

Chief Secretary orders raid at District Jail Prothrapur to weed out anti national elements & foreign nationals having mobiles & cameras Extensive raids conducted; items strictly prohibited within Prison premises recovered

Investigation taken up to ascertain source of these prohibited articles

Chief Secretary also orders detail enquiry by Additional DGP into all lapses in the Jail

Port Blair, Aug. 17

Based on confidential information received from sources that there is usage/circulation of contraband articles in the District Jail premises, Prothrapur, the Chief Secretary, A&N Administration, Shri Jitendra Narain had ordered a raid as per law, to weed out anti national elements and foreign nationals having mobile phones and camera. Accordingly, a team of A&N Police led by Deputy Inspector General of Police and other Senior Officers conducted searches inside the Jail premises today. The search was conducted by a team of about 60 Police

personnel along with Superintendent

(Prisons) and two Executive Magistrates. Thorough searches were conducted in the cells of the prisoners, library, kitchen and other common areas of the Jail premises. During the search, 2 mobile phones, 2 SIM cards, 10 knives, 28 packets of Bidi, 4 tins of Zardda, loose tobacco, betel nuts, 14 lighters, Myanmar currency amounting to 6500 Kyat and other documents and articles were recovered. These items are strictly prohibited within the Prison Cells and premises. The search operation lasted for about 4 hours.

In this regard, a case vide FIR No.

74/21 dated 17/08/2021 has been registered at Police Station Pahargaoon U/S 414, 120 (B) IPC r.w.s 42 of Prisons Act, 1894 and investigation has been taken up to ascertain the source and origin of these prohibited articles found inside the prison.

The Chief Secretary has also ordered a detail enquiry by Additional DGP into all the lapses in the Jail, a press release from SP, South Andaman District said.

The Department of Art & Culture, A&N Administration has invited application from the cultural organizations of A&N Islands seeking financial assistance in the form of GIA for the year 2021-22. As per the GIA Notification, Grant-in-Aid @ Rs.25,000/- each will be released to Cultural Organizations which have registered office in Andaman & Nicobar Islands with the objective of propagation of Art & Culture, National Integration and Communal Harmony and which are active in such endeavor for a period of not less than one year.

The Cultural Organizations shall send application in the prescribed format enclosing Utilization Certificate in GFR-12A for the details of GIA released in the previous year alongwith the Audited statement of the last financial year comprising of receipt & payment statement, income &

expenditure statement, balance sheet and annual report of activities of the Organization for the year 2020-21 month wise with supporting documents which are mandatory. All Cultural Organizations should also be registered on PFMS portal and NGP-PS Portal (NGO D A R P A N) : www.ngo.india.gov.in before applying for Grant-in Aid. The PFMS Unique Agency Code, and Unique ID of Darpan Portal to be quoted mandatorily by Organizations in its application.

The prescribed format may be downloaded from the website www.andaman.gov.in . The duly filled in applications should reach the Directorate of Art & Culture, Cellular Jail Complex on or before 31st August, 2021, a press release from Directorate of Art & Culture said.

In order to ensure containment measures of isolation and social distancing in the South Andaman District with continuous focus on the fivefold strategy for effective management of COVID-19 i.e. Test-Track-Treat-Vaccination and adherence to COVID appropriate behavior to control any surge of the cases of COVID-19 again and also to prevent any disturbance to the peace and tranquility and taking into consideration the request of the public representatives and general public, Shri Suneel Anchipaka, District Magistrate, South Andaman District, in exercise of the powers vested U/s 144 of Cr. P.C. has ordered that lockdown/restricted movement shall continue

to be in force in the entire District of South Andaman from 18.08.2021 with no movement of men and materials between 10 pm & 6 am except for those specified. Shops selling essential and non-essential items shall be allowed to open between 6 am & 10 pm by observing COVID appropriate behavior. It shall be the sole responsibility of the owner/In-Charge of the shop/business establishment to ensure its compliance and shall be held responsible for any violation and he/she shall be liable to be fined to the tune of Rs.50,000/- in addition to sealing of the shop/establishment for a period of 14 days by the Executive Magistrate

and shall be liable for action under DM Act.

No movement of men and material without valid movement pass/e-pass shall be allowed after 10 pm.

Movement shall be allowed after 10 pm for medical emergency cases.

Persons engaged for essential activities for movement of goods on

Andaman Trunk Road, loading and unloading of essential cargo after 10 pm shall be allowed on production of valid movement permit issued by the Office of District Magistrate. Travel of persons who intend to proceed to their destinations at mainland after 10 pm shall be allowed on production of valid travel documents.

