BOTH SIDES OF ROADS CAUSE HARDSHIP

Time for Traffic Police to launch one sided parking norms in main, interior roads in city

 Port Blair, May 8: Haphazardly parked vehicles on both sides of roads not only on main roads but bylines and interior roads in the city has become a cause of concern for the residents and motorists alike. Residents say the already-narrow bylanes have become more congested due to parking of vehicles on both sides of this lane. Vehicles of local residents remain parked in a haphazard manner and still no action is taken to clear the roads. People have to commute in the narrow stretch of road every day for office in cars and with vehicles parked on both sides of this narrow stretch of road, navigation becomes tricky for the residents. The narrow stretch of bylines and some residents parking their vehicles on both sides of the roads is leading to a lot of hardship for both motorists and pedestrians. The interiors areas in the city witnessing major traffic chaos due to parking of vehicles on both sides of roads includes Lillypur, Telugu Basti Barack (Haddo), Buniyadabad junction, Musilim Basti, Delanipur market area, Premnagar, Daryfarm Junction Lal brijin, Ranchi Tikiri, Dignabad, Round basti, sistnagar, Seashore road, phoenix Bay area, phongy kyung etc. Another issue is the absence of proper parking places in the city and also in interior roads leaving severe traffic jams not only in major roads, but in bylines and interior roads. Motorists parked their vehicles on both sides of the road leaving traffic movement reduced to a crawl during busy hours. Chaotic parking by motorists chock the traffic movement during school and evening hours. Due to lack of parking sense among the motorists and traffic Police unable to launch a system wherein motorists are told to park their vehicles on one side of the road even if it is not the main roads, parking chaos will always show its ugly face. With traffic jams becoming the order of the day in major roads in the city, bylines and interior roads are also witnessing jams and people park their vehicles on both sides of the roads. "Motorists, both cars and two wheelers stupidly park their vehicles on roadside on both sides and go for the shopping which is leading to choking of roads at any time of the day", said a resident. Motorists, including two wheeler drivers having no fear of the Traffic Police and little respect for the traffic flow, park their vehicles on both sides of roads, causing nuisance to the smooth flow of traffic as well as pedestrians", said Danny, a shopkeeper. Roads are actually meant for traffic flow and not for parking of vehicles. Since motorists care too much for the traffic cops, they park their vehicles in a haphazard manner. What is needed is serious drives to educate the motorists not to park the vehicles in haphazard manner, said another resident. The traffic Police should come up with a plan and enforce one sided parking not only on major roads, but bylines and interior roads in the city.

What will be left

After being made to perform open-heart surgery, assemble cars, build houses, steer traffic, clean up messes and mind babies and pets, robots will now be made to taste food. The scientists at Cambridge University who are developing a robot chef claim that the machine is being given the ability to "taste" so that it can determine whether or not the food it has prepared is "enjoyable". But considering that human beings can rarely agree on what tastes good and what doesn't — one man's delicious Lakhavi biryani is another's bland mess — what objective standards are there for a robot to perform this task?

A quick tour of social media will make clear the near impossibility of the robot's task: Take, for instance, the Great Indian Mango Debate that breaks out on Twitter every summer without fail. What should the AI chef do in the face of such polarised opinions? Should it use an Alphonso to make the mango cheesecake, and risk alienating Dassehri and Langda fanatics? It could even be argued that chasing this dream of a perfectly enjoyable meal cooked by AI will end up depriving human beings of that most cherished of conversational topics: Complaining about food. Put food-tasting robots in charge of meals and no longer will there be opportunities to sling an over-seasoned soup back to the kitchen.

Then there is the larger question of whether or not every meal even needs to be "enjoyable". After all, there is something to be said for a bland or milky chai — to take one example — that ends up sharpening one's appreciation of a cup that has just the right ratio of tea, sugar and milk. Indeed, a robot chef might serve plate after plate of "enjoyable" food, but if there's nothing against which to measure the joy it gives the human who eats it, everything would be mere bland perfection.

TATA STEEL TO GROW ORGANICALLY, NEW ACQUISITIONS UNLIKELY THIS DECADE: MD

Tata Steel Ltd will look to grow organically, and the steel giant is under no pressure to look at fresh acquisitions during this decade, chief executive officer and managing director T.V. Narendran said.

Narendran said that the Jamshedpur-based behemoth will fuel its growth ambitions to more than double its output, relying on organic growth at its existing sites.

