He also stressed the need to develop a hybrid system of online and offline learning to avoid overexposure of technology of school-going children.

The Prime Minister reviewed the implementation of the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020, yesterday where he was



apprised of the progress of formulation of National Curriculum Framework. The Prime Minister also suggested that secondary schools with science labs should engage with farmers in their area for soil testing to create awareness about soil health.

During the meeting in New Delhi, it was

suggested that the databases maintained by Anganwadi Centers should be seamlessly integrated with the school databases. Regular Health check-ups and screening for children in schools should be carried out with the help of technology.

In order to create new possibilities for life-long learning and centrally involve

critical and

interdisciplinary thinking in learners, the UGC has published guidelines according to which students can pursue two academic programmes simultaneously.

Online, open and multi-modal learning have been promoted vigorously by both schools and higher education institutions. This initiative has helped in reducing the learning loss due to the COVID-19 pandemic and will contribute greatly in reaching education to remote and inaccessible parts of the country.

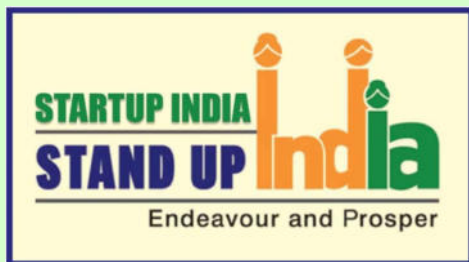
Promoting entrepreneurship through Stand-Up India Scheme in A&N Islands

Loan amounting to Rs. 51.56 crores disbursed to beneficiaries for setting up own ventures since inception of scheme

Port Blair, May 8

The Stand-Up India scheme aims at promoting entrepreneurship among women and Scheduled Castes and Tribes. The scheme is implemented by Department of Financial Services (DFS), Ministry of Finance, Government of India. Stand-Up India Scheme facilitates bank loans between Rs. 10 lakh and Rs. 1 Crore to at least one Scheduled Caste (SC) or Scheduled Tribe (ST) borrower and at least one woman borrower per bank branch for setting up a greenfield enterprise. This enterprise may be in manufacturing, services or the trading sector. In case of non-individual enterprises at least 51%



of the shareholding and controlling stake should be held by either an SC/ST or woman entrepreneur.

A total of 250 beneficiaries were provided loan amounting to Rs. 51.56 crores since inception of the

scheme. 222 women beneficiaries were provided loan amounting to Rs. 44.12 crores while loan amounting to Rs. 9.37 crores were provided to the SC/ST beneficiaries to start their own ventures.

As per data

received from Lead Bank Port Blair, in A&N Islands, altogether, 68 beneficiaries have availed loan under the Stand-Up India Scheme and an amount of Rs. 15.51 crores have been disbursed to the applicants during the financial year 2021-22 for setting up their own ventures.

SC/ST or woman entrepreneurs, above 18 years of age, can avail loans under the scheme only for greenfield project. Greenfield signifies first time venture of the beneficiary in manufacturing or services or trading sector. In case of non-individual enterprises, 51% of the shareholding and

Custody of girl child handed over to Police team of PS Jagacha

Port Blair, May 8

In a joint exercise by the District Child Protection Unit under the overall supervision of Shri Suneel Anchipaka, Chairman (DCPU)/ Deputy Commissioner (SA) in coordination with the Child Welfare Committee and Police Station Pahargaon, a minor girl hailing from Howrah District, West Bengal was

rescued.

On receipt of the information regarding the missing report of a minor girl, a case was registered U/s 363/365 of IPC at PS Jagacha, Howrah, Police Commissionerate, West Bengal on 5th May, 2022 and upon this, the SHO Pahargaon and his team acting swiftly on the matter rescued the minor girl from

Teylorabad.

The child was immediately shifted to Child Care Institution and was attended by a team of officials of District Child Protection Unit (DCPU) and counselling was provided.

National Family Benefit Scheme being implemented by Social Welfare Deptt.

