 Mayabuder, Sept 30: Mayabuder Police has registered a POCSO case against a 23 years old man from Bajota area. The person who is the neighbour of the victim girl used to allegedly sexually assault the 17 years old school drop-out. The girl initiated the matter to her parents yesterday and they took her to the PHC, Tugapur. After examination, it turned out that the victim was pregnant for 7 months. Realizing that the girl is a minor, the medical authority immediately informed the Police Station, Mayabuder. On receiving the complaint, the police swung into action and registered the matter under POCSO Act followed by arresting and producing him to the Special Court (POCSO) at Mayabuder. Further details are awaited.

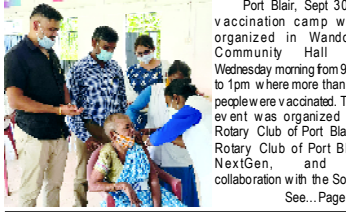

End of the novel coronavirus?

What's more French than picking the perfect baguette, or the long lunch at a Parisian café? It's la bise — a kiss (sometimes more) on each cheek with which Frenchmen and women have greeted friends and loved ones for centuries. Until, that is, the arrival of the novel coronavirus. Around the world, Covid-19 has not only claimed millions of lives and flattened economies, it also marooned people on islands of self-isolation. It turned the small rituals of togetherness — the hug and the handshake, the small talk with strangers and the communal feast — into mortal hazards. In France, la bise, a sign of affection and even fraternity, became a casualty of the pandemic.

The vaccine is turning out to be a kiss of life. With over 70 per cent of France's population now inoculated, the French are returning to kiss and greet. Even President Emmanuel Macron, who had urged his countrymen to restrain their instinct to shake hands or kiss each other at the height of the pandemic, has been seen tossing an air-kiss or two. In India, where social hierarchies make touch a fraught thing, and where universal vaccination seems a long stretch away, all this fuss must seem like a first-world problem. We have found a way to restore our social life — whether it is the adda at the tea shop or the unhurried stroll at fish markets or the revenge tourism at hill stations — armed with nothing more than dangerous complacency and a mask on our chins.

But, as it turns out, like all habits upended by Covid-19 it is not easy to turn the clock back. Who is to blame if some French shudder at viral loads and exposure when drawn into la bise? Nevertheless, if the muah-muah is back, can our old lives be far behind?

WHY CLIMATE CHANGE IS MAKING IT HARDER TO CHASE FALL FOLIAGE

Droughts that cause leaves to turn brown and wither before they can reach peak colour. Heat waves prompting leaves to fall before autumn even arrives. Extreme weather events like hurricanes that strip trees of their leaves altogether.

For a cheery autumnal activity, leaf peeping is facing some serious

threats from the era of climate change. Leaf peeping, the practice of travelling to watch nature display its fall colours, is abounded annually in many corners of the country, especially New England and New York.

But recent seasons have been disrupted by weather conditions there and elsewhere, and the trend is likely

to continue as the planet warms, said arborists, conservationists and ecologists.

Typically, by the end of September, leaves cascade into warmer hues throughout the US. This year, many areas have yet to even pivot from their summer greenshades. In northern Maine, where peak conditions typically arrive in late September, forest rangers had reported less than 70 per cent colour change and moderate leaf drop on Wednesday.

Across the country in Denver, high temperatures have left dead, dry edges of leaves early in the season, said Michael Sundberg, a certified arborist in the area.

Instead of trees doing this gradual change, they get through these wacky weather events. They change all of a sudden, or they drop leaves early, Sundberg said. It's been a few years since we've had a really good leaf year where you just drive around town and see really good colour. The reason climate change can be bad for fall foliage has a bit to do with plant biology. When fall arrives, and day length and temperature drop, the chlorophyll in a leaf breaks down, and

that causes it to lose its green colour. The green gives way to the yellows, reds and oranges that make for dramatic autumn displays.

Achieving those peak colours is delicate balance, and one jeopardized by changes in the environment, said Paul Schaberg, a research plant physiologist with the US Forest Service based in Burlington, Vermont. Warm fall temperatures can cause leaves to remain green longer and delay the onset of what leaf peepers look for in terms of fall colour, he said.

Worse, dry summers can stress trees and cause their leaves to miss the fall colour turn altogether, Schaberg said. A 2003 study in the journal Tree Physiology that Schaberg co-wrote stated that environmental stress can accelerate leaf deterioration.

If climate change is going to mean significant drought, that means trees are going to shut down, and many trees are just going to drop their leaves, he said. Severe droughts that really mean that the tree just can't function that doesn't improve colour. It's happening already. This summer's heat-wave in the Pacific Northwest brought temperatures of over 110 degrees Fahrenheit (43 Celsius) to

Oregon, and that led to a condition called foliage scorch, in which leaves prematurely browned, said Chris Still, a professor at the Forest Ecosystems Society department at Oregon State University.

The leaves' pigment was degraded and they fell shortly thereafter, Still said. That would be a less scenic fall season in parts of Oregon.

That's a really big example of colour change just due to heat-wave shock, Still said.

Climate change also poses longer-term threats that could disrupt leaf peeping. The spread of diseases and invasive pests and the northward creep of tree species are all factors tied to warming temperatures that could make for less vibrant fall colours, said Andrew Richardson, a professor of ecosystem science at Northern Arizona University.

