73rd Republic Day celebrated in Isles

Lt Governor unfurls National Flag at historic Netaji Stadium amidst patriotic fervour



Port Blair, Jan 26 : Together with the rest of the Country, the 73rd Republic Day was celebrated today in these Islands too in a manner befitting the occasion with extra precautions and measures in view of the COVID-19 situation. The main function for the Republic Day was held at the historic Netaji Stadium wherein the Lt Governor, A&N Islands & Vice Chairman, Islands Development Agency, Admiral DK Joshi, PVSM, AVSM, YSM, NM, VSM (Retd.) unfurled the National Flag and took the salute of the Republic Day Parade. The parade and guard of honour comprised of the armed contingents of the Army, Navy, Air Force, Coast Guard, A&N Police, Fire Brigade and NCC alongwith their bands. Defence helicopter showered flower petals at Netaji Stadium, the venue of the main function of the Republic Day-2022.

'Police Medal for Meritorious Service'

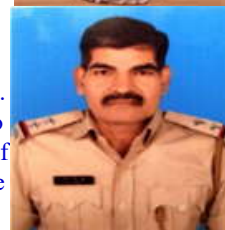
Sh. Shashi Prakash Dubey, SI (Supervisory Tech.)

73rd Republic Day celebrations in A&N Islands

Port Blair, Jan. 25 : As of every year on 26th January, the Nation celebrates Republic Day with grandeur, gaiety, fervour and enthusiasm. This year too, the Republic Day will be celebrated in a manner befitting the occasion, however with some extra precaution and measures in view of the prevailing COVID-19 situation.

In the A&N Islands, as per the tradition, the National Flag would be unfurled at all Govt. offices/institutions including schools, dispensaries, post offices etc. The Hon'ble Lt. Governor, A&N Island will grace the function at Netaji Stadium, Port Blair and will unfurl the National Flag at 8:35 am after laying wreath at the 'Martyr's Column' at the National

Memorial - Cellular Jail. The parade and guard of honour will comprise of the armed contingents of the Army, Navy, Air Force, Coast Guard, A&N Police and also contingents from Fire Brigade and NCC along with their bands. In view of the COVID-19 situation no public or school children will take part in the ceremony.

Vaccination- shield against the virus

Port Blair, Jan 25 : The vaccination drive is continuing smoothly in A&N Islands. As per data available, a total of 6,03,443 beneficiaries in the age group of 18 and above have been vaccinated so far in A&N Islands. Similarly, 21,921 beneficiaries have been vaccinated in the age group of 15 to 18 years against the target beneficiaries of 23,000. The number of beneficiaries administered precautionary dose of vaccine so far stood at 4764.

A total of 406 eligible beneficiaries were vaccinated in A&N Islands today. 320 beneficiaries were vaccinated in South Andaman District, out of which, 39 beneficiaries were in the age group of 15-18 years, 40 beneficiaries were in the age group of 18-44 years and the number of beneficiaries administered precautionary dose of vaccine stood at 100. 57 beneficiaries were vaccinated in North & Middle Andaman District, out of

which, 7 beneficiaries were in the age group of 18-44 years and the number of beneficiaries administered precautionary dose of vaccine stood at 34.

29 beneficiaries were vaccinated in Nicobar District, out of which, 19 beneficiaries were in the age group of 15-18 years, 1 beneficiary was in the age group of 18-44 years and the number of beneficiaries administered precautionary dose of vaccine stood at 7.

SEARCH & RESCUE OPERATION OF DISTRESSED MFB VANDANA BY COAST GUARD OFF EAST ISLAND, ANDAMAN SEA



On 20 Jan 22, at 1615 Hrs, MFB Vandana, departed from Durgapur, Diglipur for fishing with 03 fishermen onboard. The Boat raised a distress call when it was adrift South-West of East Island. On receipt of information from MRCC Port Blair, HQ ANC instructed Coast Guard Ship C-416 to provide assistance to the

distressed boat. On arrival at datum, the Coast Guard Ship embarked its technical team onboard the fishing boat and attempted defect rectification. However, the efforts proved futile due to non-availability of spares. Thereafter, the Coast Guard ship C-416 took MFB Vandana under tow and entered harbour

at 2250 hrs on 20 Jan 22, thus facilitating safe returns of the 03 fishermen, and their Boat to Diglipur. The swift action reinforces commitment of Andaman and Nicobar Command to assist fishermen at sea when in distress, in consonance with Coast Guard motto of 'Vayam Rakshamah'.

Member of Parliament along with Stakeholders of Tourism Industry meet Secretary Tourism; Highlight crucial issues

Shri Kuldeep Rai Sharma, MP on 21.01.2022 led a delegation of Water Sports, Tourist Fiber Boat, Boat Owners Association, North Bay, Dive Club, Havelock Scuba Diving Association, Tourist Vehicle Owners' Association, Port Blair to discuss various tourism related issues with the Secretary Tourism, A&N Administration.

The Member of Parliament expressed concern of the Tourism and allied industries in these Islands and particularly in the prevailing COVID-19 Pandemic scenario. He said that in the private sector tourism and allied industries are undoubtedly the major source of providing employment for the Islanders.

He said that livelihood of as many as 50,000 families in these Islands are dependent on the tourism related industries which for past two years has suffered major

financial setback due various restrictions imposed under the National Disaster Management Act by the Central Government and the local administration to prevent the spread of COVID-19 pandemic in these Islands.

