Congress invites Akhilesh, Mayawati, former deputy CM Dinesh Sharma to attend Bharat Jodo Yatra in UP

LUCKNOW, DEC 26 /--/
The Congress has invited several leaders of non-BJP parties, including Samajwadi Party president Akhilesh Yadav, BSP supremo Mayawati and RLD's Jayant Chaudhary, to take part in the Uttar Pradesh leg of the Bharat Jodo Yatra.

An exception is former deputy chief minister Dinesh Sharma who has been invited to the yatra in his capacity as a professor of Lucknow University. Another professor of the university, Ravikant, has also been invited. The Rahul Gandhi-led Bharat

Pradesh on January 3 through Loni in Ghaziabad. It will then pass through Baghpat and Shamli to enter Harvana. Congress spokesperson Ashok Singh told PTI that the party has extended invitations to opposition leaders in the state to attend the yatra. In the present times when people are not allowed to raise their views, this yatra is the only option to know people's minds, the spokesperson said. The entire opposition has almost the same view about this government so they have been invited to participate

in the yatra, the party spokesman said.

In addition to Yadav. Mayawati and Chaudhary, the Congress has invited SP MLA Shivpal Singh Yadav, BSP general secretary Satish Mishra, Suheldev Bharatiya Samaj Party chief Omprakash Rajbhar and Communist Party of India secretary Atul Anjan, he said. Former Union minister Salman Khurshid, who is the state coordinator of the yatra, had told newspersons last week that the Bharat Jodo Yatra is not of any party but of the whole country and leaders of various parties will be invited to attend it.

the names of leaders who would be invited then Congress general secretary Priyanka Gandhi Vadra, who had led the party's campaign in the Uttar Pradesh assembly elections earlier this year, will join the yatra in the state on all three days. The Kanyakumari-to-Kashmir yatra, which has so far traversed more than 2,800 km through 10 states, is on a nine-day winter break and will resume on January started Kanyakumari in Tamil Nadu on September 7 and will conclude in Kashmir early next year. Maharashtra Lokayukta Bill that aims to bring CM, cabinet under its ambit tabled in Assembly

NAGPUR, DEC 26 /--/ The Maharashtra Lokayukta Bill 2022 which aims to bring the chief minister and the council of ministers under the ambit of the anti-corruption ombudsman, was tabled in the Assembly on Monday.

As per the draft bill, prior approval of the Assembly has to be obtained and the motion has to be placed before the immediate session of the House before initiating any inquiry against the chief minister. Such motion shall be passed by not less than two-thirds of the total members of the Maharashtra Legislative Assembly, the draft bill stated. The draft bill also held the Lokayukta shall not inquire into any matter involving any allegation of corruption against the chief minister if it relates to internal security or public order in the state. "any such inquiry shall be held in-camera and if the Lokayukta comes to the conclusion that the complaint deserves to be dismissed, the records of the inquiry shall not be published or made available to anyone," it states.

On the appointment of the ombudsman, the draft law states the Lokayukta shall consist of a chairperson who is or has been the Chief Justice of the High Court, a judge of the Supreme Court, or a judge of the Bombay High Court. "...such number of members, not exceeding four out of whom, two shall be judicial members," it said. The selection committee for the appointment of members and the chairperson will comprise the chief minister, deputy chief minister, speaker of the Legislative Assembly, chairperson of the Legislative Council, the Leaders of Opposition in the Assembly and Council and the chief justice of the Bombay High Court or a judge nominated by the CJ. "No appointment of the chairperson or a member shall be invalid merely by reason of any vacancy in the selection committee," the draft bill said.

Notably, Maharashtra Deputy Chief Minister Devendra Fadnavis had announced the state will have a Lokayukta law on the lines of the Centre's Lokpal law. (PTI)

Delhi govt sanctions Rs 104 crore for hospitals to procure general medicines amid fresh Covid scare

NEW DELHI, DEC 26 /--/ The Delhi government on Monday approved a budget of Rs 104 crore for hospitals to procure general medicines as part of preparations to deal with emergency situations amid a surge in Covid cases in some countries.

At a review meeting, deputy chief minister Manish Sisodia directed the heads of government hospitals to share details of beds, ventilators, ICUs, human resources, oxygen plants, and medical logistics with the Health department by the evening. "The surge in Covid cases globally is a matter of concern for everyone. Delhi hospitals have been asked to prepare well in advance and stay vigilant. "An amount of Rs 104 crore has been approved to ensure that there is no shortage of any medicines at government hospitals and they are well prepared to deal with any situation," a statement quoted Sisodia as saying. A mock drill will be organised at all the hospitals on Tuesday to ensure the health facilities' readiness for the management of Covid following the Centre's directions, the deputy chief minister added. He said any gaps would be addressed immediately by Health department officials.

The mock drill will assess bed availability, manpower, referral resources, testing capacity, medical logistics, telemedicine services, and medical oxygen, among others. Real-time data on the availability of beds, oxygen cylinders and ventilators will be available for the public on a Delhi government portal from Tuesday, officials said. An official said testing was also likely to be ramped up soon. At present, around 2,500 to 3,000 tests are being conducted daily in the city. Meetings are being held with residents' welfare organisations and nongovernment organisations, which are being asked to create awareness about the emerging situation.

Last week, chief minister Arvind Kejriwal had said the new Omicron sub-variant BF.7 of the coronavirus, which is causing a surge in cases in some countries, had not been detected in Delhi so far and that his government was fully geared to tackle any eventuality. Instructions have been issued to send samples from all positive cases for genome sequencing, increase precaution dose coverage and manpower in hospitals.

Kejriwal had also directed officials to take prior approval for procurement of essential items needed and inspect the machines in all hospitals. The chief minister had asserted that they were self-sufficient in terms of oxygen availability and storage. During the second Covid wave last year, Delhi had grappled with oxygen shortage with hospitals sending out SOS messages over depleting supplies on social media. However, experts say the BF.7 sub-strain should not worry India too much as a lot of people have developed immunity against the virus -- either through vaccination or previous infection -- unlike China where people have low immunity due to tough restrictions. "double government", can potentially propel it ahead of opponents when the narratives for the 2024 Lok Sabha polls begin to set in. It was a rout for Congress which won only 17 seats while the new entrant Aam Aadmi Party bagged five seats. However, in at least 35 seats, the combined votes polled by candidates of the Congress and the AAP exceeded the votes polled by BJP nominees. Gujarat was rocked on October 30 when British-era cable suspension bridge with a crowd of revellers enjoying Diwali vacation collapsed into the Machchu river, killing 135 people and injuring several others. In July, hooch claimed 50 lives in Botad district in the 'dry' state. On the legal front, a court in February sentenced a record number of 38 convicts to death holding them responsible for the 2008 synchronised blasts in Ahmedabad which killed 56 people and sentenced 11 others to life imprisonment. Memories of communal riots rekindled after 20 years when 11 convicts serving a life term for the gang rape of Bilkis Bano gang and murdering her family members were released from jail on remission in August. This decision of the Gujarat triggered government outrage and led to a legal challenge in the Supreme Court. After the top court upheld the clean chit given by the SIT to incumbent Prime Minister Narendra and 63 others, includingseniorgovernment officials in the 2002 Gujarat riots, the police arrested activist Teesta Setalvad, and IPS officers R B Sreekumar and Sanjiv Bhatt in June for allegedly fabricating documents to frame innocent

