Life in the ocean: From the shores or from a boat, the sea looks like a huge mass of uniform, inky blue water. It is not so actually. Life in the sea is amazingly different at different depths. From the surface to a few feet below, the ocean is a sunlit world, that changes from day to night. Below this, the ocean becomes cold, dim, and unchanging. And thousands of meters below the surface, the ocean is a region of nearfreezing temperatures, crushing pressure, and complete darkness.

Most marine plants and animals are adapted to living in one of three regions- the sunlight, twilight, or midnight zone. These zones are defined by the presence (or absence) of light. They differ from one another in temperature amount of pressure, and nutrient supply. We will mainly focus here on the sunlight zone where most of the familiar animals and plants are present.

A&N Administration Issues New **COVID-19 Protocols for Travellers** in A&N Islands

Port Blair, Oct. 26: In supersession to earlier orders and circulars issued from time to time by A&N Administration regarding COVID management in A&N Islands following are the COVID-19 protocols to be followed for travellers in A&N Islands with immediate

All asymptomatic children below 12 years of age are exempted from RT-PCR test to travel to A&N Islands by sea/air route.

People above 12 years of age intending to travel from mainland who are not vaccinated /partially vaccinated against COVID-19 will

have to undertake RT-PCR test in mainland within 48 hours before commencing such journey to A&N Islands. They will also be tested at Point of Entry.

All asymptomatic passengers undertaking journey to inter-island sectors are exempted from any type of COVID-19 testing irrespective of their vaccination status.

All symptomatic passengers travelling from mainland or travelling to inter-island sectors must undergo RT-PCR testing within 48 hours of commencement of irrespective of their age group and vaccination status.

Disqualification of **Imran Khan**

The Pakistan Election Commission's decision to disqualify Imran Khan from completing his term in Parliament is a setback for the former Prime Minister, who has been rallying his supporters against his political rivals as well as the military establishment ever since he was ousted in April. The commission found Mr. Khan, leader of the Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) party, guilty of illegally selling gifts he got from foreign dignitaries when Prime Minister and concealing the profits. And the four-member bench came up with a particularly harsh judgment of barring a popular politician and the main opposition leader from office, an order that is reminiscent of former Prime Minister Nawaz Sharif's disqualification in 2018. Mr. Khan would also be prevented from heading the PTI as an earlier Supreme Court judgment bars disqualified leaders from heading political parties. The verdict came days after Mr. Khan swept the by-polls by winning six out of seven National Assembly seats, in a sign of his surging popularity despite the different cases slapped on him. He has challenged the commission's verdict in the Islamabad High Court, but, needless to say, the development has added to his legal woes. It could threaten his political career and worsen the political instability.

While the legality of the commission's verdict would be reviewed by the High Court, it is hard to miss the parallels between the disqualification of Mr. Sharif and that of Mr. Khan, barred from office after they fell out with the powerful military establishment. Mr. Sharif always had a testy relationship with the military. Mr. Khan, on the other side, was a beneficiary of Mr. Sharif's ouster. He rose to power with help from the establishment, and the then opposition which makes up the current government, accused him of being a pawn in the hands of the generals. But the tables turned when Mr. Khan tried to rein in the military. Now, he is accusing the military of conspiring with his political rivals to keep him out of power. Whether he is right or wrong, Pakistan's history suggests that any popular leader who tries to mobilise political capital independent of the military's standing would be met with strong institutional resistance. Mr. Khan's story is no different. Pakistan is in a crisis. The Shehbaz Sharif government is a short-term arrangement; the economy is in free fall; and this year's floods have made matters worse, leading to growing public resentment. The civilian leaders should assert themselves, strengthen democracy and take the country out of the morass it is in. Instead, their power struggles, under the long shadow of the military, are further destabilising the country.

WhatsApp Resumes After Over an Hour of Disruption



October 26: NEW DELHI: Popular messaging app WhatsApp faced a global outage from the UK to India, with users being not able to send and receive text and video messages for more than an hour.

The services were restored for some users after the unexplained disruption that last over an hour. The resumption of service was confirmed by several users.

WhatsApp's services across many parts of India and the world were disrupted on Tuesday afternoon as thousands of users were unable to send or receive messages on the Meta-owned platform.

After the snag hit, WhatsApp had said it is working to restore services.

"We're aware that some people are currently having trouble sending messages and we're working to restore WhatsApp for everyone as quickly as possible," a Meta company spokesperson said in a statement.

#Whatsappdown was trending on Twitter, and many users took to the microblogging platform to share funny memes on the issue.

Downdetector reported a significant rise in complaints around Whatsapp outage; nearly 29,000 reports were flagged by users.

Downdetector's heatmap was showing WhatsApp users in major cities, including Delhi, Mumbai, Bengaluru and Kolkata were impacted by the disruption.

Hyderabadis Witness Solar **Eclipse with Excitement**



October HYDERABAD: Hyderabadis were able to get a glimpse of the partial solar eclipse in the city on Tuesday, thanks to clear skies. The eclipse was visible from 4.59 pm until sunset.

The Birla Planetarium in the heart of the city was packed with sky gazers, and there were special arrangements made there for the aficionados to view the celestial spectacle. There was a palpable sense of excitement as throngs of families with children flocked to the planetarium to witness the solar eclipse.

