strain in labour market

The Periodic Labour Force Survey (2019-20) points towards the steady build up of distress in the labour market in India. As the survey pertains to the July 2019 to June 2020 period, it captures both the economic slowdown prior to Covid, and the period after the national lockdown was imposed to restrict the spread of the pandemic. The survey data shows an increase in the labour force participation in agriculture during this period. This, as some have argued, implies that during this period of stress, agriculture emerged as an "employer of last resort". Equally significant is that much of the increase in the women's labour force participation recorded by the survey during this period was in the category of unpaid family workers, and not in more productive forms of employment. These are worrying developments. The PLFS data shows that the share of the labour force engaged in agriculture rose to 45.6 per cent in 2019-20, up from 42.5 per cent in 2018-19—an abrupt reversal of the decades-long decline in the labour force participation in agriculture. This suggests that the movement of labour out of agriculture, which had gathered pace post 2004-05, seems to have been stymied by the economic slowdown. The reverse migration of labour from cities to villages would have only increased the pressure on agriculture to absorb the workers. The rise in the female labour force participation is also problematic. Under normal circumstances, considering the low rates of female labour force participation in India—for women aged 15 and above it stood at 24.5 per cent in 2018-19—a rise in participation would be a positive development. However, much of the increase observed in 2019-20 was in the form of unpaid family work. In fact, according to the survey, the employment rate for unpaid workers in household enterprises in rural and urban areas increased by 15.9 per cent in 2019-20, from 13.3 per cent in 2018-19. What these numbers also reflect is the failure of the economy in not being able to create enough non-agricultural jobs (even in pre-Covid times) to absorb both those shifting out of agriculture, and the millions entering the labour force each year. Worryingly, even the jobs that are being created tend to be largely informal in nature.

A giant old tree ..

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Meanwhile Department of Electricity deployed its staff for removal of damaged Electric line and poles. There are several huge trees around residential and official complexes in Mayabunder. Fall of any tree may lead to serious damage. Cutting down of all such tree's is advocated by residents.

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Similarly, 490 beneficiaries were vaccinated in North & Middle Andaman District out of which, 221 were in the age group of 18-

44 years. In Nicobar District, 118 beneficiaries were vaccinated out of which, 21 were in the age group of 18-44 years.

After two doses, immune response to Covishield higher than Covaxin: Hyderabad study

Hyderabad, 9th Sep, 2021: Immunogenicity or the immune response after two doses of Covishield vaccine is higher when compared to two doses of Covaxin, according to a study conducted in Hyderabad. The study, which is currently in preprint

stage and was published in the medRxiv journal, looked into the "IgG titer levels" or antibody levels of 54 patients who visited the Chanukya Endocrinology Centre in the city.

The study deployed tests of these 54 patients to check the IgG anti-spike neutralising antibody levels, 10 days after they took the second dose. When the results of 53 patients, including that of 30 males and 23 females, came out, the study found that 28 had titres (concentration of antibodies) more than 250 value points and 25 had titres less than 250 value points. The titres were lesser among those of higher mean age group at 56-57 years as compared to the previous group with more antibodies whose mean age was 55.

When comparing efficacy of the two vaccines, the study employed the two proportion test and found the "P Value" to be statistically significant in Covishield than Covaxin. "Also we employed two sample t-test for estimating means of IgG titres of respective vaccines. For Covaxin it was 23.7 and for Covishield it was 126," said Dr GV Chanukya, the lead author of the study. "To put it in simple terms, the antibody levels were six times greater for Covishield as compared to Covaxin," he added. The authors note that this study is significant as a pilot project because the routine trials conducted by vaccine makers themselves have relied on natural infection to measure the immune response as against checking the titer levels after the entire period of vaccination and waiting for that long a period was not feasible.



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RISE IN CASES OF ANXIETY, DEPRESSION IN COVID TIME

A study by a leading private hospital in Delhi has found that there has been a rise in cases of anxiety and depression among people during the COVID-19 pandemic, particularly in the lockdown period following its first wave.

The web-based cross-sectional study was conducted by the department of mental health and behavioural sciences, Max

Hospital, Saket, during the first wave of the pandemic, a spokesperson of the hospital said on Wednesday.

