Delay in office work make Labourers of ALF restless, shortage of clerical staff causes delays

Port Blair, Dec 23: Hundreds of Labour working in the Andaman Labour Force unit of the Port Management Board of the Administration are struggling to get their salary and other official benefits due to shortage of clerical staff in the department. About 100 hard working Labourers employed in the PMB have to wait for several days to getting their benefits. According to sources, due to shortage of clerical staff in the PMB, officials works are getting hampered. From sanction of leave to other benefits and other GPF, EPF, Pension and Medical Treatment benefit these Labourers are entitled to be being delayed. Because of official apathy, the Labour Force have to suffer. The PMB have engaged these labourers for undertaking various works in the department. These Labour's are working in the dept for the past many years. Labourers who need urgent medical leave to take their relatives to mainland for treatment are the worst sufferer as their applications for leave remains pending for months. The senior officers of the Department are least bothered to the problems of these staff. Applications seeking other benefits like GPF advance, LTC etc are delayed due to delay process of application.

MP sanctions purchase and supply of three School Buses for students of Diglipur region

Port Blair, Dec 23: The Member of Parliament, of Shri. Kuldeep Rai Sharma has sanctioned purchase and supply of three School Buses (one 26 seater and two 54 seater Non AC) to the State Transport Service unit of Diglipur, Transport Department from MPLADS fund for three specific routes of Diglipur region so that students of the region can comfortably reach their respective schools. The cost of a 26 seater bus is Rs. 15 Lakhs while each 54 seater bus is Rs. 30 Lakhs. During his recent tour to North Andaman a large number of people including students highlighted the problem regarding shortage of STS buses and heavy crowds of passengers in various routes of North Andaman, for which students are finding it difficult to reach school on time. Students and parents had informed the Member of Parliament that during school hours in some routes 75 to 80 students have to travel along with regular passengers in jam packed STS buses, making it difficult for girl students to travel. Talk, Kyiv & Moscow

Volodymyr Zelensky asked for continued American support during his in-person speech to the US Congress. On his first known trip abroad since the start of the Russian invasion of Ukraine, Zelensky pitched American aid as an investment in international security and democracy. Clearly, his message was directed at the incoming Republican majority in the US House of Representatives, many of whom have become sceptical about unfettered aid to Kyiv that comes out of American taxpayers' pocket. In fact, the Biden administration has just announced another \$1.85 billion in military aid to Ukraine that will include for the first time the Patriot air defence system.

However, Russia has warned that increasing the supply of American arms to Ukraine will only aggravate the conflict. But while Moscow plans to boost the size of its armed forces by 30%, even Vladimir Putin recently admitted that the situation in the four Russian-occupied Ukrainian regions was complicated. And getting trapped in a long drawn-out conflict will further strain the Russian economy and create conditions for discontent and turmoil within Russian society.

Meanwhile, the continued Russian bombardment of Ukrainian cities and energy infrastructure means that millions of Ukrainian citizens are facing a catastrophic winter with no electricity or running water even as temperatures plummet. Given the huge humanitarian crisis unfolding, the Ukrainian leadership needs to be practical here. True, grave injustice has been wrought on Ukraine. But in order to end the suffering of the Ukrainian people, a negotiated end to the conflict is worth considering. With the Russian military also finding the going tough as winter sets in, perhaps this is the moment to reopen channels of communication and go back to the dialogue table.

Of course, this won't be easy for Zelensky given that his country continues to be under attack. But pushing Putin into a corner and prolonging the conflict indefinitely will harm Ukrainians themselves. Thus, both sides need to work out an acceptable exit strategy to end the war, which globally has pushed inflation up and energy costs higher.

BHARAT BIOTECH'S INTRANASAL COVID VACCINE TO BE AVAILABLE ON COWIN FROM TODAY AMID FEARS OF SPIKE IN CASES

Bharat Biotech's intranasal Covid vaccine has been approved by the Union Health Ministry as a booster dose for those aged 18 years and above and is likely to be introduced on the COWIN platform Friday evening, official sources said.

The needle-free vaccine will be available at private hospitals as of now and can be administered as a precaution dose to adults who have

been vaccinated with two doses of either Covishield or Covaxin.

