

Chief Secretary inspects public conveniences in different areas of city, a well at Haddo & crematorium at Junglighat amidst heavy rain

Directs PBMC for constructing separate public toilets for men & women, carrying out immediate maintenance works & making functional Sulabh Shauchalaya at Haddo

Directs for creating sitting areas in Junglighat Burning Ghat & connecting it to sea enabling people to perform last rituals of their loved ones



Port Blair, July 16

The Chief Secretary, A&N Administration, Shri Jitendra Narain, along with Senior Officers of the Administration, the Deputy Commissioner, South Andaman, Shri Suneel Anchipaka, Secretary, PBMC, Shri G. Sudhakar, Shri Viswender, DANICS, Smti. U. Kavitha, Chairperson, PBMC and Ward Councillors, Engineering and Sanitary Staff of PBMC conducted inspection of the densely populated Haddo and other areas in pouring rain this morning to assess the sanitary and hygiene condition of the public toilets and take corrective actions.

The Chief Secretary inspected the Community Toilet Complex in Haddo (Ward No. 01) behind defence boundary wall and directed the Secretary, PBMC and the Engineers of PBMC to renovate the facility by changing the doors and fittings and make it operational in a clean manner within three weeks. The Chief Secretary expressed displeasure about the insanitary and unhygienic condition of the toilet complex and instructed that they should be maintained in a hygienic manner once they are

renovated and made operational. At Haddo, the Sulabh Shauchalaya near the Haddo Jetty was found closed. Instructions were given to the PBMC Engineers for taking up necessary repair works and make the Shauchalaya functional within 45 days and to utilize the first floor of the double storey building which is lying unused.

The Chief Secretary also inspected the Japanese well of the PBMC in Haddo and directed the PBMC Officers to get the well cleaned on war-footing so as to make its water of potable standards.

The Chief Secretary interacted with the public during the surprise inspection in pouring rain and listened to their grievances in detail and directed the concerned officials to take corrective actions. The public appreciated the gesture and were happy due to the fact that for the first time, despite heavy rain, the Chief Secretary of the UT Administration inspected the densely populated Haddo area.

The toilet block at Delanipur was inspected where seepage was spotted inside and PBMC Engineers were instructed to immediately

undertake the repair works for the comfort of the users. It was observed that the staff of the NGO manning the facility is not wearing uniform and not maintaining a register of charging fees; and accordingly a report was sought about the performance of NGO's managing the toilets in PBMC jurisdiction along with action taken against the NGO managing the Delanipur toilet block.

The Chief Secretary also inspected the Junglighat Cremation Ground (Burning Ghat) and directed the PBMC Officials to make adequate seating arrangements for the relatives and persons attending the cremation rituals and to dismantle the chimney in the vicinity of the quarters of the cremation ground in-charge, Shri Rakesh to prevent the possibility of collapse of the structure which could endanger lives of his family.

The Chief Secretary also interacted with Shri Rakesh and lauded his yeomen services in cremating the dead bodies in general and of the corona virus victims in particular during the pandemic period and assured that the UT Administration will reward him and his family suitably for his noble efforts.

The contractor and PBMC officials were instructed to complete the remaining renovation works within 45 days and make the facility a clean and better place for cremating the dead bodies in an honorable manner. The PBMC Engineers were directed to make the LNG Crematorium operational and to make necessary modifications for conducting the traditional cremation rituals smoothly as the present facility is not having sufficient space. The Chief Secretary also instructed for creation of a small access towards the sea enabling people to perform the last rituals of their loved ones.

The public toilet adjacent to Mohanpura Bus Terminus was inspected and observing its unhygienic condition, PBMC Engineers have been instructed to extend the facility to provide separate and clean toilets for men and women and ensure that the renovation works are completed within four weeks and the facility is maintained in a neat manner subsequently considering the high footfall due to its adjacent location to the Bus Terminus and Aberdeen Bazaar, a press release from the Secretary, PBMC said.