The online survey was conducted to assess the

awareness, anxiety and depression symptoms among people in the country during the COVID-19 pandemic, compared to the situation prior to it,

hospital authorities said.

A total of 1,211 responses were recorded out of which 1,069 responses were included in the analysis, according to the study published in the International Journal of Mental Health Systems, they said.

The study stated that 44.6 per cent of them met the criteria for mild anxiety, 30.1 per cent for moderate anxiety and 25.3 per cent for severe anxiety.

Also, 26.1 per cent of them met the criteria for mild depression, 16.7 per cent for moderate depression, and 3.8 per cent for severe depression, it said.

"Data was collected via a self-report questionnaire for a period of four weeks during the nationwide lockdown. Participants were residents of India, with minimum 10 years of education, with basic knowledge of English language and were of the age of 18 years and above," the study said.

Participants with any existing or previous history of any major psychiatric illness were excluded from the analysis, doctors said.

The study was conducted

using a web-based survey that was circulated to the general population. The survey was broadcasted through email and public platforms of social media and messaging applications such as WhatsApp, hospital authorities said.

"There's a definite rise in the cases of anxiety and depression seen across the population in the COVID-19 pandemic, particularly after the second wave as compared to the first wave. I have seen many people coming to terms with grief, having lost their family members followed by depression and significant anxiety," said Dr Sameer Malhotra, director and head, department of mental health and behavioural sciences, at the hospital.

"As per a study, we conducted last year on a sample size of 1,069 individuals of the general population during the first wave of COVID, we found that 55 per cent of those who took part in it, had significant anxiety symptoms and more than one-fourth of them were experiencing depressive symptoms," he added.

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Mass dharna by ABVP

Port Blair, Sept 9: The Akhil Bharatiya Vidyarthi Parishad (ABVP), Andaman and Nicobar Islands organised a mass 'Dharna' near Shyama Prasad Mukherjee Park, Aberdeen Bazar for its various long pending demands particularly for establishment of Central University in these Islands. The ABVP raised strong objection against setting up Deemed University under a crony club in

the Administration in the decision of Deemed University.

ABVP organised this 'Dharna' for seeking attention of Central Government towards deteriorating quality of Higher Education due to unwanted intervention of local administration particularly in establishing a central university in these Islands. He further alleged that the administration is hiding the facts from students, academia and

in a punitive action, the Pondicherry University has de-affiliated one of the colleges (DBRAIT). Pondicherry University is not allowing the students to appear in University Examinations admitted through Lateral entry in their engineering courses. Pondicherry University is not ready to give affiliation for new batch as the regulation/norms to maintain quality education laid down by UGC/

University and other apex regulatory body are not abide by the Administration/Principal, DBRAIT. The only Law College of these Islands (ALC) do not have its own building to run its courses even after five years of its establishment. The creation of post of faculties and other staff for Andaman College (ANCOL) have not materialised yet. To maintain quality education in these Islands ABVP demands



these Islands. Shri R. Rajsekhar Vihag Secretary, ABVP, ANI, condemned the administration for creating obstacles in setting up a new Central University in these Islands. He alleged that the local administration, in order to stop the process of Central University, took a suo moto and self-styled decision for setting up a deemed university under a crony club society. Shri R. Rajsekhar alleged that the opinion of P.R.s, public and stakeholders (students and teachers) has never been taken by

public at large and consistently trying to establish a low quality deemed University despite objection raised by the student's community of these Islands. Shri Rajsekhar further alleged that administration consistently and persistently doing the gross violations of UGC rules in the colleges of administration. Administration is continuously delaying the appointment of regular Principals, sufficient regular teaching faculties and non-teaching staffs. Since administration is not adhering to norms of University/UGC/GOI,

existing colleges to be associated only with a new Central University or with existing Pondicherry Central University but not with any society based proposed Deemed University. Hence ABVP demands for setting up a Central University in these Islands so that the dream and vision of New India envisaged by our beloved Prime Minister may be translated into reality. Shri R. Rajsekhar told that if student's interest is not kept on the priority of Administration we will scale up our protest in coming days.

