority communities in Pakistan are evidence of the vulnerable status of minorities in this country, she said.

A day earlier, India slammed Pakistan for raising the Kashmir issue during an emergency special session of the UN General Assembly on the Ukraine conflict in New York, saying such statements by Islamabad deserve the "collective contempt" of the international community and "sympathy for a mindset which repeatedly utters falsehoods".

In his remarks to the UNGA emergency special session that was convened on the Ukrainian conflict. Pakistan's ambassador to the UN Munir Akram had raised the issue of Kashmir. Malaysian opposition leader Anwar hopeful of election win

PETALING JAYA, OCT 13/--/Malaysian opposition leader Anwar Ibrahim said Thursday he was optimistic that his alliance can achieve a simple majority in general elections expected to be held next month, despite the odds stacked against them. Riding on a wave of anger over government corruption, Anwar's three-party Hope Alliance won a stunning victory in 2018 polls with the help of former Prime Minister Mahathir Mohamad. On his second run of premiership, Mahathir became the world's oldest at 92, but their government collapsed less than two years later due to infighting. The United Malays National Organisation, which has led Malaysia since its independence from Britain in 1957 until its defeat in 2018, has since returned to power as part of a Malay-dominant coalition.

Prime Minister Ismail Sabri Yaakob, a UMNO man, dissolved Parliament on Monday for early polls despite major floods expected next month due to the year-end monsoon season. UMNO has been feuding with its allies in the government and believes it can win big on its own after victories in several recent by-elections. Anwar said UMNO's victory in the by-elections were mainly due to a low turnout of opposition voters, who were disillusioned by political bickering and his alliance's collapse.

I remain very optimistic, he told a news conference, because public awareness of government corruption and its failure to bolster the economy and improve livelihoods is high. We are confident. We must work towards achieving a simple majority. Anwar, once a high-flyer in UMNO, was in jail during the 2018 polls for sodomy charges he said were politically motivated. Anwar, 75, was pardoned after his alliance won the polls and was due to take over from Mahathir before their government collapsed.

Anwar admitted the former government under Mahathir did fail in some major core issues." He has said previously that Mahathir, who has since formed a Malay party on his own, was not fully committed to reforms.

I am not here to represent the former administration. We are looking at the future. From what I observe from my visits to the four, five states in the last few weeks, there is clearly a marked change (in support) and that momentum (for change) has begun," Anwar said.

His camp is open to work with other opposition parties including Mahathir's if they are committed to reforms, he added. Anwar's alliance, which has 90 out of 222 seats in the just-dissolved Parliament, is the main contender. But analysts said it will need to forge cooperation with other smaller opposition parties to ensure votes are not split. The Election Commission will meet Oct. 20 to set a date for the vote, which must be held within 60 days after Parliament

Smoking, diabetes, obesity bigger risk factors for Covid death than heart ailment: Study

WASHINGTON, OCT 13/--/Risk factors for cardiovascular disease such as obesity, smoking and diabetes, rather than preexisting heart disease, are the main contributors to death and poor outcomes among critically ill COVID-19 patients, according to a study. Patients with cardiovascular disease were found to have close to a 30 per cent higher mortality rate than critically ill COVID patients without the preexisting condition. However, when adjusted for risk factors -- including age, sex, race, smoking and others -- that relationship was no longer statistically significant. "The fact that the association between cardiovascular disease and death was so heavily diminished when accounting for comorbidities suggests that cardiovascular risk factors rather than preexisting heart disease are the main contributors to in-hospital death in patients with severe COVID-19," said senior author Salim Hayek. The team, led by researchers at the University of Michigan in the US, analysed outcomes for more than 5,100 patients admitted to intensive care units at 68 centers across the US with severe COVID between March and June of 2020. Of those patients, 1,174 had either preexisting coronary artery disease, congestive heart failure or atrial fibrillation. A total of 34.6 per cent of patients died within 28 days and nearly 18 per cent suffered a cardiovascular event, such as cardiac arrest or myocarditis.

