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Seats for NEET PG at Port Blair centre full

Aspirants urge Admn. to take-up with NTA for more seats or centre

Port Blair, Jan. 9: The hardships of students from isles seem to be never ending as more and more issues are hurdle their way to success. Now it's the turn of MBBS students all set to appear in NEET-PG. The National testing agency (NTA) will be conducting the NEET-PG test on 5th March, 2023. The portal for registration was opened recently but the seats were full within a few hours of opening the portal. This is because in isles there is only one centre that too with limited seats. With the establishment of a medical college in Port Blair there are several MBBS holders preparing to appear in NEET-PG so that they can secure their seat in medical institutions for PG courses. Since the number of seats for the test is very less compared to MBBS holders in isles, seats for the registration



from Port Blair centre closed within a few hours of opening of the portal. All those who were preparing for the test and failed to register on the portal for the test are feeling helpless as their future is again struck due to limited resources in isles. Few of them planned to appear for the test from Chennai centre and attempted to register for the same. To their utter surprise, all seats for Centers in Chennai are also full. Now the aspirants for the test from isles are in no hope of getting through for PG courses. Those who can afford hefty air fare to travel to other states in the country to appear in the test may proceed. But what about those who cannot

afford the high air fare? According to MBBS holders, the situation is mainly due to irrationality between the number of seats at Port Blair centre and number of aspirants. They are of the opinion that in other states and UT's test centers are fixed in all the Districts to facilitate easy access to the centre and optimum participation. But in Andaman and Nicobar Islands, the only centre is fixed at Port Blair with fewer seats. Aspirants are looking towards the UT Administration with the hope that matters will be taken-up with the NTA for increasing seats at Port Blair centre or allowing few more centers in isles. This will address the concern of numerous students left behind who may not be able to afford to move to the mainland for giving the exam and a loss of opportunity for a brighter future.

Driving to despair

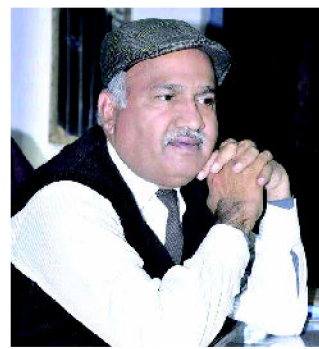
A good percentage of our time is spent on roads, and our roads just don't get better or safer. A third of the 4.1 lakh documented road accidents in 2021 resulted in 1.5 lakh deaths. Another third of the accidents resulted in grievous injuries. Nearly everyone has a scary story about a close shave on the road. Recent incidents like the heart-wrenching Anjali Singh case in Delhi, cricketer Rishabh Pant's accident in Uttarakhand, and Tamil Nadu software engineer S Shobana's death, mowed down by a truck after her two-wheeler was felled by a pothole, highlight the multiple dimensions of risks while on the road.

The record-setting expansion of the road network is a positive development. But the ecosystem that facilitates safe travel has lagged far behind. Building infra isn't the end; new structures manned by old ways of doing things aren't helping. Anjali was dragged by a car at night for over 12 kilometres with an eyewitness making calls to cops multiple times in vain. The poor state of policing on national capital roads stood exposed. The car's drunk driver had no driving licence but had nothing to fear on unpoliced roads.

Not surprisingly, cities like Delhi, where crimes against women are frequent and street-lighting uneven, have few women two-wheeler drivers, unlike most southern cities. Women motorists and pedestrians will also feel much safer in better-lit roads, which enable improved road visibility. Agencies like NHAI and state public works departments, which construct and maintain major roads, must also be held to task for poor road conditions like potholes, inadequate signage and unscientific road construction.

Official records blame overspeeding and dangerous driving as responsible for most accidents, and non-wearing of safety equipment like helmets and seatbelts for most deaths. This implies that road safety enforcement must get better. The Motor Vehicles Act as amended in 2019 had empowered state governments to conduct electronic monitoring of roads through speed cameras, CCTV cameras, speed guns, body wearable cameras etc. Investments in such tech upgrades should happen faster. Equally important is incentivising public participation in taking victims to hospitals promptly and reimbursing hospitals for emergency trauma care. From policing to courts to transport department to public works to healthcare, a 'whole of government' approach can make citizens safer. Such improvements will represent the next generation of governance reforms that India must target.

