ढाली खेती स्थित सरकारी सामान्य आवास में रहने वाले लोगों का कहना है की संबंधित विभाग के द्वारा कई सालों से यहां पर रख रखाव का कार्य नहीं हुआ है और बार बार शिकायत करने के बावजूद भी कोई कारवाही नहीं करने से छत पूरी तरह से उड़ गया है और कमरे से खुला आसमान दिख रहा है ।

इन आवासों में रहने वाले लोगों ने शंका जताई है की अगर अभी भी समय रहते इन सामान्य आवासों का रख रखाव का कार्य नहीं किया जाता है तो कभी भी कोई बड़ा हादसा हो सकता है जिससे की जान माल को हानि भी पहुंच सकता है ।

रंगत स्थित ढाली खेती में बने सरकारी सामान्य आवास के रख रखाव पर संबंधित विभाग तुरंत ही कारवाही करते हुए यहां पर रहने वाले लोगों की जान माल की सुरक्षा पर अपना ध्यान केन्द्रित करे ।

MP demands uninterrupted power supply in Andaman and Nicobar Islands

The Member of Parliament of Andaman and Nicobar Islands, Shri. Kuldeep Rai Sharma has demanded uninterrupted power supply in Andaman and Nicobar Islands. In a letter addressed to the Chief Secretary, the Member of Parliament mentioned that due to frequent power cuts and several hour long power outages, the general public have been suffering heavily.

He mentioned that frequent power cuts not only cause huge discomfort but also disturbs the daily activities of every household including studies of children. In working hours frequent power cuts are also disturbing normal classes of every school. He pointed out that other than this, unemployed youths who have been earning their daily bread by running petty shops or tourism businesses are also suffering heavy financial losses as

they are unable to do billing, ticketing and other tour scheduling works.

The Member of Parliament added that in the last three days several areas of Port Blair city have witnessed power cuts for more than four to five hours in both morning and evening hours, which has caused widespread disappointment.

He added that in today's age life without uninterrupted power supply is unimaginable.

Member of Parliament recommends Mortuary Van for Rangat Tehsil of Middle Andaman from MPLADS

Fulfilling the demands raised by the General Public of Rangat region, the Member of Parliament of Andaman and Nicobar Islands, Shri. Kuldeep Rai Sharma has recommended 'An Mortuary Van for the Panchayat Samiti Rangat' from MPLADS fund for the use of People of the region.

The Mortuary Van will be provided to Panchayat Samiti Rangat at the cost of Rs. 15 Lakhs.

Once inducted, the Mortuary Van will not only help the general public during last rites of their loved one at Rangat region but also the Mortuary Van can be pressed into use to transport

dead-bodies from Port Blair to Rangat.

Presently people of Middle and North Andaman are facing huge difficulties in transporting dead-bodies from Port Blair to Middle and North Andaman because of the high rate of private Mortuary Vans of Port Blair.

इन क्षेत्रों में रहने वाले स्थानीय लोगों का कहना है की जिन कम मूल्यों के शराब की बोतलों को एनिडको के शराब की दुकानों में उपलब्ध होना चाहिए यही शराब अवैध रूप से शराब की दुकान रखने वालों के पास दुगनी दामों पर उपलब्ध रहता है जिसके पीछे बड़ा रहस्य छुपा हुआ है ।

इन क्षेत्रों में रहने वाले लोगों को संदेह है की शराब के इस काला बाजारी में कई लोग शामिल हो सकते हैं जिसमें प्रमुख रूप से एनिडको शराब दुकान का मनेजर उनका सह कर्मचारी के साथ साथ पुलिस और राजस्व विभाग के अधिकारी और कर्मचारी शामिल हो सकते हैं ।

इन क्षेत्रों में यहां पर रहने वाले स्थानीय लोगों के द्वारा लगाये गये आरोप पर संबंधित विभागों के द्वारा संज्ञान लेकर जांच कराया जाना चाहिए तथा एनिडको की शराब दुकान में बिकने वाली कम मूल्यों की शराब सबसे पहले यहां के स्थानीय लोगों को उपलब्ध कराया जाना चाहिए और अवैध रूप से बिक्री करने वाले शराब दुकान पर कानूनी कारवाही करते हुए इन्हे बंद किया जाना चाहिए जिससे की वतावरण में शांति बना रहे ।

Member of Parliament demands implementing uniform rule for availing Child Care Leave in all departments for convenience of working mothers

The Member of Parliament of Andaman and Nicobar Islands, Shri. Kuldeep Rai Sharma has requested the Chief Secretary to implement uniform rules for availing Child Care Leave (CCL) in all departments of Andaman and Nicobar Administration for convenience of working mothers in taking care of their children as per prescribed norms of Government of India.

