Life in the ocean: From the shores or from a boat, the sea looks like a huge mass of uniform, inky blue water. It is not so actually. Life in the sea is amazingly different at different depths. From the surface to a few feet below, the ocean is a sunlit world. that changes from day to night. Below this, the ocean becomes cold, dim, and unchanging. And thousands of meters below the surface, the ocean is a region of nearfreezing temperatures, crushing pressure, and complete darkness.

Most marine plants and animals are adapted to living in one of three regions- the sunlight, twilight, or midnight zone. These zones are defined by the presence (or absence) of light. They differ from one another in temperature amount of pressure, and nutrient supply. We will mainly focus here on the sunlight zone where most of the familiar animals and plants are present.

Success is not an activity but a process ...

The Job and the Man

At a time when ethnonationalist and majoritarian far-right parties are on the ascent in many democracies across the world, the rise of Rishi Sunak, a man of colour and a practising Hindu, to the premiership of the predominantly white, Christian U.K., has great symbolic value. While his election as Britain's first non-white Prime Minister points to the readiness of Conservative MPs to look beyond the racial and religious barriers for a solution to the crisis both party and country are in, his victory was particularly welcomed by sections in India, who see some historical fulfilment in a man of Indian origin ruling over India's former colonial rulers. But the power of symbolism is limited when it is tested with the hard realities of the day. In fact, the very circumstances that led to his rise should themselves serve as a warning for the new leader. He is the fifth Prime Minister since the Tories' victory in the 2010 general elections, and the third in the last two months. Liz Truss, his immediate predecessor, had also promised to revive the economy but exited in seven weeks amid a hostile market reaction to her policy measures and an open revolt among the Tory MPs.

When the Conservatives won an outright victory in the 2019 elections under Boris Johnson, not many expected Mr. Sunak, a former hedge fund manager, to end up as the party leader in three years. And yet, he is now in 10 Downing Street, presiding over a party that is at war with itself and an economy that has an estimated budget deficit of \$45 billion and is headed towards recession. The country is also struggling with a costof-living crisis, with inflation hovering around 10%. But he does not have any magic bullet to offer. As the budget deficit remains high and markets are edgy, he is likely to announce cost-cutting measures, but for Britons who are already grappling with high inflation, that would be bad news. And as Russia's Ukraine war is not expected to wind down any time soon, the energy crisis and inflationary pressure will stay. So, Mr. Sunak will have to walk a fine line between keeping the markets in good faith and providing relief to the public rattled by high inflation, while also opening larger reforms to bring back growth. A tall ask, but Mr. Sunak could at least have begun it on a clean slate. By re-appointing Suella Braverman, an immigration hardliner and an apologist of the empire who was fired by Ms. Truss after weeks into her job, as Home Secretary, Mr. Sunak is sending mixed signals. If he does not want to repeat the fate of his predecessors in an extremely volatile political and economic climate, he should be bold enough not to repeat their mistakes.

NASA Announces New Team to Study UFOs



October 27: NASA announced that it has selected 16 individuals to be part of its independent study team on unidentified aerial phenomena (UAP). UAP refers to things in the sky that cannot be identified as aircraft or natural phenomena, or in common parlance, UFOs.

The independent study began on Monday, October 24 and will last for a period of nine months. The team's research will lay the groundwork for studies of UAPs in the future, according to NASA. The team seeks to learn how data gathered from various different sources can be analysed to shed light on the mystery of UAPs.

Researching UFOs

A full report of the team's findings will be released to the public in mid-2023, according to NASA. But don't go looking for any classified data in there since the study will focus only on unclassified data.

"Exploring the unknown in space and the atmosphere is at the heart of who we are at NASA. Understanding the data we have surrounding unidentified aerial phenomena is critical to helping us draw scientific conclusions about what is happening in our skies. Data is the language of scientists and makes the unexplainable, explainable," said Thomas Zurbuchen, associate administrator of the Science Mission Directorate, in an agency press statement.

Apart from the distant possibility of identifying alien spacecraft, identifying such UAPs has national security and air safety implications. One of NASA's goals is to ensure the safety of aircraft. Since the study will not have access to an extensive set of data, it would be nearly impossible to very or explain any of the observations. Due to this, the study's only focus is to inform the space agency about what data could be collected in the future to understand UAPs better.

October 27: New Delhi: Defence minister Rajnath Singh on Wednesday told his Russian counterpart Sergei Shoigu that the Ukraine crisis should be resolved through dialogue and that the nuclear option should not be resorted to by any side.

