Misplaced Secrets

When his predecessor Donald Trump's home in Mar-a-Lago, Florida, was raided last August and a trove of thousands of government documents was discovered there, including several hundreds of classified papers, little would U.S. President Joe Biden have imagined that he would find himself in a similar sticky situation. Yet, Mr. Biden and the White House have so far reacted calmly to the discovery of classified documents by his own attorneys at several sites including the Penn Biden Center for Diplomacy and Global Engagement, a think tank in Washington, and in the garage and several other rooms of his home in Wilmington, Delaware. There are, of course, critical differences between the cases, which will probably be mirrored in varying legal consequences of each of the two classified leaks. First, the Trump stash is reported to be over 11,000, including about 300 marked classified or top secret, and includes photographs, whereas the papers associated with Mr. Biden are reportedly fewer than 12. Second, after Mr. Biden's lawyers first discovered classified files in a locked closet at the think tank, his team voluntarily notified the National Archives and the Justice Department and are 'cooperating with the investigation' fully. In Mr. Trump's case, after the U.S. National Archives found classified records to be missing and requested that Mr. Trump return them, he failed to comply and hence the matter was handed over to the FBI. Third, while both leaks are being investigated separately, the Justice Department is conducting a criminal inquiry into Mr. Trump's handling of the documents, but in Mr. Biden's case there is no indication of wilful intent so far and he is protected by a rule that a sitting President cannot be indicted.

Notwithstanding these facts, it is clear that Mr. Biden's — or his team's — improper handling of classified material will cost him politically. Already, polls have found that his job approval rating, which enjoyed a bump towards the end of last year, has slumped back to around 40% — the all-time low of his presidency. The President is also facing difficult questions on why, after the initial discovery of the classified papers on November 2, his team suppressed that information until well after the November 8 midterm elections. Similarly, Republicans led by House of Representatives Speaker Kevin McCarthy have called for a Congressional investigation into the Biden classified leaks. The backlash could well be a setback for the case to prosecute Mr. Trump for violating the Espionage Act, even though he appears to have wilfully taken the classified documents from their proper place of holding and then possibly obstructed justice when asked to return them.

Tennyson wrote the poem based on two articles published in The Times: the first, published on 13 November 1854, contained the sentence "The British soldier will do his duty, even to certain death, and is not paralyzed by the feeling that he is the victim of some hideous blunder," which provided the inspiration for his phrase in the poem, "Someone had blunder'd."

Shah Rukh Called me, Expressed **Concern Over Protest** Against Film Pathaan: Assam CM

January 24: Guwahati: Assam Chief Minister Himanta Biswa Sarma said Bollywood actor Shah Rukh Khan talked to him over the phone early on Sunday and expressed concern over a protest against his new film 'Pathaan' in the city. Sarma assured the actor that his government will enquire about the demonstration against the movie and ensure that "no such untoward incidents" would occur again.

The development comes a day after the CM had said "who is Shahrukh Khan? I don't know anything about him or his film 'Pathaan'," while responding to queries by reporters about the violent protest by Bajrang Dal activists, who held a demonstration in front of a theatre at Narengi in the city on Friday, where the film is slated to be screened.

The far right-wing group's volunteers tore down the film's posters and burnt

WhatsApp Users Sceptical of Latest Update



January 24: Hyderabad: WhatsApp's latest version, which is requesting additional access to files on one's phone, besides the regular photos and media, has city users wary of the Android 2.23.2.8 update.

"While these permissions may not be inherently dangerous, because WhatsApp cannot access them unless the user grants permission, they have the potential for misuse. We read about some or the other cyber scam happening due to certain privacy breaches or access to data. Requests for additional access make no sense, especially when the user has granted them years ago at the very beginning," said Amman Raj, an educator.

WhatsApp's privacy policy, under its 'How we use your information' and 'Safety, Security, And Integrity' sections, reads, "Safety, security, and integrity are an integral part of our services. We use information we have to verify accounts and activity; combat harmful conduct; protect users against bad experiences and spam; and promote safety, security, and integrity on and off our services, such as by investigating suspicious activity or violations of our terms and policies, and to ensure our services are being used

Raj said that the additional requests, however, do not match the policy.