INTOXICATING POISONS ARE LEADING PEOPLE ON THE PATH OF DESTRUCTION

The first reason is that they are mostly impractical and the second reason is that governments look at the problem from an immediate perspective and not from a long-term perspective. The most important impracticality of prohibition is that it has ignored the problems of the weaker sections and lower class people, for whom alcohol acts as a relief. Countless people drinking poisonous, illegal, cheap liquor made in village-countryside, neglected backward areas and marginal inaccessible wild areas keep reaching the hospital every now and then. Those who are more affected by its poison, they cannot even touch the door of the hospital. But the attitude of the government and administration towards stopping the sale of illegal liquor is more or less the same everywhere. For a few days after a major incident, the strictness of the government is visible in the form that some amount is handed over to the families of those who died as compensation. After the ritualistic

exercise of sabotage of illegal liquor distilleries and arrests of a few liquor mafia, the story was repeated once again at some other place. The system goes to sleep as before. The important question is why such incidents of spurious liquor often happen only in the backward and neglected areas of the country? Why only the poor-working class becomes its victim? Everyone knows an easy answer to this that instead of government contracts, there is no practice in our country to check the quality of such country liquor sold at general grocery shops and dhabas etc. This business is the result of a wide network of liquor mafia running in connivance with the police and excise department. But every part of the system related to its monitoring Purja remains oblivious even after seeing this, until a major accident happens. After all, from where and how this mafia is able to provide cheap liquor to the people even in large areas of liquor ban states like Bihar. It is clear that this network is able to consume liquor as it wants, wherever it wants, due to the bribery and political patronage of the officials of the Police and Excise Department. Have the governments ever considered the question that why only the labourers-poor sections living in slums are victims of the poison of cheap liquor? What happens? Since the liquor of the poor is poisonous, for a few days on such incidents, there is mention of the system's negligence, the high reach of the liquor mafia and its greed, who want to increase their

profits by mixing deadly methanol in liquor. Common people also often become silent on such incidents by making such didactic commentary that why these poor people do not stop drinking or why they do not buy expensive liquor by queuing up at government contracts. Or 'if you drink, you will die'. While talking about As a consumer, the poor also have the right to buy and consume low-cost, but safe and sealed liquor. Significantly, in western countries, like all other consumer goods, alcohol is also a product, so its quality, price, etc. are monitored there like other food items. While the governments in our country see it linked to social morality. If this was not the philosophy behind the prohibition of alcohol which was announced in Bihar in the year 2016 and has been implemented till now, then what else! It is ironic that our Seeing the accidents caused by this, everyone gets trapped in a conflict and demands measures like complete prohibition. This is the reason why in many parts of the country even women started agitations regarding liquor ban and due to their effect the governments in Gujarat, Bihar, Mizoram, Nagaland, Manipur and Lakshadweep have banned liquor. But one of its facts is that despite all the restrictions, the acceptance of alcohol has increased in our society in the name of modernity. In the year 2019, Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment of Central Government and All India joint survey conducted by the Indian Institute of Medical Sciences

(AIIMS) in more than two lakh households in 186 districts, it was found that the number of people consuming alcohol in the country is sixteen crore. The percentage of such people in the age group often to seventy-five years who drink alcohol comes out to 14.6, which proves that if people have access to legally cheap and quality sealed liquor, then there can be a significant reduction in the accidents caused by it. In fact, prohibition efforts and such resolutions do not last long because of practical problems. Due to which the problems remain the same. It is worth mentioning here that despite the ban, foreign liquor made and sold under the State Excise Corporation in Bihar is under exemption. Due to this, it is believed that socially country liquor has been causing more harm. Undoubtedly, people from economically weaker sections have been consuming cheap country liquor, which has not only created problems like family discord and their economic loss, but the number of deaths has also been considerable. Not only this, it is seen that in states where such restrictions have already been imposed, there has been uninterrupted supply of country liquor from other states in the border areas. Prohibition is in force in Gujarat, but alcohol consumption is considerable in the border areas adjoining the neighbouring state of Maharashtra. The same problem is being seen in Bihar. Apart from Nepal, smuggling of liquor from border areas adjoining Jharkhand,