"Most of our growth in the last few years has been through the inorganic route (acquisitions). Currently, we are in a position where all our growth ambitions can be met through organic growth in our existing sites. We don't really need to acquire any new assets to grow (output) to 40-50MTPA (million tonnes per annum) from the present level of 20MTPA. We will rely more on organic growth during this decade," Narendran told PTI in an interview.

Tata Steel had reported production of 19.06 million tonnes in the 2021-2022 fiscal.

The steel behemoth had acquired Bhushan Steel in 2018, followed by Usha Martin in 2019. It is also on course to complete the acquisition of Neelachal Ispat Nigam Ltd (NINL) by the end of the April-June quarter.

Elaborating on the expansion plans of the company, he said the



NINL output will be ramped up to 10MTPA from 1MTPA, while the Kalinganagar plant will see an expansion to 8MTPA from 3MTPA, and later to 16MTPA.

"So there are huge opportunities and plans being made," he asserted.

Speaking of Tata Steel's decision to stop coal imports from Russia following its invasion of Ukraine, Narendran said the company is aware that the same quantity can be easily sourced from other countries.

"We typically buy close to 15MT of coal annually, of which around 3MT used to come from Russia, which can be easily be sourced from countries like Australia, Indonesia

and Canada," he said.

Prohibitive insurance and shipping costs from Russia and Ukraine have made trade with those countries difficult for most partners.

Narendran also ruled out the possibility of hiking steel prices further, as rates were raised earlier this year after the Russia-Ukraine crisis started.

"Most of the steel price increase happened in February-April. Right now, costs are stable, so steel prices are stable. We are comfortable with that," the top Tata Steel official said.

He said steel prices in India are likely to be Rs 8,000-8,500 per tonne higher in the first quarter of 2022-23 as compared with the fourth quarter of last fiscal.

Narendran said the demand-supply situation in the steel industry is more balanced at present and this will continue for some time.

"We are now at a stage where a few things have changed: One is China is no longer exporting as much steel as it used to in the past, other big exporting countries like Japan and Korea are also reducing shipments, because they don't want to import raw materials, leave a carbon footprint and export steel. Therefore, we're seeing a greater restraint being exercised by most countries, which have traditionally been big exporters. In Europe, Ukraine and Russia have also been large exporters, but owing to this war, they are also not in the market," he

explained.

Narendran said steel consumption will continue to grow in India, Southeast Asia and Africa, whereas demand in mature markets is likely to be sombre.

"India is fundamentally a good place to manufacture steel," he said, as it has iron ore, unlike most of the other big, steel-producing countries. "Also, much of the iron ore is in some of the poorest parts of India. Therefore, it has a great opportunity to create steel capacities, jobs and also be an exporter."

He, however, said India's steel demand has traditionally grown at less than the GDP growth rate, whereas in developing countries, consumption should ideally grow at a faster clip than the GDP.

Narendran also expressed apprehension about the crude steel production target of 300MT by 2030 as envisioned in the National Steel Policy, 2017.

"I don't think 300MT by 2030 is realistic, because we have lost three-four years due to the pandemic and other factors. Even if it grows at 7-8 per cent a year, you will be in the 200-250MT range. That would be a more realistic estimate," he said.

India produced around 120MT of crude steel during the financial year ended March 31.

'No externship': MBBS students must complete internships in same institute, MUHS clarifies

New Delhi, May 08: The Maharashtra University of Health Sciences (MUHS) has clarified that MBBS students will have to complete their internship from the college where they are pursuing their degree from this year.

The decision comes after the National Medical Commission's (NMC) released the Draft Regulations for Compulsory Rotating Internship 2021. Medical students were allowed to do 'externships' from other colleges near to their home or at colleges other than where they have enrolled in till last year.

However, the NMC has disallowed transfers to other colleges for externships. The MUHS has clarified the same and informed candidates that they will have to do internships from the same college, as per the circular issued on Monday.



The MUHS circular read, "The provision made available to students until last year where one could pursue their internship at other universities in India, including deemed universities/colleges in Maharashtra, is now being discontinued. Students will have to complete their 12-month internship at the university they are enrolled in."

As per the Draft Regulations for Compulsory Rotating Internship 2021 issued by the NMC in July 2021, "All Indian Medical

Graduates shall complete their entire period of compulsory rotating internship training (CRMI) in the institution where they have pursued and completed their Bachelor of Medicine and Bachelor of Surgery (MBBS)."