people in the riots cases. On the social front, public flogging of youths from the Muslim community by the police in Undhela village after stones were thrown at a Garba event in October led to an outrage. On the crime front, the daylight murder of Grishma Vekariya, a college student, in February in Surat by her jilted lover Fenil Goyani, in front of her family members, sent shock waves. Security agencies seized drugs worth crores during the year from the porous coast of Gujarat, which showed the state has emerged as a transit route to smuggle the banned substances. In April, heroin worth Rs 1,430 crore was seized near Kandla port. In the same month, the Indian Coast Guard seized a Pakistani boat carrying heroin worth Rs 280 crore and arrested nine crew members.

In July, heroin worth Rs

376 crore was seized near the Mundra port. The issue of illegal migration to the US from Gujarat came to the fore following the tragic death of a family of four hailing from Dingucha village on the Canada-US border in January. The deceased Jagdish Patel, his wife, and two children froze to death just a few metres away from the US border in Canada. Police cracked down on agents involved in illegal human trafficking after the incident. The highlight of the year was the Assembly elections given Gujaratis the home state of PM Narendra Modi and Union home minister Amit Shah. The contest was expected to be three-pronged between the ruling BJP, the opposition Congress, and Aam Aadmi Party. But in the end, the ruling party had the last laugh as it reaped the rich

NASHIK, DEC 26 /--/ Shiv Sena MP and chief minister Eknath Shinde's son Shrikant Shinde on Monday said the state government will take the right steps on Maharashtra's border dispute with Karnataka.

The issue of

Maharashtra-Karnataka border row heated up in the ongoing winter session of the state Assembly here on Monday, with opposition demanding a resolution on the issue. Talking to reporters here, the Sena MP said the chief minister had been in jail for taking part in an agitation over the border issue in the past and knows the intensity of the dispute well. The state government is with the Maharashtra Ekikaran Samiti and right will be taken regarding the issue, he said. Earlier in the day, Deputy Chief Minister Devendra Fadnavis informed the legislative Assembly that the state government will do whatever it can to ensure that the Marathi-speaking people in Karnataka get justice and asserted that the state government will fight even for an inch of land. On the Opposition's demand for resignation of state Minister Abdul Sattar alleging an irregularity in ordering 'regularisation' of the possession of land reserved for grazing in favour of a private person, Shinde said the opposition parties don't have any real issues to raise and were making allegations without

doing any research. Sattar had passed the order in June 2022 when he was the Minister of State for Revenue in the previous Uddhav Thackeray-led Maha Vikas Aghadi (MVA) government. The Nagpur bench of the Bombay High Court last week issued a notice to Sattar for ordering 'regularisation' of the possession of land reserved for public 'gairan' (grazing) in favour of a private person in the face of a civil court order. The MP also took potshots at the Thackeray-led faction of the Shiv Sena stating that it needs to introspect why people are leaving the fold and where it is going wrong.

Himachal govt suspends functioning of staff selection commission over

recruitment exampa per leak

SHIMLA, DEC 26 /--/ The Sukhvinder Singh Sukhu government suspended the functioning of the Himachal Pradesh Staff Selection Commission (HPSSC) on Monday, two days after an HPSSC employee was arrested along with five others over the leak of question paper for the junior office assistant (IT) recruitment exam.

According to a notification issued by the state government here, the decision has been taken in view of various irregularities found in the working of the commission, especially the recruitment process for the JOA (IT) posts.

"There has been a reported instance of leak of question paper for the post of Junior Office Assistant (Information Technology) (JOA-IT), for which examination was scheduled to be held on December 25 besides information regarding leak of question papers of posts of Junior Auditors and Computer Operators, for which examination is proposed to be held in near future," the order said.

The acts of omission and commission in the HPSSC have not only eroded its credibility but also adversely impacted the larger public interest. Prima facie, it appears that the commission has not discharged its duties and responsibilities objectively, in a transparent manner as well as with due confidentiality to the detriment of job aspirants, the order added. ShriAyyappan along with other leaders visited the residence of the victim on 25th December, 2022 morning and spoke to his family members, relatives and villagers assembled there. He stated in his letter that the area is inhabited by a

villagers informed ShriAyyappan that the above incident occurred due to the sheer callousness of the authorities concerned as no action was taken by the authorities to shift the crocodiles from the area to the Crocodile sanctuary despite requests by the fishermen villagers. The incident occurred at a place 1 KM away from Guptapara Fish Landing Centre. It is surprising that the crocodiles were allowed to remain at a place where fishermen are fishing and inhabit. Shri Ayyappan alleged that no concrete step was taken by the Environment & Forest Department of the A & N Administration or by the concerned Panchayat-raj institutions to shift the crocodile from the area because of which the instant incident occurred. He informed the Lt. Governor that the rescue operation launched by the Forest Department to save the victim was also not effective and it was reportedly conducted in a very casual manner. The family members of the victim and the villagers have reported to the CPI (M) leaders that no officer from the Administration visited their home or in the area after the tragic incident and it was left at the discretion of the lower level officials of the Forest Department. 

Prachanda Nepal's new PM

The surprise appointment of CPN-Maoist Centre chairman Pushpa Kamal Dahal on Sunday as Nepal's new Prime Minister may not bode well for India-Nepalties as Prachanda, as he is popularly known, and his main backer KP Sharma Oli had some run-ins with New Delhi previously over territorial issues. There has been an understanding between Prachanda and Oli to lead the government on rotation basis and Oli agreed to make Prachanda Prime Minister at the first chance as per his demand. Prachanda, the 68year-old guerrilla leader of former communist rebels, dramatically broke away from the five party ruling alliance led by the Nepali Congress. ending the political uncertainty after last month's general elections failed to produce a clear winner. Prachanda has support of 168 lawmakers in the 275-member House of Representatives which includes CPN-UML with 78, CPN-MC with 32, Rastriya Swatantra Party (RSP) with 20,

Rastriya Prajatantra Party (RPP) with 14, JSP with 12, Janamat with 6, and Nagarik Unmukti Party with 3. Nepali Congress is the largest party with 89 seats, and along with the other ruling alliances it has a combined strength of 136 seats in the House--just two seats short of majority.