However, the person who intend to pick/drop after 10 pm, should apply for e-pass well in advance with supporting documents and the same shall be issued by the Office of District Magistrate on case to case basis.

In order to ensure measures of isolation and social distancing in North & Middle Andaman District with continuous focus on the fivefold strategy for effective management of COVID-19 i.e., Test-Track-Treat-Vaccination and adherence to COVID appropriate behaviour to control any surge of the cases of COVID-19 again and also to prevent any disturbances to the peace and tranquility and taking into consideration the request of the public representatives and general public, Dr. Angel

Bhati Chauhan, District Magistrate, North & Middle Andaman, in exercise of the powers vested U/s 144 of Cr.P.C. has ordered that all shops and establishments are permitted to open between 6 am & 10 pm. They shall strictly follow norms of social distancing by maintaining a distance of at least 1 meter from a person and not allowing more than 3 persons at a time inside the premises. Any overcrowding on violation of social distancing will be responsibility of the

shopkeepers and will invite fine of Rs.4000/- for violation of social distancing norms and Rs. 10000/- for overcrowding in shops/establishments, along with sealing of shop for 14 days.

No movement of public beyond these timings will be allowed except for:

Hospitals, medical labs, medicines and medical equipment, ambulance and hearse vehicle services, medical and its allied activities, all medical emergency cases shall be permitted. Persons engaged for essential activities for

movement of goods on Andaman Trunk Road, loading and unloading of essential cargo shall be allowed on production of valid movement passes issued by the Office of District Magistrate.

Goods transport, vehicles carrying agricultural produce of farmers, agriculture & its allied activities shall be permitted. Movement of officers/officials involved in providing essential services such as District Administration, Police, CISE, Health Services, Home Guards, Electricity, Fire and

Jetty and here too, all were found negative. At Mohanpur Bus Terminus, 156 passengers were tested and all the reports were negative.

The Secretary said, yesterday 4 flights with 631 passengers arrived here and no positive case was detected. Today, 4 flights with 558 passengers arrived and the RT-PCR reports are awaited. Today, till 3 pm, 553 persons were administered doses of vaccine, out of which, 400 were in the age group of 18-44. The Deputy Director, GB Pant Hospital, Dr. Amitabha De said that GB Pant Hospital & ITI COVID Care Centre are free of COVID patients.

Meanwhile, the vaccination drive is continuing smoothly in A&N Islands. As per data available, a total of 3,29,103 doses of vaccines have been administered to beneficiaries so far in A&N Islands, out of the target beneficiaries of 2, 81, 603 (approx.). A total of 1623 people were vaccinated today in A&N Islands. 1108 beneficiaries were vaccinated in South Andaman District, out of which 701 beneficiaries were in the age group of 18-44 years. Similarly, 451 beneficiaries were vaccinated in North & Middle Andaman District, out of which, 241 beneficiaries were in the age group of 18-44. 64 beneficiaries were vaccinated in Nicobar District, out of which, 17 beneficiaries were in the age group of 18-44 years. A total of 1,19,584 eligible people in the age group of 18 to 44 years have been vaccinated till date, a press release from DHS said.

essential services such as District Administration, Police, CISF, Health Services, ICMR, PBMC, Electricity, Shipping Services, Home Guards, Civil Defence, Fire and emergency services, Defence personnel on duty after 10 pm shall be permitted on production of valid Identity Cards issued by their concerned Departments.

Movement of Officers/Officials, involved in providing services such as Pay & Accounts, Forest, Banking, Water Supply & Sanitation in Rural Areas, Disaster Management, Port services and related services, Telecommunication shall be allowed after 10 pm on production of movement passes already issued by the Office of District Magistrate. Movement of personnel involved in providing Broadcasting, all print and electronic media persons after 10 pm shall be allowed on production of valid movement passes issued by the Office of District Magistrate. Movement of personnel involved in providing essential/emergency services shall be allowed after 10 pm on production of e-passes to be issued by the Office of District Magistrate. It shall be the sole responsibility of the owner/In-Charge of the shop/business establishment to ensure its compliance and also if any person attached with such organization is found misusing the e-passes or using the same for purposes other than it is meant for, the owner/in-charge shall be held responsible and he/she shall be liable to be fined to the tune of Rs.25,000/- and shall also be liable for action under DM Act.

All POL outlets shall be opened from 6 am to 10 pm. Movement of private medical personnel such as Doctors, nursing staff, paramedics etc. attached with diagnostic centres and clinics, veterinary clinics shall be allowed after 10 pm on production of e-passes issued by the Office of District Magistrate. Movement of persons from containment zones shall be strictly restricted and shall only be permitted on case to case basis upon approval from the Office of District Magistrate.

