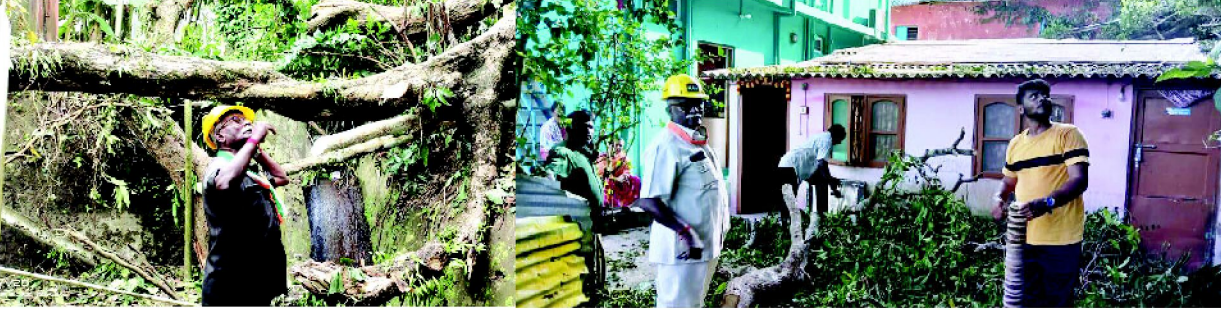

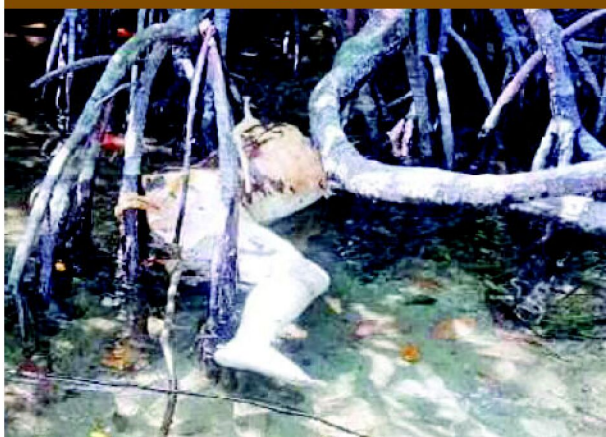

Talk, Kyiv & Moscow

Volodymyr Zelensky asked for continued American support during his in-person speech to the US Congress. On his first known trip abroad since the start of the Russian invasion of Ukraine, Zelensky pitched American aid as an investment in international security and democracy. Clearly, his message was directed at the incoming Republican majority in the US House of Representatives, many of whom have become sceptical about unfettered aid to Kyiv that comes out of American taxpayers' pocket. In fact, the Biden administration has just announced another \$1.85 billion in military aid to Ukraine that will include for the first time the Patriot air defence system.

However, Russia has warned that increasing the supply of American arms to Ukraine will only aggravate the conflict. But while Moscow plans to boost the size of its armed forces by 30%, even Vladimir Putin recently admitted that the situation in the four Russian-occupied Ukrainian regions was complicated. And getting trapped in a long drawn-out conflict will further strain the Russian economy and create conditions for discontent and turmoil within Russian society.

Meanwhile, the continued Russian bombardment of Ukrainian cities and energy infrastructure means that millions of Ukrainian citizens are facing a catastrophic winter with no electricity or running water even as temperatures plummet. Given the huge humanitarian crisis unfolding, the Ukrainian leadership needs to be practical here. True, grave injustice has been wrought on Ukraine. But in order to end the suffering of the Ukrainian people, a negotiated end to the conflict is worth considering. With the Russian military also finding the going tough as winter sets in, perhaps this is the moment to reopen channels of communication and go back to the dialogue table.

Of course, this won't be easy for Zelensky given that his country continues to be under attack. But pushing Putin into a corner and prolonging the conflict indefinitely will harm Ukrainians themselves. Thus, both sides need to work out an acceptable exit strategy to end the war, which globally has pushed inflation up and energy costs higher.

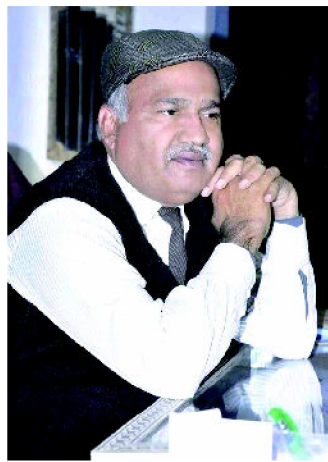

HOW TO AVOID SLEEP WHILE STUDYING DURING BOARD EXAM?