He said that Rs 1300 crores has been earmarked for expansion plan of the shipping fleet which is one of the components of the Rs. 90,000 investment plan. Under this, two 500 pax vessels viz. Sindhu & Nalanda have been inducted and two 1200 pax vessels are under different stages of construction at Cochin Shipyard Ltd., the Lt. Governor remarked.

The Lt. Governor mentioned that the vision of Hon'ble Prime Minister is to improve connectivity and infrastructure facility in A&N Islands so that the country can acquire a leading position among the developed countries and the A&N Administration is committed to achieve this vision.

The Governor Lt. informed that Memorandum Understanding (MoU) has been signed between A&N Administration and CSL i.e. CANSRU (CSL-Andaman Nicobar Ship Repair Unit). He said, many initiatives under the different components of the MoUhave been taken up, which include enhancement/up gradation of entire work force, infrastructure & hardware upgradation of the Marine Dockyard in A&N Islands. This will help in further improving the shipping sector, which is the lifeline of these Islands, the Lt. Governor added.

Informing about the various infrastructure developments in Isles, the Lt. Governor disclosed about the coming up of an International Container Transshipment Terminal (ICTT) at Campbell Bay which is also part of the Rs 90,000 crore investment plan in A&N Islands. He said, in the month of September, 2022 an amount of Rs.70,000 crore has been approved by the Ministry for different projects in A&N Islands and ICTT is

also a part of the component. The proposed development of Green Field Deep Sea Port at Atlanta Bay in Diglipur will pave the way for A&N Islands to become a hub for Ship Repair & Ship Construction in Bay of Bengal, he said.

In his address, the Chairman & Managing Director, Cochin Shipyard Ltd., Shri Madhu S. Nair said, the construction of vessel is due to sheer passion and commitment of the workers, engineers and team work of the Cochin Shipyard Ltd. This 'State of the Art' vessel is one of the best in the world, he said. Apart from these two 500 pax-cum - 150 ton cargo, Sindhu and Nalanda, the CSL is also constructing two 1200 pax vessels for A&N Administration, the CMD said. He also informed about the CSL's engagement with A&N Administration for ship building as well as to revamp the ship repair eco-system in A&N Islands.

Earlier, welcoming the chief guest and others present on the occasion, the Secretary (Shipping), Shri Kishore Kshirsagar Lakshman said, the Vessel Nalanda like its sister ship MV Sindhu which was inducted last year can carry 500 passengers and 150 tons of cargo. The addition of this ship in DSS fleet will bolster our capacity to provide services in the interisland route as well as in mainland route. The Shipping Department is committed towards providing services in different Islands, the Secretary said. To ensure an uninterrupted shipping service, the Secretary said that the Shipping Department is committed to provide better services with the mantra 'Sabka Sath, Sabka Vikas, Sabka Vishwas, Sabka Prayas'.

After inducting the vessel, the Hon'ble Lt Governor, took a walk around the vessel Nalanda and inspected passenger amenities available onboard.

This all weather vessel, has a length of 91 Mtr and can cruise at a speed of 16 Knt. The vessel is not only equipped with machineries of latest technology but also offers modern passenger amenities, with 12 Pax deluxe cabins, 32 Pax 1st Class Cabin and 36 Pax 2nd Class Cabin. The vessel also have 346 Bunks and 74 Seating for passengers. The vessel is also having 40 separate exclusive berths for unaccompanied ladies travelling onboard.

The induction of this vessel will prove to be an important milestone which will not only enhance the operational capabilities across the Islands but also contribute in promoting safe and comfortable journey for the passengers.

The vessel on her maiden voyage will sail to Little Andaman with passengers tomorrow (Oct. 28) at 1000 hrs from Haddo Wharf.

Two Girls, One a Minor, 'Raped' at Hyderbad Orphanage

October **HYDERABAD**: Two inmates of an orphanage in Neredmet under the Rachakonda commissionerate are said to have been raped.

One of the victims, a minor, was allegedly raped by Murali, one of orphanage's the employees, while theother girlwas allegedly raped in Sangareddy by another suspect named Ganesh. The two accused were taken into custody and sent to remand.

The incident came to light after four girls escaped from the orphanage, leading to a missing complaint made by the orphanage home authorities. Although these incidents occurred a few months ago, they came to light only on Tuesday. The two accused were taken into custody placed on remand. The orphanage is



home to 30 girls, including two majors who stayat home and commute outside to school or work, according to Rachakonda police. These girls are from low-income families. The orphanage authorities reported four girls, including three minors, as missing in a complaint to the Neredmet police station on October 19.





