DEMANDS FOR PARKING SPOTS FOR TROUBLE-FREE SERVICES

Absence of designated parking space in city troubles auto rickshaw drivers

Port Blair, Nov 13: Lack of adequate parking space for auto rickshaws in the city has been creating hardship for the auto drivers as they are forced to park their auto on the roadside, adding to the traffic snarls in the city. Hundreds and thousands of auto operators operate in the city helping the commuters reach their working place on a daily basis. However, lack of parking space for the autos is causing a lot of difficulties for smooth flow of traffic. In order to avoid blockage of the traffic on roads, PBMC should develop as many parking spaces for the autos because if auto rickshaws are allowed to park haphazardly, the problem will soon become acute, in the

already congested city roads. Auto drivers too have placed their demands for creating parking space for auto. "There are several vacant lands in the city which can be developed as auto parking stands so that instead of parking on roads, auto can be parked on the designated auto parking stand to avoid traffic congestion", said an auto driver. "Officials of the Traffic Police and the Revenue department should conduct a joint survey of vacant land in the city which can be developed as parking lots for auto rickshaws. Vacant land in the Dairy farm Jn, Dollygunj Jn, Bathubasthi Jn, Garacharma, Shadipur Jn, Goalghar Jn, STS Bus Terminus Marine Gate, Aberdeen Bazar Jn. After identification

of the proposed land, the Port Blair Municipal Council should develop these land as parking space for autos. We have designated parking space for trucks, taxis and other mini-cargo vans, but there is no designated parking space for autos rickshaws", said another auto driver. "One of the constant complaints received by the traffic police was the rampant illegal parking of autos on the road causing congestion. The auto drivers are blamed for parking their vehicles on the road causing traffic chaos during peak hours. But without providing designated parking space to auto rickshaws, the auto drivers have no choice but to park their auto at any place anywhere on the roads", said a citizen.

Finding Nemo in Andamans

Near the southern tip of South Andaman Island, west of Port Blair, lies Wandoor, a quaint little town with spectacular beaches and lush greens, typical of tropical places. It is also the entry point to the Mahatma Gandhi Marine National Park, one of India's six protected marine environments. Most mornings, the jetty at Wandoor is buzzing with activity, as boats ferry people to the thalassic wilderness every 30 minutes.



Spread over 280 sqkm, the park comprises a dozen islands and several islets with bays, creeks and lagoons, and fragile ecosystems. Of these, only two—Jolly Buoy and Red Skin—are open to visitors. And it is to one of these that the boats head to on an hour-long journey, winding their way through a labyrinth of mysterious mangroves that are home to several wildlife species such as civets and deer, but none of them are visible through the thick growth. The abundance of water birds, however, more than makes up for it. Bright blue kingfishers, herons and waders flit across.

Most of the islands are surrounded by fringing reefs and vegetation that sometimes vary from island to island, depending on the extent of human interaction. A few of the islands are also crucial turtle breeding grounds.

The shores of the Jolly Buoy Island are a palette of

More judges please

The Supreme Court issuing notice to the Union law secretary over the delay in greenlighting collegium-cleared judge appointments again brings a long-simmering issue to a boil. Justices Kaul and Oka said it was unacceptable that the Centre was neither appointing nor communicating its reservations on the 11 names reiterated by the collegium. It is becoming “some sort of a device” to compel these persons to withdraw their consent, the bench said, arguing that delays like these makes the judiciary lose the services of talented candidates, who lose patience after a while.

Union law minister Kiren Rijiju has criticised the collegium system. CJI DY Chandrachud told this newspaper that there was no need for gamesmanship and grandstanding. He said the collegium ensures judicial independence but also said the system could do with more transparency and diversity in appointments. None of this helps, however. Neither has GoI attempted to revive the National Judicial Appointments Commission since 2015, nor has SC taken meaningful, proactive steps towards fostering transparency or diversity.