Researchers say the association between such events and death did not differ between patients with and without preexisting heart disease. The study, published in the journal Circulation: Cardiovascular Quality and Outcomes, found that the presence of myocardial injury was associated with cardiovascular events and death, regardless of whether a patient had preexisting heart disease. Myocardial injury was common among patients in the ICU, occurring in nearly half of patients who had heightened levels of troponin, a protein released when the heart muscle is damaged. Patients with the highest troponin measurements were nearly three times more likely to die than those without myocardial injury, the researchers said in a statement. "While patients with severe COVID commonly had signs of cardiac injury, our findings reinforce COVID-19 as a pulmonary disease with multiorgan injury related to systemic inflammation," Hayek

China quashes social media about protest banners in Beijing

BEIJING, OCT 13/--/ China's internet censors moved quickly to scrub social media posts Thursday after reports that banners criticising the Communist leadership were hung from a busy intersection in the capital Beijing. Images on Twitter, which is blocked in China, showed smoke spiralling up from a fire on an elevated roadway and banners calling for an end to the hard-line zero-COVID policy and the overthrow of Communist Party leader and President Xi Jinping. Political protest is rare in China, and police are on high alert this week in the run-up to a major Communist Party congress that opens Sunday. There were no banners hanging from the roadway later in the day, but a circular black scar was visible on the shoulder area where the fire would have been. It was not clear who might have hung the banners or when they were placed.

Dozens of police milled about the area, entering stores. At times, they stopped pedestrians and questioned them. Associated Press journalists were questioned three times and asked to produce identification. Police denied anything unusual had happened in the area. Three shopkeepers also denied seeing any banners, smoke or any unusual activity. One woman shook her head no without even looking up from her sewing machine. But a cyclist waiting at a stoplight was overheard saying that traffic was clogged in the area in the morning and smoke was billowing from the bridge. Posts containing the hashtags Beijing or Haidian were quickly blocked on China's popular Weibo social media platform. Some of the posts expressed support and praised the unidentified person's courage without referring to the incident directly. Others said on Twitter that their accounts had been temporarily disabled on another major Chinese platform, WeChat, after they shared photos of the incident. A song named Sitong

'akistan reports rape of a woman every two hours: <u>Survey</u>

ISLAMABAD, OCT 13/--/A woman is raped in Pakistan in every two hours, according to a recent survey, highlighting the unsafe conditions for women in the country where cases of honour killing is also rampant. The survey. which was conducted by Pakistani channel SAMAA Investigation Unit (SIU) based on the data collected from the Punjab province's home department and Ministry of Human Rights, also found that while the rape cases of women spiked, the conviction rate remained an abysmal 0.2 per cent.

"Newly collected and compiled data showed that as many as 21,900 women were reported to have been raped in the country from 2017 to 2021. This meant that around 12 women were raped across the country daily, or one woman every two hours," said the survey.

According to the surveyors, these reported cases could be just the tip of the iceberg since societal stigma and fear of retributive violence prevent women from reporting the incidents to the authorities. The data showed that in 2017, some 3,327 cases of rape



were reported. This jumped to 4,456 cases in 2018, 4,573 cases in 2019, dipped to 4,478 cases in 2020 before rising to 5,169 cases in 2021, the report said.

In 2022, the media reported 305 rape cases across the country. As many as 57 cases were reported in May, June (91), July (86) and August (71). Previously media reports have said that in Punjab, around 350 rape cases were reported from May 2022 to August 2022 but no data was available for the first four months of the year. In

2022, as many as 1,301 cases of sexual violence against women were heard in 44 courts in Pakistan. The police filed charge sheets in 2,856 cases. But only 4 per cent of the cases went to trial, the report said. The conviction rate in rape cases during this period remained at an abysmal 0.2 per cent, the report highlighted. In 2020, the United Nations Development Programme ranked Pakistan top among the 75 countries with an anti-women bias in courts.

