> In a letter addressed to the Minister of Information and Broadcasting, Government of India, the Member of Parliament mentioned that FM 100.9 MHz being broadcast

from AIR Port Blair has been declared as the  $42^{nd}\ FM$ Station of Vividh Bharati Network by Prasar Bharati. Accordingly, two hours of local programmes are being broadcasted from VB FM Port Blair in the morning and evening hours from 26.01.2019, the day when it was inaugurated.

In very short span of time the service has become immensely popular among the residents of a major part of South Andaman region

but sadly the transmission of Vividh Bharati FM Port Blair (100.9) does not reach to other Islands, where such service is needed very badly for entertainment of public and also to overcome the feeling of remoteness and isolation.

The Member of Parliament pointed out that availability of Vividh Bharati FM Port Blair (100.9) in all Islands will not only become a source of entertainment for Islanders but also it can save lives during any natural disaster

## A Brief Respite

Russian President Vladimir Putin's decision to observe a 36-hour ceasefire on the front line in Ukraine comes at a time when his troops are struggling to cope with a series of battlefield setbacks and mounting casualties. The Kremlin's version is that it ordered the ceasefire, from Friday noon till Saturday midnight, as Orthodox Christians in both countries celebrate Christmas on January 7. Ukraine has guestioned Russia's sincerity, saying the Kremlin would use the pause in fighting to replenish and rearm its forces and move more soldiers to the line of contact. Yet, if observed by both sides, this would be the first ceasefire on the entire front line since the war began on February 24 last year. Mr. Putin's move appears more like a sign of weakness than any serious push for peace. On New Year's day, Russia lost at least 89 soldiers when Ukraine targeted the eastern city of Makiivka where hundreds of troops were temporarily stationed. In Bakhmut, the eastern city that has been under attack for six months, Ukraine says its troops pushed back the Russians.

Russia, which made some territorial gains in the early phase of the war, has been struggling to build battlefield momentum ever since Ukraine, armed and bankrolled by the collective West, started its counter-offensive in late August. Ukraine recaptured swathes of territories from Russia, including much of the Kharkiv Oblast in the northeast and Kherson city in the south. Faced with battlefield setbacks, Gen. Sergey Surovikin, the new commander for the war, changed strategy — he redirected the offensive focus towards Donetsk, started building stronger defence lines across the vast front line, and launched a heavy bombardment campaign targeting Ukraine's critical energy infrastructure. The air strikes have partially damaged Ukraine's energy grid and disrupted power and water supplies to millions, but they have not changed the ground reality. If Ukraine survives winter, fighting could pick up pace. The U.S. and Germany have already announced that they would send Patriot missile systems to Ukraine. The U.S., France and Germany would also be sending armoured vehicles, to better prepare Kyiv for the coming land war. Cornered in the war theatre, Mr. Putin might come under enhanced pressure to escalate the conflict. But continuing this war will be costly for all sides. If the ceasefire holds for 36 hours, Mr. Putin should extend it further and seek dialogue, without preconditions, with both Ukraine and its backers in the West. The temporary truce should be the beginning of a lasting one.

## Health, Science /Tech **Old NASA Satellite**

Falling from Sky this



January 8: A 38-year-old retired NASA satellite is about to fall from the sky. NASA said Friday the chance of wreckage falling on anybody is "very low." Most of the 5,400-pound (2,450-kilogram) satellite will burn up upon reentry, according to NASA. But some pieces are expected to survive. The space agency put the odds of injury from falling debris at about 1-in-9,400.

The science satellite is expected to come down Sunday night, give or take 17 hours, according to the Defense Department. The California-based Aerospace Corp., however is targeting Monday morning, giveor take 13 hours, along a track passing over Africa, Asia the Middle East and the westernmost areas of North and South America.

The Earth Radiation Budget Satellite, known as ERBS, was launched in 1984 aboard space shuttle Challenger. Although its expected working lifetime was two years, the satellite kept making ozone and other atmospheric measurements until its retirement in 2005. The satellite studied how Earth absorbed and radiated energy from the sun.

The satellite got a special sendoff from Challenger. America's first woman in space, Sally Ride, released the satellite into orbit using the shuttle's robot arm. That same mission also featured the first spacewalk by a U.S. woman: Kathryn Sullivan. It was the first time two female astronauts flew in space together. It was the second and final spaceflight for Ride, who died in 2012

## Chintapalli Records 1.5 C, Thin Ice **Sheets Forms Over Grasslands**

January Visakhapatnam: Mercury dipped to 1.5 degrees Celsius in and around Chintapalli mandal under ASR district on Sunday morning. In several places thin ice sheets were seen on grasslands and vehicles that were kept in the open by the visitors. The morning was pleasant and surprised many tourists who have been camping since the new

This is for the second time the temperature dipped to such a low in five years. On December 31, 2018, the same temperature was recorded.

