Plankton: this is a term used to describe the smellers, free floating plants and animals, which just drift along with the winds and currents. Some plankton have a limited swimming ability and can migrate daily in a vertical direction. Plankton are an important source of food for many sea animals.

There are two types of plankton Phytoplankton, which are microscopic plant plankton, and Zooplankton, which are larger animals plankton. Phytoplankton are amongst the most productive food manufactures of the seas.

Heavy Rains Predicted Over Andaman Island

Port Blair, Nov. 20: As per Indian Meteorological Department's weather forecast, heavy rain (7-11cm) is likely to occur at one or two places over Andaman Island on Nov. 24. Distant Cautionary Signal No. 1 hoisted at Port Blair Port.

High waves in the range of 2.5 - 3.4 meters are forecasted during 12:30 hours on 20-11-2022 to 23:30 hours of 21-11-2022 along the west coast of Andaman Islands between Ten Degree Channel to Coco Channel. Current speeds vary between 50- 75 cm/sec.

Similarly, high waves in the range of 2.4 - 3.3 meters are forecasted during 12:30 hours on 20-11-2022 to 23:30 hours of 21-11-2022

Malady and Remedy

The collegium system of making appointments to the higher judiciary has come under focus, largely due to critical remarks made by Union Law Minister Kiren Rijiju. A lawyer has now formally approached the Supreme Court for reconsideration of its 2015 judgment striking down the Constitution amendment and the law creating a National Judicial Appointments Commission (NJAC). While the petition will be "listed in due course", there is another aspect that flags the tension between the Government and the judiciary over judicial appointments. A Bench of the Court voiced its displeasure over the Government delaying its recommendations for appointment, as well as ignoring names that had been reiterated twice or even thrice. The result was that lawyers whose names had been recommended for appointment had withdrawn their consent to be judges. The Bench was forced to observe that keeping the recommendations on hold was "some sort of a device to compel these persons to withdraw their names". The Government's keenness to wrest back the power to make judicial appointments from the judiciary is clear. However, it is doubtful whether this can be achieved by a review petition. The 4:1 verdict can only be reviewed by a Bench of equal strength, and the Government has not sought a review all these years. Mr. Rijiju did say, as part of his series of comments critical of the collegium system, that the Government had accepted the decision, but added that it could not be silent forever over the opaqueness and lack of accountability in the system.

Much of the criticism heaped upon the collegium system is not unfounded. It is opaque, it does limit the zone of consideration to those known to its members and judges who are consulted on appointments, and there is no indication that it is conducive to attracting the best legal talent. Some maladies it was supposed to remedy — mainly, the perception about the executive's influence over the judiciary — persist. Even the judgment that struck down the 99th Constitution Amendment and the NJAC Act accepted that there were flaws, but the majority chose to retain the collegium system until it was improved. The exercise to improve it was also abandoned soon. However, if the Government is really keen to bring about a change, the petulant response of stalling appointments is not the way. It has to work towards an alternative mechanism, one that does not have the perceived infirmities that led to the invalidation of the earlier law. The NJAC mechanism enabled the outnumbering of judicial members by executive nominees. A better system than the present one should avoid such pitfalls in the name of executive primacy in judicial appointments.

Movie Review | Drishyam 2, an Interesting Carry Forward from the Original

November 21: Thrillers as a genre have had a weak and suspect repute in mainstream Bollywood. The transformation is perhaps restricted to the remakes of cinema from Kerala. The Drishyam franchisee in the first spell was indeed with good reason well received and appreciated both by the audience for which it was originally meant and then the larger audience that was fortunate to view it in their own familiar terrain. While the original is based on a Japanese novel: The Devotion of Suspect X full marks to Jeethu Joseph who played imaginatively with the inherited characters and their earlier trauma by weaving a tale ahead. Taut and straight with no familiar potholes. The film in its present avatar pays due respects to Nishikant Kamat the award-winning film maker who unfortunately died young. This time in-charge of the delivery is Abhishek Pathak who stays true to the script and has the vision to do away with the needless frills of songs and needless drama. In a timespan of about 140 minutes, give or take a couple, he revisits the Salgaonkar family even as the police haunt and taunt them again. In a quick recall for those who have lost touch with the 2014 outing he recalls how the son of a high-ranking police officer Meera Deshmukh (Tabu) is killed by members of the Salgaonkar family largely in self-defense. Hunted by the police, the family head Vijay (Ajay Devgn) hides the body and walks out to freedom in

the absence of substantial proof of the murder. The sight of hiding the corpse, at the site of a police station under construction was the interesting twist in the tale.