West Bengal and Uttar Pradesh proves such a ban redundant. Similarly, illegal liquor distilleries running on the power of influence and high political contacts shutting it down is a big headache. There are two reasons why most alcohol prohibition measures have failed. The first reason is that they are mostly impractical and the second reason is that governments look at the problem from an immediate perspective and not from a long-term perspective. The most important impracticality of prohibition is that it has ignored the problems of the weaker sections and lower class people, for whom alcohol acts as a relief. Workers who clean foul-smelling manholes in cities and towns often end up in the gutter after drinking alcohol. Get down, so that they can avoid the stench and do this work. They can be stopped from drinking if they are provided with masks to protect them from bad smell and get extra wages for this work. If such people do not get liquor through legal means, then they will adopt illegal means for it, due to which the trade of liquor will increase secretly and cheap liquor will be sold at more expensive prices. That's why it seems that the indirect intention behind implementing liquor ban and taking a resolution is didactic, i.e. people should give up alcohol themselves or buy foreign liquor at expensive prices. From this it seems that only the poor are being deprived of liquor, while the rich will continue to get foreign liquor as easily as before. Open government contracts in Delhi are a symbol of this.

FLY91, NEW AIRLINE PROMOTED BY FORMER KINGFISHER AIRLINES EXEC, PLANS TO TAKE OFF BY DEC 2023

At a time when demand for air travel is growing in India, a former Kingfisher Airlines executive and the former India head of Prem Watsa's Fairfax Financial are joining hands to launch a new regional carrier.

The new airline, to be called Fly91, will be headed by Harsha Raghavan, managing partner at Convergent Finance LLP, who will be the chairman, and Manoj Chacko, who will be the CEO. Chacko has had three decades of experience in the airline, travel and allied industries and has held executive positions in Kingfisher Airlines, Emirates, SOTC Travel and WNS Global Services.

During his stint at Kingfisher, Chacko helped the airline become India's second-largest airline by market share by building out a strong pan-India network and enhancing connectivity into regional markets. The airline shut operations in 2012.

Raghavan founded Fairfax's investment activities in India as CEO of Fairbridge Capital and was the director of Fairfax India between 2010-2018.

Fly91 will operate in the short-haul segment only, where flights last between 45 and 90 minutes and will serve India's regional airports.

According to the airline, 30 per cent of India's domestic passenger traffic originates from regional airports, and it says the segment is so far under-served by existing airlines. Goa will be the base of Fly91. Incidentally, Goa's second airport recently opened in Mopa.

Just UDO (which means just fly) Aviation Private Limited, has applied for a no-objection certificate and for requisite security clearances from the

ministry of civil aviation. It hopes to begin operations by December 2023.

"The India growth story goes beyond five metros, with nearly 50 cities having a population of more than one million. Manoj's vision to serve these cities and his decades of experience in India's airline and travel sectors makes him the kind of passionate entrepreneur whose idea we can back with our capital," said Raghavan of Convergent.

Convergent and funds advised by Convergent will initially invest Rs 200 crore in the airline. Convergent will also work with Fly91 on matters such as operations, capital allocation, and long-term business strategy as a co-founding partner.

According to a report, Fly91 will operate a fleet of leased 70-seater ATR aircraft.

The Narendra Modi-led government has been pushing hard to boost regional air connectivity, through its regional connectivity scheme (RCS) - Ude Desh Ka Aam Nagrik (UDAN), launched in 2016. It has earlier indicated plans to operationalise 100 airports by 2024.

As on November 30, 2022, 453 routes had commenced, operationalising 70 airports including two water aerodrome

and nine heliports, according to the civil aviation ministry. More than 2.15 lakh UDAN flights had operated and over 1.1 crore passengers had availed the benefits in UDAN flights, it further said in an update last month.