Heatwaves have emerged as a deadly health hazard in India



Northwestern, central and south-central India are new hotspots of intense heatwave over the past 50 years, a study has said.

The study also highlights the need for developing effective heat action plans in the three heatwave hotspots regions with a focus on different vulnerabilities among the inhabitants.

Heatwaves have emerged as a deadly health hazard, claiming thousands of lives across the globe in recent decades, with episodes strengthening in frequency, intensity and duration in the past half-century in India as well.

This has caused severe impact on health, agriculture, economy and infrastructure. In such a scenario, it is extremely important to identify the most heatwave vulnerable regions of the country to prioritise immediate policy intervention and stringent mitigation and adaptation strategies, the Department of Science and Technology said.

A team of researchers led by R. K. Mall, including Saumya Singh and Nidhi Singh from the Department of Science and Technology, Mahamana Centre of Excellence in Climate Change Research (MCECCR) at Banaras Hindu University, studied the change in spatial and temporal trends in Heatwaves (HW) and Severe heatwaves (SHW) over the past seven decades in different meteorological subdivisions of India.

This work has been supported under the Climate Change Programme of the Department of Science and Technology. The study published in the journal 'International Journal of Climatology' links the association of HW and SHW with mortality over India.

"The study showed a shift in the spatio-temporal trend of HW events from the eastern region of Gangetic West Bengal and Bihar to northwest, central and further to the south-central region of India.

"The research also observed an alarming southward expansion and a spatial surge in

SHW events in the last few decades that may put a greater population at additional risk of heat stress in a region already characterised by low diurnal temperature range (DTR), or the difference between the maximum and minimum temperatures within one day and high humidity," the statement added.

Importantly, the HW and SHW events were found to be positively correlated with mortality in Odisha and Andhra Pradesh, highlighting that human health is highly susceptible to severe heatwave disasters.

With an ever-increasing extreme-temperature threshold, a heat resilient future is the need of the hour.

Dense population with an intensive outdoor work culture calls for equitable heat resilient mitigation and adaptation strategies covering each section of the society depending on their vulnerability, it said. The study highlights the need for developing effective heat action plans in the three heatwave hotspots regions. To mitigate future disastrous implications of exacerbated heat extremes and frame adequate adaptation measures in the wake of possible emergence of new hotspots, reliable future projections are needed. This will help study the frequency, intensity, and spatial surge of heatwaves in the future. The study found models LMDZ4 and GFDL-ESM2M to be the best-performing ones in simulating heatwaves over India in the present scenario, which can be reliably used for future projections as well. The two models have laid the grounds for preparation for a heatwave resilient future, it said. In a separate study by meteorologists published earlier this year, heatwaves have claimed more than 17,000 lives in 50 years from 1971-2019. The paper, authored by M. Rajeevan, former secretary of Ministry of Earth Science along with scientists Kamaljit Ray, S. S. Ray, R. K. Giri and A. P. Dimri, said there were 706 heatwave incidents from 1971-2019. Kamaljit Ray is the lead author of the paper.

Amazon vs Future Group-Reliance: SC stays Delhi HC proceedings

In a major relief for Future Group, the Supreme Court on Thursday stayed for four weeks all proceedings in the Delhi High Court related to Amazon's dispute with the merger of Future Group with Reliance Retail. The Supreme Court also ordered a stay on enforcement of the order of an emergency arbitrator by the Delhi High Court.

The Supreme Court direction halts the seizure of assets of Future Coupons, Future Retail and promoter Kishore Biyani. A single-justice bench of the Delhi High Court in March had ordered attachment of assets of Future Group for violating the emergency arbitrator's award.

The bench comprising Chief Justice N.V. Ramana and Justices Surya Kant and A.S. Bopanna directed the NCLT, Competition Commission of India and SEBI not to pass a final order on the dispute for four weeks.

The bench considered the statements of senior advocates Harish Salve and Mukul Rohatgi, appearing for FRL and Future Coupons Private Ltd (FCPL), respectively, that the arbitrator has reserved the final verdict in the case after hearing both sides.