Prachanda, who becomes the Prime Minister of Nepal for the third time, is seen as pro-China. He has in the past said a new understanding with India needed to be developed on the basis of "changed scenario" in Nepal and after addressing all outstanding issues, like revision of the 1950 Friendship Treaty and resolving Kalapani and Susta border disputes. The India-Nepal Treaty of Peace and Friendship of 1950 forms the bedrock of the special relations between the two countries. In recent years, Prachanda, however, said India and Nepal need to address diplomatically some of the issues "left by history" to realise the full potential of the bilateral cooperation. His main backer Oli is also known for his pro-China stance. As the prime minister, Oli last year claimed that efforts were being made to oust him after his government redrew Nepal's political map by incorporating three strategically key Indian territories, a move that strained ties between the two countries. India had termed as "untenable" the "artificial enlargement" of the territorial claims by Nepal after its Parliament unanimously in 2020 approved the new political map of the country featuringLipulekh, Kalapani and Limpiyadhura areas which India maintains belong to it.

Nepal shares a border of over 1850 km with five Indian states -- Sikkim, West Bengal, Bihar, Uttar Pradesh and Uttarakhand. Land-locked Nepal relies heavily on India for the transportation of goods and services. Nepal's access to the sea is through India, and it imports a predominant proportion of its requirements from and through India.

Pentagon deeplyworried at China's military beef-up

The Pentagon, headquarters of US military establishment, submitted to the US Congress a report, 'Military and Security Developments Involving the People's Republic of China 2022' pursuant to the National Defence Authorisation Act for Fiscal Year 2000. It reflects Pentagon's concern about China's military beef-up as it poses a challenge to the hegemonistic power of American military supremacy. The report encapsulates China's plan to beef up the integrated development of mechanisation, informatisation, and intelligentisation of the PRC's armed forces, aiming at outmanoeuvring of the American military-industrial complex in a couple of decades.,

The 196-page report reveals "in both classified and unclassified form, on military and security developments involving the People's Republic of China 'tenets and probable development of Chinese security strategy and military strategy, and of the military organisations and operational concepts supporting such development over the next 20 years. The covert belligerence in PRC's preparedness is of concern for Washington although Beijing reiterated its commitment to US-China engagement and cooperation on security matters through bilateral military-to-military contacts, for such engagement and cooperation. The report identifies 'the contours of the People's Liberation Army's way of war', while surveying China's current activities and capabilities, and assessment of its future military modernisation

The Pentagon document has noted that PRC in 2021 began reposing greater responsibility on the PLA 'as an instrument of statecraft as it adopted more coercive and aggressive actions in the Indo-Pacific region'. Following completion of modernisation in 2020, the PLA 'now sets its sights to 2027 with a goal to accelerate the integrated development of mechanisation, informatisation, intelligentisation of the PRC's armed forces. If realized, this 2027 objective could give the PLA capabilities to be a more credible military tool for the Chinese Communist Party to wield as it pursues Taiwan unification.' There is a comparative statement between China and Taiwan in tabular form on China's all out edge over Taiwan in any eventual military showdown. The 20th National Congress of the CCP laid down important military and security

implications for the PLA's 2027 centenary objectives while having focused on intensification and acceleration of PLA's modernisation goals over the next five years, including strengthening its "system of strategic deterrence." The report mentions how CCP increasingly turns to the PLA in support of its global ambitions. It covers security and military developments involving the PRC until the end of 2021.

The Pentagon report in the sub-section, 'understanding China's strategy, mentions PRC's national strategy that aims to achieve the great rejuvenation of the Chinese nation" by 2049. China 'increasingly views the United States as deploying a whole-of-government effort meant to contain the PRC's rise, which presents obstacles to its national strategy'.


Importantly, China describes its view of strategic competition' in terms of a rivalry among powerful nation states, as well as a clash of opposing ideological systems'. Leaders of PRC - top brass of CCP -believe that structural changes in the international system and an increasingly confrontational USA 'are the root causes of intensifying strategic competition' between the two countries. One of the special features of China's armed preparatory plan is what is termed as Military-Civil Fusion Development Strategy that plans to "fuse" its security and development strategies to build an integrated National Strategic System and Capabilities in aid of the PRC's national rejuvenation goals. It will develop and acquire advanced dual-use technology for military purposes and deepen reform of the national defence science and technology industries that serves a broader purpose to strengthen all of the PRC's instruments of national power. China's space industry, managed by the PLA, is rapidly expanding its intelligence, surveillance, reconnaissance, navigation, and communication satellite constellations. The successful landing of a rover on Mars and launch of the first and second modules of China's first long-term space station in 2021 and 2022 demonstrated the industry's continued progress. PRC's strategic land-based nuclear and

conventional missile forces, associated support forces, and missile bases. The PLARF is advancing its long-term modernisation plans to enhance its strategic deterrence capabilities. The SSF is a theatre command-level organisation established to centralize the PLA's strategic space, cyberspace, electronic, information, communications, and psychological warfare missions and capabilities'. The JLSF provides integrated joint logistics support for the PLA and concentrates its efforts on improving joint strategic and campaign-level logistic efficiencies through training and on integrating civilian products and services.

China's arsenal is mammoth with the largest aviation force in the Asia-Pacific region and the third largest in the world, with over 2,800 total aircraft (not including trainer variants or uncrewed aerial systems (UAS) of which approximately 2,250 are combat aircraft (including fighters, strategic bombers, tactical bombers, multi-mission tactical, and attack aircraft).

China has developed a sophisticated, persistent cyber-enabled espionage and attack threat to military and critical infrastructure systems through its efforts to develop, acquire, or gain access to information and advanced technologies. Detected PRC cyberspace operations target telecommunications firms, managed service providers and software developers. The PLAAF is rapidly catching up to Western air forces and continues to modernise with the delivery of domestically built aircraft and a wide range of UAVs. In October 2019, the PLAAF publicly revealed the H-6N as its first nuclear-capable air-to-air refuelable bomber, signalling the airborne leg of its nuclear triad.. In 2021, it launched approximately 135 ballistic missiles for testing and training. This was more than the rest of the world combined, excluding ballistic missile employment in conflict zones. In 2021, the PRC continued building three solid-fuelled intercontinental ballistic missile (ICBM) silo fields, which will cumulatively contain at least 300 new ICBM silos. China's space industry, managed by the PLA, is rapidly expanding its intelligence, surveillance, reconnaissance, navigation, and communication satellite constellations. The successful landing of a rover on Mars and launch of the first and second modules of China's first longterm space station in 2021 and 2022 demonstrated the industry's continued progress. (IPA)


bloke sound like an Indian.