"It is likely to be rolled out in the national Covid vaccination programme soon," they said.

The ministry's approval for the intranasal vaccine as a booster comes amid a spurt in Covid cases in China and some other countries.

The nasal vaccine -- BBV154 - received approval of the Drugs

Controller General of India (DCGI) in November, for restricted use in an emergency situation, for those above 18 years as a heterologous booster dose.

"The vaccine branded as iNOVACC is likely to be introduced on the Co-WIN platform Friday evening onwards. For now, it will be available in private hospitals," an official source said.

The intranasal vaccine is another example of India's research and development prowess in the vaccine development arena. Secondly, it is easy to administer and builds up immune barriers in the respiratory tract through which respiratory viruses enter the body.

"The intranasal vaccine is now approved and recommended as one of the options for precaution dose," chairman of the National Technical Advisory Group on Immunisation (NTAGI) Dr N.K. Arora told PTI.

The intranasal vaccine

iNOVACC is a recombinant replication deficient adenovirus vectored vaccine with a pre-fusion stabilised spike protein. This vaccine candidate was evaluated in phase I, II and III clinical trials with successful results, the Hyderabad-based vaccine maker had said in a statement.

Clinical trials were conducted to evaluate iNOVACC as a primary dose schedule as well as a heterologous booster dose for subjects who have previously received two doses of either Covishield or Covaxin. The vaccine was developed in partnership with Washington University, St. Louis, which had designed and developed the recombinant adenoviral vectored construct and evaluated it in preclinical studies for efficacy.

Product development related to preclinical safety evaluation, large-scale manufacturing scale-up, formulation and delivery device

development, including human clinical trials, were conducted by Bharat Biotech. Product development and clinical trials were funded in part by the Government of India through the Department of Biotechnology's Covid Suraksha programme. The government has advised those eligible to take the precaution dose and follow Covid-appropriate behaviour, including wearing masks and social distancing. Union Health Minister Mansukh Mandaviya will hold a meeting with the health ministers of the states and Union territories at 3pm over the Covid-related situation in the country.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi had on Thursday cautioned people against complacency and urged them to wear masks in crowded places, while also directing officials to strengthen surveillance measures, especially at international airports. - Source: The Week

CS reviews status of Covid-19

Port Blair, Dec. 23: The Chief Secretary, A&N Administration, Shri Keshav Chandra, IAS held a comprehensive meeting yesterday to review the current status of COVID-19 in A&N Islands and future threat perception. The meeting was attended by Shri Neeraj Thakur, IPS, DGP, ANP, Shri Kamal Datta, IFS, PCCF, Shri Nikhil Kumar, IAS, Commissioner-cum-Secretary (Health), Secretaries, Deputy Commissioners of all three Districts, Officers of A&N Administration and representatives from Andaman Nicobar Command. During the meeting, the Chief Secretary urged the people of the islands to follow all the COVID Appropriate Behavior in order to prevent the outbreak of infection in these islands. He advised the people to wear mask, maintain social distancing, especially in crowded places and not to panic. The Chief

Secretary further directed the concerned authorities to review the logistic supplies and place fresh orders for procurement, if needed. He also directed the Health Department to augment the process of manpower hiring and purchase of logistics, if needed, to tackle the situation. The Chief Secretary directed the District Magistrates to review the stocks of medical supplies, beds and oxygen in their respective jurisdiction and take necessary action accordingly. Further, he directed to follow the guidelines and advisories issued by MoHFW, New Delhi and act accordingly. He said, samples of all positive cases must be sent for genome sequencing to the designated INSACOG Laboratories. He also directed all concerned to activate the surveillance at the Port of Entry as well as in all the Health Institution across the Islands. ILI/SARI cases across

the Islands should be reported daily and a media team be constituted to brief the media on daily basis, the Chief Secretary said. The Chief Secretary directed the Health Department to issue an advisory on Do's & Don'ts pertaining to COVID-19 for the general public. He also mentioned that in case of any untoward situation, Andaman & Nicobar Administration is fully prepared to tackle the situation. Earlier, the Commissioner-cum-Secretary (Health) briefed about the present situation of COVID-19. This was followed by detailed presentation about the current status of COVID-19 globally, in the country as well as in the Islands. He also informed about the status of medical supplies including oxygen, status of vaccination in the Islands and also future threat and strategies to tackle any unforeseen situation, a press release from Nodal Officer, COVID-19 said. Health Advisory for COVID-19