In July this year, a report

released by the World Economic Forum placed Pakistan as the second-worst country in terms of gender parity and put it at the 145th spot in a survey of 146 countries. The only worse performer than Pakistan was Afghanistan. Pakistan (145th) has a population of 107 million women, and in 2022 has closed 56.4 per cent of the gender gap that affects them. This is the highest overall level of parity Pakistan has posted since the WEF report was launched. Pakistan has also been urged by international bodies, including the United Nations, to take action against the rising cases of honour killings in the country. According to the Human Rights Commission of Pakistan data, 1,957 incidents of honour killings were reported over the past four years, according to a

report by the The Express Tribune. The average rate of honour killing in women between 15-64 years was found to be 15 per million women per year. "This may be yet another dubious world distinction we have achieved", the article in the newspaper

Tri-series: Pakistan beat Bangladesh by 7 wickets

tri-series final against hosts New Zealand with a nervewracking seven-wicket win over Bangladesh on Thursday after Mohammad Nawaz secured victory with just a ball to



spare. Litton Das, who brushed off an early leg strain to put in a gutsy performance, and captain Shakib Al Hasan both chalked up half-centuries for Bangladesh to set Pakistan 174 to win in Christchurch. In reply, Pakistan had to work for the win as allrounder Nawaz put in a match-changing innings of 45 off 20 balls. With his side needing eight runs from the final over, Nawaz delivered by grabbing three doubles, then sealed the victory with a four squeezed between point and short third-man. Pakistan face hosts New Zealand in Friday's final while Bangladesh finish on four straight defeats in the tri-series, a warm-up event ahead of the Twenty20 World Cup in Australia. Pakistan's Mohammad Rizwan was the man of the match, but he immediately paid tribute to Nawaz. "I'd like to credit Mohammad Nawaz as he made it easy in the end," said Rizwan, top-scorer with 69 runs off 56 balls. "Nawaz's innings changed the momentum. "Obviously, the win gives us confidence, but New Zealand is playing at home." Bangladesh opener Das had earlier produced a gutsy display despite needing treatment for an early thigh strain. While his opening partner Najmul Hossain Shanto and Soumya Sarkar were both caught early on, Das dug in with a superb 69 off 42 balls, firing six fours and two sixes around Hagley Oval. After Das was finally caught by Mohammad Wasim, Shakib Al Hasan kept the scoreboard ticking over with 68 runs off 42 balls. In reply, Pakistan openers Rizwan and Babar Azam put on a partnership of 101. After reaching 55 runs off 40 balls, Azam was finally caught in the 12th over. Then Haider Ali immediately went for a duck, clean bowled by Hasan Mahmud. At 101-2, Pakistan were under pressure. But Nawaz wrestled the match away from Bangladesh with a stunning four, then a six, and another four off three consecutive balls in the 15th over. Bangladesh took the game to the wire when Rizwan was finally caught at deep cover. However, Nawaz kept his cool to see Pakistan home. "It's been difficult, but we played our best game today," said disappointed Bangladesh captain Shakib al Hasan. (AFP)

Don't just look to survive against Shaheed Afridi, look to score runs: Gambhir to India

NEW DELHI, OCT 13 /--/ India must counter Pakistan leftarm pacer Shaheeh Shah Afridi in an aggressive manner and not just look to see him off in their T20 World Cup opener, former cricketer Gautam Gambhir said on Wednesday. India will take on arch-rivals on October 23 in Melbourne. Afridi, who is returning from a knee injury that ruled him out of the Asia Cup, is expected to pose a serious threat to the Indian batters at the Melbourne Cricket Ground in the upcoming T20 showpiece. "When it comes to Shaheen Afridi, don't look to survive. Look to score runs from him. Because the moment you look to survive, everything becomes really small. Whether it's your backlift, whether it's your footwork, and obviously, in T20 $cricket\ you\ can't\ look\ to\ survive, "\ Gambhir\ said\ while$ speaking on Star Sports show 'Game Plan'. "I know that he can be dangerous with the new ball, but again, irrespective, the Indian batters need to score more runs, get into better positions, and look to time the balls rather than to hit it. "India will be fine because India has got the quality in their top 3 or 4 who can definitely take on Shaheen Shah Afridi," the former world T20 winner added. Gambhir's former teammate and former left-arm pacer Irfan Pathan said Indian batters need to play smartly at the iconic MCG. "When you play at the MCG, the straight boundaries are not that big. It's the side boundaries that are massive. Obviously, India need to be smart, especially the batting. "Probably, it will be difficult to hit the side boundaries, so they have to play the gaps and probably convert the twos into threes and ones into twos, because running between the wickets will be very important," he suggested. Irfan also had advise for Indian bowlers against the likes of Pakistan captain Babar Azam and Mohammad Rizwan. "Don't give them any width whatsoever, especially Rizwan, because he's the guy who takes the Powerplay on his shoulders. Just try to get the pace going. Babar takes his time. So, you need to be aware of those situations and those batters," he said. "The line has to be on the stumps, with tight lines. And with both batters, the length changes slightly. When it comes to Rizwan, you can afford to bowl more fuller. You can try to hit him beneath the knee roll. This is where your line and length can be. "And when it comes to Babar Aazam, you need to get him out LBW, but your aim should not be on his front leg, it should be behind his leg because he's slightly open. This is where Arshdeep and Bhuvaneshwar Kumar come in with that in-swinging delivery," Irfan added. (PTI)

