What is a Coral?

Corals are tiny animals that have an outer stony skeleton and live in colonies in the sea. They belong to the same animals group as the sea anemones, and jelly fish. Each coral animal is called a polyp and lives inside a cup of carbonate (Limestone). It has a mouth at the top surrounded by tentacles. The tentacles help to capture food like plankton for the coral. While it is alive, a coral poly's tentacles protrude from the cups for feeding.In times of danger, the polyp can withdraw into its cup. This is similar to a turtle withdrawing into its shell when disturbed. A coral polyp cannot move and remains fixed to its cup throughout its life. Coral polyps can be of several species - in A&Nalone, 135 species are found.

Coral Colonies: Many thous ands of coral polyps are connected together to form a coral colony. These colonies are of many shapes and colours.

Promising Breakthrough

The decision by the insurgent Nationalist Socialist Council of Nagalim (Isak-Muivah faction) to reengage in talks with the Union government, conditionally, on the basis of the Framework Agreement signed in August 2015, is a welcome one. This breaks a deadlock that has persisted in talks since October 2019, which was set as a deadline for the peace accord. The possibility of a resumption of talks received a boost last week when the NSCN(I-M) and other Naga groups represented in the Naga National Political Groups (NNPGs) pledged in a joint statement to "overcome the cynicism" and that they are "committed to a dialogue in order to move forward" the talks for an accord. With a group of legislators and Ministers from the State meeting up with the NSCN(I-M)'s representatives — a step that has borne fruit the stage is now set to take forward the talks, a process that seems to have been put on the backburner in October 2019. The Centre and the NSCN(I-M) must review what went wrong since the Framework Agreement was reached in 2015 and the complexities that have remained since the landmark ceasefire agreement that was signed between the two parties in 1997.

One key factor preventing a comprehensive peace accord has been the splintered nature of the Naga insurgency and the need for the Centre to deal with groups other than the NSCN(I-M). But the insurgency as a whole has weakened considerably over time and this has paved the way for talks to a negotiated accord. Second, the demands related to the greater "Nagalim", made by the NSCN(I-M) apart from other rebels would have implications in other States, and this has complicated negotiations. Any agreement would have to be careful about not changing the boundaries of the existing States in the country as doing so could spark conflagrations in other North-east States where inter-ethnic relations remain volatile. While the machinations by the Centre in getting a deal done, especially the secretive nature of the talks, have played a part in the deadlock in talks, it is clear that the obdurate and intransigent demand for a separate flag and a Naga constitution by the NSCN(I-M) has been a stumbling block as well. The spat between the former Governor and interlocutor R.N. Ravi and the NSCN(I-M) also did not help matters. The differences of opinion on the aforementioned issues need to be dealt with directly by the representatives of the Naga groups and the Government. It is not enough to promise a solution for the sake of publicity.

Sony PlayStation 5 Rumoured to **Get Removable** Disc Drive in 2023



September 21: We're nearly two years into the PlayStation 5 era and stocks of the newest Sony console are still not as easy to find as most gamers would like. However, Sony is still working on the PlayStation 5 and alongside new games, we are now also reportedly going to see a new design variant of the console.

A new leak by Insider Gaming's Tom Henderson via Trusted Reviews suggests that Sony is working on a new, slimmer PS5 model that will come with a detachable disc drive that players will be able to insert CDs into. The drive will likely mean the end for the disc-edition PS5 consoles, which have an asymmetrical look thanks to an attached vertical disc drive on the side.

The report also says that this detachable disc drive will be sold separately for Digital Edition PS5 owners as well. Those who get the same, will be able to plugit into the USB Type-C port on the back of the console and use disc games seamlessly.

The detachable PS5 access ory would also be a boon for Disc Edition owners, who will now not have to get a new PS5 altogether should their disc drive get damaged. Meanwhile Digital Edition owners will also now be able to get the extra attachment should they wish to own certain games physically instead of

Note that this information is a rumour for now, and Sony has neither confirmed nor commented on the same as of now. Currently, the Sony PlayStation 5 is available in the same two Disc and Digital variants, but remains to be a low-in-stock purchase and a scalper favourite.

PRIs from different Gram Panchayats of Mayabunder

Opening the sectoral discussions, the Chief Secretary emphasized the need to understand the geographical disadvantages, limitations of funds, shortage of manpower and technical capabilities of executing agencies. He explained that nation-wide there is shortage of including manpower Andamans, which cannot be filled overnight. The Heads critical service Departments like Education, Health, Electricity, APWD were advised to work out some immediate solution to fill the gaps in remote part of the Islands and also to take strict action against the underperforming Govt. servants and those reluctant to join or work in remote part of the Islands. The PRIs were also advised to remotely monitor and inform the Heads of Departments in case any Govt. servant posted in their area fails to render desired services.

On the issue of scarcity of drinking water during dry spell to meet the ever increasing demand, the Chief Secretary instructed the concerned officials and PRIs to identify more water bodies/water sources to find a permanent solution. He further directed the officials of APWD to prepare detailed action plan and priority list in consultation with the PRIs.

Regarding the issue of poor road condition, the Chief Secretary informed that the NHIDCL officials have assured that they will complete the critical stretch between Sitanagar and Kalara Jn. within two months. He further informed that the works taken up under PMGSY have now been transferred to APWD and the PRI members will be intimated as soon as the road work is sanctioned for their respective Panchayats. On the issue of shortage of LPG Cylinders, the Chief Secretary said that the Administration will resolve the issue and efforts are also on to increase the capacity of the LPG Bottling Plant for a permanent solution.

