Life in the ocean: From the shores or from a boat, the sea looks like a huge mass of uniform, inky blue water. It is not so actually. Life in the sea is amazingly different at different depths. From the surface to a few feet below. the ocean is a sunlit world, that changes from day to night. Below this, the ocean becomes cold, dim, and unchanging. And thousands of meters below the surface, the ocean is a region of nearfreezing temperatures, crushing pressure, and complete darkness.

Most marine plants and animals are adapted to living in one of three regions- the sunlight, twilight, or midnight zone. These zones are defined by the presence (or absence) of light. They differ from one another in temperature amount of pressure, and nutrient supply. We will mainly focus here on the sunlight zone where most of the familiar animals and plants are present.

Allegation on Large Scale Corruption and Siphoning Off Huge Amount from A&N Islands to Mainland

CPI(M) Meeting Demands CBI Probe to Unearth the Facts

Port Blair, Nov. 7: The meeting of the Andaman & Nicobar State Organising Committee of CPI (M) held on 5th November 2022 at Port Blair observed with grave concern and anguish that corruption is increasing in these islands with the overt or covert patronage of the BJP-led government at the centre.

During the last 2 - 3 years, particularly during the tenure of the rape accused former Chief Secretary, the corruption

was at its zenith with the allegations of large scale collection of money from the businessmen and others by some of the officials of the Administration, the meeting observed. There were allegations of corruption of in grant of Bar licenses, renewal of bar licenses, quarry licenses, purchase of buses in the Transport Department, etc.

It was alleged in the media that about 300 to 400 crores

of rupees have been siphoned off to mainland during the last 2 years. CPI (M) observes that one or two official cannot be solely held responsible for it as the money might have gone to the political bosses in Delhi.

In this context, allowing the former Chief Secretary in the post for more than 17 months despite knowing that he was allegedly indulging in corrupt, unethical and illegal activities, by the BJP

government at the centre speak voluminous about the nefarious activities of the political-bureaucratic combine in the islands.

The meeting noted that instead of taking action against the officers concerned, the central government continued to protect such corrupt officers which implies the allegations as true that the political bosses on the mainland are also beneficiaries of such large

CPI(M) Demands CBI Investigation on Sex-For-Job Racket

Port Blair, Nov. 7: The meeting of the CPI (M) Andaman & Nicobar State Organising Committee held at Port Blair on 5th November 2022 notes with concern and anguish that the investigation into the sex-for-job racket involving a former Chief Secretary of the Andaman & Nicobar Administration, who is a 1990 batch IAS officer, former Labour Commissioner and a few other people is not being carried out as per law.

Remote Voting

India has the largest diaspora population, with nearly 1.35 crore non-resident Indians spread across the globe. Many of them leave the country for short-term work and could miss out on exercising some of their rights such as registering their vote in India's Assembly or parliamentary elections. Currently, the Election Commission of India (ECI) allows enrolled overseas citizens to vote in person at the polling station in the constituency where the person is registered as an overseas elector. The necessity to vote in person and the costs have, for overseas citizens, acted as a disincentive for their wanting to exercise their mandate. This was evident in the numbers of such voters in the 2019 Lok Sabha election — 25,606 among the minuscule 99,844 registered electors who voted. In 2014, a committee constituted by the ECI to probe methods to enable overseas voters' mandates concluded that proxy voting was the most viable, though some political parties objected to the idea. A Bill was passed in the 16th Lok Sabha (2014-19) to enable this but lapsed. In 2020, the ECI approached the Government to permit NRIs to vote via postal ballots, similar to the system already used by service voters, i.e., the Electronically Transmitted Postal Ballot System (ETPBS), which allows registering their mandate on a downloaded ETPB and sending it to the returning officer of the constituency.

On the face of it, allowing postal ballot use should be a good move for NRIs, even if this does increase the burden on embassy or consular officials. This is also a more trustworthy way of registering mandates rather than appointing proxies — which is currently allowed for service personnel who are a limited number in each constituency unlike NRIs who could constitute a more substantial chunk among the electorate in some States. In the 2014 discussion organised by the ECI, some parties raised the question whether NRIs will get a benefit denied to internal migrant workers, but the higher costs of travel back to India, as opposed to travelling within, is a valid reason for allowing NRIs the partially electronic postal balloting facility. Several democratic countries allow for this option to their overseas citizens, but again, none has to deal with anything near the scale India has. The more important question to be tackled while extending the facility of voting to overseas Indians is whether longer term migrants should also be allowed to register their mandate as the idea behind limiting voters to specific constituencies on account of their residency will become infructuous. Therefore, if the postal ballot system is indeed instituted, rules must be clearly framed for voters' eligibility on the basis of their time spent away from the country.