Board exams are approaching fast and students are totally packed with their exam preparations and revision work. Sometimes, when you have to study for long hours at night to prepare for a test or exam, sleep comes as the biggest hurdle in your way. It seems like pulling you back from reaching your goal. When you study with a fresh mind in the morning, it becomes quite easy to grab things, but at certain periods like in the afternoon and at late night, sleep becomes inevitable as you try to stretch your study hours. Actually, it happens when you are restless. At such times, you are left with two

options; the first is keeping the books aside and lying down to take rest and the second is fighting against the drowsiness to keep yourself awake. But sleeping while studying is too easy, the real deal is to ditch sleep and stay awake.

Here some useful tips that you can follow to avoid sleep while studying for long hours.

1. Keep your study room well lighted: The biggest mistake most of the students make is studying with just a table lamp in the whole room due to which a significant portion of the room remains dark, promoting a cosy environment which would eventually make you more tempted to go to that charming bed with dim surroundings. So, to avoid such a comfy situation, keep your room bright and well lighted.

2. Sit in a chair, not on the bed: Your sitting position also matters a lot while studying for long hours. Try to seat yourself in a chair with back support and a table in front. It will help you stay active and alert while studying. On the other hand, if you lie on your bed while studying you may get into lazy mode, eventually making you feel sleepy. While sitting on the chair, keep moving your body parts at regular intervals so that you don't go into dormancy.

3. Avoid heavy meals: We've all

felt that drowsy feeling that sneaks in after a meal and if you have to study with such a snoozing mood then no one can help it. Actually, after having a heavy meal, you are full and relaxed and you are struggling to keep your eyes open. The lethargy that comes after consuming a heavy diet diminishes the retention power. Also, when you feel lazy, you are more likely to hit the bed. But don't think that you will have to go on starvation to avoid this sluggishness. Instead, you should take your meals early and opt for small meals.

4. Drink lots of water: Here, water is being recommended not only to keep you hydrated but also to keep you alert. Actually, it's the best trick that most of the students apply while studying. When you drink a considerable quantity of water, you will have to make frequent trips to bathroom for a pee, keeping you moving and alert. Moreover, drinking an adequate quantity of water helps to keep the brain well hydrated, increasing its memory and retention power.

5. Follow 'Early to bed, early to rise' funda: This comes from a famous saying, 'Early to bed, early to rise makes a man healthy, wealthy and wise'. This is absolutely true because if you manage to go to sleep early at night then you will get

adequate sleep, waking up to a fresh and energetic day. With a fresh mind, you can concentrate on your studies quite well. A fresh mind has a better concentration power to retain information.

6. Take a nap in the afternoon: If you have been continuously studying since morning, then an afternoon nap is a must to save your brain from getting exhausted. It would also help you avoid sleep during studying late at night. A short nap is enough to keep you alert keeping the drowsiness away.

7. Keep your body parts alert and awake: If you keep on studying with the same stagnant position for long hours, then you are more likely to get surrounded by laziness and drowsiness. So, the moment you start feeling sleepy, get up from your chair and move around in your room and stretch your legs and arms. You may study while walking around your room. It has been observed that study while walking, not only helps in avoiding sleep but also enhances concentration.

8. Read out aloud while studying: This trick works really well to keep away the lethargy. It minimizes the chances of falling asleep while studying. It has something to do with listening to your own voice. Try to teach yourself like

the teacher explains a topic in the classroom. This will not only help to throw away the drowsiness but also to improve your learning power.

9. Learn by writing: If you keep on reading the text to be learned then it will create a monotonous situation due to which you are more likely to start feeling bored which will ultimately give an invitation to sleepiness. To keep the lethargy away, you are advised not to merely be a spectator, but learn by writing so that your brain remains active doing the pen and paper work and recalling the things you have learned.

10. Avoid studying difficult topics at night: During the night you feel more sluggish if you are solving complex problems or trying to learn difficult topics. Try to tackle only the light and easy portions of the syllabus at night. Leave the tough portions for daytime when your body and brain are fresh and active. For the late night study, pick only those topics which are easy, interesting and are your favourite ones.

So, to earn those extra grades by sacrificing sleep, above stated tricks will surely help you to meet your desired academic goals.