Fisheries Deptt. warns owners of mechanised & motorised boats engaged in fishing in shallow water; urged them to avoid any fishing operations in non permitted areas

It has come to the notice of the Department of Fisheries that the Mechanised boats registered with the Authorised Officer, South Andaman District are operating within Zone-A (0 to 6 Nautical Miles) of North and Middle Andaman District. Fishing by mechanised fishing boats in shallow waters affects the livelihood of

small traditional fishermen and is also harmful to the marine environment. It has also come to the notice of the Department that Motorised boats are using ring net in shallow areas of North and Middle Andaman District. These are serious violations of A&N Islands Marine Fishing Regulation and Rules framed there under. Therefore, the owners of mechanised and

motorised boats engaged in such activity have been warned to strictly abide by the provisions of A&N Islands Marine Fishing Regulation and Rules framed there under and avoid any fishing operations in the non permitted areas.

Any violation of the

A&N Islands Marine Fishing Regulation and Rules framed there under will invite action as deemed fit by the Authorised Officer including cancellation of Registration of Fishing Vessel, a press release from the Director of Fisheries said.

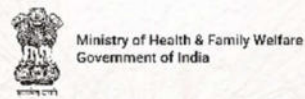
NEET (UG)-2022 Exam to be held today; candidates advised

The NEET (UG)-2022 Examination is scheduled to be conducted on July 17 from 2pm to 5.20 pm (IST) in Pen and Paper mode throughout India in 546 cities. Social distancing measures as per Government of India guidelines in the current scenario of COVID-19, to ensure the health and safety of the candidates will be strictly implemented without compromising the high standard, sanctity and fairness in the conduct of the examination.

Candidates must adhere to guidelines and new process for social distancing and hygiene to ensure the safety and health of their own and fellow candidates. The candidate will be offered a fresh N95 mask before entry. In order to stop the chances of any UFM being used in the examination, the candidate is expected to wear the freshly provided mask at the centre.

Important instructions for the exam and advisories regarding COVID-19 have also been issued to the candidates in their respective Admit Cards. make our village and our Islands plastic free. She has also taken initiative of distributing cloth bags in her village every Sunday to create awareness and requested the general public to use it for shopping.



The students were made aware that, littering of plastics in open spaces creates unhygienic conditions, as it acts as a breeding ground for insects and mosquitoes that cause diseases like malaria and dengue. Plastics do not undergo degradation, thus, stay in the soil for many years, which affects soil fertility and degrades the soil quality. It was urged to the gathering that by proper disposal of the plastics these problems can be reduced.

The students were also sensitized that good Menstrual Hygiene Management (MHM) plays a fundamental role in enabling women and girls to reach their full potential. Menstrual Health and Hygiene (MHH) is essential to the well-being and empowerment of women and adolescent girls. Insufficient menstrual hygiene practices are the cause of stress associated with menstruation and reproductive tract infections. Thus such type of awareness sessions will be organized to make them aware on the menstrual hygiene and proper disposal of the sanitary napkins.

Vaccination drive in A & N Islands

24,870 beneficiaries in the age group of 12 to 14 years administered both doses of vaccine

Port Blair, July 16

The vaccination drive is continuing smoothly in A&N Islands. As per data available, a total of 6,84,530 doses of vaccine have been administered to beneficiaries in the age group of 18 and above so far. Similarly, 23,596 beneficiaries have been vaccinated in the age group of 15 to 18 years. 24,870 beneficiaries in the age group of 12 to 14 years have been administered both doses of vaccine. The number of beneficiaries administered

precautionary dose of vaccine so far stood at 31441. A total of 2207 eligible beneficiaries were vaccinated in A&N Islands today. 1737 beneficiaries were vaccinated in South Andaman District, out of which, 7 beneficiaries were in the age group of 18-44 years and the number of beneficiaries administered precautionary dose of vaccine stood at 1697. In North & Middle Andaman District, 299 beneficiaries were

vaccinated, out of which, 10 were in the age group of 12-14 years and the number of beneficiaries administered precautionary dose of vaccine stood at 269. In Nicobar District, 171 beneficiaries were vaccinated, out of which, 63 were in the age group of 12-14 years, 1 beneficiary was in the age group of 18-44 years and the number of beneficiaries administered precautionary dose of vaccine stood at 39, a press release from DHS said.