Telangana HC Asks State to Look Into Transgenders' Plea for Aasara Pension

21: September HYDERABAD: The Telangana High Court on Monday directed the state government to consider positively a PIL seeking extending pensions to transgender persons. A division bench of Chief Justice Ujjal Bhuyan and Justice C.V. Bhaskar Reddy observed that it must be done without any second thoughts as transgender persons were vulnerable and faced social taboo.

The bench said it was of the prima facie opinion that transgenders should be included in the government order that had been issued for providing Aasara pensions to the elderly, women who had lost their husbands, weavers and others. The courtasked for the government's stand and adjourned the hearing to October 19.






ration rice and financial assistance to transgender persons without insisting on ID proofs as well as vaccination against the Coronavirus Petitioner's counsel Jainab explained the pathetic conditions that transgender persons were living in.

Chief Justice Bhuyan said that the government should not ignore transgender persons and they could not be excluded from society. He opined that the government should conduct a census to know the population of transgender persons and a separate board should be established to support them.

When government counsel Radhive Reddy said that Centre had to conduct the census, the bench recalled that the Bihar government had conducted a census of the OBC population. Petitioner's counsel said that a record produced by the Telangana government, the population of trangender persons in the state was around 59,600 but the government had vaccinated only 12,000 of them against Covid-19.

Port Blair, Sept. 21: One positive case has been detected today in A&N Islands from incoming flight passengers who arrived here yesterday. Today, 10 flights with 1809 passengers arrived, out of which, 1678 passengers were vaccinated with both doses while RT-PCR test was conducted on 111 passengers and the reports are awaited.

Rohit Blames Bowlers, Hardik Can't Pinpoint Cause, Wade Says 3 Sixes in Harshal's Over Game-Changer

September 21: India skipper Rohit Sharma had no qualms conceding that they were outplayed by a confident and ruthless Australia in the series opener in Mohali on Tuesday, pinning the blame on the ineffective and inconsistent bowling by his side.

India suffered a four-wicket loss against Australia despite putting up a formidable score of 208 in the first T20I.

"I don't think we bowled well. 200 is a good score to defend, and we didn't take our chances in the field. It was a great effort from our batters, but the bowlers were not quite there," Rohit said at the post-match presentation. "There are things we need to look at, but it was a great game for us to understand what went wrong. We know this is a highscoring ground. You can't relax even if you get 200. We took wickets to an extent, but they played really well. They played some extraordinary shots. If I was in that changing room, I would expect to chase that

Rohit felt the partnership between Matthew Wade and Tim David was the turning point. He said: "For us, it was just about that one wicket between Wade and Tim David. And we were not able to do that. I think they got a 60-odd partnership in 32 balls, which was a turning point from their perspective."



Don't know where we lost: Pandya

Team India all-rounder Hardik Pandya said the team failed to execute its plans.

"Aap batao kahaan haare? (You guys tell us where we lost)," Pandya shot back when asked about where India lost the match.

"You can't exactly pinpoint where we lost the game. It is a bilateral series, we will try to improve in the next two games," Pandya told reporters after the

"We failed to execute our plans. They (Australia) played some good shots, credit where it is due."

"We all know what Bumrah brings to the side and how important he is for us. Jasprit being there makes a big difference. He is coming back after injury, and it is important for him to get enough time before he makes his comeback," said Pandya.

Harshal's over turning point:

When Harshal Patel came to bowl the 18th over, Australia needed 40 runs from three overs. The pair of Matthew Wade and Tim David took 22 runs from Harshal's last over, which shifted the match in the visitors' favour.

"With the wicket like this, we knew that we're never out of the game. In the middle, myself and Timmy (David) talked that if we manage to hit four sixes in the next 18 balls, the match is ours," said Wade.

"We managed to get 22 from Harshal's over and that for us, was the turning point," said Wade, who scored 45 not out off 21 deliveries as Australia chased down the total with four balls to spare.

The second match of the three-match series will be played in Nagpur on Thursday.

England Wins 1st T20 in Triumphant Return to Pakistan

September 21: England made a triumphant return to Pakistan after 17 years with a six-wicket win in the first Twenty20 on Tuesday.

Debutant left-arm fast bowler Luke Wood grabbed 3-24 to help limit Pakistan to 158-7 after captain Moeen Ali won the toss in his country of roots and elected to field.

Alex Hales, in his return to England colors after more than three years, smashed 53 off 40

balls and led the visitors to 160-4 in 19.2 overs.

Pakistan couldn't capitalize on Mohammad Rizwan (68) and captain Babar Azam's (31) aggressive opening stand of 85 off 57 balls before the middle-order capitulated against Wood in the death overs.

Hales then benefitted from two dropped catches in his 20s before going down to fast bowler Haris Rauf soon after completing his half century. Harry Brooks, who played for Lahore in the PSL earlier this year, made an unbeaten 42 off 25 balls to finish off the game with four balls to spare.

Both teams observed a minute of silence in memory of Queen Elizabeth II before the start of play and England players also wore black armbands.

The series is a tune-up for next month's T20 World Cup in Australia with Karachi hosting four games and Lahore the remaining three from Sept. 28-Oct. 2.