CITU Union Wins 1/30th Pay Plus DA Case – Thousands of Workers to get Benefits

Port Blair Dec 26 : In a great relief to thousands of daily rated mazdoors working in various departments under the Andaman & Nicobar Administration, the Division Bench of the Hon'ble Calcutta High Court sitting Circuit at Port Blair while disposing of the Appeal filed by the Govt. of India & A & N Administration has directed the Administration on 19th December, 2022 that all DRMs under the Administration shall be granted the benefit of the 1/30th of pay plus DA irrespective of the sanctioned posts/vacant posts. The Government of India, Ministry of Personnel, Public Grievances & Pensions (Department of Personnel & Training) vide their OM No. 49014/2/86-Estt dated 7th June, 1988, among other things, had directed all the Ministries and departments under it that the casual workers be paid 1/30th of the pay at the minimum of the relevant pay scale plus DA. The Andaman & Nicobar Administration on receipt of the said OM from Govt of India had forwarded the same to all the departments under it with the directions to implement it immediately. However, when the workers claimed this benefit in individual cases, the Administration opposed to grant the benefit and the litigation went up to Hon'ble Supreme Court which rejected the contention of the Administration/Govt of India. The matter was taken up with the A & N Administration and Govt of India several times by the CITU A & N

State Committee and Andaman Sarvajani Nirman Vibhag Mazdoor Sangh (ASNVMs), affiliated to CITU urging them to implement the 1988 OM of the Govt of India but no favourable decision was taken on the issue. The ASNVMs had conducted a series of agitation including strike throughout the islands from 2014 onwards with the demand for grant of 1/30th of pay plus DA to all the DRMs working in APWD. But the BJP government at the centre and A & N Administration did not consider the demand of the workers to implement the Govt of India's order of 1988. However, in 2017, the A & N Administration came with a scheme for grant of 1/30th of pay plus DA to the DRMs and accordingly an Office Memorandum bearing No. 289 dated 22nd September, 2017 was issued by the Additional Secretary (Labour) - cum - Labour Commissioner. In this OM, the benefit was sought to be granted only from the date of issue of the OM i.e. from 22nd September, 2017. It was also laid down in the said OM of 22nd September, 2017 that the benefit of 1/30th of pay plus DA will be granted to DRMs against the vacant sanctioned posts. Accordingly, a large number of DRMs of APWD were extended with the benefit of 1/30th of pay plus DA while more than half of the workers were denied of the benefit. In 2018, the Andaman Sarvajani Nirman Vibhag Mazdoor Sangh (ASNVMs), affiliated to CITU, had filed a Writ

Petition before the Hon'ble Calcutta High Court, Circuit Bench at Port Blair, praying for direction to the Govt. of India/A & N Administration to extend 1/30th of pay plus DA benefit to all the daily rated mazdoors working under the APWD. The Govt of India/A & N Administration vehemently opposed the prayer of the Union. However, on 13th December, 2019, the Circuit Bench of the Hon'ble High Court had directed the Administration and Govt. of India to extend the financial benefit of 1/30th of pay plus DA Scheme to all the DRM workers from the date of their initial appointment as per the Govt. of India's order of 1988 irrespective of the stipulation of sanctioned/vacant posts, etc. Challenging the High Court judgement of 13th December, 2019, the Govt of India & A & N Administration filed an Appeal before the Division Bench of the Calcutta High Court in February, 2020. The Division Bench of the Hon'ble High Court on 18th November, 2021 had imposed a cost of Rs. 51,000/- on the A & N Administration for dilatory tactics adopted by the Administration promptly. Again, the Hon'ble High Court at Calcutta on 2nd December, 2022 has imposed a cost of Rs. 1.25 lakh on the A & N Administration to be paid to the CITU-affiliated Andaman Sarvajani Nirman Vibhag Mazdoor Sangh (ASNVMs) within one week for the dilatory tactics adopted by the

Govt of India and A & N Administration in pursuing the Appeal filed by them. The cost of Rs. 1.25 lakh was paid to the Union within the period as directed by the Hon'ble High Court. While modifying the order of the single Judge of the Hon'ble High Court dated 13th December, 2019, the Division Bench said that the benefits to the DRMs under the circular dated 22nd September, 2017 will accrue only with effect from the date of circular (OM) and not before that. The Division Bench has also upheld the order of the Single Judge that no distinction should be made between the DRMs working against the sanctioned posts and DRMs casually engaged by the State. The Hon'ble High Court has directed that the benefits be paid to all the DRMs under the Administration within a period of two months from date. The Hon'ble High Court has also ordered that the Circular and process of framing of Scheme for regularization and every other benefit under the 1988 OM of Govt of India would mandatorily and positively be brought into force within the next three months. The BJP-led central government with a view to deny the benefit of 1/30th of pay plus DA to the poor workers has been engaging the Additional Solicitor General of India to defend this case. However, the Union was represented by Ld. Advocate Shri Gopala Binu Kumar of Port Blair. (Source: CITU)

IN FIFTH ROUND OF HIKE IN MILK PRICES THIS YEAR, MOTHER DAIRY INCREASES PRICE BY RS 2/LITRE IN NCR

Mother Dairy has decided to hike milk prices by Rs 2 per litre in Delhi-NCR market with effect from Tuesday, citing rise in input costs.