According to a report by the news agency PTI, the BCCI did offer Ganguly another role within the board which the former skipper declined. The BCCI had offered Ganguly to be the chairman of the Indian Premier League (IPL) but considering it as a more minor role as compared to being the Board president, the former India captain denied the offer.

"Souray was offered IPL chairmanship but he politely declined the offer. His logic was that he cannot accept becoming head of a sub-committee in BCCI after heading the same institution. He had expressed

interest in continuing in the position," the news agency quoted a BCCI source as saying. Soon after PTI reported the news about Ganguly, fans flooded social media with reactions to the development that took place during the BCCI meeting. It was Ganguly who sacked Virat Kohli as the captain of the ODI team after a fallout between him and Kohli saw the latter stepping down from T20I and Test captaincy. Ganguly is expected to hand over the reins to Roger Binny on October 18 during the BCCI AGM meeting. While Ganguly is set to vacate his post, Jay Shah will continue to serve as the honorary secretary of the BCCI. Apart from continuing as the BCCI secretary, Jay Shah is also reportedly tipped to replace Ganguly to represent the Indian cricket board at the ICC board meetings. During Ganguly's tenure a lot of controversies took place and the communication gap between players and the board was visible to everyone as the Kohli saga unfolded. Dominant India crush Thailand by 74 runs to enter women's Asia Cup final

SYLHET, OCT 13 /--/ A dominant India crushed minnows Thailand by 74 runs to storm into the final and remain on course for a recordextending seventh women's Asia Cup title here on Thursday.

The win over Thailand took India to their eighth straight Asia Cup final -- four each in ODI and T20 formats. Before 2012, the tournament was a 50over-a-side affair. The semifinal contest against Thailand was always expected to be a cakewalk for India and it turned out to be so. India posted 148 for six after being sent in to bat and then restricted Thailand to 74 for 9 in the lop-sided contest. Chasing the target, Thailand were never in the hunt as they lost wickets at regular intervals. The Thai women, however, fared much better than their previous outing against India in the league stage, where they were crushed by nine wickets. In that match, the Indians bundled out Thailand for just 37 runs in 15.1 overs and then chased down the target with consummate ease. On Thursday, the Thai women gave a better account of themselves with the bat despite being reduced to 21 for 4 in the eighth over. Deepti Sharma (3/ 7) did most of the damage with her offspin, picking up the first three Thai wickets -- Nannapat Koncharoenkai, Natthakan Chantham and Sornnarin Tippoch -- in consecutive overs.

Medium pacer Renuka Singh (1/6) then cleaned Chanida Sutthiruang as Thailand's chase fell apart. Captain Naruemol Chaiwai (21) and Nattaya Boochatham (21) showed some resistance with the bat with a 42-run stand for the fifth wicket but the asking rate was too tall. In fact, they were the only two Thai batters to register double digit scores. Once the duo departed, the Indian bowlers just ran through Thailand lower-order batting line-up. Rajeshwari Gayakwad (2/10), Shafali Verma (1/10) and Sneh Rana (1/16)were the other wicket takers for India.