In a letter addressed to the Chief Secretary the Member of Parliament mentioned that some departments under Andaman and Nicobar Administration have made the process of sanctioning Child Care Leave (CCL) so much complex that working women are finding it too difficult to avail Child Care Leave CCL,

which is a benefit provided by Government of India. He mentioned that some departments are demanding medical certificates for granting CCL while some departments are asking the women employees to find a replacement, even for applying for CCL. The Member of Parliament mentioned that a mother in need of Child Care Leave (CCL) to take care of their children during health issues, examinations and any other needs can't run from pillar to post to find a medical certificate or replacement. Things become difficult for working mothers who are working in remote Islands.

He mentioned that together with jobs and children, women carry

many other responsibilities and this is why considering the challenges faced by working women, the Government of India has framed specific rules for availing CCL but in some departments additional rules are being imposed, which are restricting women from availing CCL at the time of need..

He said that Child Care Leave can be granted to women employees having minor children below the age of 18 years, for a maximum period of 2 years (i.e. 730 days) during their entire service, for taking care of up to two children whether for rearing or to look after any of their needs like examination, sickness etc.

25,435 beneficiaries in the age group of 12 to 14 years administered both doses of vaccine

Port Blair, July 20 : The vaccination drive is continuing smoothly in A&N Islands. As per data available, a total of 6,84,260 doses of vaccine have been administered to beneficiaries in the age group of 18 and above so far. Similarly, 23,631 beneficiaries have been vaccinated in the age group of 15 to 18 years. 25,435 beneficiaries in the age group of 12 to 14 years have been administered both doses of vaccine. The number of beneficiaries administered precautionary dose of vaccine so

far stood at 41,290. A total of 3456 eligible beneficiaries were vaccinated in A&N Islands today. 1672 beneficiaries were vaccinated in South Andaman District, out of which, out of which 135 were in the age group of 12-14 years, 5 were in the age group of 15 to 18 years, 1 beneficiaries were in the age group of 18-44 years and the number of beneficiaries administered precautionary dose of vaccine stood at 1368.

In North & Middle Andaman District, 1127 beneficiaries were

vaccinated, out of which 54 were in the age group of 12-14 years and the number of beneficiaries administered precautionary dose of vaccine stood at 1053.

In Nicobar District, 657 beneficiaries were vaccinated out of which 28 were in the age group of 12-14 years, 3 were in the age group of 15 to 18 years, 2 beneficiaries were in the age group of 18-44 years and the number of beneficiaries administered precautionary dose of vaccine stood at 586.

COVID-19 status in A&N Islands

Port Blair, July 20 : Eight positive cases have been detected today in A&N Islands, of which, 2 were from incoming flight passengers who arrived here yesterday. Today, 9 flights with 1164 passengers arrived, out of which, 1049 passengers were vaccinated with both doses while

RT-PCR test was conducted on 78 passengers and the reports are awaited.

During RAT conducted on 20 passengers bound for North & Middle Andaman at Ferrargunj, no positive case has been detected. At Phoenix Bay Jetty, 16 passengers were tested with

RAT, no positive case has been detected. RAT was conducted on 13 passengers at Mohanpura Bus Terminus, no positive case has been detected. At helipad one person was tested with RAT and the report was negative.

यूनिवर्सिटी ऑफ मिशीगन के सायकोलॉजिस्ट प्रो. ईथन क्रॉस का कहना है कि अपने से बातचीत का कोई नियम नहीं है। यह आलोचना भी हो सकती है। खुद से स्वस्थ संवाद काम में फोकस बढ़ाने, कठिन हालात का सामना करने और बेहतर समझ बनाकर हमारे विकास में अहम भूमिका निभाता है। अगर आपकी सेल्फ टॉक नकारात्मक है और आप इसे बदलना चाहते हैं तो लगन और अनुशासन से बदल सकते हैं।

इसे नए सिरे से विकसित कर सकते हैं। अमेरिका के कोलोराडो की मनोवैज्ञानिक मेलिंडा फाउड्स के अनुसार लक्ष्य नकारात्मक सेल्फ टॉक को बदल कर इस विचार को मजबूत बनाना है कि आप अच्छे, काबिल और सक्षम हैं। इसका अर्थ गलतियों को अनदेखा करना नहीं है।

