Right To Contest Election Not A Fundamental Right; It Is Only A Right Conferred By Statute: Supreme Court

New Delhi, 15th Sep, 2022: The Supreme Court observed that the right to contest an election is not a fundamental right but only a right conferred by a statute. An individual cannot claim that he has a right to contest election and the said stipulation violates his fundamental right, so as to file his nomination without any proposer as is required under the Act, the bench comprising Justices Hemant Gupta and Sudhanshu Dhulia observed while dismissing a Special Leave Petition filed by Vishwanath Pratap Singh. The Court also imposed a cost of Rupees one lakh on Singh. Singh had first approached the Delhi High Court challenging a

notification issued by Election Commission of India for election to Rajya Sabha after he was not allowed to file his nomination without a proper proposer



proposing his name. The High Court rejected his contention that his fundamental right of free speech and expression and right to personal liberty has been

infringed. The Apex Court, while dismissing his SLP, observed that the writ petition before the High Court was entirely misconceived. "The right to contest an election is neither a fundamental right nor a common law right. It is a right conferred by a statute," the bench observed while referring to earlier judgments viz Javed v. State of Haryana, (2003) 8 SCC 369 and Rajbala v. State of Haryana (2016) 2 SCC 445. In Javed (supra), the Supreme Court had made the following observations: Right to contest an election is neither a fundamental right nor a common law right. It is a right conferred by a statute. Congress gears up for party polls



In the run-up to the election of the new Congress president, nominations for which can be filed from September 24 to 30, it has been decided that PCC delegates who form the electoral college for the polls can pass a resolution authorising the incoming party chief to nominate the new PCC chiefs and AICC delegates.

A decision to this effect was taken in a meeting of the Central Election Authority of the party with the Pradesh Returning Officers on Wednesday, called to take stock of the arrangements for the election that will take place on

October 17 in the event of more than one nomination being filed. Announcing this today at a press briefing, CEA Chairman Madhusudan Mistry said the state returning officers for the election will convene meetings of the PCC delegates in which they can pass a resolution that the new party president can nominate the state Congress presidents and AICC delegates.

This resolution, Mistry clarified, will have no bearing on the process to elect the new party president. "The resolution, whoever the incoming president is, will make it convenient for that

person," he said.

Meanwhile, the decision is expected to result in a flurry of resolutions authorising Congress President Sonia Gandhi to nominate the PCC chief and AICC members. Already, a meeting of the newly elected PCC delegates from Kerala held on Thursday in Thiruvananthapuram has passed a resolution unanimously decided to authorise Gandhi to nominate PCC President and elect or nominate AICC members from Kerala.

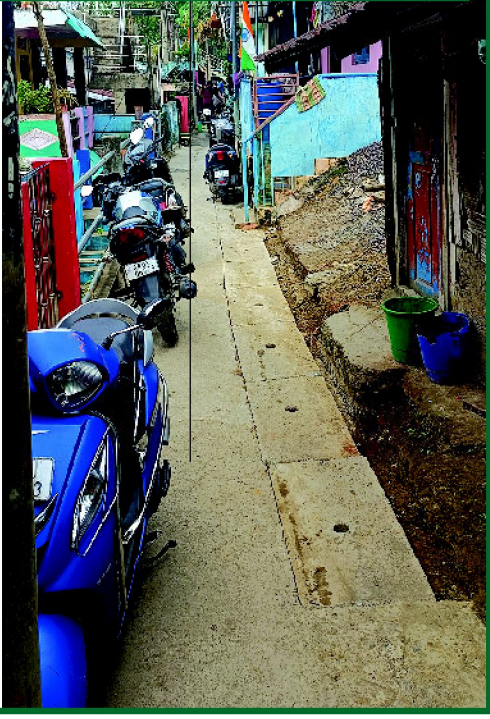
A senior Congress leader said these resolutions were not expected to result in any appointments being made by Gandhi, who will as soon as the election process is notified, will be in office in a caretaker capacity. Even earlier, she is expected to leave it to be taken care of by the incoming president.

There are over 9,000 PCC delegates, who can vote in the election to choose the new Congress president. The list of the See... Page No. 02

Covid 'End Is In Sight', says WHO chief

The head of the World Health Organization said Wednesday that the number of coronavirus deaths worldwide last week was the lowest reported in the pandemic since March 2020, marking what could be a turning point in the years-long global outbreak.

At a press briefing in Geneva, WHO Director-General Tedros Adhanom Ghebreyesus said the world has never been in a better position to stop COVID-19.

We are not there yet, but the end is in sight, he said, comparing the effort to that

made by a marathon runner nearing the finish line. Now is the worst time to stop running, he said. Now is the time to run harder and make sure we cross the line



and reap all the rewards of our hard work.

