The President's fleet review, an awe-inspiring and much-awaited event, will be conducted at Visakhapatnam on February 21, 2022. President, Shri Ram Nath Kovind, who is also the Supreme

Panchayat and Municipal Elections

Alternative documents to EPICs for establishing identity of those electors not been provided with EPICs or have lost EPICs and whose names are included in Electoral Rolls notified

Port Blair, Feb. 20

It is necessary to check impersonation of voters in the interest of purity of elections to Panchayats and Municipal Councils and for the conduct of such elections in a fair manner. Rule (68) of the Andaman and Nicobar Islands (Election Procedure) Rules, 1995 and Rule (55) of the Andaman and Nicobar Islands (Municipal) (Election Procedure) Rules, 1995, provide

inter alia, that the elector should produce his Identity Card before the Presiding Officer or the Polling Officer authorized by him in this behalf.

In this regard, it is to mention that 98% voters have been issued Electoral Photo Identity Cards (EPICs). However, there may be electors who have lost their Identity Cards and a few newly enrolled electors may not be having the EPICs, and such

electors will find it difficult to cast their vote.

The Election Commission, Andaman and Nicobar Islands, after taking into account all relevant factors and the legal and factual position, has directed that the following alternative documents to EPICs may be used for establishing the identity of those electors who have not been provided with EPICs or have lost their

EPICs and whose names are included in the Electoral Rolls viz. Licence, PAN Card Unique Identity issued by the Income Aadhaar Card, Indian

has launched the (JSSK) on 1st June, 2011 in view of the difficulty being faced by the pregnant women and parents of sick new-born along-with high out of pocket expenses incurred by

them on delivery and treatment of sick-new-born. The scheme is to benefit pregnant women who access Government health facilities for their delivery. Moreover, it will motivate

those who still choose to deliver at their homes to opt for institutional deliveries. As per data received from Directorate of Health Services, entitled



EPFO Payroll data: 14.60 lakh net subscribers added during the month of December, 2021

New Delhi, Feb. 20 (PIB)

The provisional payroll data of EPFO released on 20th February 2022 highlights that EPFO has added 14.60 lakh net subscribers during December 2021. Comparison shows an increase of around 2.06 lakh in net payroll additions in December 2021 as compared to 12.54 lakh net subscribers added during the corresponding month previous year. For the month of December 2021, the net subscriber addition has increased by 19.98 % as compared to previous month of November 2021.

Of the total 14.60 lakh net subscribers

added, 9.11 lakh new members have been enrolled under EPF & MP Act, 1952 for the first time. Approximately 5.49 lakh net subscribers exited but rejoined EPFO by opting to continue their membership with EPFO by transferring their PF accumulations from previous to present PF account instead of opting for final withdrawal. Further, the number of members exiting EPFO has been on a declining trend since July, 2021. Gender-wise analysis indicates that net female payroll addition during the month is approximately 3 lakh. Share of female

enrolment is approximately 20.52% of the total net subscribers addition during the month of December, 2021.

EPFO provides provident fund, pension benefits to the members on their retirement and family pension & insurance benefits to their families in case of untimely death of the member. EPFO is country's principal organization responsible for providing social security benefits to the organized/semi-organized sector workforce covered under the statute of EPF & MP Act, 1952.

Nationwide COVID vaccination drive crosses over 175 crore 37 lakh mark

New Delhi, Feb. 20

Over 175 crore 37 lakh vaccine doses have been administered so far under Nationwide Vaccination Drive. Health Ministry said, over 30 lakh 81 thousand doses were administered yesterday. The recovery rate is currently at 98.28 per cent. Over 48

thousand recoveries in the last 24 hours increases total recoveries to 4 crore 20 lakh 86 thousand 383. Over 19 thousand new cases were recorded in the last 24 hours. India's Active caseload currently stands at 2 lakh 24 thousand 187. Active cases stand at 0.52 per cent. Daily

positivity rate is at 1.68 per cent and weekly positivity Rate is at 2.27 per cent. 673 deaths were reported in the last 24 hours. Over 75 crore 93 lakh tests have been conducted so far. Over 11 lakh 87 thousand tests were conducted in the last 24 hours. (Source: india.gov.in)

COVID-19 status in A&N Islands

Port Blair, Feb. 20

During the RT-PCR test conducted on 302 passengers who arrived here yesterday, two positive case has been detected. Today, 15 flights with 2307 passengers arrived, out of which, 1968 passengers were vaccinated with both doses while RT-PCR test was conducted on 312 passengers (6 foreign travellers) and the reports are awaited.