However, in the event of any difficulty due to the current pandemic situation, this internship can be completed at another NMC-approved medical college hospital, the notice which was released by the NMC in November read. (Source-Career 360)

The survey finds that 32% of married women (18-49 years) have experienced physical, sexual, or emotional spousal violence. The most common type of spousal violence is physical violence (28%), followed by emotional violence and sexual violence.

Domestic violence against women is highest in Karnataka at 48%, followed by Bihar, Telangana, Manipur and Tamil Nadu. Lakshadweep has the least domestic violence at 2.1%.

The experience of physical

violence is more common among women in rural areas (32%) as compared to their counterparts in urban areas (24%) and a woman's experience of violence declines sharply with increased schooling and wealth — both for the female victim, as well as the male perpetrator.

The survey says, 40% women with no schooling are subject to physical violence compared to 18% who completed their schooling. The experience of physical violence ranges between 39% among women in the lowest wealth quintile and 17% in the highest wealth quintile.

In over 80% cases of

physical violence against women, the perpetrator is the husband. Husbands who have completed 12 or more years of schooling are half as likely (21%) to commit physical, sexual, or emotional spousal violence as those with no schooling (43%). "Experience of spousal physical or sexual violence varies greatly with the level of the husband's alcohol consumption. 70% of women whose husbands often get drunk have experienced spousal physical or sexual violence, compared with 23% of those whose husbands do not drink," says the report. Vaccination- shield against the virus

Port Blair, May 08: The vaccination drive is continuing smoothly in A&N Islands. As per data available, a total of 6,77,491 beneficiaries in the age group of 18 and above have been vaccinated so far in A&N Islands. Similarly, 23,454 beneficiaries have been vaccinated in the age group of 15 to 18 yrs. and 11,936 beneficiaries have been vaccinated in the age group of 12 to 14 yrs. The number of beneficiaries administered precautionary dose of vaccine stood at 21084. A total of 397 eligible beneficiaries were vaccinated in A&N Islands. 348 eligible beneficiaries were vaccinated in South Andaman District, out

of which 21 beneficiaries were in the age group of 12-14 years, 16 beneficiaries have been vaccinated in the age group of 15 to 18 yrs, 1 beneficiary was in the age group of 18-44 years and the number of beneficiaries administered precautionary dose of vaccine stood at 143. 37 beneficiaries were vaccinated in North & Middle Andaman District and the number of beneficiaries administered precautionary dose of vaccine stood at 36. 12 beneficiaries were vaccinated in Nicobar District and the number of beneficiaries administered precautionary dose of vaccine stood at 11. - Source : IP&T

New plant-based Covid vaccine 70 per cent effective against variants: Study

A new plant-based Covid-19 vaccine is nearly 70 per cent effective against symptomatic disease caused by five variants of the coronavirus, according to results of the human clinical trial of the preventive.

The vaccine developed by researchers at Canadian biotechnology company Medicag contains coronavirus-like particles (CoVLP) produced in plants which are combined with an adjuvant (ASO3) that helps vaccines work better.

The phase 3 trial of the vaccine was conducted at 85 centres involving 24,141 adults who were randomly assigned to receive two intramuscular injections of either the CoVLP+ASO3 vaccine or placebo 21 days apart.

The researchers confirmed Covid-19 by polymerase chain reaction (PCR) test in 165 participants.

The study, published on Thursday in the New England Journal of Medicine (NEJM), shows that the vaccine efficacy

was 69.5 per cent against any symptomatic Covid-19 caused by five variants.

In a statistical analysis, vaccine efficacy was 78.8 and 74.0 per cent against moderate-to-severe disease and among those who were seronegative at the start, respectively, the researchers said.

"The CoVLP+ASO3 vaccine was effective in preventing Covid-19 caused by a spectrum of variants, with efficacy ranging from 69.5 per cent against symptomatic infection to 78.8 per cent against moderate-to-severe disease," the authors of the study

noted.

In the vaccine group, there were no severe cases of Covid-19, the researchers said.

The median viral load for breakthrough cases was more than 100-fold lower in the vaccine group versus the placebo group, they said.

Solicited adverse events were mainly mild or moderate and transient, and occurred more frequently in the vaccine group versus placebo group, according to the researchers.

