Life in the ocean: From the shores or from a boat, the sea looks like a huge mass of uniform, inky blue water. It is not so actually. Life in the sea is amazingly different at different depths. From the surface to a few feet below, the ocean is a sunlit world. that changes from day to night. Below this, the ocean becomes cold, dim, and unchanging. And thousands of meters below the surface, the ocean is a region of nearfreezing temperatures, crushing pressure, and complete darkness.

Most marine plants and animals are adapted to living in one of three regions- the sunlight, twilight, or midnight zone. These zones are defined by the presence (or absence) of light. They differ from one another in temperature amount of pressure, and nutrient supply. We will mainly focus here on the sunlight zone where most of the familiar animals and plants are present.

Success is not an activity but a process ...

Incremental Win

The two-week long climate conference in Egypt has drawn to a close with a symbolic victory in the form of a fund that will compensate some of the countries bearing the brunt of climate changelinked natural disasters. However, progress on action to keep temperatures from rising beyond 1.5°C of pre-industrial levels was limited. The 27th edition of the United Nations Conference of the Parties was projected to be an 'implementation' COP that would have decisively resolved questions on how developed countries, responsible for the bulk of historical emissions, would make good on an old promise to provide developing countries \$100 billion annually by 2020. And whether the world would commit to end all categories of fossil fuel, and not just coal. Despite hours of negotiations, these deadlocks remain. COP27 will certainly be remembered as the COP of Loss and Damages (L&D). A nearly three-decade old movement, first initiated by the island nation of Vanuatu and the Alliance of Small Island States, has come to partial fruition. There will now be a dedicated fund to compensate the most vulnerable developing countries that are already bearing the brunt of climate change-linked natural disasters. L&D refers to impacts of climate change that cannot be avoided either by mitigation (cutting greenhouse gas emissions) or adaptation (modifying practices to buffer against climate change impacts). They also include not only economic damage to property but also loss of livelihoods, and the destruction of biodiversity and sites that have cultural importance. This broadens the scope for affected nations to claim compensation.

The text approved at Sharm el-Sheikh only commits to a fund being created and leaves discussions for how it is to be set up and, most importantly, who will pay how much to it, for future COP negotiations. While there have been nominal commitments by Scotland and Wallonia (Belgium) to donate to such a fund, the estimated L&D is already over \$500 billion. During negotiations this year, the European Union pressed hard for China, the Arab states and "large, developing countries" — and this could include India — to contribute on the grounds that they were large emitters. This already opens up fresh occasion for acrimony in future COPs and given that barely a third of committed climate finance has made its way to developing countries, the L&D fund too might take years before it can meaningfully operate. While the gain is incremental, countries ought not to lose momentum and must work harder to ensure that COPs remain credible catalysts and are not occasions for pyrrhic victories.

Anel Meley Pani Thuli: Resilience Was her Reply

November **HYDERABAD**: Movies hold a mirror to society and at times they are a mirror of society. A lot depends on how a certain incident is portrayed.


Decades back when 'Bandit Queen' was made, it had a tagline: 'Revenge Was Her Reply'. Phoolan Devi was assaulted by the upper caste men and hence she decided to queue them all and shoot them dead.

Similarly, in 'Zakhmi Aurat', Dimple Kapadia who played a cop, is gangraped. She decides to avenge it by castrating the perpetrators with a doctor friend of hers.

Revenge and instant justice might be natural instinct and expectation after the ordeal. But that's not exactly how the real world operates.

This is what 'Anel Meley Pani Thuli' (Moth on a flame in Tamil) is all about. The movie by debutant director R. Kaiser Anand is different from other rape stories in the sense that it takes a realistic approach to the incident and raises the important question of honor vis a vis weaponizing a woman's body.

Mathi (Andrea Jeremiah), the protagonist, is today's woman in every sense. She works as an operational manager with a sports store. She is a confident young woman who doesn't shy away from standing up for her women co-workers if need be. So, when on a trip to a village for marriage she herself faces assault, she is shaken but refuses to cow



to a hospital seeking medical treatment. However, she faces regular apathy there as no woman doctor is available. Next, she goes to a police station to register the case. Police too spring into action and nab quite a few people based on her description. However, it's here where a major twist occurs and Mathi realizes that in fact, the police inspector and two of his colleagues who are attending to her are the ones who assaulted her a few hours ago.

Kaiser Anand has done a wonderful job in sketching the character of Mathi. She is contemporary and courageous. She sports a never-say-die attitude which is essential in dealing with such tragedies. He has portrayed her as a survivor, a fighter, and not as a victim. Hence, she is hell-bent on seeking justice. "They should be punished as per the law," Mathi tells the lady cop, which essentially is the message of the movie.