In its weekly report on the pandemic, the U.N. health agency said deaths fell by 22% in the past week, at just over 11,000 reported worldwide. There were 3.1 million new cases, a drop of 28%, continuing a weeks-long decline in the disease in every part of the world.

Still, the WHO warned that relaxed COVID testing and surveillance in many countries means that many cases are going unnoticed. The agency See... Page No. 06

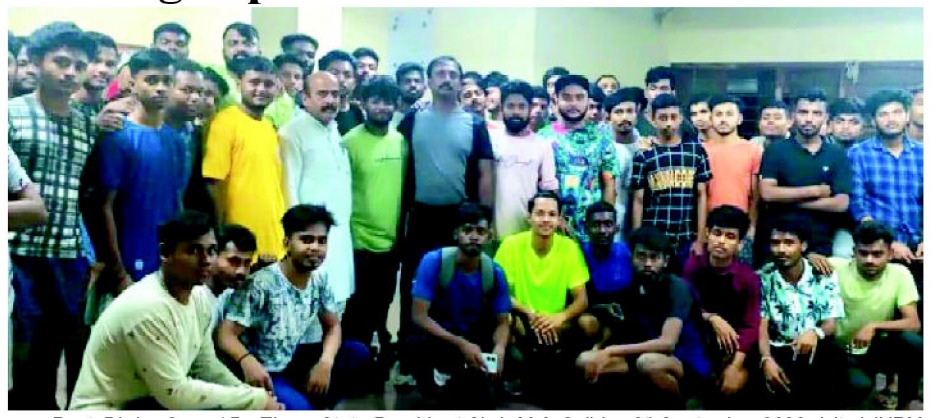

Minimum tax for MNCs

India's presidency of G20 beginning this December – it hosts the leaders' summit in September next year – comes at a complex moment in global politics. The world today is being increasingly divided by the strategic security competition between US-led G7 and the China-Russia compact. Caught in the middle are a large number of developing nations who are being forced to choose sides despite this not being in their best interests. It is against this backdrop that G20 aims to serve as a vital platform to voice concerns of the Global South.

True, challenges before the forum are many. From climate change and reforming global finance to tackling the current energy and food crises, the G20 agenda under India's presidency is expected to be full. This will give New Delhi the perfect opportunity to showcase its leadership skills. That Bangladesh is on the guest list along with UAE and Oman for the leaders' summit highlights India's regional prioritisation. But a dispute is already brewing over Russian President Vladimir Putin's expected attendance at the Bali leaders' summit this November. Some Western leaders want to exclude Russia from G20 until the war in Ukraine abates. The Indian presidency will inherit this problem. Remember, though, that kicking Russia out of G8 not only failed to deter Moscow vis-à-vis Ukraine but also pushed it closer to China. Therefore, India must make it clear that isolating Russia is not the answer. Meanwhile, on substantive matters, the Indian presidency should ensure that the G20-OECD pact on a 15% minimum global tax rate for large corporations should stick to the 2023 delivery schedule. MNCs' tax avoidance via using multiple geographies can only be tackled by multilateral, coordinated action. Getting this tax going will be a test of G20's efficacy.

Congress gears up...

delegates will be available in Mistry's office at the AICC headquarters from September 20 to 24. Those wanting to file nominations can come and choose their ten supporters from the list A copy of the list will be provided to those who file their nominations. A decision to keep the list at the AICC for perusal by those wanting to contest the election was taken after demands were made for greater transparency

with regard to the list. Thiruvananthapuram MP Shashi Tharoor had sent a letter to Mistry, which was jointly signed by party leaders Manish Tewari, Karti Chidambaram, Pradyut Bordoloi and Abdul Khaleque, demanding that the voters' list be made public. While the CEA declined the demand for making the list public, it agreed to make it available for perusal at the AICC headquarters in addition to the PCC offices.

Identity cards, bearing QR code, are being issued to all the delegates by September 20. The voters will have to carry the ID cards to the polling centre. Those delegates whose cards do not carry their photograph will have to carry an ID proof. Mistry said that the PCC delegates have been chosen by and large by consensus, except for Andamans, where election took place to choose the new PCC delegates.

issued a set of policy briefs for governments to strengthen their efforts against the coronavirus ahead of the expected winter surge of COVID-19, warning that new variants could yet undo the progress made to date.

If we don't take this opportunity now, we run the risk of more variants, more deaths, more disruption, and more uncertainty," Tedros said.

The WHO reported that the omicron subvariant BA.5 continues to dominate globally and comprised nearly 90% of virus samples shared with the world's biggest public database.

In recent weeks, regulatory authorities in Europe, the U.S. and elsewhere have cleared tweaked vaccines that target both the original coronavirus and later variants including BA.5.

Maria Van Kerkhove, the WHO's technical lead on COVID-19, said the organization expected future waves of the disease, but was hopeful those would not cause many deaths.

