

World Leaders' Summit of COP26 in Glasgow India will bring its non-fossil energy capacity to 500 GW by 2030 and will fulfill 50 percent of its energy requirement through renewable energy by 2030:PM

New Delhi, Nov. 2

India will achieve net-zero carbon emissions by 2070 and reduce one billion tonnes of carbon emissions from the total projected emissions by 2030. The country will bring down the carbon intensity of its economy by more than 45 percent by 2030. Delivering the National Statement at the World Leaders' Summit of COP26 in Glasgow, Prime Minister, Shri Narendra Modi said, India will bring its non-fossil energy capacity to 500 GW by 2030 and it will fulfill 50 percent of its energy requirement through renewable energy by 2030.

Prime Minister said the country constitutes 17 percent of the global population and its contribution to the emission has remained only five percent. But today, the entire world admits that India is the only major economy that has delivered on the



Paris Agreement in letter and spirit. The Prime Minister added that the climate finance and transfer of low-cost technology become even more important when India has resolved to move forward with a new commitment and new energy. He said, India is responsible for just five percent of emissions and it is putting climate change at centre of its policies.

Talking about climate finance, the Prime Minister stressed the need to put pressure on

those countries that have failed to deliver on their promises about climate finance. He said all climate finance promises have been empty ones so far and developed countries must ensure one trillion dollar climate finance at the earliest. Shri Modi also opined to track climate finance just like we track the progress of climate mitigation.

Prime Minister also said, instead of mindless and destructive consumption, mindful and deliberate utilization is the need of the hour, adding that the movement can bring in revolutionary changes in areas including agriculture, fishing, housing, hospitality, tourism, water management and energy. He also called for making lifestyle for the environment a global mission. On the sidelines of the COP26 World Leaders' Summit, Shri Modi met his UK

Supreme Court issues directions for compliance by general public on firecrackers Manufacture, sale & use of joined firecrackers (series crackers or laris) banned

Port Blair, Nov. 2

In pursuance of order passed by Hon'ble Supreme Court of India on 29-10-2021 on firecrackers case, the Hon'ble Supreme Court has issued various directions for compliance by the general public. Crackers with reduced emission (improved crackers) and green crackers with QR code would be permitted to be manufactured and sold. The manufacture, sale and use of joined firecrackers (series crackers or laris) is banned as the same causes huge air, noise and solid waste problems. No e-commerce websites, including Flipkart, Amazon, etc., shall accept any online orders and effect online sales. Any such e-commerce companies found selling crackers online will be hauled up for contempt of court and the Court may also pass, in that eventuality, orders of monetary penalties as well. Firecrackers with Barium salts is banned. On Diwali days or on any other festivals like Gurupurab, etc., when such fireworks generally take place, it would strictly be from 8 pm till 10 pm only. On Christmas eve and New

Year's Eve, when such fireworks start around midnight i.e., 12 am, it would be from 11.55 pm till 12.30 am only.

Nobody would be permitted to flout and/or disobey the directions issued by the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India. Any willful and deliberate disobedience will be viewed very seriously and action as deemed fit will be taken against the violators by the enforcement agencies, a press release from Andaman & Nicobar Pollution Control Committee, Department of Science and Technology said.

labourers to meet both ends of their livelihoods. The UT Administration has taken relentless efforts leaving no stone unturned to implement this scheme within the established time frame by the Central Government and made functional with effect from February, 2021 in its true letter and spirit.

Affairs has launched toll free number: 18003454445 (via Mobile) & number 14445 (via Landline) to address all the queries/grievances and to provide information related to entitlement of foodgrains under NFSA during working hours (8.45 am to 5 pm)

In addition to this, the Government of India has launched a mobile App namely 'Mera Ration' to facilitate the ONORC-related

services among beneficiaries of the NFSA, particularly migrant beneficiaries, Fair Price Shops and other stakeholders. The App can be downloaded through Playstore App for the registration of migrant beneficiaries, checking of foodgrains entitlement as well as previous six months transactions along with status of Aadhaar seeding, a press release received here from Deptt. of CS&CA said.

IAF Dornier aircraft service on Port Blair-Car Nicobar-Campbell Bay sector to resume from Nov. 5 Frequency of helicopter service to Islands also increased

Keeping in view the demand for Inter-Island travels, the Directorate of Civil Aviation, A & N Administration has decided to resume the IAF Dornier aircraft services for Car Nicobar and Campbell Bay and increase the frequency of helicopter services to various Islands w.e.f 5th November, 2021.