Earlier, invited to bat, Shafali Verma was at her destructive best, topscoring for India with a 28-ball 42 with the help of five boundaries and one hit over the fence. Together with vicecaptain Smriti Mandhana, Verma shared 38 runs in 4.3 overs before the former hit a low full toss from Phannita straight to Onnicha Kamchomphu at mid on. Verma continued her attacking batting but was the next batter to depart, miscuing off-spinner Sornnarin Tippoch's flighted delivery to Thailand skipper Naruemol Chaiwai at short midwicket. Most of the dismissals were gifts to Thai bowlers as the Indian batters were guilty of giving away their wickets after getting starts. Jemimah Rodrigues (27) was the next to loft one straight to Rosenan Kanoh at long-on off Thipatcha Putthawong. Tippoch then had two wickets in successive overs to reduce India to 132 for 5 in the 18th over. First, she caught wicketkeeper Richa Ghosh plumb in front of the wicket and an over later, got the big wicket of skipper Harmanpreet Kaur as the batter tried to clear the cover boundary. Harmanpreet, who returned to lead the side after missing out two matches due to a niggle, looked in good nick and laced her 30-ball 36 with four hits to the fence. Towards the end, Pooja Vastrakar hit a quick 13-ball 17 with the help of a six to take India close to the 150-run mark. Sornnarin Tippoch was the best bowler for Thailand with figures of 3/24. AIFF to initiate enquiry on late arrival of player boots

BHUBANESWAR, OCT 13 /--/ The All India Football Federation (AIFF) will initiate an enquiry on the late arrival of boots of four members of the FIFA Women's U-17 World Cup squad, leading to the players wearing them for the first time during the match against USA.

AIFF secretary general Shaji Prabhakaran said that he has asked for a report from the national teams department on how the consignment of new boots did not reach on time. He said action will be taken if needed. "After going through the preliminary report, we will initiate an enquiry to find out facts and fix the responsibility," Prabhakaran told PTI on Thursday. It is learnt that some players -- mostly those who wear smaller number -- had requested for new boots last month, but the delivery got late as it was brought via land transport. Prabhakaran said the AIFF does not still know the reasons for the delay in delivery of the boots to the players, and that's why the report has been sought. "We have sought a report from the national team department of the AIFF. We don't have the full facts how this happened," he added. (PTI)

Women's IPL set to take place in March with 5 teams, max 5 overseas players in XI

NEW DELHI, OCT 13 /--/ The much-awaited inaugural edition of Women's IPL will have five teams and is set to take place in March 2023 before the start of men's IPL. As per a BCCI note accessed by PTI, the tournament will feature 20 league games with teams to play each other twice. The table toppers will get a direct entry into the final, while the second and third place teams will battle out in the Eliminator. Each team can have no more than five overseas cricketers in the playing eleven. "To have a well balance of domestic & international players and to have competitive teams, it has been tentatively decided to have five teams for WIPL. Each team can comprise maximum of eighteen players where no team can have more than six overseas players. "Further, no $more\ than\ five\ overseas\ players\ -\ four\ from\ Full\ Members$ of the ICC and one from the Associate Members of the ICC can be part of the playing XI of each team," read the BCCI

"The view within Cricket Australia is that David is doing particularly well on the field and making a great contribution off the field,"

India, on the other hand, were automatic qualifiers as tournament hosts. The Indians were simply overwhelmed by a technically and physically far superior American side, but they would hope to "play their game" against Morocco. "We have a good chance against Morocco tomorrow. If we can show

the right attitude, we can score and get some points," pitch." The Atlas Lionesses, who lost 0-1 to Brazil, Dennerby said on Thursday. "We need to fight it out, we have no other option left." The match against Morocco will be the best chance for India to get points as they will be up against traditional powerhouse and title contenders Brazil in their last group match on October 17. Before the tournament Dennerby had said that India would be a difficult team to score against, but the defence, of which captain Astam Oraon was a part, had an off day against the Americans letting in goals after goals. The taller and stronger Americans scored multiple goals from corner kicks and India would look to avoid repeating the same mistake against Morocco, who will not have that much physical advantage. "We have a team that can definitely handle the speed but football is not all about running or the number of sprints the girls take.