CPI(M)'s Tarigami suggests dialogue to resolve issues of Kashmiri Pandit employees

JAMMU, DEC 26/--/Asserting that warnings only complicate issues rather than solving them, Senior Communist Party of India (Marxist) leader MY Tarigami on Monday suggested dialogue with the protesting employees who are seeking their relocation outside Kashmir in the wake of targeted killings.

Hundreds of Kashmiri migrant Pandits and Jammu-based reserved category employees are camping in Jammu after leaving their places of postings in the Valley following the killing of their colleagues -- Rahul Bhat and Rajni Bala -- by terrorists in May.

Last week, Lieutenant Governor Manoj Sinha asserted that all necessary measures had been taken to ensure the safety of minority community employees, including Kashmiri Pandits, in Kashmir and sent out a "loud and clear" message to those demanding a transfer that no salary will be given for sitting at home.

"They are caught in a hapless situation and need a sympathetic and humanitarian approach to address their demands. The warnings are not given to our own people, it further complicates the situation," Tarigami, who is also convener and spokesperson of the People's Alliance for Gupkar Declaration (PAGD), told PTI here.

He said the minority employees are feeling insecure and "they (administration) is saying that they are not going to listen to them". "...Learn to conduct business with your own people by holding dialogue and made them satisfy if you think the situation is normal in the valley, though it is

Tarigami said the National Investigation Agency (NIA) and other central government agencies are going house-tohouse and the people are being booked under the draconian Public Safety Act (PSA) and shifted to jails outside the valley.

"If the situation is normal, why do they not go for removal of the Armed Forces Special Powers Act (AFSPA)? Journalists are not free to work or make critical analyses of the situation," he said. (PTI)

Services affected for over an hour on Pink Line section due to OHE issue

NEW DELHI, DEC 26/--/ Services were affected for over an hour on a section of the Delhi Metro's Pink Line on Monday due to a disruption caused by a bird dropping an external wire on a live overhead equipment (OHE) line, officials said on Monday.

The 58-km-long Pink Line connects Majlis Park with Shiv Vihar.

"Train services between Maujpur and Shiv Vihar section of the Pink Line were affected on the down line (going towards Shiv Vihar) from 11.15 am to 12.35 pm today as one of the OHE wire parted due to scrap external wire dropped by bird on live OHE resulting in shorting of phase to earth," a senior Delhi Rail Metro (DMRC) Corporation official said.

He said the DMRC's OHE maintenance teams "rushed to the site and undertook the repair work" of this parted catenary wire (part of OHE), which was damaged and broken the Jauhari between Enclave and Shiv Vihar

During this period, single line services were maintained between Shiv Vihar to Maujpur through the up line as maintenance work of the damaged catenary wire was in progress in the affected section on the down line, the official said.

Normal services were restored on the MaujpurShiv Vihar section at 12.35 pm, he said.

The DMRC had also tweeted to alert commuters earlier in the day.

"Slow movement of trains between Shiv Vihar and Maujpur-Babarpur stations on the Pink Line. Services are normal on the section i.e. between Maujpur-Babarpur and Majlis Park. Normal service on all other lines," the DMRC tweeted at 11:25 am.

There was no impact on train services from Maujpur to Majlis Park during this period as Maujpur is a loop interchange section on the Pink Line, the official said, adding that regular announcements were also being made to inform the passengers about it. (PTI)

Videocon founder Dhoot arrested in ICICI Bank loan fraud case

Court remands the industrialist along with Chanda and Deepak Kochhar, earlier arrested in loan fraud case, to CBI custody till Dec 28

NEW DELHI, DEC 26/--/The CBI on Monday arrested Videocon Group founder Venugopal Dhoot in connection with the ICICI Bank loan fraud case, officials said. The 71-year-old Dhoot was arrested from Mumbai after a brief questioning session on Monday morning, hours before former CEO and MD of the ICICI Bank Chanda Kochhar and her husband Deepak Kochhar were to be produced before a Special Court for remand hearing. The CBI is planning to file a charge sheet against the three and other suspects soon, they said. The three-day remand of Kochhars arrested on December 23 is getting over on Monday. The CBI had taken into custody Chanda Kochhar and her husband Deepak alleging that they were not cooperating with the investigation, and

giving evasive replies. Chanda Kochhar has denied knowledge of any pecuniary transactions between her husband and Dhoot, the agency had claimed during remand proceedings at a CBI Special Court in Mumbai on December 24. Senior advocate Amit Desai, appearing for the Kochhars, had opposed the remand, saying the "main borrower of the loan has not been arrested, and the present accused were not the beneficiary of any amount. Desai had also brought to the court's notice a letter written by the ICICI Bank to the CBI in July 202I stating that there was no wrongful loss to it in any of the transactions under question. The CBI had named the Kochhars and Dhoot, along with companies Nupower Renewables (NRL) managed by Deepak Kochhar, Supreme Energy, Videocon International Electronics Ltd, and Videocon Industries Limited, as accused in the FIR registered under IPC sections related to criminal conspiracy and provisions of the Prevention of Corruption Act in 2019, they said.

The CBI had alleged that ICICI Bank had sanctioned credit facilities to the tune of Rs 3,250 crore to the companies of Videocon Group promoted by Dhoot in violation of the Banking Regulation Act, RBI guidelines, and credit policy of the bank. It was also alleged that as a part of the quid pro quo, Dhoot made an investment of Rs 64 crore in Nupower Renewables through Supreme Energy Pvt Ltd (SEPL) and transferred SEPL to Pinnacle Energy Trust managed by Deepak Kochhar through a circuitous route between 2010 and 2012. China continues to reel under a wave of Omicron variants, Xi demanded more efforts in guiding the public acquire health knowledge and skills, maintain good personal hygiene and form a healthy lifestyle to build a defence line against the epidemic for the whole society, state-run Xinhua news agency reported on Monday. This is the first time that the Chinese president has commented on the grim Covid situation in the country after his government overnight relaxed the stringent zerocovid policy earlier this month following mass antigovernment protests. British, Indian with suspected Covid infection land in Kolkata airport from abroad

KOLKATA, DEC 26/--/A British national and an Indian coming from abroad were suspected to be infected with Covid-19 following a rapid antigen test at the Netaji Subhas Chandra International Airport in Kolkata, a senior official of the West Bengal Health Department said on Monday. The British woman, aged around 42 years, has been shifted to an isolation ward of the state-run Infectious Diseases & Beleghata General Hospital in Beliaghata here, the officer said. Her sample was sent for genome sequencing at the National Institute of Biomedical Genomics at Kalyani in West Bengal's Nadia district to ascertain whether she is infected with the BF.7 variant of coronavirus.