Performance-wise Andrea Jeremiah shines There is no no histornics. currently. There is no shouting and

Mathi very bravely goes screaming and mostly all along she has emoted through her eyes and voice. A memorable and knock-out performance indeed. Aadhav Kannadasan as her fiancé, and Azhagam Perumal and Ilavarasu as the menacing cops too are

Google Maps will Now Let You Search for **Nearby Fast-Charging EV Stations**

November 21: Google Maps has just received an update with several new features, headlined by a new search filter that lets users find fast-charging EV stations in India. Users can now find stations with chargers rated 50kW or higher for a faster top-up. To use the feature, search for "EV charging stations" on the Maps app, then select the "Fast charge" filter.

Additionally, users can also choose to see search results based on the charging plugs that are compatible with their car. Both features are live widely on Android and iOS across countries where EV charging stations are available.

Google Maps has just received an update with several new features, headlined by a new search filter that lets users find fast-charging EV stations in India. Users can now find stations with chargers rated 50kW or higher for a faster top-up. To use the feature, search for "EV charging stations" on the Maps app, then select the "Fast charge" filter.

Additionally, users can also choose to see search results based on the charging plugs that are compatible with their car. Both features are live widely on Android and iOS across countries where EV charging stations are available.

The new Google Maps feature will make it easier than ever for EV owners to find charging stations that'll best serve their needs.

Alongside the EV charging-related additions, Google Maps is also expanding 'Accessible Places' and 'Live View' availability. Accessible Places lets people know if a destination is wheelchair accessible. The feature was launched in 2020 in select countries, but Google's now announced that it's available globally on Android and iOS. To use the feature, turn on the "Accessible Places" setting in the Google Maps app.

Meanwhile. Live View is an augmented reality feature that lets users view places nearby like stores, coffee shops, banks, and ATMs through their phone's camera. Simply tap on the camera icon on the search bar above in the Maps app to use it. Note that the feature is n't available in India right now, and is being rolled out only in cities like London, Los Angeles, New York, Paris, San Francisco, and Tokyo.


The issue regarding construction of Sea Wall at Mus was also discussed

Shri. Vishal Jolly raised Secretary that despite the Price) of Rs. 105.90/-, in the month of December 2021, the ground level implementation of copra procurement at MPS has not started yet. Hence, the poor farmers are forced to sell

their copra in a meagre price of Rs. 35/- to Rs. 39/- only, causing immense hardship to earn their livelihood. Appointment of Surveyors by NAFED at copra collection points was also placed and discussed elaborately.

The Chief Secretary, A&N Administration after hearing & discussion assured that he would soon visit Nicobar District and ensure that all these issues are sorted out at the earliest.

He further assured that on the issue of COPRA, he would soon convene a meeting with officials of NAFED and all procurement agencies for effective ground level implementation & grant of Minimum Support Price (MSP) to all farmers.

Watch: When French Team was Evacuated from Hotel During FIFA 2018 WC After Adil Rami Used Fire Extinguisher at Teammates

November 21: Following their 4-3 win over Argentina's Lionel Messi in the 2018 FIFA World Cup, the French team was evacuated from their hotel, after defender Adil Rami used a fire extinguisher at teammates.

In the BBC documentary, the teammembers of the France World Cup winning team revealed what exactly happened that night.

"After the match against Argentina, Didier had given the players leave after dinner," said Philippe Tournon, who was press officer for the French national team from 1983-2004 and again from 2010-18.

The players returned at 2 am and took to banging on Rami's hotel room door.

French journalist says: After beating Argentina in the last 16, some players decided to go out celebrating.

"Adil Rami stays in his room and plays Fortnite in his pants," says Laurens.

"Adil reacts, grabs the fire extinguisher, and starts spraying everybody," adds Laurens. Forward Olivier Giroud said most of them were youngsters. He says: "They were very loud, most of the young players." "It was funny, you



couldn't see anything!" adds Giroud.Tournon described what happened after the smoke detector went off.

"The smoke detector went off and woke up the whole hotel. My room was next to Deschamps. It hought he was going to tear them apart," recalls Tournon. "Instead, Deschamps said, 'If Ilay into them. I might break something we've been building for fiveor six weeks," says Touron. Deschamps' former team-mate Marcel Desailly isn't surprised.

"He's an ex-player, we've done certain things that were borderline ... very borderline! I can say, I cannot reveal this one, but. So he knows he has it in his system," says Desailly.

Deschamps didn't make a fuss out of it, and the next morning all of them had a good laugh.

"The next morning, everybody laughs about it. And that moment, in a way, emphasises so well the team spirit that France had at that world cup," says Laurens

Rami had narrated the incident to 'The Sun' in 2018 after France went on to win the World Cup. He had said: "The team began entering rooms and overturning the furniture. I took a fire extinguisher into my room as a precaution. When my door opened, Benjamin Mendy stuck his foot in and shouted: 'Come on, boys, let's trash Rami's room!' I let off the extinguisher on them. It was like a scene from Ghostbusters."


paramount, and we look forward to seeing him in Auckland."