Eligible beneficiaries can obtain form from Directorate of Social Welfare or Offices of CDPOs and other out stations



Port Blair, May 8

The Directorate of Social Welfare is implementing the National Family Benefit Scheme (NFBS) under the National Social Assistance Programme (NSAP). Under this scheme, an amount of Rs.20000/- will be given as a lump sum assistance to the bereaved household in the event of death of the breadwinner. It is clarified that in the event of death

(natural or otherwise) would make the family eligible for assistance. A woman in the family, who is a homemaker, is also considered a 'breadwinner' for this purpose. The family benefit will be paid to such surviving member of the household of the deceased poor, who after local enquiry, is found to be the head of the household. For the purpose of the scheme, the term

'household' would include spouses, minor children, unmarried daughters, and dependent parents. In case of death of an unmarried adult, the term household would include minor brothers/ sisters and dependent parents.

The death of such breadwinner should have occurred while he/she is more than 18 years of age and less than 59 years of age.

More than 190 crore 20 lakh COVID vaccine doses have been administered in the country so far under Nationwide Vaccination Drive. The Health Ministry said, more than 17 lakh 39 thousand doses were administered in the last 24 hours. During the same period, three thousand 451 new COVID cases were reported in the country.



India's active caseload currently stands at 20 thousand 635 and it is at 0.05 percent. The recovery rate is currently at 98.74 percent. A total of 3 thousand 79 people have recovered in the last 24 hours and total recoveries

touched over four crore 25 lakh and 57 thousand.

The Ministry said the weekly positivity rate stands at 0.83 percent and the daily positivity rate is at 0.96 percent. A total of 84 crore 6 lakh COVID tests have been conducted in the country so far. World No 11 Kidambi Srikanth then eked out a 18-21, 21-9, 21-11 win over Kai Schafer after a sluggish start to give India an unassailable 3-0 lead

in the Group C tie. MR Arjun and Dhruv Kapila handed Bjarne Geiss and Jan Colin Voelker a 25-23, 21-15 defeat in the second men's doubles tie as Indian continued its dominant display. HS Prannoy, ranked 23rd in the world, completed a 5-0 whitewash of Germany, with a 21-9, 21-9 win over Matthias Kicklitz.

Any Indian company incorporated under the Companies Act 1956/2013, primarily a Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises (MSME) as defined in the MSME Act, 2006 having over 51% stakes by the Indian Citizen / NRI / OCI and Head Quarter in India.

Individual Innovators will also be encouraged to apply (research & academic institutions can use this category to apply). However, release of funds shall be subjected to compliance of eligibility conditions for either Startup or MSME before agreement signing. More than one organization can jointly submit the application in partnership with consortium, registered societies & Academia. Collaboration with Academia / R&D Organization is highly encouraged.

Under the scheme, financial support will be provided to those projects/ideas who have reached at least 'Proof of Concept (PoC)' level. Financial support will be provided to the beneficiary in the form of grants. Extent of Milestone based Grant in Aid from Proof-of-Concept stage for Startup: upto Rs. 50 Lakhs, MSMEs: upto Rs. 2 Crore, Consortium: upto Rs. 10 Crore.

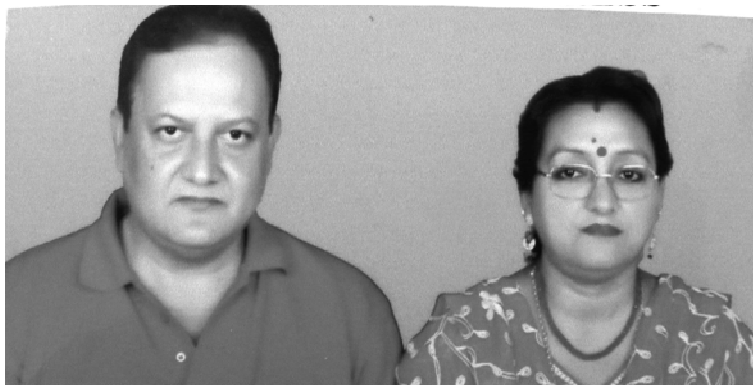

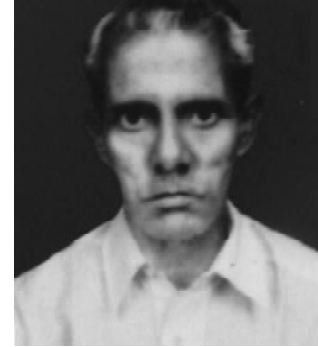