During RAT conducted on 44 passengers bound for North & Middle

Andaman at Ferrargunj, no positive case has been detected. At Mohanpura Bus Terminus, test was conducted on 45 passengers, no positive case have been detected. At Phoenix Bay Jetty, 6 passengers were tested with RAT and no positive case has been detected. RT-PCR-test was conducted on 14 crew members of MV. Bambooka, reports of which are awaited, a press release from Directorate of IP&T said.

Commerce Minister chairs meeting focused on revamping, fortification of Department of Commerce

New Delhi, Feb. 20

Commerce and Industry Minister, Shri Piyush Goyal chaired a meeting focused on the revamping and fortification of the Department of Commerce to make it future ready. The revamped Department will have a more coherent trade promotion strategy with clear targets and execution accountabilities. Empowering & instilling confidence among women Nai Roshni- scheme for leadership development of minority women

Port Blair, Feb. 20

The Ministry of Minority Affairs, GoI is implementing Nai Roshni- the Scheme for Leadership Development of Minority Women. The target group includes women belonging to all minorities notified under Section 2 (c) of the National Commission for Minorities Act, 1992 viz. Muslims, Sikhs, Christians, Buddhists, Zoroastrians (Parsis) and Jains. The objective of the scheme is to empower and instill confidence among minority women, including their neighbours from other communities living in the same village/locality, by providing knowledge tools and techniques for interacting with Government systems, banks and other institutions at all levels.

The leadership development training scheme shall be implemented by the Ministry of Minority Affairs through selected organizations. The selected organizations should implement the project directly through their organizational set-up in the locality/village/area. The Central Government and UT Administration training institutes including universities and

institutes of higher learning can also implement the scheme. Organizations which would be eligible for applying for financial assistance under this scheme are Societies registered under the Societies Registration Act, 1860; a public Trust registered under any law for the time being in force, a private limited non-profit company registered under Section 25 of the Indian Companies Act, 1956; Universities/ Institutions of higher learning recognized by University Grants Commission (UGC), Training institutes of Central and State Government/UT Administration including Panchayati Raj Training institutes and Duly registered Cooperative Societies of Women/ Self Help Groups.

The selected organization would have the responsibility to motivate, identify and select women to be trained in accordance with the criteria of the scheme from villages/urban localities having a substantial minority population. The organizations will involve Head of the Gram Panchayat/Municipal Body/ Local Authority for identification/ selection of women trainees.

The details of the trainees will be submitted by the Organization before the start of training through the Online Application Management System (OAMS) for Nai Roshni, once the project is approved. Although there will be no annual income bar, a woman/parent or guardian of woman having annual income not exceeding Rs.2.50 lakh from all sources would be given preference in selection. They should be between the age group of 18 years to 65 years.

The proposal should be submitted in the prescribed format through Online Application Management System (OAMS). The link of OAMS is available on official website of Ministry of Minority Affairs i.e. www.minorityaffairs.gov.in. After filling up the complete proposal in the OAMS, a print of the same may be taken and submitted to the District Collector/ District Magistrate for their recommendation in the prescribed format. The detailed guidelines of the scheme are available on the website www.minorityaffairs.gov.in, a press release from Directorate of Social Welfare said.

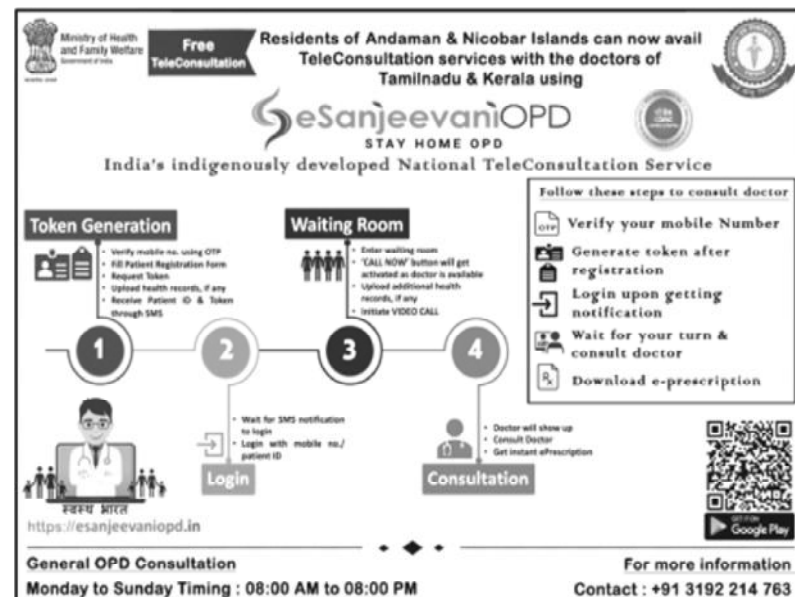
e-Sanjeevani-India's National Teleconsultation Service now accessible in A&N Islands Patients can avail free online consultation with doctors in Kerala & Tamil Nadu by using e-Sanjeevani OPD Android App or by logging into the portal State Health Agency may be contacted for more information