The Supreme Court's direction came as it was hearing a plea by Future Coupons Private Ltd against a Delhi High Court order that had put on hold Future Group's order to sell its retail

assets to Reliance Retail.

On August 6, the Supreme Court had ruled that the emergency arbitrator's award was enforceable in India.

PARTNERING RIDE-HAILING FIRM BLUSMART, RELIANCE PLANS EV CHARGING NETWORK

Mukesh Ambani's Reliance Industries has already announced big renewable energy plans and the company is moving fast in stitching partnerships to expand in this space. On Thursday, Jio-BP, the fuel retailing joint venture between Reliance Industries and British energy giant bp, announced a partnership with the all-electric ride hailing platform BluSmart to set up a network of commercial large scale electric vehicle (EV) charging stations. BluSmart is a ride hailing platform and has only all-electric vehicles in its fleet. Currently operating only in the Delhi-NCR region, the company has plans to expand into other major cities in India.

Under the partnership, Jio-bp and BluSmart will collaborate in planning, development and operation of EV charging infrastructure at suitable locations in cities where BluSmart will operate. In the first phase, these EV charging stations will be rolled out in the national capital region. Each charging station will be able to accommodate at least 30 vehicles.

"Jio-bp will be at the forefront of EV infrastructure development in the country," said Harish Mehta, CEO of Jio-BP. This partnership with BluSmart follows a partnership Reliance had

announced with food delivery platform Swiggy in August. The partnership with Swiggy is aimed at promoting the adoption of battery-operated EVs, including deployment of electric two-wheelers that will be supported by Jio-bp's network of battery swap stations and Swiggy's network of delivery

BluSmart is a significant milestone in our vision of offering new age low-carbon emitting, cleaner and more affordable options," said Mehta.

Anmol Jaggi, the co-founder and CEO of BluSmart said that EV superhubs will be the future of EV charging providing seamless charging access to consumers and ride-hailing fleets and they will be jointly building some of the largest EV superhubs.

Reliance is one among several companies that are aiming to give a big push to EV charging infrastructure in the country. The limited charging infrastructure has often been cited as a key reason behind the slow EV adoption in

partners.

Jio-bp has plans to set up a distributed network of thousands of battery swap stations over the next five years at retail outlets and other urban locations like residential and commercial complexes, malls, hotels, business parks and IT hubs. Jio-bp operates a network of fuel retail outlets in India, with plans to expand to 5,500 outlets in five years.

"Leveraging bp's learnings from the UK with bp Pulse, where they have the country's largest EV charging network; from Germany through their Aral brand—Jio-bp intends to bring in the latest in EV technology to our consumers. Our partnership with

India.

In April this year, Hero MotoCorp, the country's largest two-wheeler maker had announced a battery swapping joint venture with Taiwan's Gogoro. Ola Electric has also announced plans to set up a hypercharger network of 1 lakh charging points across 400 cities in five years. For Mukesh Ambani, battery charging network is just one part of his mega ambitions in the new energy space. Ambani announced last week that RIL has started developing the green energy Giga Complex in Jamnagar. It has targeted investments of Rs 75,000 crore in the next three years to set up four gigafactories.

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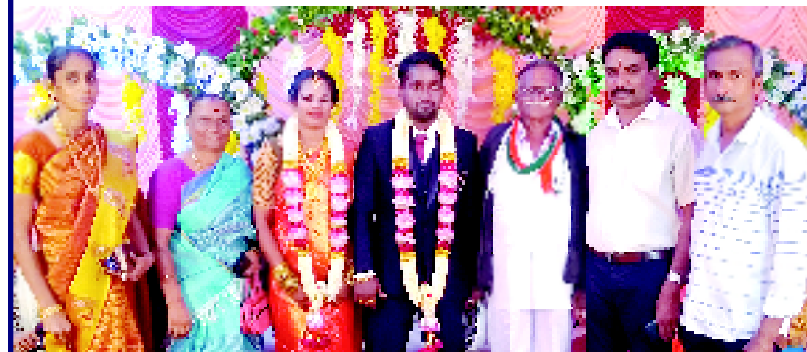


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
