Essential maternal health services are provided on 9th of every month at identified Public Health Facilities in A&N Islands

Port Blair, Feb. 19

The Pradhan Mantri Surakshit Matritva Abhiyan (PMSMA) has been launched by the Ministry of Health & Family Welfare (M o H F W), Government of India aimed at providing assured, comprehensive and quality antenatal care, free of cost, universally to all pregnant women on the 9th of every month. The PMSMA launched in the year 2016 guarantees a minimum package of antenatal care services to women in their 2nd / 3rd trimesters of pregnancy at



designated government health facilities and it envisages to improve the quality and coverage of Antenatal Care (ANC) including diagnostics and counselling services as part of the Reproductive Maternal Neonatal

Child and Adolescent Health (R M N C H + A) Strategy.

As per the data provided by Directorate of Health Services, the PMSMA has been implemented in A&N Islands on 9th September, 2016. On

9th day of every month all essential maternal health services are provided at identified public health facilities including examination by Medical Officers. Under this scheme, a total number of 2356 pregnant women

were examined during April 2021 to December 2021 and 111 pregnant women with high risk were referred to G.B Pant Hospital during the same period.

PMSMA helps in providing quality ANC including complete set of investigations like such as HB, Urine Albumin, VDRL, OGTT including ultrasound for each pregnant woman. These facilitates timely detection, referral, treatment and follow-up of high risk pregnancies and ensure that all pregnant women complete their scheduled Antenatal Care visit.

Advisory to general public and tourist in view of inclement weather

COVID-19 status in A&N Islands No positive case detected during RT-PCR test conducted on incoming flight passengers

Port Blair, Feb. 19

During the RT-PCR test conducted on 282 passengers who arrived here by flight yesterday, no positive case has been detected. Today, 13 flights with 2105 passengers arrived, out of which, 1793 passengers were vaccinated with both doses while RT-PCR test was conducted on

302 passengers (8 foreign travellers) and the reports are awaited.

During RAT conducted on 35 passengers bound for North & Middle Andaman at Ferrargunj, one positive case has been detected. At Mohanpura Bus Terminus, test was conducted on 37

passengers and no positive case has been detected. At Phoenix Bay Jetty, 43 passengers were tested with RAT and no positive case has been detected. At Helipad, 2 passengers were tested with RAT, no positive case has been detected, a press release from Directorate of IP&T said.

Comprehensive Economic Partnership Agreement will open up new opportunities to India in field of Infrastructure, Aviation, Finance and Ports: Minister

New Delhi, Feb. 19

Commerce and Industry Minister, Shri Piyush Goyal today said that the Comprehensive Economic Partnership Agreement (CEPA) between India and UAE will create a minimum 10 lakh jobs for youth of the country. Addressing a press conference in Mumbai, Shri Goyal said, the agreement will help in making the country self-reliant, and will also provide job opportunities to the youth of India in a big way. He said, UAE has a very high dependence on skilled manpower from outside, adding that India is thinking of going for mutual recognition of professional bodies

such as chartered accountants. Similarly, for different professions, similar agreements between educational institutions too would be looked at, he said.

He said, through this agreement both the countries will do trade worth 7.5 lakh crore rupees for a period of next five years, adding that both the countries are also looking at aligning in the education sector.

The Minister said, 90 per cent products exported from India will have zero duty in UAE. Some of the products which were listed out are textile which includes readymade garments, pharmaceutical

products, agriculture products, food processing products, footwear, leather, sports and engineering goods, gems and jewellery and all those products which come from labour oriented sector.

Shri Goyal also said that there is a pool of talent in fintech, greentech, automation and artificial intelligence in India and as a reason the economic partnership agreement will prove to be more beneficial.

He informed that medicines which have been approved in developed countries like the USA, Canada, Australia and UK will be allowed to sell in

UAE in 90 days after submitting the application. This, he said, will also provide new opportunity to the India's pharmaceutical industry.