He urged that there is paramount need to bring normalcy in the tourism and allied industries though carefully and steadily so that several socioeconomic problems, now being faced by Islanders served by these industries, get subsided to a large extent.

The representatives of various tourism related associations expressed their need before the Secretary (Tourism), Andaman and Nicobar Administration of which major were repairs of floating jetty at Aberdeen Water Sports Complex and Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose (Ross) Island, Parking Stand for Tourist

Vehicle at Port Blair, Development of Viper Island as one day tourist destination, opening of extension centre of National Institute of Water Sports (NIWS), Ministry of Tourism, Government of India at Port Blair to facilitate easy and timely inspection, certification and licencing of the Water Sports facilities and equipments, Jolly Buoy to be opened for tourism, implementing easy procedure for replacement of trained and certified personals, securing beaches from Crocodile attack, maintenance of civic amenities such as toilets, changing The Secretary (Tourism) assured Mr. Kuldeep Rai Sharma, Member of Parliament and the representatives of various tourism related associations to look into the matter for consideration.

Andaman & Nicobar Territorial Congress Committee celebrates 73rd Republic Day

He said that January 26th was chosen as the date for celebrating Republic Day because on this day in 1930 the Indian National Congress revealed the declaration of India's independence from the colonial rule.

He further said that Indian constitution is unique, which takes care and respects the aspirations of every caste, religion and guarantee them equal rights. It should be the bounden duty of the every political party, social groups and especially general public to save the constitution, which is indicative of India's beauty and its acceptance as the largest democracy of the world.

"Congress Party shall continue to fight and defeat the forces

harming the very foundation of the Indian constitution and won't compromise on its stated position of safeguarding the constitution and working towards Nation building, peace and development", he added.

Zubair, Youth Congress State President Mr. Elayaraja Als, NSUI State President Mr. M.A Sajid besides various other party activists and block presidents.

Member of Parliament demands appointment and posting of Counselors & Wellness Teachers in all the Secondary and Sr. Secondary level Schools of ANI

The Member of Parliament of Andaman and Nicobar Islands, Mr. Kuldeep Rai Sharma has requested the Hon'ble Lt. Governor of ANI to appoint and post Counselors & Wellness Teachers in all the Secondary and Sr. Secondary level Schools in Andaman & Nicobar Islands as per CBSE guidelines.

In a letter addressed to the Hon'ble Lt. Governor, the Member of Parliament mentioned that appointment of trained counselors in schools is the need of the hour; as students are undergoing a paradigm change with families moving from a joint family system to nuclear families, especially in an era of humungous variety of social media networks with an increasing number of suicides among youth. As pointed out by the United Nation, one of the most important lacuna in our new social order is that we have very few empathetic listening counselors, he added.

The Member of Parliament pointed out that we have 384 Government-run schools in

Andaman and Nicobar Islands. But, none of the schools have a student counselor till date.

He said that due to the absence of proper counseling for the students in the schools through an expert in the subject, the students are facing deep stress on account of untoward incidents occurring in their routine life such as getting less marks, unsuccessful of CBSE board examination, natural calamities like COVID-19 pandemic diseases, earthquake, cyclone etc due to their intolerable situations.

The Member of Parliament added that according to the circular released by CBSE authorities in 2014, (CBSE/AFF/CIRCULAR/2014/675578) it is mandatory to have a full-time student-Counselor in every school. The circular further pointed out that the exercise should be carried out to gauge the need and scope of support services available across the schools as social, interpersonal, physical and emotional problems,

which the students go through need to be resolved.

Pointing out that about five batches of students have graduated in B.Sc. Psychology in the Andaman College (ANCOL) and many others who have also graduated in PG Counseling Psychology, the Member of Parliament said that this could be a win-win situation where the schools and college could have full-time student-counselors on one hand with all the benefits pointed above and employment opportunity for the unemployed graduates.

The Member of Parliament requested the Hon'ble Lt. Governor to issue necessary direction to the Education Department to make necessary arrangements for appointment and posting of Counselors and Wellness Teachers in every Secondary and Senior Secondary level school across the A&N Islands in terms of CBSE guidelines, to safeguard in the interest of the student community, at the earliest.

A&N Islands add yet another feather in its cap! International Ship and Port Facility Security (ISPS) Qualification awarded to Port Blair Port

It is to the credit of the Port that it qualified for the prestigious 'International Ship and Port Facility Security Code' (ISPS) certification awarded by the International Maritime Organization (IMO) on 20th January, 2022. The ISPS qualification was confirmed by Capt RK Muduli, Deputy Nautical Advisor-cum-Surveyor-in-Charge, MMD, Port Blair after a gruelling 10 hour audit which involved among others, Document Review, Audit of Security infrastructure, inspection of Port Control Tower, Mock Terrorist Strike, Inspection of weapons, arms, equipment, security procedures, night exercise and illumination facilities at the Port.

As is well known, the ISPS Qualification is a sought after Certificate which announces to the World Maritime Community that the Port is safe for use. A major part of Mercantile Shipping

does not risk sending their fleet to countries which are disturbed such as West Africa, Mozambique, Somalia and Yemen due to the lack of such certification.

The ISPS Certification has 3 Levels viz Level-1 is the most desirable which announces that the Port is safe for commercial use, Level-2 that the Port is under Terrorist threat and Level-3 that a Counter-Terrorist Operation is underway. Level-2 and Level-3 are short term states that indicate that Security procedures are enhanced temporarily.