As per the new schedule, there will be weekly 2 flights of IAF

Dornier aircraft for Car Nicobar and Campbell Bay on every Monday and Friday. Besides, the helicopter services will be available for Campbell Bay on every Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday & Saturday. Similarly, for Kamorta, Katchal and Teressa the helicopter services will be operated on every Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, Friday & Saturday. For Chowra there will be weekly two

services of helicopter on every Monday & Friday. For Mayabunder and Diglipur, the helicopter services will be available from Monday to Saturday on daily basis. For Rangat there will be weekly 2 services on every Monday and Friday. For Hutbay, the helicopter services will be operated on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday & Friday. For Swaraj Dweep, the helicopter sorties will be operated

on every Monday and Saturday.

Further, as per new schedule, there will be total 13 flights per week for Car Nicobar from Monday to Saturday, including two flights of IAF Dornier aircraft, a press release received from Directorate of Civil Aviation said. Processing of applications for grant of Environmental Clearance to be done through online PARIVESH portal

In pursuance of MoEF & CC Office memorandum dated 19-04-2021, the Andaman and Nicobar Pollution Control Committee, Department of Science and Technology, Andaman and Nicobar Administration has shifted complete processing of applications for grant of Terms of Reference (ToR) and Environmental Clearance (EC) through online PARIVESH portal.

PARIVESH -Pro

Active Responsive facilitation by Interactive and Virtual Environmental Single Window Hub is a Ministry of Environment, Forests and Climate Change initiative for single window clearances of Environment, Forests and Wildlife and Coastal Regulation Zone (CRZ) Clearances. It facilitates online submission and monitoring of the proposals submitted by the proponents by automating the entire tracking of proposals

which includes online submission of a new proposal, editing/ updating the details of proposals and displays status of the proposals at each stage of the workflow.

The Environment Impact Assessment (EIA) Notification, 2006 under the Environment (Protection) Act, 1986 mandates the requirement of prior environment clearance for the projects/ activities listed in the schedule to the said Notification. The projects or activities

requiring prior environmental clearance from the concerned regulatory authority, is referred to the Central Government in the Ministry of Environment and Forests for matters falling under Category 'A' in the Schedule and at State level, the State/Union Territory Environment Impact Assessment Authority (SEIAA) for matters falling under Category 'B' in the said Schedule. The SEIAA shall base its decision

One convicted to undergo rigorous imprisonment for three years with fine by Hon'ble POCSO Court, Mayabunder

The Hon'ble Special Court under POCSO Act, Mayabunder has found guilty and convicted one accused person namely K Duryodhan, Retd. Govt. employee of Electricity Department, R/o Poka Dera under Police Station Mayabunder and sent him to judicial custody

on Nov. 1, 2021 for reflection of mind for hearing of quantum of punishment. Accordingly, on 2/11/2021, Shri. Jimut Bahan Biswas, Hon'ble Additional Sessions Judge -cum- Special Judge under POCSO Act, North & Middle Andaman District, Mayabunder after

hearing upon both sides passed an order and sentenced to undergo rigorous imprisonment for three years to the convict for the offence punishable under section 8 of POCSO Act, 2012 and also to pay fine of Rs.50,000/-, out of which, 90 percent amount is to be paid to the victim girl as

compensation u/s. 357 of Cr.P.C., in default of payment the convict will have to undergo rigorous imprisonment for six month more.

4,96,196 lakh doses of vaccines administered to beneficiaries in Isles so far

Port Blair, Nov. 2 Vaccination drive to vaccinate maximum number of eligible beneficiaries of 18 above age group in the entire Island Territory is continuing. Due to the vigorous effort made by the Health Department, the number of cumulative doses of vaccines administered to beneficiaries so far in A&N Islands has reached 4,96,196. A total of 915 people were vaccinated today in the age group of 18-44. 723 beneficiaries were vaccinated in Nicobar District, out of which, 2 beneficiaries were in the age group of 18-44. A total of 1,73,507 eligible people in the age group of 18 to 44 years, age group of 18 to 44 years have been vaccinated till date.

The entire process of Haj Application for Haj -2022 is provisional subject to final Guidelines of KSA. Haj Application can be filled online only at website of Haj Committee of India i.e 'http://hajcommittee.gov.in' and through 'Haj Committee of India' Mobile App. Payment of registration fee is to be deposit online.