Faculty from the astronomy department at Osmania University (OU) observed the eclipse and captured it on camera using a phone hidden behind a six-inch Celestron telescope with a neutral density filter.

The next celestial event that Hyderabad residents can view is a lunar eclipse on November 7–8, while the next solar eclipse won't happen until 2024, according to the department's associate professor Dr. D. Shanti Priya. According to her, the institution plans to work with an OU alumnus to broadcast the eclipse of 2024 live as it is observed through a telescope in the US.

Seema Leaders Back with Demand for Statehood to Greater Rayalaseema



October 26: NELLORE: With the YSR Congress government batting for Visakhapatnam executive capital, some leaders Rayalaseema led by former Nandyal MP Gangula Pratap Reddy are back with the demand for a Greater Rayalaseema state with Tirupati as its capital.

Pratap Reddy pressed for Kurnool, Kadapa, Chittoor, Nellore and Prakasam both Chandrababu Naidu and Jagan Mohan Reddy ignored the region even as they are from Rayalaseema.

Speaking to Deccan Chronicle during his visit to Nellore to mobilise support for statehood to Greater Rayalaseema,

Pratap Reddy said their agitation initiated in 2020 was affected because of the Covid situation for two years." Tirupati is most suitable to become the capital due to fast-paced industrial development, international airport, proximity to Krishnapatnam port as also to Chennai and Bengalurucities besides the presence of large extents of government land in the vicinity," he said.

Reminding that the capital should be in Rayalaseema region and the high court in coastal Andhra as per the Sribagh pact between politicians of Rayalaseema and coastal Andhra in 1937, he said the agreement was simply ignored. Though the first capital was set up at Kurnool after AP was carved out of combined Madras state in 1953, it was shifted to Hyderabad later.



I Want Virat Kohli to Retire from T20 Cricket and Use His Energy to Score Centuries in ODIs: Shoaib Akhtar

October 26: Pakistan icon Shoaib Akhtar heaped praise on Virat Kohli after his unbeaten 82 against Pakistan in Sunday's T20 World Cup encounter between the archrivals. Akhtar, who has always been a vociferous supporter of Kohli during his lean patch, said, "According to me, he played the greatest innings of his life against Pakistan. He played like this because he had the selfbelief that he will do it."

"He was down and out for 3 years, he didn't score runs, he was stripped of his captaincy and a lot of people said a lot of things to him. People even dragged his family into it but he kept training and put in the graft and just a day before Diwali, he played a firecracker on an innings. He decided that this place and this stage is perfect for his comeback. The king is back and he is back with a bang and I am really happy for him. He is a great cricketer," the Pakistan legend added.Akhtar also said



that he wanted Kohli to retire from T20 cricket because he did not want Kohli to put all his energy in that format of the game only. "I want him to retire from T20I because I don't want that he puts his entire energy in T20I cricket. If he used all his might like he did today, he can score three centuries in ODIs," he said.

The former Pakistan speedster also showered plaudits on the Pakistan cricket team, saying they had done marvelously well.



"Pakistan, don't lose heart. You played really well. Iftikhar, I have criticised you but you have played a brilliant innings. Shan Masood, you were brilliant. Naseem Shah, you were absolutely great and Shaheen, you work on your fitness because you are not fully fit," he said. Akhtar also felt that Pakistan were playing a bowler less and said that this needed to be rectified. He also termed the recent clash between the two neighbours as one of the best matches in history.

T20 World Cup: Team India Finds Falafel and 'Make Your Sandwich' Menu Inadequate

October 26: Indian players boycotted the lunch after their optional training session on Tuesday afternoon as they felt it was cold and inadequate. The Indians had an optional session attended by captain Rohit Sharma, Virat Kohli, Dinesh Karthik, Rishabh Pant, KL Rahul, Mohammed Siraj, Ravichandran Ashwin, Shardul Thakur and Deepak Hooda, alongwith the support staff. The team management gave a rest to Axar Patel, Bhuvneshwar Kumar, Mohammed Shami, Hardik Pandya and Arshdeep Singh after the Pakistan game in Melbourne on Sunday.

"The food was not up to the mark. We can't have a sandwich after a practice session," a

member of the Indian squad said.

A few players had falafel at the ground while the rest decided to have food back at the hotel. Meanwhile, India will have a rest on the eve

of their game against the Netherlands. It is learnt that the ICC had decided to hold India's practice session at Blacktown, some 42 km away, but the team doesn't want to travel so far.

The SCG will host a double-header on Thursday. South Africa will face Bangladesh in the afternoon before India play the Dutch in the evening. As per the scheduled release by the ICC, South Africa, Bangladesh and the Netherlands will have their practice sessions at the SCG on Wednesday.



The Indian team had its camp at Blacktown during the 2021 tour of Australia where they had stayed at Olympic Park. But the team didn't want to travel such a long distance on the eve of the match.

The ICC hands over the schedules to all participating teams way in advance and gets it approved. But it's up to respective teams to take a call before each game whether they want to adhere to the schedule. However, the ICC doesn't modify the schedule at the last moment unless there's any unforeseen incident during the tournament.