A new variant of COVID-19 is spreading in some countries. While the UT of A&N Islands has taken many measures to contain the spread of COVID-19 and there is no need to panic. The people can join hands to prevent the transmission of disease in the UT by taking the following measures:

1. Do not panic.
2. Don't pay heed to rumors.
3. Wear mask in all crowded places including schools, colleges, hospitals, markets, cinema etc.
4. Wash your hands and face at regular intervals with soap and water or use alcohol based sanitizer for cleaning hands.

INDICES TANK FURTHER ON FRIDAY. WHAT CAUSED THE MARKET CRASH?

A surge in Covid-19 cases seems to have given stock market investors in India the chills. The BSE Sensex cracked 981 points or 1.6 per cent on Friday to close at 59,845.29, while the wider NSE Nifty 50 index tumbled 321 points or 1.8 per cent to close at 17,806.80. This was the fourth consecutive session that the broader markets had ended in the red.

"Markets were caught in a frenzied selling as weak global cues and bearish external factors pushed both the benchmark indices below the psychological levels," said Amol Athawale, deputy vice-president, technical research at Kotak Securities.

Over the past week, the broader equity markets have now declined near 2.50 per cent.

"Besides the spurt in Covid cases in China and Japan, the better than expected US GDP numbers further raised concerns that the Federal Reserve will go for more rate hikes to tame inflation, which accentuated selling pressure in the markets," said Athawale.

On Friday, barring Titan, which ended flat, all the other stocks in the Sensex closed lower. Among the major losers were bluechips like Tata Steel, which slumped 5 per cent, Tata Motors (4 per cent), and Reliance Industries, Bajaj Finserv and State Bank of India (3 per cent or more).

The mid and smallcaps saw deeper cuts today; while the BSE MidCap Index ended 3.4 per cent lower, the BSE SmallCap index plunged over 4 per cent.

Central banks in developed economies hiked interest rates sharply in 2022 to tame record high inflation. But the fallout is that many of these economies, including the US, are staring at a recession as we look ahead into 2023.

While that may have already been factored in by investors, what has come as a surprise is the sudden surge in Covid-19 infections in China and many other countries. For much of the last two years, the Chinese government tightly followed its 'zero Covid' policy. But after protests erupted in the country against the frequent lockdowns, the government decided to dismantle the policy and open up the country. New Covid cases have exploded there since.

Subsequently, countries like the USA, Japan and Korea have seen a rise in Covid cases in the last few days. While India has

not seen a dramatic surge in cases so far, the government has begun random tests of international arrivals, and mask mandates have made a comeback in few places. Investors are now worried whether there will be a repeat of 2020 and 2021, just when people had thought that Covid will soon be confined to history books.

While the Indian economy is expected to be among the fastest growing in 2023, the worry is a spike in Covid once again could yet derail the fragile growth recovery.

"The spike in Covid cases across China dampened the appetite for risk as it instilled fears of another global Covid outbreak," said Vinod Nair, head of research at Geojit Financial Services. The extent of sell-off this week, perhaps indicates that investors may want to hold on to cash and wait for more clarity to emerge as we head into the new year. The sudden spike in Covid cases in China, plus expectations of continued interest rate hardening by the US Fed, have roiled equity markets globally. Overnight on Thursday, the Dow Jones Industrial Average in New York and S&P500 index ended more than one per cent lower. That had a ripple effect on Asian markets on Friday. The Nikkei 225 index in Japan closed one per cent lower, the Hang Seng index in Hong Kong was down 0.4 per cent and the Shanghai Composite Index fell 0.3 per cent.

In the afternoon, however, most of the European markets were trading in the green, providing a glimmer of hope for bulls ahead of the Christmas weekend.

Covid updates: Mandaviya to meet state health ministers; hospitals plan mock drills

Union Health Minister Mansukh Mandaviya will hold a meeting with state health ministers and union territories on Friday over rising COVID-19 cases and preparedness.