Port services will continue to operate as usual and both essential and non-essential cargo can be moved in and out of port, as per requirement for loading/unloading/clearing of cargo and the same shall be permitted till 10 pm only. e-Passes for operation of cargo movement after 10 pm needs to be obtained, which shall be strictly permitted on case to case basis by the Office of the District Magistrate. Construction activities shall be permitted till 10 pm. Construction activities of national importance and strategic projects beyond 10 pm shall be permitted with prior permission of District Magistrate and e-Passes needs to be obtained, which shall be strictly permitted on case to case basis by the Office of the District Magistrate.

Movement of persons involved with Hotels/Restaurants and Mess for home delivery of food shall be allowed till 10 pm. Dine-in shall be permitted between 6 am to 10 pm only, subject to 50% of the seating capacity and strict adherence of COVID appropriate behaviours. However, take away/parcel service and home delivery should be encouraged. It shall be the sole responsibility of the owner/In-Charge of the shop/business establishment to ensure its compliance and he/she shall be held responsible for any violation and shall be liable to be fined to the tune of Rs.50,000/- in addition to sealing of the shop/establishment for a period of 14 days by the Executive Magistrate and shall also be liable for action under DM Act.

Public Transport/ Buses shall be allowed to ply with strict adherence to the SOPs issued in this regard by the Transport department. Sale and service of liquor at licensed premises shall be permitted till 10 pm. SOPs and orders regarding the timings for sale and service of liquor at all licensed establishments (C, C1, B1, B2, B3 and B4 category) issued by the Deputy Commissioner (Excise), South Andaman should be strictly adhered to. All Parks/Playgrounds/Stadiums/Gyms and yoga institutes shall be permitted till 10 pm with 50% capacity and strict adherence of COVID appropriate behaviours. Any person violating the above directions shall be liable for fine to the tune of Rs.1,000/-, whereas the organisation shall be fined to the tune of Rs.25,000/-.

Last rites/funerals shall be permitted with a maximum of 20 persons with strict adherence to COVID appropriate behaviours.

No tribal passes will be issued for southern group of islands till further orders except for official purposes/national importance and strategic projects. All Religious places/ places of worship are allowed to open till 10 pm with 50 persons at a time along with priest for offering prayers. Wearing of face masks, maintaining social distancing, provision of thermal scanning and use of hand wash and sanitizers will be mandatory. The Management Committee of the religious places shall be responsible to ensure strict compliance and any violations of the directions shall be liable for fine to the tune of Rs.25,000/- payable by the Committee.

Religious places/ places of worship in containment zones shall remain closed. Only those outside containment zones will be allowed to open up. Social gatherings shall be allowed with a maximum 50 persons. Wearing of face masks, maintaining social distancing, provision of thermal scanning and use of hand wash and sanitizers will be mandatory. The parties concerned and management committee of the Hall/Hotel shall be responsible to ensure strict compliance of the COVID appropriate behaviours and any violations of the directions shall be liable for fine to the tune of Rs.50,000/-.

Theatres shall be permitted to function with 50% seating capacity and strict adherence of COVID appropriate behaviours. The owner of the theatre shall be liable for fine to the tune of Rs.50,000/-, in case of any violations.

Academic congregations shall be allowed with maximum 50% seating capacity. Wearing of face masks, maintaining social distancing, provision of thermal scanning and use of hand wash and sanitizers will be mandatory. The Owner/Proprietor of the academic institutions/coaching centre shall be responsible to ensure strict compliance of the COVID appropriate behaviours and any violations of the directions shall be liable for fine to the tune of Rs.50,000/- SOPs in this regard shall be issued by concerned department. Indoor sports activities shall be allowed with no spectators. Wearing of face masks, maintaining social distancing, provision of thermal scanning and use of hand wash and sanitizers will be mandatory. The management of the indoor facility shall be responsible to ensure strict compliance of the COVID appropriate behaviours and any violations of the directions shall be liable for fine to the tune of Rs.25,000/- SOPs in this regard shall be issued by concerned department.

e-pass for emergency movement during restricted timings may be submitted online on <https://epass.andaman.gov.in>. The applicants/organizations submitting applications for e-pass should invariably submit valid and clear supporting documents, failing which the application will be summarily rejected. In view of the emergent circumstances, this order is being issued ex-parte and is addressed to the public in general. Further, the Superintendent of Police/Sub-Divisional Magistrate/Executive Magistrates and all authorities concerned shall ensure strict compliance of this order and shall adequately inform and sensitize the field functionaries to note that these restrictions fundamentally relate to movement of people, but not to that of essential services.