The other passenger, a man from Bihar's Darbhanga who returned from Bangkok, "has gone back home on his own" from the airport, the officer said.

The woman who had landed at the city airport on Sunday night from Kuala Lumpur was initially kept in isolation at a hotel before she was shifted to the hospital on Monday morning, the official added. An RT-PCR test was conducted on the British national and the result is awaited. The state health department would be monitoring the health of the other 30-odd passengers who travelled on the same flight with her. "The woman was meant to travel to Bodh Gaya. We are waiting for the RTPCR report and will take action accordingly," the official said. He told PTI that the man

Mehrauli murder: Accused Poonawala taken to forensic lab to record voice sample

NEW DELHI, DEC 26/--/Mehrauli murder accused Aaftab Amin Poonawala was on Monday taken to the Central Forensic Science Laboratory here to record his voice sample after police came across an audio clip in which he was purportedly heard fighting with Shraddha Walkar. According to sources, police came across the audio recording, purportedly of a heated argument between Walkar and Poonawala, while investigating the murder case. The accused, currently lodged in Tihar Jail, was taken to the CFSL to record his voice sample which will be checked if it matches the male voice in the clip, they said. "We have got hold of an old audio clip in which Poonawala could be heard having a heated argument with Walkar. It is an old clip but could prove to he crucial evidence with respect to the case," a source privy to the development in the case said. "Poonawala was taken to the CFSL where his voice sample was recorded and it will be matched with the purported audio clip to ascertain if it was Poonawala's voice in the alleged audio. "This will help us understand the kind of relationship they shared and further help us in establishing the trigger behind the incident," the source added. According to

them, Poonawala reached the CFSL office around 11 am and left for Tihar from there around 3 pm after recording his voice sample for which the Delhi Police had sought permission from a city court. The sources also said the investigating team has got a purported video of Poonawala and Walkar from a witness' phone in which Poonawala is allegedly seen being "counselled." This video was purported to have been shot in Mumbai. 'We are also checking the veracity of the purported video and will question Poonawala in this regard as the probe is still underway," the source said. The investigating team is also in the process of getting Poonawala's face recognition test done. During the process, a 3D image of his face will be taken to ensure that he cannot deny his presence in the said video, they added. Poonawala allegedly strangled his live-in partner Walkar, 27, and sawed her body into 35 pieces, which he kept in a 300-litre fridge for almost three weeks at his Mehrauli residence, before dumping them across the city over several days. He was arrested on November 12, and a court in New Delhi on Friday extended his judicial custody by 14 days. (PTI(

Frigid monster storm across **US claims at least 34 lives**

hunkered down against a deep freeze Sunday to ride out the winter storm that has killed at least 34 people across the United States and is expected to claim more lives after trapping some residents inside houses with heaping snow drifts and knocking out power to tens of thousands of homes and businesses. The scope of the storm has been nearly unprecedented, stretching from the Great Lakes near Canada to the Rio Grande along the border with Mexico. About 60 per cent of the US population faced some sort of winter weather advisory or warning, and temperatures plummeted drastically below normal from east of the Rocky Mountains to the Appalachians, the National Weather Service said.

Travellers' weather woes are likely to continue, with hundreds of flight cancellations already and more expected after a bomb cyclone when atmospheric pressure drops very quickly in a strong storm developed near the Great Lakes, stirring up blizzard conditions, including heavy winds and snow. Some 1,707 domestic and international flights were cancelled on Sunday, according to the tracking site FlightAware. The storm unleashed its full fury on Buffalo, with hurricane-force winds and snow causing whiteout conditions, paralysing emergency response efforts. New York Gov. Kathy Hochul said almost every fire truck in the city was stranded Saturday

and implored people Sunday to respect an ongoing driving ban in the region. Officials said the airport would be shut through Tuesday morning. The National Weather Service said the snow total at the Buffalo Niagara International Airport stood at 109 centimetres Sunday.

Daylight revealed cars nearly covered by 6-foot snowdrifts and thousands of houses, some adorned in unlit holiday displays, dark from a lack of power. With snow swirling down untouched and impassable streets, forecasters warned that an additional 1 to 2 feet of snow was possible in some areas through early Monday morning amid wind gusts of 40 mph. Police said Sunday evening that there were two "isolated" instances of looting during the storm. Two people died in their suburban Cheektowaga, New York, homes Friday when emergency crews could not reach them in time to treat their medical conditions. County Executive Mark Poloncarz 10 more people died in Erie County during the storm, including six in Buffalo, and warned there may be more dead. "Some were found in cars, some were found on the street in snowbanks," said Poloncarz. "We know there are people who have been stuck in cars for more than 2 days." "If I stay in this car I'm going to die here with my kids," Ilunga recalled thinking. He cried when the family walked through the shelter doors. "It's something I will never forget in

Russia shoots down Ukrainian drone near its Engels airbase

Russian military reported on Monday that it shot down Ukrainian drone approaching an airbase deep inside Russia, the second time the airbase has been targeted this month, raising questions about the effectiveness of Russia's air defenses if drones can fly that far into the country.

Russia's Defense Ministry said the incident took place in the early hours of Monday, and three servicemen were killed by debris at the Engels airbase that houses the Tu-95 and Tunuclear-capable strategic bombers that have been involved in launching strikes on Ukraine. Engels is located in Russia's Saratov region on the Volga river, more than 600 kilometers (more than 370 miles) east of the border with Ukraine, No. damage was inflicted on Russian aircraft, the ministry said.

Ukrainian Air Force spokesperson Yurii Ihnat, speaking to Ukrainian television on Monday, did not directly acknowledge Monday's incident, but said: "These are the consequences of Russian aggression." He added: "If the Russians

not affect them in the deep rear, they were deeply mistaken' Ukrainian officials have never confirmed sending drones into Russia. They have maintained ambiguity over previous high-profile attacks, including drone strikes on Russian military bases earlier this month.

unprecedented strikes on Engels and the Dyagilevo base in the Ryazan region in western Russia killed a total of three servicemen and wounded four more. The strikes on the airbases were followed by a massive retaliatory missile barrage in Ukraine that struck homes and buildings and killed civilians. In Ukraine, at least four have been wounded in Russian shelling of five regions in the country's southeast over the past 24 hours, according to the deputy head of Ukraine's presidential office, Kyrylo Tymoshenko. On Sunday, Russian forces attacked the city of Kramatorsk, where Ukrainian forces are headquartered. missiles hit an industrial facility and damaged residential buildings, but no casualties were reported. according to the battlefield report from the Ukrainian presidency. US embassy sounds red alert; prohibits Americans from visiting Islamabad's Marriott Hotel

ISLAMABAD, DEC 26 /--/ The US embassy in Pakistan has warned about a possible terrorist attack against American citizens at the Marriott Hotel here in the country's capital and prohibited American staff from visiting the five-star facility, an official statement said.