Applicant can fill their Haj application online themselves or through Haji Suvidha Kendra. The A&N Islands UT Haj Committee has also set up a E-Suvidha Kendra for assisting Hajis in the online submission of HAF. Haj applications will be accepted online only. Applicant must read the guideline/undertaking carefully before filling Haj Application. Pilgrims must upload first & last page of Machine readable passport, latest passport size photograph, copy of cancelled cheque of cover head and copy of address proof. The applicants must be in possession of machine readable Indian international Passport validity upto 31.12.2022. Age limit is upto 65 years.

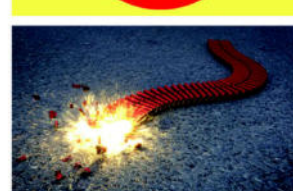
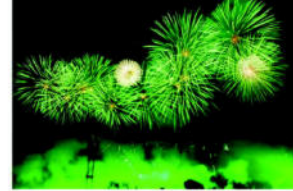

- Use of Series fire crackers or laris are banned.
- Pastic carry bags are BANNED. Crackers should not be sold in plastic carry bags.

A&N Police issues safety advisory for mishap free Diwali

All accidents due to fireworks occur as a result of carelessness, negligence and ignorance. It could be avoided by observing some very simple precautions. Hence, the following guidelines are to be followed to ensure mishap free Diwali.

Fire precautionary measures for Home**Do's:**

1. Buy crackers from licensed shops only.
2. Keep the fire crackers in the manufactured boxes, store them in cool and dry place, keep out of reach of children and animals, away from all sources of heat and fire until the time they're needed. Don't store them under the stairs or passageway.
3. Burst crackers in open spaces like community parks, play grounds, etc.
4. Maintain a two-foot distance from the crackers while igniting.
5. Keep blanket and bucket of water nearby for First Aid.
6. Keep regulators of gas cylinders in off position and protect door/window curtains from stray rockets.
7. If your clothes catch fire - stop, drop down on the ground and roll.
8. Use dry, sterile, non-adhesive dressings
9. Apply water in case of burns to reduce the temperature. Do not smear ointment, butter or any other oily substance on wounds. Rush the patient to the nearest hospital.
10. If the fingers or toes are burned, use dry, sterile, non-adhesive dressings to maintain gaps between the fingers.

Don'ts

1. Do not cover the crackers with tin containers or glass bottles for extra sound while bursting.
2. Do not wear loose clothing while near fire or fireworks as they may easily catch fire.
3. Don't wear synthetic cloths instead use fitting cotton cloths
4. Never bend over the crackers while igniting or re-ignite the fireworks that don't light in the first instance.
5. Always use candles for lighting the crackers.
6. If someone gets burnt, don't remove the clothing (unless it comes off easily).
7. Don't place diyas or earthen lamps near flammable material, wood, cloth or paper which could easily catch fire.
8. Decorative lights or electric lights should not be tied to metal poles.

Fire precautionary measures for cracker shops.

1. At the places where crackers are sold, a safety distance should be kept from similar premises (minimum 15 mtrs) or any other premises used for storage of explosive, inflammable or hazardous materials.
2. All the articles of inflammable or combustible in nature should be removed from the place where crackers are sold.
3. Fire crackers should be sold on the ground floor only.
4. Electric wiring must be enclosed in conduct pipes and not to be left hanging freely.
5. No oil or gas lamp should be allowed in the shops.
6. The lights must be properly fixed in the ceiling and should not be suspended by a wire.
7. No person less than 18 years of age should be allowed to load or unload crackers under Child Labour Prohibition and Regulation Act.
8. Smoking must not be allowed near the cracker selling shops.
9. The following fire fighting equipment should be kept handy.
 - a) Water CO2 Extinguisher (9 Ltrs.) - 01 No.
 - b) CO2/DCP Extinguisher (4.5kg)/(6kg) - 01 No.
 - c) Fire Buckets (filled with water) - 02 Nos.
10. Display of Fire Crackers shall not be done in silence zone. Silence zone is an area comprising not less than 100 mtrs. around Hospitals, Educational Institutions, Courts, Religious places or any other area, which is declared as such by the competent authority. In case of any fire, fire service may be informed over phone numbers of Police Fire Control room 101, 232107, 232325 or Dy. Superintendent of Police (Fire) 232697, 9434282817 or concerned Police Fire Station at various places in A&N Islands. (Source: SP (Fire))