With regards to the steel sector, he said that unless the steel is not melted in the UAE, it won't be called as the country of origin. He said, the certification of the country of origin will be given by the UAE Government. He further said that India is right on its track to achieve the target of 400 million dollars, as he said that till 14th of this month country's exports have reached 350 million dollars, by eclipsing all the previous records. FPOs to Play Key Role in Making India Millet Hub of the World Seminar at India Pavilion in Expo-2020 Dubai showcases India's export potential of Millets and ways to upscale the value chain

New Delhi, Feb. 19 (PIB)

As part of the ongoing 'Food, Agriculture and Livelihood' fortnight, the India Pavilion at EXPO-2020 hosted a seminar - 'India: Millets production and upscaling value chain' on Friday. Senior government officials and sector experts deliberated on opportunities for Indian industry players producing and processing millets, to enhance the export potential of the country during the session.

Speaking at the session, Dr. Abhilash Likhi, Additional Secretary, Ministry of Agriculture & Farmers Welfare said, "We urge the startups and Farmer Producer Organizations (FPOs) to not only help in upscaling millets' value chain, connecting to domestic and international markets but also to creating an inclusive framework where we take producing communities along."

The UN General Assembly adopted a resolution sponsored by India and supported by over 70 nations declaring 2023 as the 'International Year of Millets', aimed at raising awareness about the health benefits of the grain and its suitability for cultivation under changing climatic conditions.

Ms. Shubha Thakur, Joint Secretary (Crops & Oil Seeds), Ministry of Agriculture and Farmers Welfare shared, "Keeping in view the International Year of Millets, we are trying to build momentum for the millets



campaign by highlighting its nutritional benefits and value chain." Underlining the nutritional security aspect of millets, Dr. B Dayakar Rao, CEO, Nutrihub, said, "Millets have health benefits and can reduce obesity and malnutrition. It is well marked on vitamins, minerals and phytochemicals and it also helps beat hypertension, colon cancer and cardiovascular diseases as it reduces triglycerides present in the body." He added, "Now with the onset of the International Year of millets, India is ready to lead the world by sharing best practices, technologies, the goodness of millets and established values and experience with other countries."

Shri Kuntal Sensarma, Economic Advisor, Ministry of Food Processing Industries (MoFPI), talked about the policy incentives in this sector and said, "Two of our suggestions to the Union Ministry of Finance for this year's budget have been accepted to strengthen the sector and create necessary

policy environment. One was in the context of the International Year of Millets for 2023 based on major programmatic interventions and the other one on the Production Linked Incentive (PLI) scheme and formalization of micro-enterprises."

Deliberating on upscaling the value chain of millets, Dr. C Anandharamkrishnan, Director, NIFTEM shared, "There is a need to formalize the unorganized food processing system by providing the FPOs, SHGs and co-operatives with technical support, credit linkages and ensuring adequate storage capacity to avoid food wastage."

Multiple startups and FPOs are participating in the 'Food, Agriculture and Livelihood' fortnight and displaying their innovative agri tech solutions and, sustainable and healthy millets-based products. The 'Food, Agriculture and Livelihood' fortnight will conclude on March, 2nd.

India gets proposals worth Rs 1.5 lakh crore for semiconductor, display fabs: MeitY

New Delhi, Feb. 19

The Semicon India Programme which has been approved with an outlay of 76 thousand crore rupees has elicited good response from the industry. In order to widen and deepen electronic manufacturing and ensure development of a robust and sustainable Semiconductor and Display ecosystem in the country, the Union Cabinet had approved the Programme in December last year.

Ministry of Electronics and IT said, India Semiconductor Mission, ISM which has been set up as a dedicated institution for Semicon India Programme, has received 5 applications for Semiconductor and Display Fabs.

It entails a total investment to the tune of over one lakh 53 thousand crore rupees. Three companies have submitted proposals for semiconductor fabs and two companies for display

fabs. Vedanta in Joint Venture with Foxconn, IGSS ventures PTE, Singapore and ISMC have submitted applications for Semiconductor Fabs. Vedanta and Elest have submitted applications for Display Fabs. The applicant companies under the Semiconductor and Display Fab Schemes have been issued acknowledgment by this Mission. ISM will coordinate with the applicant companies who have also reached out to states to provide access to world class infrastructure.