Driven by the growing small-town penetration air traffic in India grew at a 12 per cent compounded annual growth rate between 2015-2020. However, the Covid-19 pandemic hit the sector hard in 2020 and 2021. In the last few months, there has been a strong revival in airline passenger traffic as post Covid travel has picked up in a big way.

According to ICRA, between April-December 2022, domestic passenger traffic grew 63 per cent year-on-year to touch 9.86 crore.

Several airlines are betting big on the revival in air travel. Akasa Air, backed by late billionaire investor Rakesh Jhunjhunwala, had started flights last year. Tata Group, which acquired Air India last year, is in talks with plane makers Airbus and Boeing to place a large order, which reports have said could be as many as 500 aircraft.

Fly91 will compete with not just the large carriers like Indigo and SpiceJet, which have in recent years added many flights on regional routes, but also regional carriers like Star Air and FlyBig. Several airlines like Air Carnival, Air Costa and Air Pegasus in the past decade started airlines betting on the regional demand potential, but eventually shut down. - Source : Theweek



3,700 dams in India will lose 26% storage capacity by 2050: UN study

Around 3,700 dams in India will lose 26 per cent of their total storage by 2050 due to accumulation of sediments which can undermine water security, irrigation and power generation in future, warns a new study by the United Nations.

The Central Water Commission, had in 2015, reported that among 141 large reservoirs which are over 50-years-old, one quarter had lost at least 30 per cent of their initial storage capacity.

Trapped sediment has already robbed roughly 50,000

large dams worldwide of an estimated 13 to 19 per cent of their combined original storage capacity.

The study by the United Nations University Institute on Water, Environment and Health (UNU-INWEH), also known as the UN's think tank on water, shows that 6,316 billion cubic metre of initial global storage in 47,403 large dams in 150 countries will decline to 4,665 billion cubic metre, causing 26 per cent storage loss by 2050.

The loss of 1,650 billion cubic

metre storage capacity is roughly equal to the annual water use of India, China, Indonesia, France and Canada combined.

In 2022, the Asia-Pacific region, the world's most heavily dammed region, is estimated to have lost 13 per cent of its initial dam storage capacity. It will have lost nearly a quarter (23 per cent) of initial storage capacity by mid-century.

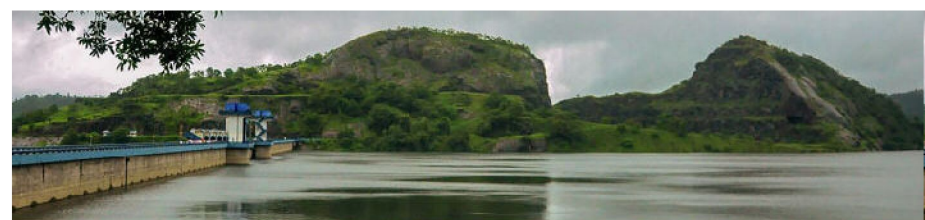
The region is home to 60 per cent of the world's population and water storage is crucial for sustaining water and food security.

"UNU-INWEH estimates that India's 3,700 large dams will have lost on average 26 per cent of their initial total storage by 2050," the report said.

China, meanwhile, the world's most heavily dammed nation, has lost about 10 per cent of its storage and will lose a further 10 per cent by 2050, it said.

Water storage infrastructure is critical for development. Large dams and reservoirs provide hydroelectricity, flood control, irrigation, and drinking water and often perform multiple functions simultaneously.

Accumulation of sediments decreases a reservoir's capacity over the years and determines a reservoir's life expectancy. Adam is considered large if it is higher than 15 m or between 5 and 15 m high, but impounds over 3 million cubic metres. - Source : Theweek

Star India asks BCCI for discount of Rs 130 Cr in current deal, exiting Byju's wants Board to encash bank guarantee

India's home season media rights holder Star India has asked the BCCI for a Rs 130 crore discount in the existing deal while jersey sponsor Byju's, which is on its way out, wants the board to encash bank guarantee worth an estimated Rs 140 crore to honour the current agreement.