सूत्र वाक्य बनाकर शुरुआत करें

फाउड्स कहती हैं कि अपने लिए एक सूत्र वाक्य बना लें जो दिमाग में जड़ें जमाए और नकारात्मक सोच का विरोध करें। मैं अच्छे से भी बेहतर हूँ या मैं बहुत काबिल हूँ। इसे दोहराएं। दबाव, तनाव, थकान में इसे याद रखना कठिन होगा। अपने कमरे, घर में कई जगह लिखें, दोहराएं जिससे नकारात्मक विचार दूर हों।

अपना नाम लेकर खुद से बात करें

किसी समस्या पर दूसरे को सलाह देना आसान होता है। ऐसे में अपना नाम लेकर या खुद को "आप" कहकर खुद से बातचीत करें। इससे आप उस विषय से मानसिक रूप से दूर होंगे। बेहतर सलाह दे पाएंगे। ऐसा सोचना भी कारगर हो सकता है कि उस समस्या पर एक महीने या साल भर बाद आप क्या सोचेंगे।

प्रकृति के करीब जाएं, चिंताएं छोटी होंगी

Minister visits Fish Landing Centre at Rangat; assures of all assistance from Govt. for developing 'Model Fishermen Village' Project in North & Middle Andaman District



Port Blair, July 14 : The Hon'ble Minister of State for Information & Broadcasting and Fisheries, Animal Husbandry & Dairying, GoI, Dr. L Murugan, arrived here on a two day visit to the A&N Islands today. On arrival, the Minister was received by Senior Officers of the Administration, PBMC Chairperson and public representatives. Soon after arrival at Port Blair, the Minister proceeded to Rangat where he visited the Fish Landing Centre at Rangat Bay. Addressing the gathering, especially the fishermen community there, the Minister stated that prior to 2014 there was no separate Ministry for Fisheries but after 2014 the Central Government created a separate Ministry named Fisheries Ministry for the development of Fisheries sector in the country.

The Minister further said, keeping in mind the huge potential

in fisheries sector, the Central Govt. immediately brought a scheme named 'Blue Revolution' in 2015 under which a fund of Rs. 5000 Crores was provided for implementation of different schemes for the development of Fisheries Sector. In 2017, a new scheme named 'Fisheries Infrastructure Development Fund' was introduced in which provision for Rs. 7500 crore was kept for taking up projects like creation of Fish Landing Centres, development of fishing harbor, construction of ice plants and cold storages, processing plants, development of community hall for fishermen and dwelling units for fishermen etc, all over the country, the Minister added.

The Minister said, to make the Fishermen 'aatmanirbhar' during the COVID period, a new scheme named 'Pradhan Mantri Matsya Sampada Yojana'

was announced by the Prime Minister in which Rs. 20,000 crore was earmarked to carry out various activities for the betterment of the Fishermen community. Some of the activities under this scheme are being implemented in these Islands too, he said. The Minister said that he is happy to hear from some of the fishermen that they have been benefitted from the Pradhan Mantri Matsya Sampada Yojana.

The Minister also highlighted different schemes of the Ministry of Fisheries and urged the Fishermen to avail the benefits of the schemes. He further said that the demand of the fishermen community for additional fund for completing the 'Model Fishermen Villages' will be fulfilled and assured of all assistance from Govt. for developing 'Model Fishermen Village' Project in N&M Andaman District. The

Minister further informed that the Ministry has also brought 'Deep Sea Fishing Scheme' for the small fishermen so that they can also establish their businesses and export fish directly. The Minister urged the fishermen to take advantage of this scheme.

The Minister also interacted with the newly appointed SagarMitras under PMMSY who have been appointed for promoting the schemes under PMMSY. The Minister urged the

SagarMitras to work sincerely and create awareness about the various schemes under the Fisheries Ministry for the betterment of the fishermen community. The Pradhan of Nimbutala informed the Minister about the issues of fishermen in particular and the general public of the area in general.

Earlier on arrival, the Minister was welcomed by the senior officers of the Fisheries

Department at Fish Landing Centre at Rangat Bay.

Earlier, the Minister interacted with the PRI members and BJP leaders & workers at Atal Bihari Vajpayee Auditorium at Rangat. He also met and interacted with the public representative and office bearers of NGOs at Govt. Guest House Rangat. The Minister also visited the Azad Hind Fauj Setu at Kadamtala and interacted with beneficiaries of various Govt. schemes.

Further, lectures on Snake bite and basic life support was delivered to fishermen by Station Medical Officer.