Senior scientist at Agriculture Regional Research Station at Chintapalli, Dr M Suresh Kumar said the lowest temperature zero degree Celsius was recorded on January 6, 1992. This was the lowest in 30 years, he said and added that the temperature dipped to 1 degree Celsius on December 30, 1998, January 5, 1999, January 17, 2003 and January 15, 2012.

"Lambasinghi located at 3,000 feet altitude might have recorded 1 degree Celsius. Chintapalli is located at a height of 2,800



feet and Araku Valley 2,700 feet," Dr Suresh Kumar said attributing the fluctuating low temperatures to climate change.

IMD officials and weather experts have said the temperature will drop further during the coming days in most parts of the state. People will witness more cold days during the Sankranti festival in



# He is Just Telling us that Batting is so Easy: Hardik on Surya

January 8: India captain Hardik Pandya on Saturday said with each innings the rampaging Suryakumar Yadav has been telling his teammates that "batting is so easy".

The 32-year-old Surya produced yet another scintillating knock an unbeaten 112 off 51 balls as India crushed Sri Lanka by 91 runs in the series-deciding third T20 International here for a 2-1 series win.

"Ithink he has been surprising everyone every innings that he isbatting. Heis just telling us that batting is so easy. If I were bowling to him, I'd be disheartened on seeing his batting, with the shot he plays. He has played blinders after blinders," Pandya said at the presentation ceremony.

Surya took over after Rahul Tripathi blazedaway to a 16-ball 35, and Pandya was also full of praise for the latter.

"Special mention to Rahul Tripathi the ball was doing something but he showed great intent. Then SKY did his thing." When asked if he has ever given advice to Surya, Hardik said, "You don't need to tell him anything, he knows what to do. If there is any situation where he is unsure, we have our chats but more often than not, he knows what to do." Thanks to Surya's blazing knock, India posted an imposing 228 for five. The hosts then bowled out Sri Lank for 137. While left-arm spinning allrounder Axar Patel went wicketless on Saturday, he played his



part with the bat, scoring 21 off just nine balls.

"I'm really proud of him (Axar), the way he is batting down the order and hitting. This will give a lot of confidence to him and the team as well," Hardik said.

The skipper added, "My motto in life as captain has been that I'llback myplayers. These are the best T20 cricketers in India and that's why they are here. There is no space for doubting in this format and we're backing the players properly." "The way we played in the series is pleasing, we didn't even play 50 percent of our game in the second game but we still fought well." Player of the Match Surya said he tried to put himself under pressure while preparing for a game.

"It is really important to put pressure on yourself when you are preparing for the game. The more pressure you put, the better you can play. There is a lot of hard work involved. Some quality practice sessions are also involved," Surya said. He added, "The boundaries (here) behind were 59-60m, so I tried to clear them. There are a few shots that are pre-determined but you have to be ready for other strokes as well.

"Most of the time, I try to find the gap, and use the field to my advantage." While he was disappointed with the overall result, Sri Lanka captain Dasun Shanakasaid he is "happy with my own performance".

"Before coming here, I was not in top form, but I am very happy with my own performance. The way boys played the tournament, there were a lot of positives. The players have improved a lot. Good to see them playing well." Asked about not bowling enough, Shanaka said, "Coming into the series, I had a finger injury, so I did not bowl enough."

"Hopefully, will bowl more in the ODIs. I want to keep the boys relaxed on the field, but while batting it is a different game."

## Nehra Made a Big Difference to My Captaincy at GT: Pandya

January 8: There has been no looking back for Hardik Pandya since he led Gujarat Titans to an IPL triumph in their maiden appearance last year, and the new Indian T20I skipper credits his franchise coach Ashish Nehra for making "a big difference" to his captaincy. Coming back from a long injury layoff, the premier all-rounder was made the Gujarat skipper in a bold move by the first-timers. But Pandya, who had led only once at senior level in a tour game against Australia, proved his

detractors wrong and led by example. "What has been very important from Gujarat point of view is the kind of coach I worked with. Ashish Nehra made a big difference in mylife, because of our mindsets. We might be two different personalities, but we have very similar cricketing thoughts," Pandya said after leading India to a 2-1 series win over Sri Lanka here on Saturday. "Because I was with him, it added value to mycaptaincy. It helped me to get exactly what I know. It was justabout getting that

assurance, once I got that... the awareness of this game I always knew. It was all about knowing and backing what I knew already. It has definitely helped me," he added.

Before the home series against Sri Lanka, the Indian selectors overhauled the side after the Rohit Sharma-led teamfailed towin the T20I World Cup in Australia, losing to eventual champions England in the semifinal.

Prior to this series, Pandya had led India's T201 side whenever Rohit was unavailable.