Meanwhile in China, residents of a city in the country's far western Xinjiang region have said they are experiencing hunger, forced

quarantines and dwindling supplies of medicine and daily necessities after more than 40 days in a lockdown prompted by COVID-19.

Hundreds of posts from Ghulja riveted users of Chinese social media last week, with residents sharing videos of empty refrigerators, feverish children and people shouting from their windows.

On Monday, local police announced the arrests of six people for spreading rumors about the lockdown, including posts about a dead child and an alleged suicide, which they said

incited opposition and disrupted social order.

Leaked directives from government offices show that workers are being ordered to avoid negative information and spread positive energy instead. One directed state media to film smiling seniors and children having fun in neighborhoods emerging from the lockdown.

The government has ordered mass testing and district lockdowns in cities across China in recent weeks, from Sanya on tropical Hainan island to southwest Chengdu, to the northern port city of Dalian. - Source : The Week

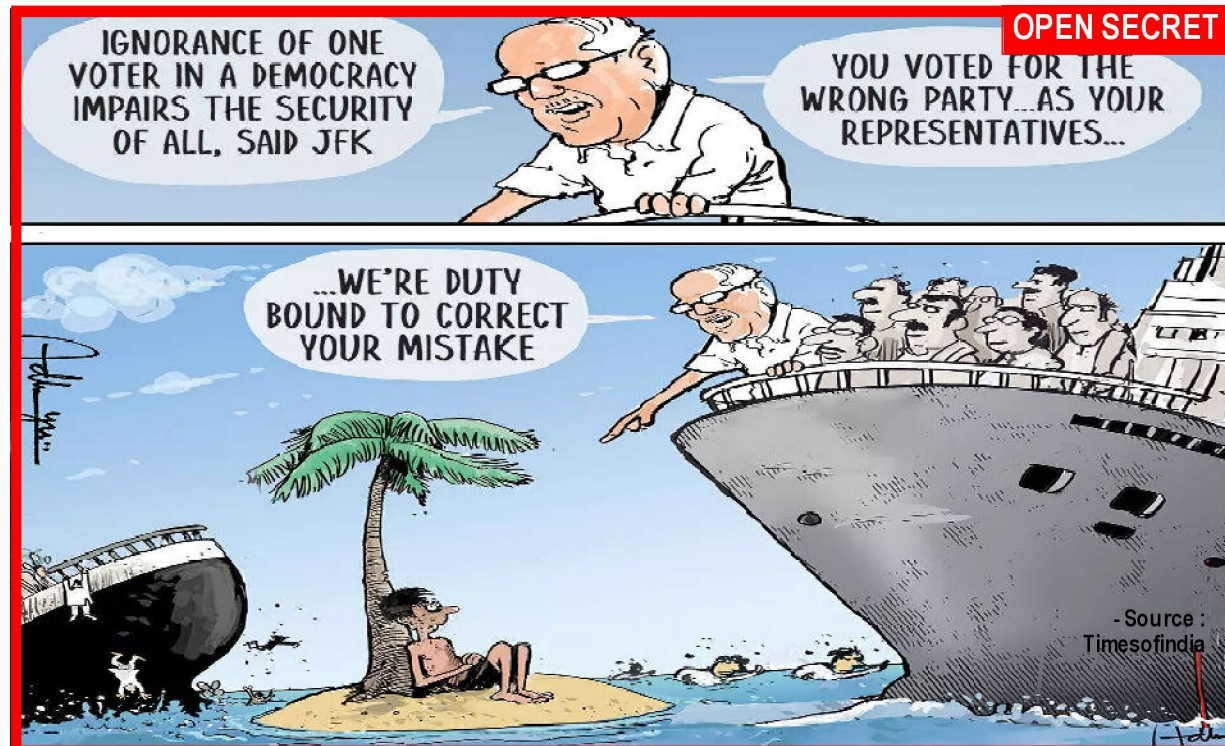
Right To Contest ...

the most in view of Part IX having been added in the Constitution, a right to contest election for an office in Panchayat may be said to be a constitutional right—a right originating in the Constitution and given shape by a statute. But even so, it cannot be equated with a fundamental right. There is nothing wrong in the same statute which confers the right to contest an

election also to provide for the necessary qualifications without which a person cannot offer his candidature for an elective office and also to provide for disqualifications which would disable a person from contesting for, or holding, an elective statutory office. In Rajbala (supra), it was held that the right to contest for a seat in either of the two bodies is

subject to certain constitutional restrictions and could be restricted further only by a law made by the Parliament. The court added that Singh did not have any right to contest election to the Rajya Sabha in terms of the law made by the Parliament. "The Representation of People Act, 1950 read with the Conduct of Elections Rules, 1961 has contemplated the

name of a candidate to be proposed while filling the nomination form. Therefore, an individual cannot claim that he has a right to contest election and the said stipulation violates his fundamental right, so as to file his nomination without any proposer as is required under the Act", the court said while dismissing the SLP.