According to sources, the meeting will be held at 3 pm on Friday. This comes as Mandaviya

made a suo-motu statement in the Rajya Sabha on Thursday on India's preparedness. "We are constantly monitoring the situation. There are no direct flights between China and India but people come via other routes," he said.

He added that the focus is

to ensure that no unknown variant of the virus enters India and at the same time there is no impediment to travelling.

On Wednesday, Prime Minister Narendra Modi held a high-level meeting wherein he directed officials to strengthen the ongoing surveillance measures, especially at international airports. Modi had also urged people to follow Covid-appropriate behaviour, including wearing masks in crowded public places, especially in view of the upcoming festive season.

Meanwhile, government hospitals across the country will hold mock drills from Tuesday. Union Health Minister Mansukh Mandaviya will also visit a government hospital in Delhi for

the drill.

The Union Health Ministry added that it is preparing fresh guidelines for Christmas and New Year, reported ANI.

The Centre has also approved nasal vaccines which will be used as a heterologous booster. The needle-free vaccine will be available first in private hospitals. It will be included in COVID 19 vaccination program from Friday, according to official sources. It will be introduced on the Co-WIN platform on Friday evening, they said. The nasal vaccine -- BBV154 -- received approval from the Drugs Controller General of India in November for restricted use in an emergency for those above 18 as a heterologous booster dose.



World Cup 2022: FIFA reviews chef Salt Bae's 'undue access' to hold trophy

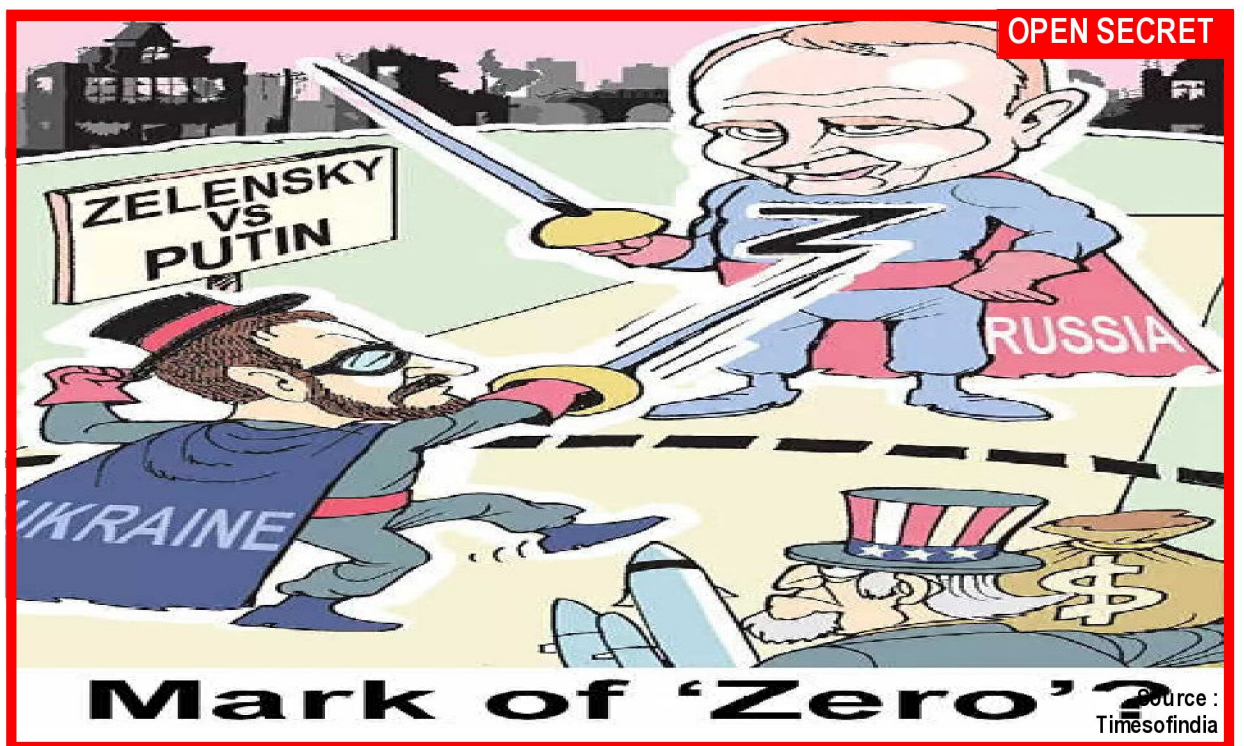
FIFA is taking appropriate internal action to address breaches of World Cup protocol by a celebrity chef who held the gold trophy on the field, football's governing body said.