Any disobedience of the above orders shall invite penal action u/s 188 of Indian Penal Code, 1860 and the relevant provisions of the Disaster Management Act, 2005 against the violator(s) and fine shall also be imposed as per Order issued by this office from time to time. This order shall come into effect from 18th August, 2021 and shall remain in force till 24th August, 2021.

emergency services, Defence personnel on duty shall be permitted on production of valid Identity Cards issued by their concerned Departments.

Movement of bare minimum personnel involved in providing Broadcasting and Cable services, Internet service providers, all print and electronic media persons, private security services, POL Outlets, LPG Stores/Godowns, ATMs, Cold Storages and warehouses shall be allowed for which valid passes shall be issued by the Office of District Magistrate based on the certification from the concerned organisation. Construction activities shall be permitted from 6 am to 10 pm and beyond 10 pm subject to special permission of the District Magistrate. Movement of persons involved with Hotels/Restaurants and Mess to be certified by the firm/organisation for home delivery of food shall be allowed till 10 pm. on production of movement pass already issued by the District Magistrate. Dine-in shall be permitted between 6 am & 10 pm subject to 50% of the seating capacity and strict adherence of COVID appropriate behaviours. However, take away/parcel service and home delivery should be encouraged. It shall be the sole responsibility of the Owner/Incharge of the shop/business establishment to ensure its compliance and also if any person attached with such organisation is found misusing the movement pass or using the same for the purposes other than it is meant for, the Owner/Incharge will be liable to be fined to the tune of Rs.10,000/-, along with sealing of shop/establishment for 14 days and shall also be liable for action under DM Act. Public transport/buses shall be allowed to ply with strict adherence to the SOPs issued in this regard by the Transport Department. Sale and service of liquor at licensed premises (B1, B2, B3 and C category) shall be permitted till 10 pm. SOPs and orders regarding the timings for sale and service of liquor at all licensed establishments issued by the Deputy Commissioner (Excise) should be strictly adhered to. All Parks/Playgrounds/Stadiums/Gyms and yoga institutes shall be permitted to open from 6 am to 10 pm with 50% capacity and strict adherence of COVID appropriate behaviours. Any person violating the above directions shall be liable to be fined to the tune of Rs.1000/- whereas the organization shall be fine to the tune of Rs. 10,000/-.

Last rites/funerals shall be permitted with a maximum of 20 persons with strict adherence to COVID appropriate behaviours.

All Religious places/ places of worship are allowed to open between 6 am & 10 pm with 50 persons at a time along with priest for offering prayers. Wearing of face masks, maintaining social distancing, provision of thermal scanning and use of hand wash or sanitizers will be mandatory. The Management Committee of the religious places shall be responsible to ensure strict compliance and any violations of the directions shall be liable for fine to the tune of Rs. 10,000/- payable by the Committee.

Religious places/ places of worship in containment zones shall remain closed. Only those outside containment zones will be allowed to open up. Social gatherings shall be allowed with a maximum 50 persons. Wearing of face masks, maintaining social distancing, provision of thermal scanning and use of hand wash and sanitizers will be mandatory. The parties concerned and management committee of the Hall/Hotel shall be responsible to ensure strict compliance of the COVID appropriate behaviours and any violations of the directions shall be liable for fine to the tune of Rs.10,000/-.

Academic congregations shall be allowed with maximum 50% seating capacity. Wearing of face masks, maintaining social distancing, provision of thermal scanning and use of hand wash and sanitizers will be mandatory. The Owner/Proprietor of the academic institutions/coaching centre shall be responsible to ensure strict compliance of the COVID appropriate behaviours and any violations of the directions shall be liable for fine to the tune of Rs.10,000/- SOPs in this regard shall be issued by concerned department. Indoor sports activities shall be allowed with no spectators. Wearing of face masks, maintaining social distancing, provision of thermal scanning and use of hand wash and sanitizers will be mandatory. The management of the indoor facility shall be responsible to ensure strict compliance of the COVID appropriate behaviours and any violations of the directions shall be liable for fine to the tune of Rs.10,000/- SOPs in this regard shall be issued by concerned department.

The movement passes issued by the District Administration from 22nd May, 2021 onwards shall remain valid.

In view of the emergent circumstances, this order is being issued ex-parte and is addressed to the public in general. Further, the Superintendent of Police/Sub-Divisional Magistrate/Executive Magistrates and all authorities concerned shall ensure strict compliance of this order and shall adequately inform and sensitize the field functionaries to note that these restrictions fundamentally relate to movement of people, but not to that of essential services. Any disobedience of the above orders shall invite penal action u/s 188 of Indian Penal Code, 1860 and the relevant provisions of the Disaster Management Act, 2005 against the violator(s). This order shall come into force with effect from 18th August, 2021 till further orders.