e-Sanjeevani is a teleconsultation solution developed by C-DAC (Centre for Development of Advanced Computing), Mohali under the guidance of Ministry of Health & Family Welfare. The e-Sanjeevani platform has two modules namely e-Sanjeevani OPD and e-Sanjeevani HWC. In the e-Sanjeevani OPD module, patient to doctor interaction is possible whereas in the e-Sanjeevani HWC module, doctor to doctor interaction can be done.

The patient can consult a doctor online on the e-Sanjeevani OPD platform by using a desktop /laptop PC or through smartphone by downloading the e-Sanjeevani OPD Android App available on Google Play.

In e-Sanjeevani OPD, patients can login from anywhere simply by registering on the portal esanjeevaniopd.in by filling up some mandatory fields such as phone number (for generation of OTP), name & address. They will in turn get a token number. The patient will have to again login to the site by entering the phone



number and token number, which will then take the patient to the waiting room with names of doctors available for consultation. The patient will have to wait for their turn (based on token number) to consult a doctor. After consultation, one will have to download e-prescription for purchasing medicines.

The Ministry of Health & Family Welfare through C-DAC Mohali has now linked Andaman & Nicobar Islands with the General OPDs of Kerala & Tamil Nadu States respectively namely

General esanjeevani OPD Kerala and Tamil Nadu State esanjeevani OPD. The patients from Andaman & Nicobar Islands can avail free consultation with the doctors of these two States right from their home over a call / video call using the esanjeevaniOPD App on their smart phone or by logging into the portal [https:// esanjeevaniopd.in/](https://esanjeevaniopd.in/).

Learn & Earn: skill development initiative for minorities Upgrading skills of minority youth in various modern/traditional vocations

Port Blair, Feb. 20

The Ministry of Minority Affairs, GoI is implementing the Central Sector Scheme- Seekho aur Kamao (Learn & Earn) for Skill Development of Minorities. The scheme aims at upgrading the skills of the minority youth in various modern/traditional vocations depending upon their educational qualification, present economic trends and the market potential, which can earn them a suitable employment or make them suitably skilled to go for self employment. The scheme is implemented through selected expert Project implementing Agencies (PIAs). It ensures placement of minimum 75% trainees, out of which at least 50% placement is in organized sector.

The scheme is implemented by the following Project Implementing Agencies (PIAs) through Societies of the State Governments/UT Administrations registered under the Societies Registration Act; any private recognized/registered professional



institution of repute conducting such skill development courses for at least last three years with established market linkages and placement record and fulfilling any other criteria laid down by the Ministry; any industry or an association of industries like ASSOCHAM, CII, FICCI etc. who are willing to run such skill upgradation training centres as per financial norms of the scheme with a proper plan of placements; any institution of Central/State Governments including Public Sector Undertakings and Training institutes of Central/ State Governments including Panchayati Raj Training institutions; Civil Societies (CS)/Non-Governmental Organizations (NGOs) which fulfill certain requirements.

For availing the benefit under the scheme, the trainee should belong to minority community, should be between 14-35 years of age, minimum qualification of trainee should be at least Class V. In case seat for reserved categories as prescribed under this scheme remain vacant, these vacant seats may be treated as unreserved.

NFSA beneficiaries urged to get Aadhaar number seeded with Ration Card data base by March 31

The Govt. of India has inter alia requested individual beneficiaries under NFSA to furnish proof of Aadhaar number or undergo Aadhaar authentication to receive subsidies under NFSA.
