99.87% of the target beneficiaries administered 1st dose of COVID vaccine

529828 samples tested so far; Rate of Test Per Million stands at 1324570

Port Blair, Sept. 19

The A&N Administration is strictly implementing the five-fold strategy of Testing, Tracing, Treatment, COVID-Appropriate Behaviour and Vaccination for effective COVID-19 management in Isles. In order to curb the chain of transmission of the virus and to reduce the number of positive cases, various steps have been initiated. Ever since the outbreak of COVID-19, A&N Islands has augmented its testing manifold. As on date, 529828 samples have been tested in A&N Islands and the Islands' Test Per Million (TPM) presently stands at 1324570.



measures thereby benefiting the citizens at large.

As per health data of Sept. 19, the new active case in the last 24 hours is 2 while the total number of active cases during the 2nd wave (since 01.03.2021) is 13 in the entire Islands. Out of the total, 7600 confirmed cases of COVID since March 2020, 7458 patients have been cured / discharged so far.

So far, 4,11,782 doses of vaccines have been administered to beneficiaries in A&N Islands. The cumulative beneficiaries vaccinated with first dose so far is 281240 (99.87%) while cumulative beneficiaries

Apart from this, the incoming flight passengers are also being retested with RT-PCR upon arrival at Port Blair, as double checking in measure. Similarly, RAT is also being conducted on Inter-Island bound passengers travelling by ship, roadways as well as by Heli. This way, the Administration has been able to curb the transmission of the virus and that has contributed to bringing down the number of active cases in the Islands, thus enabling relaxations in lockdown

Farmers' Corner- A Knowledge Hub

Nature's own vitamin C factory: the West Indian Cherry

Post COVID-19 pandemic, there has been increased awareness about the nutritional aspects of our food, particularly vitamin C. West Indian Cherry or Barbados Cherry is one of the richest sources of vitamin C in the plant kingdom. The plant grows as a shrub; however, it could be trained and pruned to the desired shape. Studies at ICAR-CIARI have successfully demonstrated its suitability for potted cultivation. It could also be grown as a hedge in gardens, parks, schools and colleges. Rooted cuttings start fruiting after 12-15 months of planting and the plant flowers and fruits minimum three times in a year. It is a sun loving plant and could be easily planted in terraces and balconies with ample sunlight. Fruits could be eaten fresh or processed into juices, jelly and as frozen fruits. Its juice could be used to enhance the flavor and vitamin C content of other fruit juices. ICAR-CIARI has been involved in multiplication and popularization of the species among various stakeholders.

Benefit: Consumption of a few fruits could fulfill our recommended daily intake of vitamin C. Further, the plant has high aesthetic appeal and could be used to beautify the surrounding of residential as well as commercial spaces.

Over 80 crore 43 lakh doses of COVID vaccine doses administered in country; National recovery rate reaches 97.68 percent

New Delhi, Sept. 19 India has administered over 80 crore 43 lakh doses of COVID vaccine so far under the Nationwide Vaccination Drive. Union Health Ministry said, more than 85 lakh 42 thousand vaccine doses were administered in the last 24 hours. The Ministry said, 38 thousand 945 COVID

patients recovered during the last 24 hours and the national recovery rate has reached 97.68 per cent. Till now, more than three crore 26 lakh people have recovered from COVID-19.

The country reported 30 thousand 773 new cases in last 24 hours. Currently, India's active caseload is at around three lakh 32 thousand.

The active cases constitute less than one per cent of the total reported cases. However, the daily positivity rate stands at 1.97 per cent.

The Ministry said, the testing capacity across the country continues to be expanded and more than 55 crore 23 lakh COVID-19 tests have been conducted so far. (Source: india.gov.in)

9. **Testing Procedure.** The procedure for recruitment of Enrolled Followers is as follows:-
(a) Written test. The written test shall be of one hour duration having General Knowledge and General English (10th standard) related questions for 50 marks. Candidates must obtain 50% marks (for General & OBC) and 45% (for SC/ST) in written test as pass marks.
(b) Professional Skill Test. The candidates who pass the written test will undergo PST for sweeping, mopping, cleaning of toilet, drains and maintenance of septic tank/sewer lines onboard Ship/Shore. Skill test shall carry no marks and will be conducted as a qualifying test.
(c) Physical Fitness Test. Candidates who pass the written test and qualify the skill test will be called for Physical Fitness Test. PFT shall carry no marks and will be conducted as a qualifying test. Candidates will have to qualify the PFT. The standards for PFT are laid down below:-
 (i) One mile/1.6 Km run – Within 07 minutes
 (ii) 20 Squat ups (Uthak Bathak)
 (iii) 10 Push ups
(d) Medical Standards. Candidates who qualify in written test, PST and PFT will be subjected to a medical examination as per medical standards for Indian Coast Guard as laid down in CGO 26/2002 and as amended from time to time.
 10. Candidates will be selected based on merit in written test only out of 50 marks. In case of a tie between two or more candidates, person elder in age shall be ranked higher.
 11. The post is transferable anywhere in India (Mainland/Island) subject to the exigencies of the service.