James Webb Space Telescope's First Images **Show Stunning Range**

November 7: "Somewhere something incredible is waitingto beknown!" NASA administrator Bill Nelson aptly quoted these words of Carl Sagan at a worldwide online eventorganised to release the first science images sent home by the James Webb Space Telescope (JWST). Whether this incredible revelation will have to do with the birth of stars; the most distant galaxies that formed within less than a billion years of the Big Bang; or the presence of biomarkers in the atmosphere of exoplanets (planets outside our solar system), only time can tell. The five images that were released were carefully selected, to align with the scientific goals of the mission, from about 700 pictures of the cosmos that JWST had collected soon after its launch on December 25, 2021.

In the order in which they were released, the five images were the following: a deep field picture in which the telescope gazed into a galaxy cluster that is about 13.1 billion light years away; a hot gaseous exoplanet that is about 1,000 light years away — a spectrum of its atmosphere which carried the chemical fingerprint of water vapour; a violent explosion that marked the death of a massive star, known as the Southern Ring; a group picture of five galaxies — Stephan's Quintet, about 300 million light years away and a picture of Carina nebula, which is 7,600 light years away, showing crops of new stars being born.

The extent of clarity in these images could be felt as zooming into the images revealed more and more detail of the stars, galaxies and gaseous dust.

Visual information

"It's a set of amazing images. Every image looks so beautiful but it is also full of information," says Jessie Jose from the physics department of the Indian Institute of Science Education and Research (IISER), Tirupati.

She is a member of a large collaboration whose proposal has been accepted for observations using JWST. "Among these pictures released by NASA, the one of Carina nebula is the one I was most moved by," she says. "If you zoom into it you will see lots of features such as nebulae, lots of newborn stars, jets and outflows from these young stars. it's a star-formation nursery."

The electromagnetic spectrum is made up of light of many wavelengths ranging from x-ray, ultraviolet and visible to infrared and mid-infrared wavelengths, to name a few. On Earth, we mostly get only the visible light of the sun, as our atmosphere filters out the others. Similarly, every celestial body emits light in all wavelengths. JWST has onboard instruments that sense light in the infrared mainly 0.6 micron to 28 microns. It has multiple cameras in this regime. Some of these cameras capture images while others capture the spectral details. Since infrared light can penetrate the clouds of dust that surround celestial objects, many features that cannot be imaged with visible light cameras would show themselves to the JWST.

CBI Registers Case Again to Probe Theft of 13 Idols from Palavoor Temple in Tamil Nadu

November 7: The Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) has registered a case to again probe the theft of 13 idols from a Palavoor temple in Tamil Nadu in June 2005, in view of the allegations made by two police officers against each other about several irregularities.

The CBI has initiated investigation following a directive of the Madras High Court. It has also been directed to nab the culprits and recover the other antique idols that are still in the alleged possession or control of prime accused Subash Chandra Kapoor, who was detained by the German police on an October 2011 and extradited to India in July 2012 with regard to another case.

The High Court, in its order, said the probe against Mr. Kapoor had come to a "stand still in view of the opinion dated June 29, 2019, alleged to have been given by A.G. Ponn Manickavel", the Inspector-General of Police who earlier in the State police. The order came on a petition moved by the then Inspector Kader Batcha, previously posted with the Idol Wing of the Crime Investigation Department (CID)-Chennai.

In his petition, Mr. Batcha had alleged that he was made an accused and a fresh case was later registered against him by the special team under Mr. Manickavel. The



Palavoor case registered in June 2005. The Inspector joined in 2006, continued the probe and filed a charge sheet against eight accused in 2008. Of the 13 idols, four were Interpol Red Notice in recovered from accused Deenadayalan.

> Mr. Batcha also alleged that the Inspector-General of Police colluded with the Deenadayalan to get the latter's statement recorded before a magistrate, based on which the Inspector was made an accused. Mr. Deenadayalan became an approver and pardoned.

In the additional charge sheet in the Palavoor case, supervised the Idol Wing Mr. Kapoor was described as the prime accused. However, as alleged, Mr. Manikavel later advised the government against pursuing with the Germany government the issue of sanction/permission to prosecute Mr. Kapoor in the pending cases.

The court observed that Mr. Kapoor was formally arrested in the 2005 case on December 26, 2016, just two days before Mr. Deen adayalan recorded his

"confession" statement, 12 years after the theft and nine years after four idols were recovered from him by a police team comprising the accused Inspector. The court found in consistencies in the statement.

In his counter affidavit, Mr. Manickavel said he had filed a contempt petition in 2019 alleging that the then government, the former Director-General of Police (DGP) and then Additional DGP in the Idol Wing of CID-Chennai had been interfering with investigation prosecution of cases. He alleged that the then Additional DGP of the Idol prevented subordinate officers from registering First Information promptly Reports, investigating the cases and prosecuting the accused.

"I submit that the allegations made against me are per se defamatory. I have done my job as an officer appointed by this Hon'ble Court strictly in accordance with law and procedure. The allegations are totally false and mischievous," his affidavit said.

November 7: Former Pakistan swashbuckling batter Shahid Afridi has said that Suryakumar Yadav has a unique skill set for hitting sixes. Afridi's comments came after Suryakumar blasted an unbeaten 61 off 25 balls in the 71-run trouncing on Sunday.