The statement was issued by the embassy on Sunday, two days after a suicide bombing in Islamabad killed a policeman. "The US government is aware of information that unknown individuals are possibly plotting to attack Americans at the Marriott Hotel in Islamabad sometime during the holidays." it said. "Effective immediately. the Embassy in Islamabad is prohibiting all American staff from visiting Islamabad's Marriott Hotel," the statement said. The embassy also directed that as Islamabad has been placed on a 'Red Alert' citing security concerns while banning all public gatherings, all mission personnel have been urged to refrain from non-essential and unofficial travel in the capital throughout the holiday season. It asked the US nationals to exercise vigilance at events and places of worship, and avoid locations with large crowds while reviewing personal security plans. The advisory comes after the latest attack in Islamabad and an uptick in countryside attacks by the banned Tehreek-e-Taliban Pakistan (TTP) terror group. The TTP has stepped up attacks on security forces since November, when they ended a months-long cease-fire with the Pakistan government. (PTI)

Strong Bangla-India ties to grow further in 2023 despite outstanding bilateral issues

friendly ties with India and bilateral cooperation are expected to gain momentum in 2023 despite some pending issues, especially the sharing of river waters, that Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina has said Dhaka believes could be resolved through negotiations.

Bangladesh-India relations are multifaceted in nature and rooted in a shared history, geographical proximity and commonality in their cultures. The emotional bonds stemming from the contribution of India towards the liberation of Bangladesh in 1971 remain a dominant factor in the country's political, social and cultural web. Being India's nextdoor neighbour, Bangladesh's relations with New Delhi are crucial for its political and economic stability. The two neighbours have remained engaged bilaterally and, unlike some western nations, India usually refrains from commenting on Bangladesh's domestic politics in public. Former diplomat Humayun Kabir, who now runs Bangladesh Enterprise Institute, a nongovernment think tank, told PTI that owing to geographic reality and historic backdrop, "good relations' are likely to be there in place in the interest of both countries. "But there is a general perception in Bangladesh that we give more and

get less' this concern must go and being the bigger neighbour, India is expected to take the lead role," he said. The two countries have several pending issues with the most crucial being the sharing of waters in common rivers, including the Teesta River, which flows through India.

Prime Minister Hasina has repeatedly said that Dhaka believes the outstanding issues with New Delhi could be resolved through discussions. During her visit to India in September, she noted that India and Bangladesh share 54 rivers and sought an early conclusion of the Teesta watersharing agreement. "I recall that the two countries have resolved many issues in the spirit of friendship and cooperation. We hope that all outstanding issues, including the Teesta water sharing agreement, will be concluded at an early date," she said at a joint media interaction with Prime Minister Narendra Modi in New Delhi. "There are 54 rivers. As long as Prime Minister Modi is here, India and Bangladesh will resolve all these issues... Our main aim is to develop the economy and fulfil the basic needs of our people. With friendship, you can solve any problem. So we always do that." she added. Former foreign secretary Harsh Vardhan Shringla said last year that India will continue to engage

Bangladesh to conclude the Teesta agreement as soon as possible.

The Teesta river dispute is an important point of bilateral talks between India and Bangladesh, as the latter has sought a fair and equitable distribution of Teesta waters from India. The two countries also signed an agreement in 2011 to share surface waters at the Farakka Barrage near their mutual border. However, the proposed deal was called off after repeated objections by West Bengal Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee. The water-sharing issue remains unresolved. Interfaith harmony in Bangladesh and Dhaka's ties with China over mega projects largely are also thought to be issues of concern to India. However, Bangladesh maintains that while Beijing is one of its major development partners, it will never undermine its close historic bond with India. On the domestic front, politics and the economy are the two areas where the country is facing challenges in 2023.

Bangladesh is scheduled to go to polls in early January 2024. "The governance system now appears as the crucial factor to sustain political stability and economic durability in the current context," Kabir said. His comments came as tensions rose with the return of former prime minister Khaleda Zia's Bangladesh Nationalist Party

(BNP) to the political scene after years of wilderness and are eying the upcoming elections. BNP chief Zia has been debarred from political activities as she was iailed in 2017 for 17 years in two graft cases, though under a special government arrangement she is now staying at her home since the outbreak of the pandemic. Her son Tarique Rahman now steers the party, but he too is convicted in several criminal and graft cases while two Bangladeshi courts have declared him a "fugitive".

In the past two months, the BNP has staged public rallies in major cities across the country. Prime Minister Hasina's Awami Leagueled government has decided to tighten further its spending as trade imbalance and inflation eroded Bangladesh's GDP while a sense of panic gripped people due to fallout from money market volatility. Financial analysts said Bangladesh's growth was remarkable but its economy was now at risk.

According to analysts, Bangladesh's economy continued to grow during the Covid-19 pandemic, but the Russia-Ukraine war caused a setback with dwindling demand for the country's exports, mainly readymade garments, in the western markets and badly hit its foreign currency reserves. (PTI)

S. Korealaunches jets, fires shots after North flies drones

SEOUL, DEC 26 /--/ South Korea's military fired warning shots, scrambled fighter jets and flew surveillance assets across the heavily fortified border with North Korea on Monday, after North Korean drones violated its airspace for the first time in five vears, officials said.

South Korea's military detected five drones from North Korea crossing the border, and one traveled as far as the northern part of the South Korean capital region, South Korea's Joint Chiefs of Staff said. The military responded by firing warning shots and launching fighter jets and attack helicopters to shoot down the North Korean drones. The attack helicopters fired a combined 100 rounds but it wasn't immediately known if the North Korean drones were shot down There were no immediate reports of civilian damage on the ground in South Korea, according to the Defense Ministry. One of the aircraft, a KA-1 light attack plane, crashed during takeoff but its two pilots both ejected safely, defense officials said. They said they also requested civilian airports in and near Seoul to halt takeoffs temporarily.