This is the fifth round of hike in milk prices this year by Mother Dairy, one of the leading milk suppliers in Delhi-NCR with volumes of more than 30 lakh litres per day. Mother Dairy has increased the prices of full-cream milk by Rs 2 to Rs 66 per litre, while toned milk rate has been revised to Rs 53 per litre from Rs 51 per litre.

Double-toned milk rate has been increased to Rs 47 per litre from Rs 45 per litre.

Mother Dairy has decided not to raise prices of cow milk and token (bulk vendored) milk variants.

The hike in milk prices will hit household budgets.

Mother Dairy attributed the hike in prices to increase in the company's procurement cost of raw milk from dairy farmers.

"It is an unprecedented year for the dairy industry. We have been witnessing a significant increase in demand of milk and milk products from both consumers and institutions, even after festivals. On the other hand, procurement of raw milk has also not picked up after Diwali as was

anticipated," the company said.

The procurement prices of raw milk have gone up by about 24 per cent over the last year due to higher input costs and heatwave conditions, it pointed out.

"This stress on the raw milk prices is being felt across the industry, putting pressure on the consumer prices. In our commitment to continue paying remunerative prices to farmers to ease the impact, we are severely constrained to revise consumer prices of select variants of milk in Delhi NCR effective from December 27, 2022," Mother Dairy said.

As a responsible organisation, the

company said it has always endeavoured to strike a right balance between farmers and consumers. "...therefore, we have been passing the increased input cost to our consumers partially on select variants and in a phased manner.

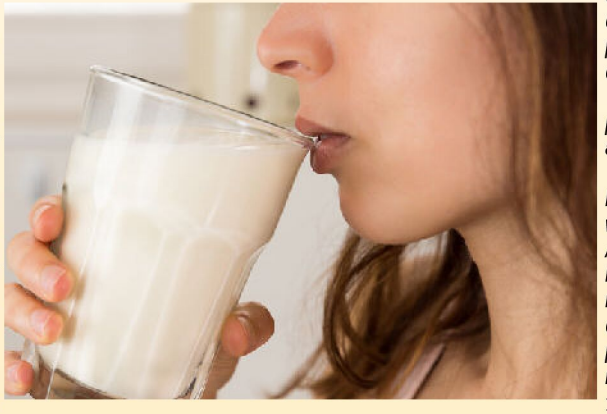
Mother Dairy passes on about 75-80 per cent of prices paid by consumers to the milk producers.

The company has taken several round of price increase in the current calendar year. The last hike was on November 21, when it increased prices of full-cream milk by Re 1 per litre and token milk by Rs 2 per litre in Delhi-NCR market.

Before that, Mother Dairy had in October increased prices of full-cream milk and cow milk by Rs 2 per litre in Delhi-NCR and some other markets in North India.

Rates were raised by Rs 2 per litre for all variants in March and August as well.

Gujarat Cooperative Milk Marketing Federation (GCMMF), which markets milk under the Amul brand, is also a major player in the Delhi-NCR market. It sells nearly 40 lakh litres per day. Milk output in India, the world's largest producer, is around 210-220 million tonnes annually. - Source : Theweek



US winter storm: Death toll rises to 34 as deep freeze paralyses Buffalo area in New York

The Arctic blast winter storm that lashed across the US over the last two days has so far claimed 34 lives, with the city of Buffalo, in New York state, being the worst hit.

The deep freeze that gripped most of the nation, along with snow, ice and howling winds, caused power outages and trapped people inside their cars. In Buffalo, the blizzard left the city marooned as emergency services struggled to reach high-impact areas.

"It is (like) going to a war zone, and the vehicles along the sides of the roads are shocking," New York Governor Kathy Hochul, a

native of Buffalo, was quoted by AFP. Hochul called it the "most devastating storm in Buffalo's long storied history" due to its power and its extended length.

The National Weather Service said 43 inches of snow fell on Buffalo on Sunday morning. The snowfall and blizzard conditions halted traffic, froze power substations and left at least 12 people dead, according to Erie County officials.