 $Cyber\, safety\, expert\, Rupesh\, Mittal\, said\, that although$ the update is yet to be studied properly, the permission request still sounds fishy, given WhatsApp's 'assured encryption' policy. Abhishek S., a former employee of Meta, said that these permissions are mostly harmless. "Sometimes, when a phone is reset or newly updated, the app could have lost its original access to your media and so asks for them to be renewed. It's not incommon." he said.

Rupesh, founder-director of Cyber Jagrithi and Safety Foundation, said, "Choose wisely what permissions and accesses are of absolute importance. For example, ever since Facebook became Meta, many got pop-ups asking them to agree to the updated policy and allowed only to get rid of it. Some haven't and don't mind however annoying the pop-up gets."

Another way is to turn on privacy notifications that tell you whenever your camera or microphone is being accessed, sometimes even when you haven't turned them on. This feature is now inbuilt into most android phones. The final trick is to permit access only when you have a file to share and turn it off once done."

National Issues to Dominate Telangana Budget Session

January 24: HYDERABAD: In its first Budget session of the Telangana Legislature after rebranding the TRS as the BRS to enter national politics, the ruling party is expected to corner the Narendra Modi-led BJP government at the Centre on a range of issues including agriculture, irrigation and power.

BRS president and Chief Minister K. Chandrashekar Rao, according to party sources, plans to use the session beginning on February 3 to deride the government's Modi "lopsided policies" regarding the Centre's power reforms, financial restrictions on Telangana, curbs on the MNREGA scheme, paddy procurement, unemployment, inflation, privatisation of PSUs, higher fuel prices, among

The CM is expected to attack the Modi government about how its "skewed policies," in addition to harming the irrigation and power sectors, have affected farmers and the agricultural sector. Further, the BRS government would also highlight the Centre's "discrimination" towards Telangana in sanctioning of funds and projects in the last nine years.



The CM announced that a special session of the Assembly will be held in December to expose the "discrimination" of the Centre towards Telangana as well as highlight the financial restrictions the Modi government had imposed on Telangana by cutting loans, which prevented Telangana's growth.

Rao was preoccupied with national politics, the expansion of BRS into other states in December, and the first public meeting in Khammam on January 18 after the party's name change. As a result, the special session of the Assembly was postponed. However, the CM surprised everyone by scheduling the Assembly session only three days into the Budget session of Parliament, which would get underway

on January 31. It has been a tradition to hold the Assembly Budget session in March since the days of undivided Andhra Pradesh. This tradition was followed even after the formation of Telangana state in 2014.

The Union Budget will be presented in Parliament on February 1. After going through its proposals to get clarity on the state's share in Central taxes and centrally sponsored schemes (CSS), the CM wants to arrive at the actual size of Telangana Budget 2023-24 and present it in the Assembly on February 3, sources said.

The state Budget has been drafted but the CM is awaiting for the Union budget for clarity, and would revise the final Budget figures accordingly.

Race for Council Posts Heats up in BRS, Whip Post Likely for Vani Devi

January 24: HYDERABAD: The race within the BRS for nominated posts in the Telangana Legislative Council heated up with the positions of deputy chairperson, chief whip and five whips lying vacant. Speculations are rife that former prime minister P.V. Narasimha Rao's daughter Vani Devi is likely to get the whip post.

The upcoming Budget session has further fuelled speculation that BRS presidentand ChiefMinister K. Chandrashekar Rao would fill the posts. The term of deputy chairperson Nethi Vidyasagar ended in June 2021 and has been lying ever since.

Many aspirants are trying to meet Chandrashekar Rao and party working president K.T. Rama Rao and lobby for their candidature. The Chief Minister and Rama Rao were reportedly weighing options



before finalising the names, taking into consideration the Assembly polls scheduled for December. This is because few senior MLCs such as Kadiam Srihari and S. Madhusudhana Chary were hoping to contest the Assembly elections. Since the Chief Minister has promised tickets to all MLAs, it would bedifficult to consider MLCs for the Assembly polls. To pacifysuch leaders, Rao may utilise this opportunity and give them nominated posts in the Legislative Assembly.

The deputy chairman post has a cabinet rank.

Gutha Sukender Reddy was re-elected as chairman of Legislative Council last March. Vani Devi got elected as MLC on BRS ticket (then TRS) from the Hyderabad-R angared dy-Mahabubnagar Graduates Constituency in March 2021.