South Korea also sent surveillance assets near and across the border to photograph key military facilities in North Korea as corresponding measures against the North Korean drone flights, the Joint Chiefs said. It didn't elaborate, but some observers say that South Korea likely flew unmanned drones inside North Korean territory. "Our military will thoroughly and resolutely respond to this kind of North Korean provocation," Maj. Gen. Lee Seung-o, director o operations at the South Korean Joint Chiefs of Staff, told reporters. South Korea's public confirmation of any reconnaissance activities inside North Korea is highly unusual and likely reflects a resolve by the conservative government led by President Yoon Suk Yeol to get tough on North Korean provocations. North Korea could respond with more fiery rhetoric or weapons tests or other provocation, some observers say.

On Friday, South Korea detected two short-range ballistic missile launches by North Korea, the latest in the country's torrid run of weapons tests this year. Friday's launches were seen as a protest of the South Korean-U.S. joint air drills that North Korea views as an invasion rehearsal. It's the first time for North Korean drones to enter South Korean airspace since 2017, when a suspected North Korean drone was found crashed in South Korea. South Korean military officials said at the time that the drone with a Sonymade camera photographed a U.S. missile defense system in South Korea. North Korea has previously touted its drone program, and South Korean officials said the North has about 300 drones. In 2014, several suspected North Korean drones equipped with Japanese-made cameras were found south of the border. Experts said they were low-tech but could be considered a potential security threat. (AP)

Post-COP15, India needs to align national goals with global framework: Experts

key challenge for India now is to align the national goals with the Global Biodiversity Framework (GBF) and take effective capacity-building measures at all levels. The 15th Conference of Parties (COP) to the Convention on Biological Diversity (CBD) ended on a high note with nearly 200 countries, including India, adopting a historic deal to preserve nature and reverse damage to ecosystems after four years of fraught negotiations. India, which is one of the Parties to the convention, pushed for Digital Sequence Information (DSI) to be considered under the CBD's access and benefit sharing mechanism, among many other targets during the run-up to the conference and through the anxious final moments until the Kunming-Montreal Global Biodiversity Framework (GBF) became a reality. The Indian delegation was led by Bhupender Yaday, Minister of Environment, Forest and Climate Change along with a team of officers from the government. "India negotiated strongly and held discussions with the COP Presidency and the Secretariat of the Convention on Biological Diversity before the final Global Biodiversity Framework was put up for adoption," Yadav said. "The suggestions from India to keep all the goals and targets, globally, were accepted, along with other propositions. India's pitch for Lifestyle for Environment (LiFE), and common but differentiated responsibilities and respective capabilities found an echo in the GBF," he added.

The LiFE initiative was introduced by Prime Minister Narendra Modi at COP26 in

DSI, which was adopted as part of the historic deal to save biodiversity at the COP15 conference, will ensure flow of funds to countries like India from users such as biotechnology companies which access its biodiversity and related genetic information, experts say. UK to stop publishing infections data in new year for 'living with COVID' phase

LONDON, DEC 26 /--/ The UK health authorities said on Monday that they will stop publishing their regular Covid-19 infections modelling data in the new year because it is seen as "no longer necessary" as the country moves to a phase of living with the virus with the help of vaccines and medicines.

The UK Health Security Agency (UKHSA) said that it will continue to monitor Covid like other common viral illnesses such as seasonal flu. Since April this year, the data on the reproductive rate, or the R value speed at which the novel coronavirus infects people, has been published fortnightly as a monitoring tool. "During the pandemic, the R value and growth rate served as a useful and simple indicator to inform public health action and

government decisions," said Dr Nick Watkins, chair of the UKHSA **Epidemiology Modelling Review** Group (EMRG). "Now that vaccines and therapeutics have allowed us to move to a phase where we are living with COVID-19, with surveillance scaled down but closely

monitored through number of different indicators, the publication of this specific data

is no longer necessary," he said. "We continue to monitor COVID-19 activity in a similar way to how we monitor a number of other common illnesses and diseases. All data publications are kept under constant review and this modelling data can be reintroduced promptly

if needed, for example, if a new variant of concern was to be identified," he added.

The EMRG said its recent detailed review concluded that the next publication of its so-called "consensus statement" on Covid-19 on January 6, 2023, "will be the

last". The UK's Covid incidence data continue to be accessible from the Office for National Statistics (ONS)

infection survey. The country's remaining Covid restrictions, including the legal requirement to self-isolate at home with symptoms, were removed earlier this year. Amid an expected rise in infections over the winter months, the health authorities had urged those with

signs of respiratory illness to avoid mixing during the festive holiday

"We are seeing a rise in cases and hospital admissions for both flu and COVID-19 as people continue to mix indoors this winter. Hospitalisation rates due to COVID-19 remain highest in those aged 65 and over, so it is vital that everyone who is eligible continues to come forward to accept their booster jab before the end of the year," Dr Mary Ramsay, Director of Public Health

Programmes, said last week. "Both COVID-19 and flu can cause severe illness or even death for those most vulnerable in our communities, and so it is also important to avoid contact with other people if you are unwell in order to help stop infections spreading over the Christmas and new year period," she said. Pakistan ill-prepared to tackle new Covid-19 variant's arrival

ISLAMABAD, DEC 26 /--/ Pakistan's health authorities appear to be ill-prepared to stop the arrival of the new coronavirus variant in the country, which is spreading fast in some countries including China, a media report said on Monday. The National Command and Operation Centre (NCOC) says that the situation is being closely monitored but $% \label{eq:closely_monitored} % \label{eq:closely_monitored} %$ according to the Dawn newspaper there have been no measures at the airports, such as rapid testing and screening of inbound travellers, to detect positive Covid-19 cases. NCOC member Dr Shahzad Ali Khan said it was uncertain how the new variants would behave in Pakistan since "viruses behave differently in different environments", the report said. "We have been closely observing the situation. It is a fact that a sudden spread [of Covid-19]

has been observed in China because there were strict restrictions in place and an abrupt removal of these curbs allowed the virus to spread," he said. Khan claimed that the immunity level of the citizens of Pakistan was better due to vaccination. "New variants may disturb those who are not inoculated, so I would people to get vaccinated and get booster shots," he said. (PTI)

has been a trailblazer who has taken cricket's shortest format by storm.

Inarguably, India's first true-blue T20 superstar, Suryahas now trained his eyes on beingsuccessful in longer formats but without changing the essence of his batsmanship.

Inanexclusive interview with PTI, 'SKY'spoke about his journey to the top of T20 rankings, his focus on ODI World Cup this year, ambitions to wear the India whites and how wife Devisha became the force behind the cricketer and the person that he is today. Excerpts from Interview:

Q: If you were told one year ago that you will be world no. 1 batter in the T20 format, would vou have believed?

A: It still feels like a dream. To be seen and called as world's No. 1 T20 batter, if someone would have told me one year back, I don't know how I would have reacted. When I started playing this format, I wanted to be the best and I worked hard for it.