The onset of fall colours, which has been drifting later into the fall, could also continue to arrive later, said Jim Salge, foliage expert for Yankee magazine. My observations in the last decade have had more years that were later than what we would consider historical averages, he said.

Airtel bets big on India's data centre boom

Leading telecom player Bhatnair is betting big on India's data centre market which is witnessing a veritable boom. The Gurgaon-based company has announced an investment of Rs 5,000 crore in expanding the data centre business through its subsidiary Nxtra.

This is a market where the demand is more than supply, said Ajay Chikara, director & CEO. "India needs huge data centres. These are crucial infrastructure (required) to support our digital economy," he added.

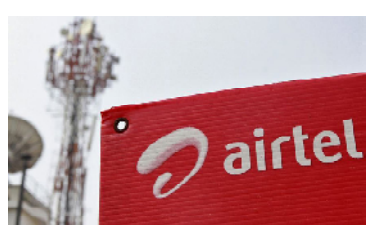
Airtel Nxtra's plans include setting up 7 hyperscale data centre campuses, including a 100MW campus in Navi Mumbai spread across three buildings, totaling 7 lakh square feet (and scalable), as well as one in Chennai which is all set to open in October. Nxtra already has about 120 Edge data centres across the country that cater to its existing 400 or so clients.

The requirement for data centres has been rising exponentially in India as technology transformed in recent years toward cloud storage, as well as the rise in internet usage in the country. The number of internet users in the country is presently above 50 crore, and expected to reach 90 crore by

2025, according to the Internet and Mobile Association of India (IAMAI).

Airtel's investment of Rs 5,000 crore, to be invested over the next three or four years, assumes significance in view of the spurt in internet usage (and content

power last year surpassed even data centre consumption in markets like the US and Europe, says TechWire Asia. The impending 5G rollout, Internet-of-Things (IoT), increased digital consumption, the government's push for data localisation all portend for a major



generation which in turn requires storage) in the country particularly after the pandemic hit. A recent JLL study says India will need more than Rs 27,000 crore worth of investment and 60 lakh square feet of space in the data centre sector to meet the burgeoning requirement. India is already fast on its way to becoming one of the major data centre players in the world — its consumption of over 100 MW of

"We see a huge growth happening in the domestic internet ecosystem. Large domestic companies like banks and startups are consuming large data centre space," added Chikara. Airtel says its data centre business revenue went up by 300 per cent in the last three years.

Vaccination drive continuing smoothly in ANI

Port Blair, Sept. 30: The vaccination drive is continuing smoothly in A&N Islands. As per data available, a total of 4,40,904 beneficiaries have been vaccinated so far in A&N Islands, out of the target beneficiaries of 2,81,603 (approx.). A total of 1,70,499 eligible people in the age group of 18 to 44 years have been vaccinated till dated 29.09.2021. A total of 1411 people were vaccinated yesterday in A&N Islands. 1218 beneficiaries were vaccinated in South Andaman District, out of which 207 beneficiaries were in the age group of 18-44 years. Similarly, 131 beneficiaries were vaccinated in North & Middle Andaman District out of which 31 beneficiaries were in the age group of 18-44. 62 beneficiaries were vaccinated in Nicobar District out of which 2 beneficiaries were in the age group of 18-44.

Govt exempts COVID-19 vaccine from customs duty till Dec 31

The government has exempted customs duty on COVID-19 vaccines for three months till December 31, which will boost domestic availability and make them cheaper. In a notification dated September 29, the Central Board of Indirect Taxes and Customs (CBIC) said the exemption would come into force on October 1, 2021, and remain in force up to December 31, 2021. Earlier in April, the government had exempted basic customs duty on the import of COVID vaccines for three months. Following the conclusion of the three-month period, COVID-19 vaccines import attracted 10 per cent duty. The exemption from import duty would help keep low the cost of overseas vaccines that are being eyed to supplement domestically made shots of Covishield and Covaxin. Currently, India imports Russia made Sputnik V vaccine. India has granted Emergency Use Approval to five vaccines - Serum Institute's Covishield, Bharat Biotech's Covaxin, Russia's Sputnik V, Moderna and Johnson & Johnson.

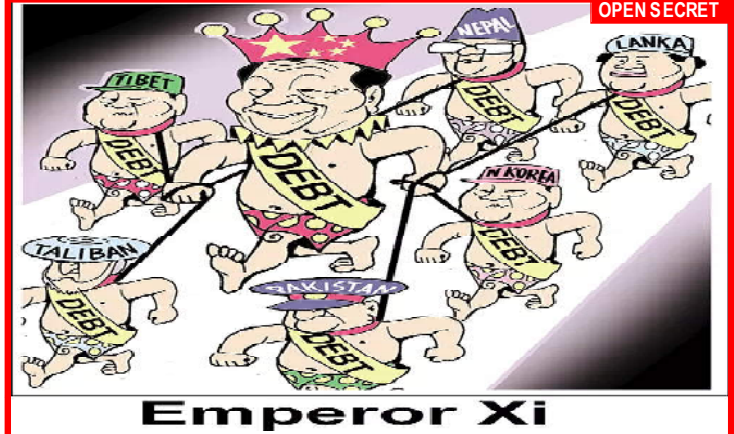
