### Gurdwara explosion

Three persons were killed on Sunday in an explosion in Gurdwara Gurdarshan Prakash at Mehta Chowk, headquarters of Sant Jarnail Singh Bhindranwale. At the time of the explosion, the Sant was away in Barer village in Gadagpur district. He returned to his headquarters, about 40 km from Amritsar, on hearing about the incident. The explosion brought down a major part of the gurdwara complex. The three dead were disciples of Sant Bhindranwale. A case under section 302 IPC and section 4 of the Indian Explosives Act was registered on a complaint lodged by Dhara Singh, a confidant of the Sant and establishment in-charge at the gurdwara. The explosion, which occurred at 12.30 pm, killed Jaswant Singh (20), Sukhmandir Singh (13) and Gajjan Singh (27). It destroyed the community kitchen in the gurdwara.

Assam tense

The Army stood by to help the civil administration and CRPF units were deployed at sensitive points in Assam on Sunday, on the eve of the 13-hour "Rasta roko" programme beginning at 5 am on Monday. This is the first time since the suspension of the stir last year that the agitation leadership has asked the people to agitate actively in the face of heavy police arrangement and the possibility of violence. The Governor of Assam and Meghalaya, Prakash Mehrotra, has already announced that all highways will be kept open.

# UK EXTENDS COVID-19 BOOSTER VACCINE TO ALL ADULTS, REDUCES GAP BETWEEN DOSES

The UK government on Monday announced to expand its COVID-19 booster vaccination programme, accepting the updated advice from scientists to extend the offer of a third top-up vaccine dose to all adults over the age of 18 and also to halve the minimum gap between second and third doses from six to three months.

UK Health Secretary Sajid Javid told the House of Commons that he had accepted the Joint Committee on Vaccination and Immunisation (JCVI) advice in full because vaccines remain the best line of defence against COVID-19, including the new Omicron variant.

The minister stressed that while there is little knowledge about the new variant, it is unlikely that vaccines would not at least prevent severe disease.

"In this race between the vaccines and the virus, the new variant may have given the virus extra legs," Javid told Parliament.

Against this backdrop of the new variant, he wants to go further and faster [booster dose change] represents a huge step up for our vaccination programme. Amalouding the number of people who will be able to get a booster dose to protect themselves and

their loved ones, he said. The minister reiterated that COVID-19 has not gone away and that it is expected that the number of Omicron variant cases will rise in the UK over the coming days from the current figure of 11.

The new variant has now been reported in many countries, including Austria, Belgium, the Czech Republic, Denmark, Germany, Italy, the

threat of the new, highly transmissible variant of COVID-19.

Earlier, the JCVI confirmed that its updated advice to expand the booster vaccine programme is intended to increase the body's immunity while scientists around the world study the makeup of the new Omicron variant, first detected in southern Africa.

Among other updated recommendations, the JCVI also

advise that children aged 12 to 15 should be invited for a second jab three months after their first and severely immunosuppressed people should be offered a fourth dose of a COVID-19 vaccine over and above three

previous doses.

"Having a booster dose of the vaccine will help to increase our level of protection against the Omicron variant, Professor Wei Shen Lim, JCVI chair, said at Downing Street briefing on Monday.

This is an important way for us to reduce the impact of this variant on our lives, especially in the coming months. We want to provide boosters early enough, before any possible wave, he explained.

Early evidence suggests the new Omicron variant initially reported to the World Health Organisation (WHO) from South Africa last Wednesday has a higher re-infection risk and it remains unclear how effective the current vaccines will prove against it.

England's Deputy chief medical officer, Professor Jonathan Van-Tam, said scientists around the world agree that the Omicron variant is "of increased concern", but stressed that there remains a "high degree of current uncertainty" about it.

I want to be clear that this is not all doom and gloom at this stage and I don't want people to panic at this stage, said Van-Tam.

"If vaccine effectiveness is reduced as seems pretty likely to some

extent, the biggest effects are likely to be in preventing infections and hopefully there will be smaller effects on preventing severe disease. But that is something that there for scientists to work out in the next few weeks, he said, adding that the booster campaign is of vital importance in preparing for what is from the new kid on the block Omicron.

The UK Medicines and Healthcare products Regulatory Agency (MHRA) Chief Executive, Dr. June Raine, added that their thorough vaccine review and monitoring had shown that it is safe for those aged 12 to 15 to have a second vaccine dose.