The film takes off from just there with a chance eye witness in David (Sidharth Bodke). A new IG of Police Tarun Ahlawat (Akshay Khanna - a faded version of the talented actor) returns to the scene of crime with a resolve to expose the criminal. Stern and precise he recruits members of the old team including erring Inspector Lakshmikanth Gaitonde (Kamlesh Sawant) and Vinayak Sawant (Yogesh Soman). Also returning into the lives of the victims(?) are Meera Deshmukh (Tabu) and her spouse (Rajat Kapoor) who surely are waiting from different perspectives who find the truth. While the former seeks to avenge the death of her son, the latter just wants the ashes to give the tragedy a quietus.

The entire thriller is kick started when the couple walk in as informers in Jenny and David (Neha Joshi and Sidharth Bodke). The twist to the tale and the manner of the narrative is largely built around the new unrevealed and unexpected twist that Vijay Salgaonkar (Ajay Devgn) now a theatre owner gives to the buried corpse and whether law catches up with the accused. The interesting part of the entire film is that it deals with a slice



of life scenario without having to take sides. Neither are the police portrayed as villains (an easy temptation given the background) nor are the members of the family conveying a story of its own by Sudhir Chaudary wins by being projected as hard-core killers or hapless victims. The story achieves a fine and proper balance that is crucial to the film. As the rap in the final moments of the film declares: it is about perceptions. Not so much about being judgmental. While a part of the credit for the Drishyam saga could be robbed by the fact that it is inspired from elsewhere, this time round the entire credit of the interesting twist must go to Jeethu Joseph for the imaginative story and to Aamil Keeyan Khan who joins the director in staying true with the screenplay and restricting the running time to just over two hours. Seen from a critical angle the viewer may be a tad disappointed with the length of the role given to seasoned actors like Tabu and Rajat Kapoor, but it is commitment to the script and not to the stars on board that wins the filmmakers favour and exactly why the film ends up being genuine. Worth mentioning cinematography of Goa at its best wins the film a few more credits.

Earth Now Weighs Six Ronnagrams: New Metric Prefixes Voted in

November 20: PARIS: Say hello to ronnagrams and quettametres: International scientists gathered in France voted on Friday for new metric prefixes to express the world’s largest and smallest measurements, prompted by an ever-growing amount of data.

It marks the first time in more than three decades that new prefixes have been added to the International System of Units (SI), the agreed global standard for the metric system. Joining the ranks of well-known prefixes like kilo and milli are ronna and quetta for the largest numbers — and ronto and quecto for the smallest.

The change was voted on by scientists and government representatives from across the world attending the 27th General Conference on Weights and Measures, which governs the SI and meets roughly every four years at Versailles Palace, west of Paris.

The UK’s National Physical Laboratory, which led the push for the new prefixes, confirmed that the resolution had passed in a statement.

The prefixes make it easier to express large amounts — for example, always referring to a kilometre as 1,000 metres or a millimetre as one thousandth of a metre would quickly become cumbersome.

Since the SI was established in 1960, scientific need has led to a growing number of prefixes. The last time was in 1991, when chemists wanting to express vast molecular quantities spurred the addition of zetta and yotta. A yottametre is a one followed by 24 zeroes.

But even the mighty yotta is not enough to handle the world’s voracious appetite for data, according to Richard Brown, the head of metrology at the UK’s National Physical Laboratory.

“In terms of expressing data in yottabytes, which is the highest prefix currently, we’re very close to the limit,” Brown told AFP.

“At the bottom end, it makes sense to have a symmetrical expansion, which is useful for quantum science, particle physics — when you’re measuring really, really small things.”

New weight of the world The new prefixes can simplify how we talk about some pretty big objects.

“If we think about mass, instead of distance, the Earth weighs approximately six ronnagrams,” which is a six followed by 27 zeroes, Brown said.

“Jupiter, that’s about two quettagrams,” he added — a two followed by 30 zeroes. Brown said he had the idea for the update when he saw media reports using unsanctioned prefixes for data storage such as brontobytes and hellabytes. Google in particular has been using hella for bytes since 2010.

“Those were terms that were unofficially in circulation, so it was clear that the SI had to do something,” he said.

However metric prefixes need to be shortened to just their first letter — and B and H were already taken, ruling out bronto and hella. “The only letters that were not used for other units or other symbols were R and Q,” Brown said.

Ben Stokes the Test Skipper can Learn from his Recent T20 Success: Ian Chappell

November 20: Former Australian captain Ian Chappell feels Ben Stokes the Test captain has plenty to learn from his match-winning performances in the T20 World Cup.

Stokes showed his big match prowess once again with a fighting unbeaten half-century in the T20 World Cup final against Pakistan. His innings in the 2019 ODI World Cup final and the Ashes Test in the same year have become part of cricketing folklore.