Local adverse events occurred in 92.3 and 45.5 per cent in the vaccine group and placebo



group, respectively, and systemic adverse events occurred in 87.3 and 65.0 per cent, respectively, they said.

"The potential effect of this plant-based technology in the current pandemic will be greatly influenced by the evolution of the pandemic itself," the authors noted. "However, the availability and further development of this platform could have important implications for pandemic readiness," they added.

The researchers noted that vaccine efficacy among adults who were 65 years or older could not be determined because of the limited enrollment of participants in this age group. However, previous evidence suggests that the CoVLP+ASO3 vaccine induced similar immune responses in both young and older adults, they said. Several authors of the study disclosed financial ties to Medicag and is the manufacturer of the CoVLP+ASO3 vaccine.

He assured the company of safety and said the firm has a bright future because it is in the hands of forward-looking administrators.

BRAZIL'S AMAZON DEFORESTATION HITS RECORD FOR MONTH OF APRIL

Deforestation detected in the Brazilian Amazon broke all records for the month of April, and that followed similar new records set in January and February, reflecting a worrisome uptick in destruction in a state deep within the rainforest.

Satellite alerts of deforestation for April corresponded to more than 1,000 square kilometres (nearly 400 square miles), the highest figure for that month in seven years of record-keeping and 74 per cent more than the same month in 2021, which was the prior record.

It marked the first time that deforestation alerts have surpassed 1,000 square kilometres during a month in the rainy season, which runs from December to April. "The April number is very scary. Due to the rain, it is traditionally a month with less deforestation," Suely Arajo, senior public policy specialist at the Climate Observatory, a network of environmental groups, told The Associated Press. The data come from the Brazilian space agency's Deter monitoring system, and correspond to the first 29 days of April. Full-month figures will be available next week.

Deter data previously showed 430 square kilometres of deforestation this January, more than quadruple the level in the same month last year. In February, it reached 199 square kilometres, up 62 per cent from 2021. The Amazon is the world's largest tropical rainforest and an enormous carbon sink. There is widespread concern

that its destruction will not only release massive amounts of carbon into the atmosphere, further complicating hopes of arresting climate change, but also push it past a tipping point after which much of the forest will begin an irreversible process of degradation into tropical savannah.

Amazonas state led deforestation in April, overtaking the states of both Para and Mato Grosso for only the second time on record. That is particularly worrisome, as

a former president of Brazil's environment regulator, said by phone.

Amazonas' destruction has been concentrated in the southern part of the state, where President Jair Bolsonaro has promised to pave a 400-kilometre (250-mile) dirt stretch of the BR-319 highway that connects the cities of Manaus and Porto Velho. Anticipation of the paving has generated real estate speculation alongside the highway; land grabbers engage in large-scale deforestation with the expectation that the areas will become legal for agriculture or cattle-raising in the future.

A study released last week by the BR-319 Observatory, a network of environmental non-profits, revealed a nearly 3,000-kilometre (more than 1,800 mile) network of secondary roads in reach of the highway. The roads are used primarily to get to areas desired by land grabbers and loggers.

Historically, the opening and paving of highways has been the main driver of Amazon deforestation. Easier access drives up land value and makes economic activities, especially cattle-raising, viable.

"We need a regional development model that is compatible with environmental protection. The solution is not simply paving roads," Arajo said. Governance needs to change entirely, he said, but the opposite is happening. "The Amazon is controlled by landowners, illegal loggers and miners. Crime is the reality." - Source : Theweek

"Amazonas is still a very preserved state. If deforestation explodes there, we will lose control of a region that is outside the traditional deforestation region," Arajo,