While three deaths were reported overnight in the Buffalo region, some victims were found in cars and some in snow banks. There are fears that the death tally

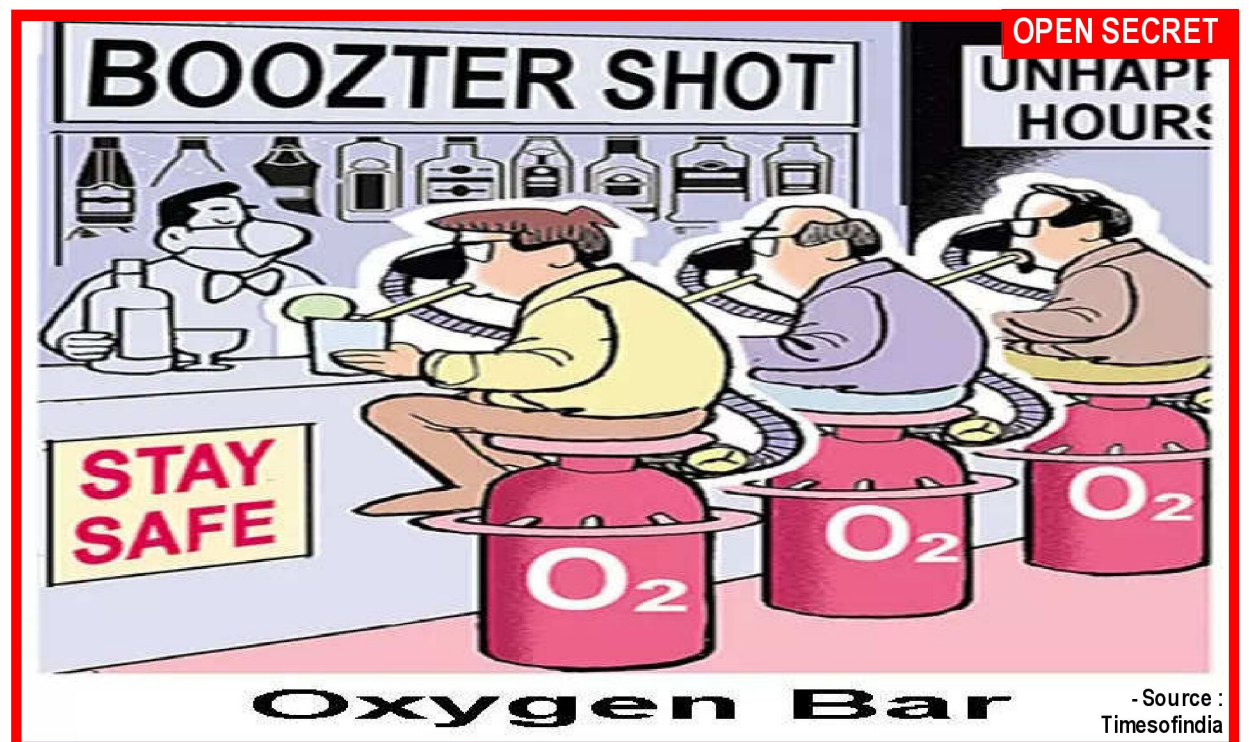
might rise further.

Over 55 million people continue to remain under wind chill alerts and freeze warnings are in effect across the South.

Besides, the cities in the Southeast, Midwest and East Coast also experienced the aftermath of the winter storm as they recorded their coldest Christmas in decades. Florida had the coldest December 25 since 1983 for Miami, Tampa, Orlando and West Palm Beach. New York City also saw record-cold temperatures on Christmas Eve at several locations, including its JFK and LaGuardia airports.

Over 150,000 U.S. homes and businesses were without power on Sunday, according to PowerOutage.us. In Buffalo, 16% of residents had no electricity on Sunday. A power grid operator supplying electricity for at least 13 states in the east has asked the customers to conserve power and set thermostats lower than usual on Christmas day too because usage was straining capacity.

The situation prompted the US Department of Energy to declare an emergency Friday in Texas. Due to the harsh weather conditions, flights continued to be cancelled on Sunday. On Christmas Day, 1,350 were cancelled while over 3,400 flights were cancelled Saturday. The effects of the blizzard extended to Canada too as the provinces of Ontario and Quebec bore the brunt of the storm. In Quebec, almost 120,000 customers were without electricity on Sunday. Officials say it could take days for some households to be reconnected, reported BBC News. - Source : Theweek