Therefore, given that the law as it stands now authorises the collegium to propose judicial appointments, there must be no inordinate delays in appointing judges cleared by the body – GoI should object only in rare cases and do so quickly. The Centre is free to enact an NJAC – and it should – but until then both the collegium and GoI must adhere to set timelines – for instance, it is 3-4 weeks when collegium reiterates a recommendation – in clearing names. The Bombay high court chief justice Dipankar Datta, who was recommended by the collegium for elevation to SC in late September, hasn't been appointed yet and the reasons aren't clear. There are seven vacancies in SC and 335 in HCs. Each vacancy filled could have shrunk their combined pendency burden of 60 lakh cases by hundreds of cases every month. GoI and SC must think of ordinary litigants who suffer.

EYE-DISEASE DRUG MAY HELP FIGHT COVID : STUDY

A drug already approved in the US for eye disease may stop the reproduction of SARS-CoV-2, the virus that causes COVID-19, according to a study.

The results indicate that the

drug called verteporfin, used for treating eye-disease, may be a candidate to treat COVID-19, and its status as FDA-approved could make it easier to launch clinical trials to verify its safety and effectiveness

against the coronavirus.

The interdisciplinary study, led by University of California, Los Angeles and published in PLOS Biology, showed that the Hippo signalling pathway is activated within



days of SARS-CoV-2 infection, suggesting that treatments using the mechanism could be deployed before symptoms arise to reduce the severity of disease, the study said.

Signalling pathways are complicated chain reactions which control many important human biological processes and in which certain proteins act as messenger molecules that promote or block the signals of other proteins.

The scientists, therefore, identified the Hippo signalling pathway as a potential target for therapies against the coronavirus.

The scientists performed experiments using tissue samples from people with COVID-19, as well as cultured human heart and lung cells selected to closely reflect how healthy cells respond to SARS-CoV-2 infection, the study said.

They observed changes in many genes involved with the Hippo signalling pathway after infection. In addition, they examined a protein called YAP, or Yes-associated protein, whose activity is blocked when the Hippo pathway is activated, according to the study.

The scientists found that in the

cultured human cells, both the original strain and Delta variant of SARS-CoV-2 activated the Hippo pathway in the first few days after infection.

When they silenced this pathway and increased YAP, the virus replicated itself more. The team also pretreated cells with verteporfin, which blocks YAP in the eye disease known as choroidal neovascularization, and then infected them with SARS-CoV-2, the study said.

In the verteporfin-treated cells, concentrations of the coronavirus were below detectable levels, compared to more than 60,000 units of the virus per millilitre in an untreated control group, according to the study. The lead researchers were investigating the Hippo pathway, which controls the size of organs in the body, in earlier National Institutes of Health funded studies of the Zika virus, which can cause undersized brains in infants. Noticing that this pathway also seemed to have virus-fighting effects, they launched the current study investigating SARS-CoV-2, the study said.

Chronic jet lag discovered in people living with HIV: Study

Washington [US], November 12 (ANI): People living with HIV have a significantly delayed internal body clock, consistent with the symptoms of jet lag, according to new findings. The findings, which have been published in the Journal of Pineal Research, may explain some of the health problems experienced by people with HIV, and guide research toward improving their quality of life.

Researchers from Northumbria and Surrey universities in the UK and South Africa's University of the Witwatersrand and University of Cape Town studied people aged 45 years and above living in South Africa's Mpumalanga province, where nearly one in four people is living with HIV. As such, the infection is endemic and does not associate with any difference in lifestyle. They found that physiological daily rhythms, as measured by the hormone melatonin, were delayed by more than an hour on average in HIV positive participants. Their sleep cycle was also shorter, with researchers noting that their sleep started later and finished earlier. This suggests the possibility that