"Our message to people aged 12-15 is that it is safe to have a second dose of the Pfizer vaccine and if you're called to receive your second dose, please go and take that offer. It will ensure that you're further protected from COVID-19, said Raine.

Meanwhile, it is hoped that tighter measures such as compulsory face coverings in shops, public transport and other indoor settings could buy more time for scientists to gain a greater understanding of the new COVID variant. The measure along with compulsory PCR tests for incoming international travellers will be in force across the UK from early on Tuesday.

## Agromet bulletin for farmers

Port Blair, Nov 30: The Central India Agricultural Research Institute has released the agromet bulletin for farmers for the period from Dec 1 to Dec 5. In the bulletin, CIARI broadcasted weather with moderate to very heavy rainfall in the next five days in Andaman and Nicobar Islands. The maximum temperature will be 29.2 to 31.5°C with minimum temperature of 22.9 to 24.6°C, whereas the maximum and minimum relative humidity is expected to be in the range of 76 to 82% and 67 to 79%, respectively in Andaman and Nicobar Islands. Wind speed of 13.0 to 48.8 kmph is expected mostly from South Easterly direction. In South Andaman (Blocks: Prothupur, Little Andaman and Ferraguni), farmers have been advised to avoid sowing of harvested paddy as heavy rainfall is expected during

2nd and 3rd Dec 2021, harvest the matured vegetables and take it to the nearby market to avoid losses due to rain, do proping to the fruit bearing paddy and banana plants, specially grown in upland and embankments of ponds, place net around the pond and keep open bunds to remove excess water as heavy rainfall is expected and keep the poultry litter dry during wet condition to avoid infection and mortality.

Farmers in North and Middle Andaman (Blocks: Rangat, Mayabunder and Diglipur) have been advised to avoid open sowing of harvested paddy as heavy rainfall is expected during 2nd and 3rd Dec 2021, harvest all the matured vegetables and take it to the nearby market to avoid losses due to rain, do proping to the fruit bearing paddy and banana plants, specially grown

## Crypto bill: Old legislation reworked, new law after cabinet approval says Sitharaman

Will cryptocurrencies be banned or regulated in India—if so, how, and what would come under its ambit? Such questions have haunted India's crypto investors even since it became clear that "private cryptocurrencies" would be prohibited under a soon-to-be tabled legislation. But a clear answer on its ambit was not given on Tuesday, when Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman addressed the Rajya Sabha during the Winter Session of parliament. However, the FM said the proposed bill would be a new one, reworked from the earlier bill.

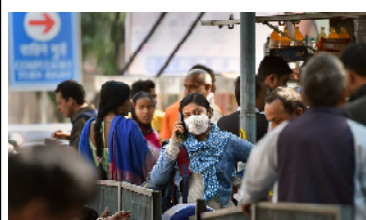
advertisements and whether they would be banned, she said the guidelines and regulations of the Advertisement Standards Council of India (ASCI) were being looked into so that the Centre could take a decision on it. She said that cryptocurrencies were unregulated in India and that the government does not collect data on its transactions. She noted that the Reserve Bank of India and the Securities and Exchange Board of India had been cautioning the public about cryptocurrencies being a "high risk" area, and said more could be done to create awareness. She also said that the Centre was monitoring the non-fungible token (NFT) space too. The description of the Cryptocurrency and Regulation of Official Digital Currency Bill, 2021, had proposed a ban on "private currencies", with exceptions to "promote the underlying technology

of cryptocurrency and its uses". The description also proposed the creation of a "facilitative framework" for creation of the official digital currency to be issued by the Reserve Bank of India. An earlier form of a bill mooted in the last parliament session, titled the "Draft Banning of Cryptocurrency & Regulation of Official Digital Currency Bill, 2019", had sought to "prohibit mining, holding, selling, trade, issuance, disposal or use of cryptocurrency in the country". The penalties provided under it included a fine and/or imprisonment up to ten years. It also stipulated that holders of cryptocurrencies would have to declare and dispose of them within 90 days of the commencement of the Act. Nischal Shetty, CEO of crypto exchange WazirX, took an optimistic note on Twitter, saying it was "good to see some crypto talk by our FM".