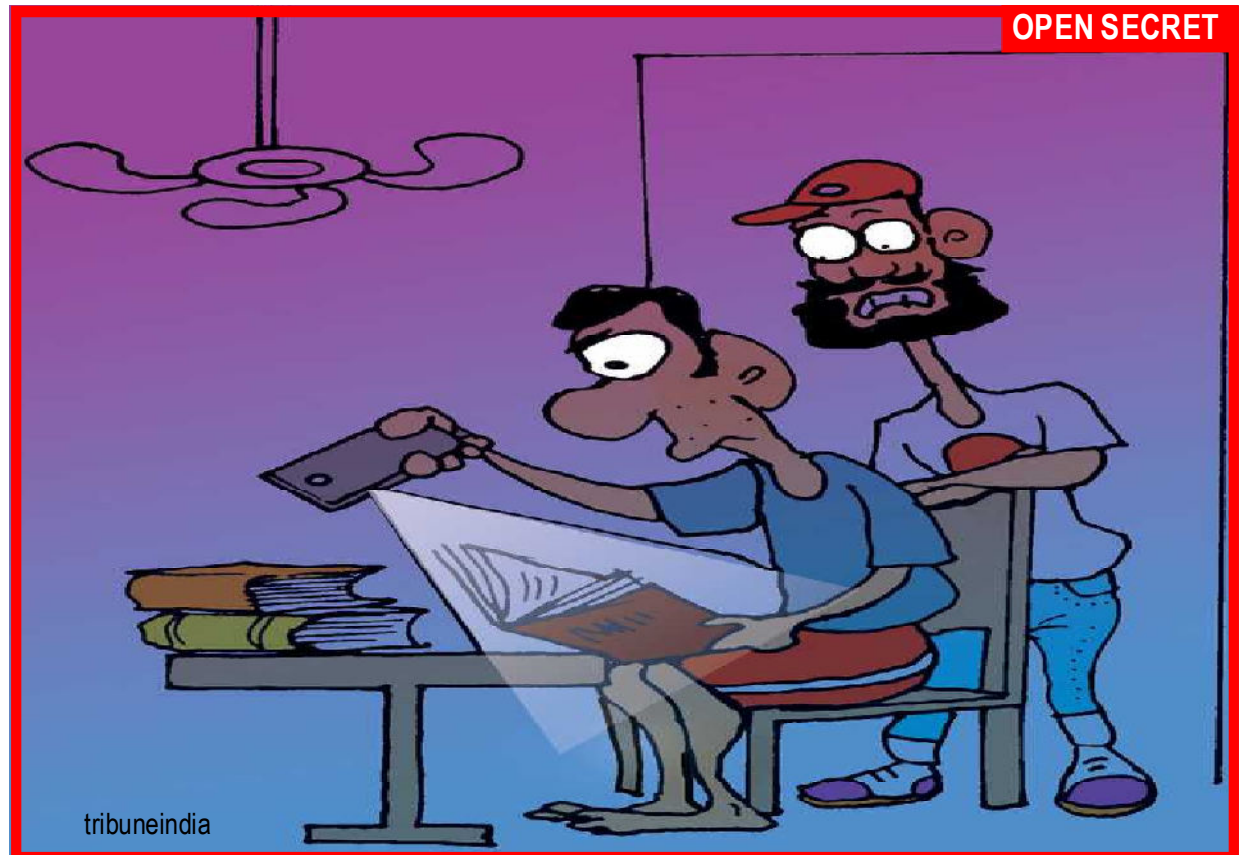

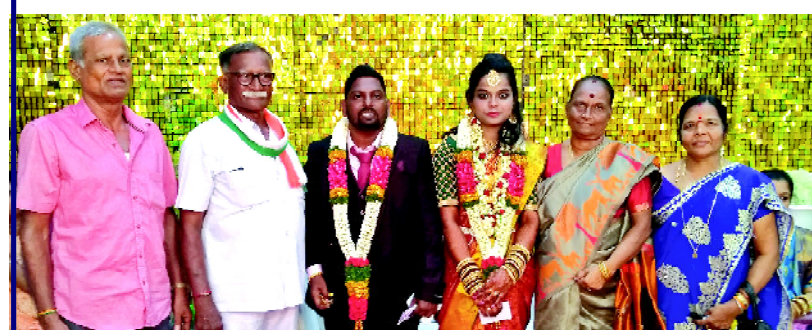

It was a hat-trick of titles for him after he had previously won the La Roda tournament and the Menorca Open in recent weeks.

The 15-year old Gukesh (Elo 2637) settled for a draw with Armenian GM Hak M Martirosyan in the final round to win the title

with eight points. He had defeated compatriot and second-seed K Sasikiran in the ninth and penultimate round.

Gukesh, who remained unbeaten through the nine rounds, gained 16 Elo points thanks to his performance here. He has now moved up to no.64 in the world rankings.

The teenaged Indian GM posted six victories and secured four draws for his final tally of eight points. Apart from scoring

over Sasikiran, he held the top-seed Jaime Santos Latasa to a draw in the fourth round and No.3 seed Shant Sargysan (Armenia) in round seven.
