### Warns global community to be aware of the challenges of terrorism

New York, Sept. 25

Prime Minister, Shri Narendra Modi addressed the 76<sup>th</sup> session of UN General Assembly on Saturday. It was a message of hope, caution and earnestly. He warned the global community to be aware of the challenges of terrorism. The Prime Minister said that those who use it as a political tool must understand that terrorism is a double edged sword and can be a threat for them as well. Prime Minister said that it must be ensured that Afghan soil is not used for terror activities. Without naming

The Prime Minister said that the global economy needs diversification and hence we need to expand the global value chain. It requires a democratic and reliable partner, which India can provide. However, it is required to have a balance in economy and ecology. He cautioned that the ocean resources should be used and not abused and we must be wary of the dangers of expansion and exclusion. Shri Modi announced that India is developing the world's largest Green Hydrogen hub.

The Prime Minister underlined the importance of science based rational and progressive thinking to overcome the challenges of regressive thinking and extremism. Shri Modi summed up his address with a poem by Gurudev Rabindranath Tagore. (Source: india.gov.in)

any country, he told that some nations are trying to use the fragile situation in Afghanistan as a tool, which must be stopped.

The Prime Minister said that the women, children and minorities need help and we must reach out to them. Pointing at the relevance of United Nations, Prime Minister said, it needs to improve its effectiveness and enhance reliability. He referred to the fact that questions have been raised about its role in the origin and handling of

COVID crisis, climate crisis, proxy wars and the developments in Afghanistan. In this background, he called for global order and to strengthen global laws and the global values.

Referring to the maritime security, Shri Modi underlined the need to have a rule-based order. He said we can take a leaf out of the UN Security Council Resolution passed under the Presidency of India.

Highlighting India's strides in COVID care, the

Prime Minister said, India not only successfully tackled the challenge but now exporting the vaccine to the needy countries. He urged the vaccine manufacturers to come and make vaccines in India.

Citing the example of how the Government's program reached to last mile with the use and help of technology, Shri Modi told that India has clearly shown to the world that democracy can deliver. He said that it is the strength of India's democracy that a person of humble origin rise to the ranks as the Prime Minister of the country after starting his journey as tea seller at a Railway

## Union Minister of Home Affairs and Minister of Cooperation attends 'National Cooperative Conference'

**After 75 years of Independence and at a time when the cooperative movement is needed the most, Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi created Ministry of Cooperation: HM**

New Delhi, Sept. 25 (PIB)

The Union Minister of Home Affairs and Minister of Cooperation, Shri Amit Shah began his address to more than 2,100 members of the cooperatives family from across the country and about 6 crore people connected in the country and abroad through virtual medium, with a mention of Pandit Deendayal Upadhyay's policy of Antyodaya. Shri Amit Shah said that the vision of welfare of the poor and Antyodaya cannot happen without cooperatives and whenever there was talk of development in the country earlier, Pandit Deendayal Upadhyay first talked about Antyodaya and today his birthday is the day to receive inspiration for lakhs and crores of workers.

Shri Amit Shah said that after 75 years of Independence and at a time when the cooperative movement was most needed, the Prime Minister, Shri Narendra Modi, created the Ministry of Cooperation. He thanked the Prime Minister on behalf of crores of people of the cooperative sector across the nation for forming the Ministry of Cooperation. He said it is a matter of pride for him to be the country's first Cooperation Minister. Shri Shah called upon cooperative leaders and workers across the country that now the



time of neglect has ended and the time of priority has started and all together shall take cooperatives forward.

The Union Minister of Home Affairs and Minister of Cooperation said that cooperatives make a very important contribution in the development of the country and this contribution is still there, but still many dimensions are yet to be reached. He said that it will have to be thought afresh, it will have to be outlined anew, the scope of our work will have to be increased, transparency will have to be brought in the work, and the cooperative movement will have to be included in the work as a nature and culture and shall have to move forward. He said that the path of development of crores of farmers, underprivileged, backward, Dalits, the poor, neglected and women of the country can be paved only through cooperatives.

Shri Amit Shah said that many people question the relevance of cooperatives and they feel that the cooperative movement has become irrelevant, but the cooperative movement is most relevant today and there is a long way to go. He said that by connecting every village with cooperatives, making every village

prosperous with the mantra of prosperity from cooperation and through this making the country prosperous, this is the role of the cooperative movement.

The Union Minister of Home Affairs and Minister of Cooperation said that the word cooperative is made up of the words 'co' and 'work', cooperative is to work together, with a goal, in one direction with the fraternity. He said that maybe the strength and economic power of all of us working in the cooperative sector is less, but our numbers are so large that if we

collect it through cooperatives, then a tremendous force is created, which no one can beat. Shri Shah said that now the time has come to make a new beginning in the cooperative movement with confidence. Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi has given a mantra, of prosperity from cooperation, and the cooperative sector will also give full thrust to fulfill the Prime Minister, Shri Narendra Modi's goal which he has set of a US \$ 5 trillion economy. The cooperative sector will also exert its full force to fulfill this goal.