Q: The priority in 2023 will be ODI World Cup and does that mean you will change your game for the 50-over format?

A: I don't like to think too much when I am playing any format. Because I enjoy this game, whenever I go into bat, I put up a show. What I always dream and visualise is that whenever I go in, I want to be the game-changer. I have always loved batting whether it is T20Is, ODIs or Ranji Trophy.

If I can do what my team wants me to do in always think how I could be different to move

NEW DELHI, DEC 26 /--/ Suryakumar Yadav 40-50 balls, why should I bat 100 balls? Q: Do you fancy your chances of making the India squad for 4-Test series against Australia? A: I started playing age-group national level cricket in red ball, so the answer lies there itself. There are a lot of tricky yet fascinating situations that you encounter across five days and you want to embrace that challenge. Yes, I am ready if they (Indian team management) need me.

Q: Skills can be taught but how does one train one's mind to cope with pressures at the highest level?

A: I would say it was never impossible but certainly it was difficult. It needed a smart approach. Instead of doing a lot of quantity, I did a lot of quality practice. There were lot of sacrifices made by me and my family. Before making my India debut, I had played 10 years offirst-class cricket. Grinding it out at first-class level, you learn a lot of tricks of the trade. So when you graduate to international level and play different bowlers, all you need to do is express yourself. But let me tell you this. If you have gone through domestic grind in India, you $are \, ready \, for \, international \, cricket \, and \, when \, you \,$ startthatlevel, you are not carrying any baggage. Just execute what you did at the domestic level.

Q: You were India Emerging (U-23) captain nearly a decade back. Over the years, while $putting \, up \, performances \, at \, domestic \, and \, IPL$ level, did you get anxious or angry that national call-up wasn't coming?

A: I won't say I got irritated but I would

to the next level. So hard work continued and you need to enjoy the game also.

That's why you started playing cricket. Whether it's a simple training session or even the food that was healthy but I didn't enjoy earlier, I started to savour it. I knew that if I stop thinking about outcomes and just focus on process, I would someday break the door.

Q: Your friend Sufiyan Sheikh said that at times you don't wear thigh pads even when

you face the best of fast bowlers. Is it true and what's the reason for it?

A: In the World T20 in Australia, I was wearing thigh pads as it was the first time I was touring the country and it wasn't a great idea (not wearing them) on those tracks with pace and bounce. But yes, on Indian tracks with low bounce, if I get a feeling that wearing thigh pads would hinder me from playing the shots that I love, then I don't wear it.

Q: Canyou explain us a bit about your 360degree technique?

A: It is an interesting story. In my school and college days, I played a lot of rubber ball cricket. On hard cement tracks and on rainy days, those would bowl would come from 15 yards and most of them chucked (threw) really hard. Now rubber ball from 15 yards will come at 140 plus clicks and if the leg side the boundary would be 95 yards, the off-side would be only 25-30 yards. So in order to prevent off-side boundaries, most of them would bowl into my body in order to prevent me from getting easy boundaries on off-side. So manoeuvring my wrists, playing those pick-up pulls and upper cuts have come from those matches. I never try those in the nets. In the nets, I like practising normally and hearing the sound of the bat hitting the ball. If I feel good I come out.

Q: What kind of bond do you share with Virat Kohli and Rohit Sharma?

A: I am actually very lucky that I share dressing room with Virat Kohli and Rohit Sharma. They are a different breed of

international cricketers. Things they have achieved, I don't know I will be ever able to

achieve that. Recently, I have had some good partnerships with Virat bhai and I have enjoyed batting with him. Rohit is like an elder brother and my sounding board. When I am in doubt, I ask him direct questions about my game. He has been

a good guiding force since I joined MI in 2018. Q: If you can also talk about the contributions of Mumbai Indians and wife Devisha in your career?

A: In my life and in this cricketing journey, there are two pillars - Mumbai Indians and my wife Devisha. Let me elaborate about MI's contribution first. When I came back here from KKR in 2018, I was looking for an opportunity to bat higher up the order and even without me asking, the management entrusted me with that responsibility. I grabbed that opportunity, kept performing and never looked back. MI provided me with all the facilities I required to move up the ladder. In 2016, I got married to Devisha and when I joined MI in 2018, we (me and Devisha) as a unit started thinking, what do we need to do to make the next grade. It was a dream we both nurtured together and she is always been around when I needed her. Even if she doesn't want to travel, I drag her around.

She brings in the balance that I need as a sportsman. She doesn't let me get complacent after a good day in office and at the same time. doesn't allow my shoulders to drop after a poor day. (PTI)

Overall, in 40 innings this year, Rohit scored 995 runs, failing to cross the 1000-run mark. These runs came at an average of 27.63, with six fifties. For the first time since 2012, he did not score an international century for an entire year. On the other hand, KL played four Tests this year in which he scored 137 runs at an average of 17.12, with one fifty. He has the best score of 50 in Tests this year. In 10 ODIs this year, he scored 251 runs at an average of 27.88, with two half-centuries and the best score of 73. In 16 T20Is this year, he scored 434 runs at an average of 28.93 and six half-centuries, with a best score of 62. Overall in 30 matches this year, KL has scored 822 runs at an average of 25.68, with nine half-centuries.

Fabian O'Neill, hailed by Zinedine Zidane as "Most Talented Player Ever", dead at 49

MONTEVIDEO, DEC 26 /--/ Former Uruguay international midfielder Fabian O'Neill, once hailed by Zinedine Zidane as "the most talented player" he'd ever $seen, died \, Sunday \, after \, a \, long \, battle \, with \,$ alcoholism. He was 49. "Goodbye Wizard," tweeted O'Neill's formative club Nacional after he passed away due to chronic cirrhosis in a Montevideo hospital where he had been rushed on Saturday suffering from a hemorrhage. "The most talented player I've ever seen," was how French World Cup winner Zidane, a teammate at Juventus, described O'Neill. Aftermaking his debut for Nacional at the age of 18 in 1992, O'Neill was transferred to Cagliari in Italy three years later. In 2000, he moved to Juventus but after playing for the



Turin giants for just one season, he was farmed out to Perugia. He then returned to Nacional before quitting in 2003. O'Neill earned 19 caps for Uruguay and scored two goals.

He was part of the squad that was eliminated in the first round of the World Cup in South Korea and Japan in 2002 although he did not feature in any of the group games due to injury. "Uruguayan football is in mourning. One of the best players to emerge in recent decades and who knew how to shine on the field with his talent and magic has left us," wrote the El Pais newspaper. El Observador said that "Fabian O'Neill was one of those great talents wasted.... his career was marked by alcohol and excesses.'