Turkish chef Nusret Gökçe, who is known as Salt Bae and is regularly seen with FIFA president Gianni Infantino, mingled with Argentina players and posed for photos after their victory over France in an epic game on Sunday in Qatar.

FIFA describes the trophy as a priceless icon which can only be touched and held by a very select group of people, which includes former winners of the FIFA World Cup and heads of state.

Following a review, FIFA has been establishing how individuals gained undue access to the pitch after the closing ceremony at Lusail stadium on December 18, the world football body said.

The appropriate internal action will be taken. The chef, who has a restaurant in Doha, was a regular guest of FIFA with VIP access during the World Cup and posted photos and video clips on social media. After Argentina's win in a penalty shoot-out following a thrilling 3-3 draw, he was filmed grabbing the arm of captain Lionel Messi on the field to get his attention. The soccer great seemed irritated in the film clip though later posed for a photo that Salt Bae posted on Instagram. - Source : Theweck

Awareness prog on POCSO Act & Drug abuse with special focus on career guidance



Diglipur, Dec 23: To spread awareness about the issues related to the POCSO Act & Drug abuse with a special focus on career guidance, Office of the Superintendent of Police N & M Andaman in association with Sub-Divisional Legal Services Committee, N & M Andaman today organized an Awareness programme at Zilla Parishad Conference hall at RK Gram, Panchayat in Diglipur. Shri Jimut Bahan Biswas Hon'ble Additional District & Sessions Judge, Mayabunder was Chief Guest on this occasion and Mrs. Geetanjali Khandelval, IPS, Superintendent of Police, N & M Andaman was Guest of Honour. Various school students, teachers, and PR members witnessed this programme. School children presented Nukkan naatks on Drug Abuse, Songs, and cultural programmes. Dr. Priyanka Iqbal, (Ayurvedic Doctor) in her

speech highlighted on emphasizing the practical know-how about identifying signs of abuse and knowing the POCSO act. Addressing the gathering, SP N & M Andaman explained the key features of the POCSO Act like Sexual Assault, Sexual Harassment, Pornography, and related sections, and the Punishment of the Act. Stages of the judicial process work in a child-friendly mechanism, which includes reporting, recording, and investigation of evidence were also highlighted to the children. The Children were encouraged to stand up for their own safety and security in order to prevent crime against children. She called for spreading awareness of POCSO and Juvenile Justice Act for wider dissemination. SP explained the ill effects of drugs and alcohol and motivated the students to spread the awareness message to their friends, peers, and family members. She encouraged students to get help from their parents and teachers when they face difficult life situations as adults tend to provide better life advice than their peers. Additional District & Sessions Judge in his speech expressed that the right kind of understanding needs to be given, in the form of legal awareness among children/students so that society can simultaneously protect minor boys, who due to their lack of understanding of the law, turn into

offenders in serious matters." Hon'ble Judge sensitized the children on POCSO related issues as child sexual abuse is a concern that is being reported daily and children being the most vulnerable section of society are susceptible to physical, psychological, and emotional abuse. Said during the interactive session held at the end of the programme with students, PRI, and the Press. Students questioned various career aspects questioned during this session. AD&SJ on this occasion declared that no case of POCSO is pending in N & M Andaman District and it is a POCSO Free District. It is a great achievement on the part of the District Police that no case of POCSO was initiated in 2021. He asked to make aware that during the pending case there is a provision for applying for compensation by the victim which can be made through Ld. Advocate. He also urged the administration to look into the creation of CWC in the N & M District. He added that in Diglipur and Rangat areas Narcotics cases are increasing which should be diminished as early as possible by awarding punishment. The programme was attended by various school students, teachers, and PRI Members. Similar programmes were also conducted in different other schools in N & M Andaman district.