Since then, speculation is doing the rounds in BRS circles that Chandrashekar Rao would give her a nominated post in the Council.





IND vs NZ 3rd ODI: The Chahal Conundrum

January 24: "Aaj Chahal TV pe koi player nahi aayenge, aaj hum aapko survey karwayenge dressing room ka"

Like an energetic vlogger, Indian leg spinner Yuzvedra Chahal holds a mic andmakes a touring video of the Indian dressing room at Raipur. From being the first-choice leg-spinner in the limited-overs setup, hehas been warming the bench of late. And the question on everyone's lips is why is the team management utilising his services more with the mic than with the ball lately.

Chahal flew to the T20 World Cup hoping that bigger grounds in Australia will favour suit his bowling only for the team management not field the legspinnerin anyof the games. Even as other teams preferred wristspinners, Chahal warmed the bench the entire tournament. He played in New Zealand, and in the three T20Is and one ODIs against Sri Lanka before making the way for Kuldeep Yadav.

With the 50-over World Cup taking precedence and the need tofindbalance means, India have been forced to take a few calls. And to make up for their batters who don't bowl, they have opted for spinners who can bat and that means there is only one spot available for Chahal and Kuldeep. And in that context, the former seems to be the one who is being sacrificed for the bigger cause. Since making his comeback, Kuldeep has not only out-bowled Chahal, but is also giving the team a wicket-taking option in the middle-overs. Plus, not all teams have a Chinaman in their ranks and the unfamiliarity that Kuldeep brings is always going to work in his favour once he found the mojo back.

And given his recent performances, Kuldeep also seems to have won back the trust of the team management. And to partner Kuldeep and lend more balance to the team India are looking at one of Ravindra Jadeja, Axar Patel and Washington Sundar as the second spinner – with the latter being the preferred choice in the ODIs against New



Zealand in the absence of the other two.

These factors have now pushed Chahal to the backseat and it remains to be seen what sort of an effect it has on his bowling now. Spinners, especially wristspinners, need confidence to prosper. Given the risk factor of giving a few more runs in search of a wicket, unless they have the full trust of the captain and the team management, wristspinners can lose confidence quickly. When the two made the Indian team cut post the 2017 Champions Trophy, the then team management backed the duo togo for wickets even at the expense of runs. With MS Dhoni around to guide them from behind, they were soldiers who just followed their master's instruction.

In 2018, Chahal had attributed his success to the freedom given by the team management the support he received from Virat Kohli. "Wrist spinners are mostly attacking and when your captain is so attacking, you get more freedom to attack," the lanky leggiehad said. And it seems line in the post Ravi Shastri and Kohli era, Chahal is not getting the same freedom he once enjoyed. No guaranteed spot in the XI, and not enough game time seems to have had an impact on his bowling.

On the eve of their third and final ODI against New Zealand at the Holkar Stadium on Monday, Chahal kept bowling to Hardik Pandya and Shubman Gill at the nets. With India already clinching the series, this is a deadrubber game, and Chahal will be hoping to get a chance on Tuesday.

Even head coach Rahul Dravid said the team would be looking to give opportunities. "Even here, there are a few guys who are yet to get a decent run in ODIs. We have been striving to give optimum opportunities in these 15-odd games before the World Cup to the ones who are in the mix," the coach stated

The Board of Control for Cricket in India (BCCI) has already identified 20 players for the 50-over World Cup and the teamwill rotate these players till the multi-nation tournament in October-November. Apart from Chahal, Umran Mallik, Shahbaz Ahmed, Rajat Patidar and S Bharat are yet to get a game in the series. However, Dravid has made it clear that the team will give opportunity to only those who are in fray for 50 over World Cup meaning the likes of Bharat, Patidar and Ahmed may have to wait.

Although benching Chahal is seen as him dropping down the pecking order, former India spinner Narendra Hirwani said the team has enough confidence in the legspinner and is only trying new players. "Chahal is the match winner. He has great maturity and team management has full confidence in him that is why they aren't worried much about him. He is such a kind of bowler, who even after a few gaps between games will win you matches. He has a bigheart and it's just that the Indian team is rotating its players," Hirwani said.

The Indian team had an optional practice session at the venue which has always been a battingparadise. The tickets for Tuesday's game have been sold out and a full house is expected. There will be some on the bench hoping to leave some mark in an insignificant game for the hosts.