Speaking on Samaa TV, Afridi said," He (Suryakumar) has come to the Indian team after playing over 250 (domestic) matches. He knows his game. He hits sixes even off good deliveries. Because he has put a lot of practice behind his game." When the anchor of the show brought

out a comparison between Pakistan's Mohd Rizwan and India's Suryakumar Yadav over their flexibility and variety of shots, Afridi responded, "As a batsman, you will have to develop good shots to become an impactful player. T20 is such a format where you will have to hit sixes all across the ground. More variety of shots you have runs will easily come to your kitty."

Meanwhile, Pakistan have joined India in the Twenty20 World Cup semi-finals on Sunday after South Africa crashed out of the tournament



after a stunning defeat by the Netherlands. Pakistan, who beat Bangladesh by five wickets at Adelaide Oval to advance, will meet New Zealand in the first semi-final in Sydney on Wednesday and India take on England a day later in Adelaide.

'Babar Should bat at No.3, Mohammad Haris to Open, and Shaheen is Back to His Best': Shahid Afridi, Waqar, Younis Khan, Aquib Javed Gung-ho About Pak's Chances

November 7: For two months now, former Pakistani cricketers have been raging at the different tv studios. Three issues particularly pricked them: Babar Azam's spot in the batting line-up, the brittleness of the middle order, and rushing Shaheen Afridi in without game time. As Pakistan pulled off another Houdini act to reach the semi-final, the mood was best captured by the former Pakistani wicketkeeper Kamran Akmal. "This can only happen to Pakistan, no other team," Akmal would say on Ary News. Sitting next to him was Younis Khan who would laugh. Ten days back, both had wanted Babar Azam to step down from captaincy after the world cup. "You have to be a leader. Babar doesn't have the spark to be a leader. He should quit captaincy so that he can focus on his batting. I have quit captaincy four times; so I know the pressures involved." Akmal would say, "he should step down from captaincy after this world cup."

In the here and now, though, the focus is on the semi-final against New Zealand. Shahid Afridi was gung-ho about the prospects as "Sydney conditions would suit Pakistan more". But Afridi does want one important change to be made at the top of the order.

"Babar Azam should drop to No.3. Let Mohammad Haris open. Babar Azam needs to listen to suggestions and he should drop down. We need to use Mohammad Haris with fielding restrictions. Babar can bat at no. 3. It's not as if he has come down to earth with a note from above that he has to

open only. He has to change. Bat at

In the middle order, now, whenever Iftikhar Ahmed and Shan Masood come to bat, we see that intent, they are looking for runs. But at top that's missing. But if you are just looking to play 30-35 balls, and I can understand that if you get 50 or so.

"You have to be positive, play your shots. Intent should be positive." The other problematic position, in the eyes of the former players, is Mohammad Rizwan. Afridi reckons he has been sussed out by other teams." All teams have a plan against Rizwan. He is good in the leg side, dragging the balls from middle stumps. He struggles a bit on the off side, so they are bowling there.

He has to take chances coming down the track and such. For that you have to practice and train those shots. New Zealand bowlers aren't going to change lines and lengths until challenge. Haris is a player who can disrupt their lines and length with hits over point and cover. He is the man who can do the job as opener. We have to take risks. Even if he gets out, it's fine. But he gives us the best chances. Rizwan has to take a few risks."

It's a point of view shared by Aquib Javed and Moin Khan as well." I agree with Aquib that Babar Azam should drop himself down the order for the next two games. He can open if he wishes in the subcontinent. Open with Mohammad Haris if he wants to use the fielding restrictions but Babar should not open," Moin Khan would tell Geo Super.

Haris has played his shots without fear and Waqar reckons "he understands T20 cricket far better than some of the other top order batsmen. He might fail a few times but that's T20. He understands it. You have to take risks. You need players like Haris to make use of fielding restrictions," Waqar told A Sports.

Shoaib Malik also agreed with Waqar. "He can open it and he will have the license to go for it. In the middle order, after the top order has already fallen, he will be under pressure of 'what would happen if I fall now'. He can bat more freely as an opener," Malik said to A Sports.

In the eyes of Aquib Javed, the moment that marked the return of Shaheen Afridi was in the 17th over when he knocked down the stumps of Mosaddek Hossain. Shaheen went round the stumps and got the full ball to shape away late to beat the defensive prod. "He moved the new ball and the toughest challenge for a fast bowler is to get the ball to shape away from round the stumps with the old ball. That's a sign that he is back.

I don't remember what I was thinking at night but when I woke up the world had changed," Aquib said on Geo Super. "When he was selected, we were all troubled. Playing him directly with just one warm-up game. So much pressure. It's not easy for a fast bowler to come back like this. He is a tough kid, his toe was fractured too in the past but he kept on playing, we have to praise his courage. He has gradually picked up his rhythm during this tournament. South Africa once learnt it was a decider choked," Aquib said.