In his column for ESPNcricinfo, Chappell wrote what Stokes the captain as well as the batter can learn from his recent T20 success. "Stokes has an enviable record of performing at his best when the stakes are highest. He has done it in crucial Tests and one-day matches and now he has achieved that remarkable feat in T20 cricket. It's no wonder England captain Jos Buttler demanded his presence in the World Cup squad.

"Typical Stokes – he was biding his time in the round-robin games until it came to the must-win match against Sri Lanka," Chappell wrote. Stokes was elevated to the Test captain job earlier this year at the expense of Joe Root in the wake of England's prolonged poor run. The southpaw along with coach Brendon McCullum has managed to turn it around for the Test side in quick time.

"Having achieved wonders in his debut season as Test captain despite playing some reckless innings, this knock should

convince Stokes that at times he needs to bat with a little more caution in the longer format. England needs Stokes playing well and contributing his best when it matters most," the Australian stated. "The fact that Buttler pushed for Stokes' presence in the T20 squad despite the allrounder's rare appearances in the format speaks highly of the captain's short-form knowledge.

"Buttler displays much T20 expertise and the one-on-one sessions in which he talked with England players about their role further enhanced those leadership qualities." Stokes has already retired from ODIs. Chappell, however, feels England limited-overs skipper Jos Buttler doesn't deserve a place in the Test team.

Buttler played his last Test during the Ashes earlier this year. "Despite Buttler's T20 success, he is an enigma in Test cricket. He is a valuable T20 keeper in addition to being a match-winning batter, but on recent form, there's no place for him in the Test side. "He's not a Test keeper, and you can't play him as a batter because, in addition to being unsure of himself, he's a dubious proposition when there are slips in place.

"Buttler's batting dilemma gives credence to what former Australian captain Mark Taylor believes – that the short forms of



the game, unlike the Test version, dictate how you play. This is particularly so in T20 cricket, where the game demands a sure-minded batter right from the off, which suits Buttler." Coming back to Stokes, Chappell feels he also needs to review the Test team's policy on spin. Both Moeen Ali and star leg-spinner Adil Rashid don't play Tests. "The other major item on his agenda is spin bowling. England need to rethink their Test policy on spin and search for a bowler who can dismiss batters on good pitches. In short-form games, spin bowlers can lure batters into committing cricketing suicide, which is a valuable skill.

"However, that is rarely viable in Tests and having a spinner play a holding role also has limited value in the longer game. "Stokes is evolving as a captain and has also produced enough magical performances in the heat of battle to be considered a miracle worker by his teammates. "This is invaluable for a captain. Being a smart cricketer, Stokes can now advance his Test leadership by shrewdly assessing those aspects of a successful T20 World Cup campaign that attracted his attention," Chappell added.

Cristiano Ronaldo is in 'Spectacular' form, Says Portugal's Ruben Neves

November 20: Cristiano Ronaldo's Portugal team mate Ruben Neves says his captain is in "spectacular" shape as the team prepare for their opening World Cup match against Ghana on Thursday. Wolves midfielder Neves, one the leaders of the changing room, dismissed any speculation that 37-year-old Ronaldo was not in peak form, saying he looked like his old self in training. "From what I've seen in training, he's in spectacular shape," Neves told a news conference in tournament host

Qatar on Sunday. "He doesn't worry us at all, we as a team know perfectly well what we need to work on so that each individual stands out on game day."

"If we're good as a team, Cristiano will be phenomenal." Neves also said Cristiano Ronaldo's explosive TV interview, in which the Manchester United forward said he had been betrayed by the club and was being forced out, had not been a distraction in Portugal's changing room. He said the furore had nothing to do with the

national squad. "Sure, it's impossible for us to walk around without been asked about the controversy, but I don't think there's any controversy at all between us in the changing room," added 25-year-old Neves. "We have a spectacular environment right here."

After missing Thursday's friendly against Nigeria in Lisbon due to a stomach problem, Ronaldo trained normally on Saturday, smiling and joking with his team mates. Portugal are in World Cup Group H with Ghana, Uruguay and South Korea.

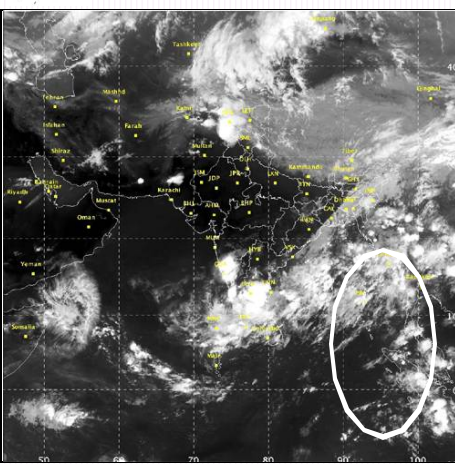