Australia Loves Virat Kohli, he Loves Them Back

October 27: A match between India and the Netherlands would not be considered box-office material, but a certain Virat Kohli has ensured that the eyes of the cricketing world would be fixed on the Sydney Cricket Ground on Thursday.

After his monumental matchwinning innings against Pakistan, every move of the charismatic master batsman will befollowed by the legions of fans, and not just those from India. Aussies are also fascinated by the former India captain, who plays the game with an approach traditionally associated with champion sides and players from these shores. The other day, among the multitudes of Pakistan and India fans was a section of Australians, chanting aloud Kohli's name. This was when he was fielding, before he struck the two most historic sixes he had ever hit.It's understandable that a cricketer of his stature is universally loved. But in Australia, they consider him one of their own. His traits are their own — the in-your-face machismo and the you-don'tmess-with-me attitude, the singleminded determination to win, what they call Australianism.

So feels former Aussie cricketer Lisa Sthalekar. "The way Virat Kohli plays his cricket is actually Australian. You look at what he has done to Indian cricket, he has pushed the fitness element and prioritised fielding. That core principle is what Australian cricketers admire and not just his ability," she tells The Indian Express. Add to that the manic running between wickets and aggressive body language." His is a name that even those who don't followcricketwill definitelyknow. And needless to say, he captures the imagination of people who love cricket," the former allrounder adds.Kohli, for them, is as Australian as it could be. Which other cricketer could win the affection of the same crowd that he had snapped his middle finger at, as he did on his first senior tour of Australia in 2011-12? Which other cricketer could be admired so much despite him picking a verbal altercation with their captains (Tim Paine and Steve Smith)?



They have loved Sachin Tendulkar and Sunil Gavaskar too, Brian Lara and Viv Richards also. Yet, none was one of their own. Kohli is their own.

A raft of former Australian cricketers have expressed the same sentiment in the past. Declared Greg Chappell in a column for the Sydney Morning Herald two years ago: "Kohli is the most Australian non-Australian cricketer of all time." He struck a Gandhi metaphor to drill his point: "Many previous Indian cricket teams tended to play with undue deference to their opponents, as if in accord with the Gandhian principle. Virat Kohli does not believe in passive resistance. He is a proponent of all-out aggression."

For the Pakistan-India match in Melbourne, Sthalekar had tagged along a couple of her Australian Football League friends to experience the electric atmosphere of the game as well as watch Kohli.

"The two guys who I was with were saying that the AFL Grand Final is all about corporates, just want-to-be-there-to-be-seen type of scene. When they saw this match, they said everyone is so emotionally invested in this match. Isaid, ya. Live and die by this result on who wins and who doesn't," she narrates.

In Sydney, where India play the Dutch, the occasion would not be as overwhelming as it is expected to be a mismatch. But there has been no shortage of buzz to watch Kohli. The trams in the SCG line have been warning passengers about a busy Thursday and toplan their travel accordingly. Needless to say, the trams and buses, the alleys and roads that lead to the SCG on Thursday would be

packed. Social media too has helped forge an emotional connection between Kohli and fans from different countries. Cricketers of the past were aloof and detached, whereas Kohli is active on social media. "Virat is more accessible than any of those guys because of the technological age we are in. People have deeper connections and at the same time, more cricket has been played. When Sachin retired, he had played only one T20 International. The game has changed so much and Virat is more accessible and that is (a reason) why the love affair continues," Sthalekar savs.

It's not just that Australia loves Kohli, Kohli has loved Australia back too. It was here that he first stamped his world-beating class, during the hurricane chase against Sri Lanka in Hobart. On these shores, he scored his first Test hundred, became Test captain for the first time and later became the first Indian captain to win a Test series Down Under. Here, he averages 54 in Tests, 47 in ODIs and 64 in T20Is. Add to the list of his epic performances the 82 not out against Pakistan on Sunday - a knock straight from the Australian playbook of winning games that seemed lost at one stage. A knock peak Mike Hussey or Michael Bevan would have scripted.Sthalekar is still in awe of that innings. "What ability!" she gushes. "Those two balls at the end of the 19th over will go down in history. It's a shot not many people in this world can play — on the up, weight going backwards, and to deposit it straight up over the bowler's head for six. It's amazing what that gentleman can do," she says. And amidst the swarms of blue at the SCG on Thursday would be those in yellow and gold jerseys, chanting and singing aloud Kohli's name. For, he is one of their own