It will work closely with the state governments to establish high-tech clusters with 300 to 500 acres of developed land, 100 Kilo Volt Ampere Power, 50 Million Litre Per Day Water, availability of natural gases and common



facility centres for testing and certification. The first round of applications was invited till 15th of this month for establishment of Semiconductor and Display Fabs. Semicon India Programme is building on the successes of Digital India Programme and Make in India Programme in electronics manufacturing sector. (Source: india.gov.in)

Govt. approves continuation of Capacity Development Scheme till March 2026

Government has approved the continuation of the Capacity Development (CD) Scheme till 31st of March, 2026. Ministry of Statistics and Programme Implementation in a statement said that the outlay approved for the continuation of the Scheme during 15th Finance Commission cycle is 3 thousand 179 crore

rupees. The Capacity Development Scheme is an Ongoing Central Sector Scheme of the Ministry with an overall objective to augment infrastructural, technical as well as manpower resources for enabling availability of credible and timely official statistics. The Scheme encompasses all statistical and data management

activities of the Ministry and plays a crucial role in generation and maintenance of official statistical system of the country.

The large-scale sample surveys undertaken by the Ministry cover important aspects of the economy and provide data inputs for policy framing of the Government. (Source: india.gov.in)

SAI extends employment offer to 398 coaches, to prepare for Olympic 2024 and 2028

New Delhi, Feb. 19

The Sports Authority of India under the Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports has extended offers of employment to 398 coaches at various levels in 21 disciplines. Many among them are former international athletes and Arjuna awardees who have competed or won medals in elite competitions such as the World Championships and Olympics. Of the total 398, 101 coaches are joining on deputation from PSUs and other government bodies.

The recruitment comes in the wake of the effort of the Sports Ministry to provide 360 degree support to athletes as they prepare for important national and international competitions, including Olympic 2024 and 2028.

Sports Minister, Shri Anurag Thakur expressed happiness that a number of former athletes who have competed at the highest

international level of competition and won medals have applied for these posts and have been selected. He said, their inclusion in the system will mean that besides training athletes in the sport itself, they will be able to train them for mental toughness which is the key to success when competing at the world stage.

The new batch of coaches and assistant coaches has a host of eminent names, including Padma Shri and Arjuna Awardee Bajrang Lal Thakur who is a gold medallist at the Asian Games and joins as a Rowing coach, Shilpi Sheoran who has won the gold in the Commonwealth championship in 2011 and joins as an assistant coach in Wrestling, Olympian Jincy Phillip who joins as an Athletics coach, Pranamika Borah multiple medallist in leading international championships who joins as a Boxing coach.



There are 4 Arjuna Awardees, 1 Dhyan Chand Awardee and 1 Dhronacharya Awardee among those who have been selected for the positions.

Besides ex-international athletes, those who have completed their Diploma in Sports Coaching from NSNIS Patiala or a recognized Indian or foreign University have also been inducted. Several SAI coaches who were previously on contract, but whose contracts had ended, have been recruited back in service, as per their eligibility.

India wins bid to host 2023 International Olympic Committee session in Mumbai

Mumbai, Feb. 19

India won the right to host the 2023 IOC session in Mumbai during the 139th IOC session that was held in Beijing, China, on the sidelines of the Winter Olympics. This will be the second time India hosts an IOC session, having done so in 1983 in New Delhi. India won the bid unopposed. Olympic gold medallist, Shri Abhinav Bindra, IOC Member, Miss Nita Ambani, IOA President Shri Narinder Batra and Sports Minister, Shri Anurag Thakur presented India's proposal for the hosting rights at this year's IOC Session today. India won the bid after 75



members voted in favour of Mumbai while one voted against it. The general meeting of the Members of the International Olympic Committee is held at least once every year. Important

decisions regarding host cities for upcoming events, inclusion or exclusion of sports and federations and changes in the Olympic Charter are made at the IOC Sessions.