Shri Amit Shah said that the cooperative movement will also develop rural society and will also create the concept of a new social capital. He said that there are many interpretations of capital, but we are a people carrying 10,000 years of culture

## Farmers' Corner- A Knowledge Hub

### Andaman Kokum (Garciniadhamkharisensis): an endemic fruit with commercial potential

Andaman Kokum is an endemic fruit species reported to occur in South Andaman Island. The plant bears attractive crimson red to purple fruits resembling kokum (Garcinia indica), a popular species in Maharashtra, Goa and Karnataka. Fruiting in Andaman Kokum occurs during dry period, mainly in February- March. Very limited natural population of Andaman Kokum are available and a few local residents are aware of its edible fruits. Interestingly, peel is discarded by the island consumers and only sour-sweet pulp is eaten. Recent studies at ICAR-CIARI have suggested that Andaman Kokum could be grown, processed and popularized in line with Kokum in the West coast of India. Peel is highly suitable for processing into various value-added products such as syrup, dehydrated rind, sweetened rind etc. Studies also suggested that fruits are rich in anthocyanins, which are natural antioxidants. Presence of pharmaceutically valued hydroxycitric acid in the peel adds to the value of it. Andaman Kokum is suitable for both backyard as well as commercial scale cultivation and processing units based on it could be promoted through self-help groups, once the sufficient produce is available. Considering the dark red peel extract, it could also be promoted as a natural colourant in beverages and processed fruit products. Planting material of Andaman Kokum is being regularly multiplied at Horticultural Plants Propagation Unit of ICAR-CIARI for sale to the island farmers.



**Benefit:** Systematic cultivation and post harvest management of this endemic fruit would support development of small scale/cottage industries apart from offering novel products to the consumers.

## State Adoption Resource Agency- disseminating information & awareness on adoption process

### Illegal adoption will attract legal action; registration being done through CARINGS

Port Blair, Sept. 25

The State Adoption Resource Agency (SARA) under Directorate of Social Welfare is functioning in these Islands as a unit to coordinate, monitor and develop the work of adoption program, disseminating information and awareness on adoption process. The adoption registration is done through 'Child Adoption Resource Information and Guidance System' (CARINGS) which is a centralized software containing database of children and registration of parents. Parents can also adopt through relative adoption or children of spouse from earlier marriage as step-parents adoption. The parents will register

themselves by logging in as PAPs (Prospective Adoptive Parents) through [www.cara.nic.in](http://www.cara.nic.in) or CARINGS 3.1. Documents such as family photographs, birth certificate, income and address proof, medical certificate along with marriage/divorce certificate have to be uploaded on the portal. After registration, Home Study Report will be prepared by social worker of Adoption Agency after which parents will be shifted to a centralized seniority list. Parents will get reference of three legally free children on the basis of seniority and preference of child as entered on CARINGS portal. It is for the information of general public that no

illegal adoptions may be encouraged failing which legal action as per Section 32, 33, 34 of Juvenile Justice (Care & Protection of Children) Act, 2015 or 6 months imprisonment or a fine of Rs.10,000/- or both will be imposed. SARA appeals to the general public to report any cases of illegal adoptions.

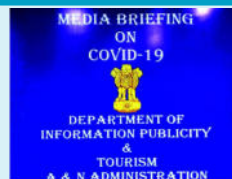

## Media briefed on COVID-19

### Three patients undergoing treatment at GB Pant Hospital; no patient admitted in COVID Care Centres

Port Blair, Sept. 25

During the RT-PCR test conducted on 1158 passengers who arrived here yesterday, one positive case has been detected. Today, 638 passengers arrived and the RT-PCR test reports are awaited. RAT was conducted on 226 passengers bound for North & Middle Andaman at Ferrargunj and all were found negative. Apart from this, 189 passengers travelling to & fro to Shaheed/Swaraj Dweep were tested at Phoenix Bay Jetty and all were found



negative. At Mohanpura Bus Terminus, test was conducted on 166 passengers and all were found negative. Similarly, at helipad, 7 passengers were tested and all were found negative. In addition to this, RT-PCR test was conducted on 64 Govt. officials and the reports are awaited. Today till 3 pm, 1260

beneficiaries were administered vaccines, out of which, 1176 were in the age group of 18-44. Giving this information while addressing the media persons on COVID-19 held in the conference hall of IP&T, the Deputy Director, G.B. Pant Hospital, Dr. Amitabha De further stated that presently three patients are undergoing treatment at GB Pant Hospital and no corona patient is admitted in COVID Care Centres.

The rate of interest for different loan amount is fixed based on SIDBI's prime lending rate which is at present 9.95%. Accordingly, rate of Interest calculated as per the range of finance is as under:

A rebate of 1% is provided for prompt payment and 2% lower rate is admissible for industrial concerns engaged in tourism, horticulture, fisheries, food-processing and environment friendly projects like recycling waste etc. A maximum Repayment period of 10 years with a moratorium period of 6 months to 2 years depending on the project is provided.

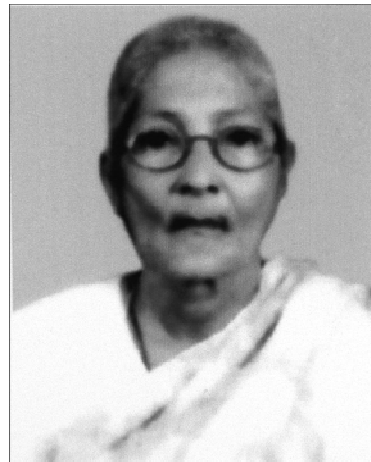