## 5G growing but no signs of when it will roll out in India

In less than a month's time, the number of 5G subscriptions globally will cross the six crore mark. The

most recent one taking place last week. Vodafone-Idea also followed suit with a test, claiming speeds



number of subscribers from India? Zilch.

Worse, there is no indication as to when services will roll out in the country, with equipment, clearances and implementation all still in a state of limbo. Reliance chairman Mukesh Ambani had declared way back in 2020 that Jio would launch 5G using indigenous technology by the second half of this year. Airtel has also been conducting 5G

of up to 3.7ghps.

However, forget this year, indications are that the best case scenario of 5G services rolling out in the country in the first half of next year also remains to be seen. The auction of spectrum has been delayed multiple times by the government, and not just due to the pandemic.

Another vexing issue has been the delay in required approvals. Ericsson, the

leading global 5G equipment maker which is working with at least two out of the three leading mobile operators in the country, said on Tuesday that the company has no timeline on when 5G would be put in place. Country head Nitin Bansal admitted that the company has no idea when its 5G infra would get the crucial security clearance from the government before they could be installed by the mobile operators.

Ericsson, along with Nokia and Cisco, had got the "trusted sources" nod in November, but have yet to get the next level of clearance, "Trusted Product", by the National Cyber Security Coordinator, Tejas Networks, owned by a Tata group company, is the only Indian domestic telecom equipment vendor to have got the first level of "Trusted Source" approval. China's Huawei is yet to get any approval. The first list of "trusted products" is likely to be announced this month.

## Omicron scare: Centre calls for rigorous testing of international travellers till Dec 31

With new challenges posed by the COVID-19 virus mutation, Union Home Secretary A.K. Bhalla is once again at the apex—steering the government's efforts to battle the pandemic for another year. Bhalla on Tuesday said the government has decided to undertake rigorous screening and testing of all international travellers arriving from "at-risk" countries till December 31.

As more countries report cases of the Omicron variant of the coronavirus, the government is exercising powers under the Disaster Management Act to enforce "prompt and effective containment measures" issued by the union health ministry, he said in an order. States and union territories will not undertake rigorous screening and testing of international passengers till New Year, but samples of travellers who tested positive will be sent to designated INSACOG genome sequencing laboratories (IGSL). State surveillance officers have been asked to ensure there is close coordination with the IGSLs for expediting the genetic analysis results. The contacts of these travellers will be also tracked and tested as per the health ministry guidelines, said the MHA in its order. States are also being asked to promptly implement public health measures in case of detection of variants of concern. The National Centre for Disease Control has reported multiple cases of the Omicron variant including three in Botswana, six in South Africa and one in Hong Kong. This variant is reported to have a large number of mutations, warned the health ministry, adding that it has serious health implications for the country in view of recently relaxed visa restrictions and opening up of international travel. The Union Home Secretary, who is the chairperson of the National Executive Committee (NEC) under the Disaster Management Act, coordinates measures and issue guidelines to prevent COVID-19 in the country. Recently, the government extended Bhalla's tenure till August 2022. In the last two years, the NEC has been issuing guidelines about lockdown and unlock phases in the country. After handling pressures of the first and second COVID-19 waves, Bhalla has an arduous task ahead once again—balancing travel restrictions in the face of an emerging mutavirulent strain.

# CHILD HEALTH AND NUTRITION IMPROVES, BUT LONG WAY TO GO TO ACHIEVE SDG TARGETS IN TIME: CRY

Analysing the fifth phase finding of the National Family Health Survey (NFHS-5), child rights organisation Child Rights and You (CRY) said though some improvements in child health and nutrition indicators in the country are heartening, there is still a long way to go in reaching the Sustainable Development Goals (SDG) within the stipulated time of 2022 and 2030 respectively.

The CRY analysed entire NFHS data, released in two phases by the Union government. Recently, data for 14 states and Union territories have been released while data of other 22 states and UTs had been released in December 2020.

Puja Marwaha, chief executive officer of CRY, said in a statement, "There are some positive trends in child mortality rates, but the progress falls short of achieving SDG targets - thus providing an early warning sign of delay in fulfilling commitments in ensuring long term gains in child nutrition. While there is some improvement in the status of birth weight, wasting and stunting, there is only a marginal increase in the percentage of children aged below three years who have been breastfed within one hour of the birth (NFHS-5 - 41.8 per cent and NFHS-4 - 41.6 per cent, a change of only 0.48 percentage points)."