The BCCI top brass deliberated on the two subjects for more than an hour in the emergent meeting of the Apex Council on Monday. It was a virtual meeting. In November, Byju's communicated to the BCCI that it wants to exit as the jersey sponsor of the Indian cricket team but the board asked the edtech company to continue until at least

March 2023.

However, in June, Byju's had extended its jersey sponsorship agreement with the BCCI until November 2023 for an estimated USD 35 million.

While approximately Rs 140 crore will be paid to the BCCI through bank guarantee, the remaining, around Rs 160 crore, will be paid via instalments. "Only Byju's and Star India's issues were discussed in the meeting but that also took well over an hour. It was a serious matter involving millions of dollars so naturally it took time," a BCCI source told PTI. Byju's, which was one of the sponsors of the FIFA World Cup, plans to lay off around 2,500 of

its 50,000 workforce by March, in its aim to become profitable.

"Star India asks for Rs 130 crore discount" It was also revealed in the meeting that Star, which had paid Rs 6138.1 crore for India's international and domestic cricket rights for the 2018-2023 period, has asked for an approximate Rs 130 crore discount in the existing deal.

Some of the matches in the deal period had to be rescheduled due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

"The issue was discussed at length but the board is yet to take a final call on it," the source added.

The development comes at a time when the BCCI is preparing



to sell media rights for the next five-year cycle after the current deal expires in March. Considering the IPL media rights fetched a staggering Rs 48,390 crore, the BCCI is expecting another windfall.

KUALA LUMPUR: PV Sindhu will face a tough test on her return from a five-month injury lay-off as top Indian shuttlers, including HS Prannoy and Lakshya Sen, will aim to start the year on a positive note at the Malaysia Open from Tuesday.

Following a highly-successful 2022, India's star shuttlers will hope to raise the bar further in 2023, during which the Paris Olympic qualification period will start in May.

With plenty of ranking points at stake, Indian shuttlers will join the other big stars such as World No. 1 Viktor Axelsen, Malaysia's Lee Zii Jia, Akane Yamaguchi, Tai Tzu ying as they aim for a good show in the USD 1,250,000 Super 1000 tournament here.

Double Olympic medallist Sindhu, who is returning from an ankle injury, begins her campaign

against former World Champion Carolina Marin of Spain.

Sindhu last played at the Commonwealth Games in August and it will be an interesting battle against Marin, who has won the last three encounters against the Indian and also boasts of a better 9-5 head-to-head record.

In the men's singles, World No. 10 Sen, the only seeded Indian player, will engage in a round of one-upmanship against compatriot and world no. 8 Prannoy in the opening round.

Meanwhile former world no. 1 Kidambi Srikanth will open his campaign against Japan's unseeded Kenta Nishimob. Awin is likely to put Srikanth up against fifth seed Jonatan Christie with defending champion Axelsen also placed in the same quarter.

In the men's doubles, World No. 5 Satwiksairaj Rankireddy and Chirag Shetty, who won the CWG title, India Open and French Open in 2022, will cross swords with South Korea's Choi Sol-gyu and Kim Wan-ho in the first round.

World championships bronze medallists Satwik and Chirag, seeded seventh, are likely to face home favourites Aaron Chia and Soh Wooi Yik in the quarterfinal if they can cross the

initial rounds.

Saina Nehwal, Aakarshi Kashyap and Malvika Bansod are also in the fray in the women's singles. While Saina will meet China's unseeded Han Yue, Aakarshi will square up against Chinese Taipei's Hsu Wen-chi and Malvika will face second seed An Se-young of Korea.

In women's doubles, CWG bronze medallists Treasa Jolly and Gayatri Gopichand will take on Hong Kong's Yeung Nga Ting and Yeung Pui Lam in the first round, while Ashwini Bhat and Shikha Gautam are pitted against Thailand's Supissara Paewsampran and Putita Supajirakul. India's mixed doubles pair Ishaan Bhatnagar and Tanisha Crasto will face Netherland's Robin Tabeling and Selena Piek in the first round.