HIV infection may cause a circadian rhythm disorder similar to the disruption experienced in shift work or jet lag. The authors believe that this body clock disruption may contribute significantly to the increased burden of health problems that people living with HIV are experiencing despite successful treatment such as an increased risk of cardiovascular, metabolic, and psychiatric disorders. South Africa has the fourth highest rate of HIV prevalence in the world, and researchers believe there is a strong need for further funding to identify whether similar disruption to the body clock is experienced by younger people living with HIV in other countries. "The participants living with HIV essentially experience the one-hour disruption associated with switching to daylight savings time, but every single morning," says Professor Malcolm von Schantz, Professor of Chronobiology at Northumbria University, corresponding author of the publication. "This happens in spite of the fact that essentially everybody is exposed to the same light-dark cycle. Our findings have important potential

implications for the health and wellbeing of people living with HIV, especially given the well-established relationships between disrupted circadian rhythms and sleep deprivation." Dr Karine Scheuermaier of the University of the Witwatersrand, senior author of the study added: "This is very similar to the risk profile observed in shiftworkers. Understanding and mitigating this disruption may be an important step towards helping people living with HIV live healthier lives." "Our findings identify an urgent research topic," says Xavier Gomez-Olive, also from the University of the Witwatersrand, whose research grant funded the study. "The next step must be to establish if the same body clock disruption exists in people living with HIV who are younger and who live in other countries." Co-author Dale Rae, of the University of Cape Town, added "This is a great example of the importance of studying sleep in people living in Africa, and demonstrates how findings from this research can also be relevant to people anywhere in the world." ‘See us as victims, not killers’: Rajiv Gandhi assassination convict after walking out of jail

Port Blair, Nov. 13: On November 11, the Supreme Court ordered the release of all the remaining six convicts, mirroring the reasoning of poor health and good behavior it had cited in May in the release of another convict in the assassination case. Referring to his release from prison after more than three decades in the assassination case of former Prime Minister Rajiv Gandhi, RP Ravichandran said that time will judge them as "innocents". He made the remarks on Saturday after walking out of jail. Speaking with news agency ANI, Ravichandran - who along with five other convicts, including Nalini Sriharan, were released from prison, said that the people of north India should see them as "victims instead of terrorists or killers". "Time and power determine who is a terrorist or a freedom fighter, but time will judge us as innocent, even if we bear the blame for being terrorists," he was quoted as saying. Nalini and Ravichandran had approached the Supreme Court in August seeking early release. They both

have been on parole since December 2021. Their move had come after the apex court granted bail to another convict in the assassination case - AG Perarivalan - on May 18. At the time, the SC had evoked its extraordinary powers under Article 142 of the Constitution to release Perarivalan on grounds of poor health and good conduct. On Friday (November 11), the top court released the remaining six convicts in the case, including Nalini and Ravichandran. Its ruling mirrored the reasoning cited by the court in Perarivalan's release. All seven convicts - Perarivalan, Nalini, Murugan alias Sriharan, Santhan, Ravichandran, Robert Payas and S Jayakumar - were arrested in 1991. Four of them, including Nalini's husband Sriharan are Sri Lankan nationals. On Saturday, Nalini - who was the longest-serving woman prisoner in the country - expressed gratitude to the people of Tamil Nadu for supporting her for 32 years. "I thank both, the state and Union government," she said. Nalini further stated that she is not

planning to meet anyone from the Gandhi family, stressing "there is no possibility" of that. "I want to be with my family... I will go wherever my husband goes. We were separated for 32 years. Our family kept waiting for us," she said. The Tamil Nadu government had earlier recommended the early release of the convicts, and following the SC order on Friday, chief minister MK Stalin said that the "welcomed" the decision. Gandhi was assassinated on May 21, 1991, at Sriperumbudur Tamil Nadu by a woman suicide bomber of the Sri Lanka-based Liberation Tigers of Tamil Eelam (LTTE) during an election campaign. The development was largely deemed to be because of his decision to send over 1,000 Indian forces to Lanka in 1987 to disarm Tamil rebels only to withdraw them later. Congress slammed the apex court's order, calling it "totally unacceptable" and "completely erroneous". The grand old party also said that the convicts have only been released from prison and not acquitted so they should not be seen as heroes. (Source: Hindustan Times)

mesmerising shades of blue met by pale sands. Picturesque as all of it is, the bigger attraction are the coral reefs that are close to the shore and in such shallow waters that it feels safe to snorkel even for rookies. What immediately catches the eye in the world below are the vivid colours of the corals in myriad shapes—spiny, needle-shaped, stubby, cauliflower-shaped, fan-shaped with domes like mushrooms. Some are clumped together, others scattered. Between them, they harbour varied sea creatures. The seafloor is packed with shells and pebbles

on which a sluggish octopus leisurely ambles along. There are a handful of star fish of differing sizes, in red, purple and yellow. Nondescript giant clams, their shells a dull sandy colour, merge with the floor, suddenly opening to reveal striking violent insides.