"Though the percentage of low birth weight children below five years has decreased over the last five years (NFHS-5 - 19.3 per cent and NFHS-4 - 21 per cent), the percentage of under-five children who were severely wasted has actually increased (NFHS-5 - 7.7 per cent and NFHS-4 - 7.5 per cent)."

But the biggest worry, she said, is the

indicators showing rising trends of anaemia. In NFHS-4, 58.6 per cent children within the age-group of 6-59 months had been reported to be anaemic, while in NFHS-5 it is 67.1 per cent, showing an alarming rise of 14.51 per cent. The target set in the National Nutrition

Iron-folic acid (IFA) supplements by expecting mothers during their first and second trimester has shown some improvement too - NFHS-5 shows that 44.1 per cent of mothers consumed the supplements for 100 days or more during pregnancy, while the figure was 30.3 in NFHS-4. IFA supplements should reduce anaemia.

Marwaha said, "While the latest findings convey some good news in child health and nutrition, it needs more efforts across many indicators to achieve Sustainable Development Goals (SDG) targets. Let us not forget that a majority of our children still suffer from multiple forms of malnutrition and hunger, and given the fact that much of our progress might have been undone by the deadly COVID pandemic, it is critical that we do not allow it to derail the gains we have made thus far and use this opportunity to build back better and equal." For NFHS-5, data were collected in two phases - from July 2019 to 30 January 2020 and from 2 January 2020 to 30 April 2021. As the first phase of data were collected before the COVID pandemic struck, it is difficult to assess the scale and quantum of the impact caused by the pandemic on the status of child immunisation and many other child health and nutrition parameters. Marwaha pointed out. She said the situation calls for considerable increase in budget allocation for child health and nutrition. This increase, coupled with a strengthened health delivery system and a robust monitoring mechanism in reaching out to the last mile children, can help ensure healthier childhood.



Strategy of the NITI Aayog was a reduction of anaemia in children (6-59 months) from 58.4 to 19.7 by the year 2022.

The percentage of anaemic women aged 15-49 years has also increased from the last round (NFHS-5 - 59.1 per cent and NFHS-4 - 54.1 per cent, which means a growth of 9.24 per cent). The target set in the National Nutrition Strategy was reduction of anaemia in women and girls (15-49 years) from 53.1 to 17.7 by the year 2022.

"Reducing the prevalence of anaemia in women and children is important as it is also associated with chronic malnutrition, spontaneous abortions, low birth weight, neonatal and infant mortality," Marwaha said.

She pointed out an interesting and apparently contradictory trend that while maternal anaemia is on the rise, intake of

Science Festival in every city and village of India to inspire the youth in critical thinking," he said.

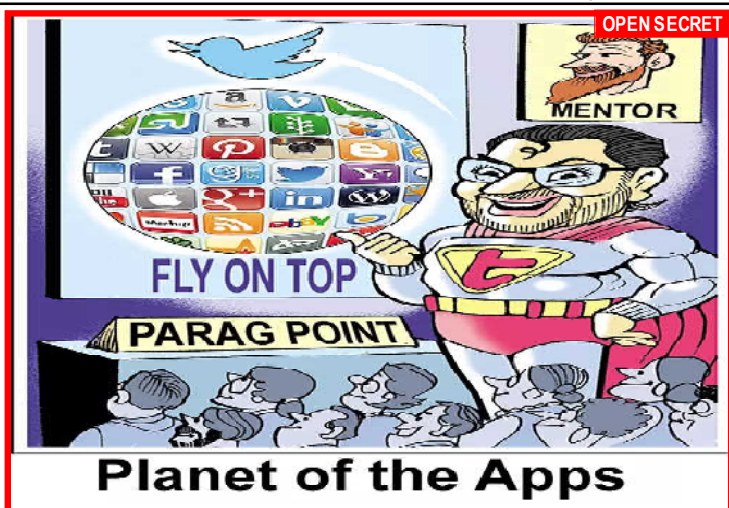
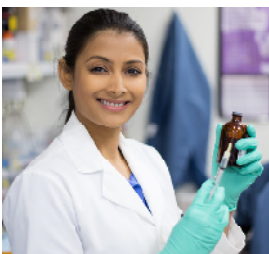
India is celebrating the 75th year of its independence and it is time to lay down the road map for the next 25 years before