Dark sea cucumbers rest motionless on the corals and startle when they suddenly move. And then there are fishes that boggle the mind and dazzle the eye. Some of them swim in shoals, gracefully weaving in and out around the corals, moving as if to a silent symphony. Others are alone or in pairs. There are parrot

fish, tiger fish, angel fish, butterfly fish, in streaks of yellow, orange, green, blue and purple.

The most fascinating creatures though are bright orange clownfish, tiny in size but so agile. RAJIV GANDHI ASSASSINATION CASE CONVICT

R P Ravichandran, one of the six convicts in the Rajiv Gandhi assassination case who was released from prison on Saturday, has urged the people of north India to see them as victims instead of killers.

After his release from Madurai Central Prison, Ravichandran, who

ordered the release of the six convicts in the Rajiv Gandhi assassination case, following which Ravichandran and five others, including Nalini Siharani, were released from jail on Saturday.

Ravichandran was out on parole when the Supreme Court verdict came. He was brought to the Madurai prison

On his plans, Ravichandran said his family and friends came first and he would take a decision after discussing them with all. He also added they were "easy targets" and the real forces behind the Rajiv assassination were powerful.

Not meeting Gandhis

Meanwhile, another convict Nalini, who was released on Saturday, thanked the people of Tamil Nadu and the central governments for their help.

She said she wanted to be with her family, adding that they have been waiting for her for a long time and she now wants to be with them. "I will go wherever my husband goes. We were separated for 32 years. Our family kept waiting for us," she added. On whether she would want to meet the members of the Gandhi family, Nalini said there was no such possibility. "I am not planning to meet anyone from

the Gandhi family. We are under the case. There is no possibility of me meeting them. I want to thank the State and Central governments. I thank the state government for giving me parole, so I could go to the Supreme Court and try my level best," she said. She was the longest-serving woman prisoner in the country and was arrested in 1991 when she was 24-year-old.

at EPL clubs and inevitably, we are asked regularly about Fenway Sports Group's ownership in Liverpool.

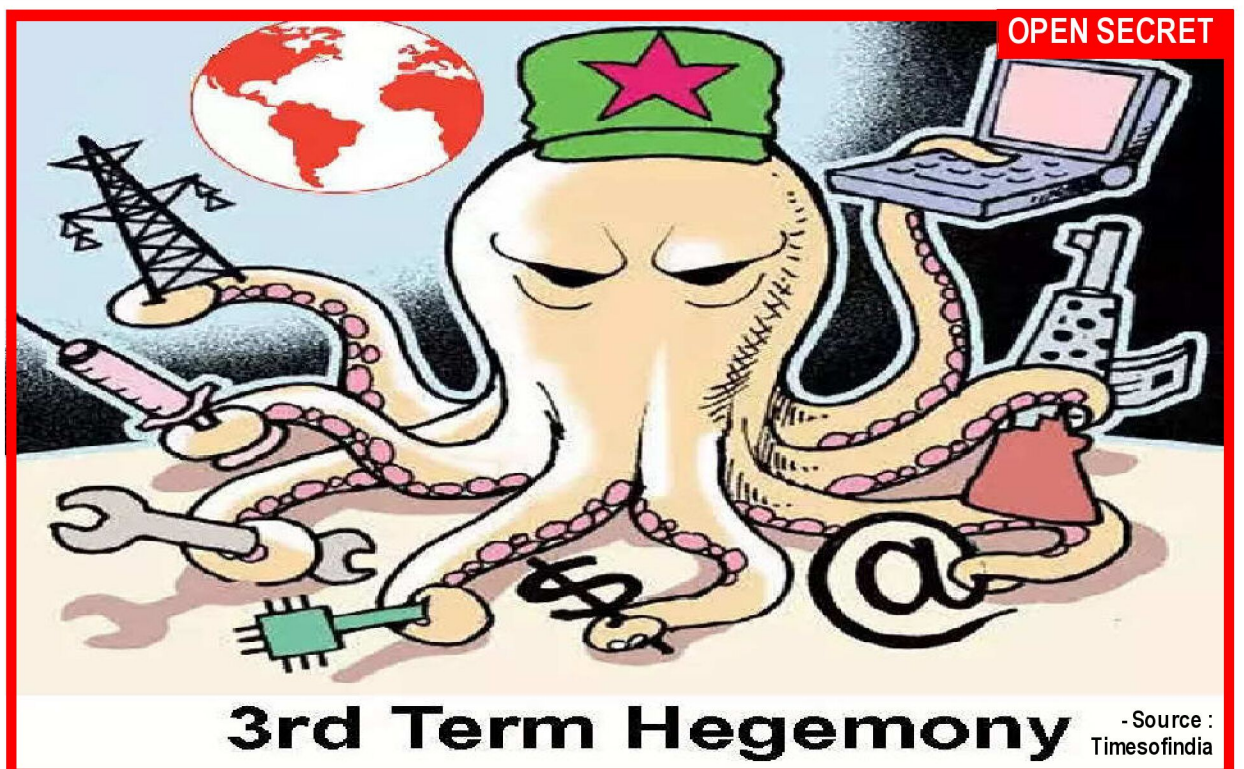
"FSG has frequently received expressions of interest from third parties seeking to become shareholders in Liverpool. FSG has said before that under the right terms and

conditions, we would consider new shareholders if it was in the best interests of Liverpool as a club."

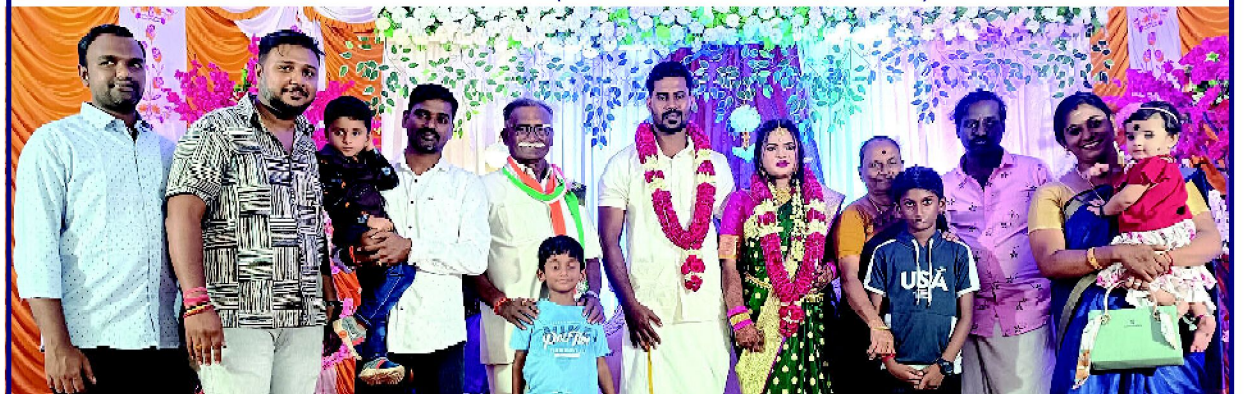

'Getting to No. 1, doesn't happen overnight...':
Sachin Tendulkar backs Team India after T20
World Cup disappointment

MUMBAI: Legendary Indian cricketer Sachin Tendulkar backed Men in Blue after their ten-wicket loss to England in the semi-final of the ICC T20 World Cup, saying that though the loss was very disappointing, the team should not be judged on basis of this defeat since it's the number one side in the shortest format of the game.

Highlighting that the T20 top ranking is not an instant process he added that a side should play good cricket over a period of time for it and India made their mark in the same.

"I know that the semi-final against England was very disappointing. Let us accept that we did not put up a good total on the board. 168 in Adelaide Oval

is not great since the dimensions of the ground are entirely different and side boundaries are really short. We were also unsuccessful in taking wickets. It was a tough game for us, a bad and disappointing defeat," legendary cricketer Tendulkar told ANI.

He also stressed that India is the number one side in the shortest format of the game.

"To get to that Number 1 spot, it does not happen overnight. The team has to play good cricket over a period of time and it has done that. Let us not judge our team on the basis of this performance. Players also did not want to go out and fail. In sports, these ups and downs are there. We have to be in it together," concluded Tendulkar.

His remarks came after the Men in Blue were knocked out in the semi-finals of the ICC T20 World Cup which left millions of cricket fans shattered.

Top knocks from openers Alex Hales and Jos Buttler powered England to an emphatic 10-wicket win over India in the second semi-final of the ongoing ICC T20 World Cup in Australia at Adelaide on Thursday.

Coming to the group stage, India had finished at the top of the Group 2 table with eight points under their belt, having won four matches out of five. They only lost one match in their group stage against South Africa.

Star batter Virat Kohli (296 runs in 6 innings with four fifties and tournament's leading run-



scorer), Suryakumar Yadav (239 runs in 6 innings with three fifties), pacer Arshdeep Singh (10 wickets) and all-rounder Hardik Pandya (128 runs with one fifty and eight wickets) were some of India's best performers in the tournament. - Source : Timesofindia

Asian Boxing Championships: Shiva Thapa
signs off with silver after sustaining injury

NEW DELHI: Shiva Thapa's (63.5kg) Asian Elite Boxing Championships campaign came

to a bittersweet end after he was forced to withdraw from the final midway due to an injury, bowing out with an unprecedented sixth medal, a silver, in Amman, Jordan on Saturday.

The 28-year-old, who became the most successful male boxer in the tournament, sustained an injury in his right knee in the opening seconds of the second round of the light welterweight gold medal bout against Abdullaev Ruslan of Uzbekistan, suffering a RSC (Referee stops the contest) loss.

Thapa, seeded third, was trailing when the injury occurred. He had lost the

fast-paced opening round 0-5.

In the opening three minutes, both the boxers had tried to assert their authority, even resorting to body blows with the Uzbek coming on top.

In the second round, while trying to make up ground, Thapa fell on the canvas after exchanging a few punches. He managed to rise up without any aid as the referee gave a count but the Indian looked in pain as play remained halted. Thapa then received medical attention as the ringside doctor examined his right knee.

Eventually the bout was called off as Thapa hobbled away. The seasoned boxer struggled to even stand up while the referee announced the winner.

The final will leave a bad taste, in an otherwise flawless campaign by Thapa.

His haul now includes a gold (2013), three silvers (2017, 2021 and 2022) and two bronze medals (2015 and 2019).

With the silver, Thapa has overtaken Kazakh legend Vassiliy Levit, an Olympic silver medalist and two-time world bronze medal winner, who was the only other male pugilist with five Asian Championship medals.

Six-time world champions MC Mary Kom (7) and L. Sarita Devi (8) have more Asian medals than Thapa, with the latter having the distinction of claiming six successive, five of them gold, at the peak of her prowess.

- Practice frequent hand washing. Wash hands with soap and water or use alcohol based hand rub. Wash hands even if they are visibly clean
- See a doctor if you feel unwell (fever, difficult breathing and cough). While visiting doctor wear a mask/cloth to cover your mouth and nose

Don'ts

- Cover your nose and mouth with handkerchief/tissue while sneezing and coughing
- Throw used tissues into closed bins immediately after use
- Avoid participating in large gatherings

Have a close contact with anyone, if you're experiencing cough and fever

Touch your eyes, nose and mouth

Spit in public
