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## PM Modi announces mission to make India self-sufficient in edible oils

New Delhi, Aug. 9

Prime Minister, Shri Narendra Modi on Monday announced a National Edible Oil Mission-Oil Palm (NMEO-OP) to make India self-sufficient in cooking oils, including palm oil, as he stressed on reducing the dependence on imports. Addressing a virtual event on PM-Kisan scheme, he said over Rs 11,000 crore will be invested in the edible oil ecosystem.

The Prime Minister also transferred over Rs 19,500 crore to over 9.75 crore farmers under the government's flagship PM-Kisan scheme. On the occasion, Shri Modi said while India has become self sufficient or Aatmanirbhar in



Shri Modi stressed India must become self reliant in edible oil too as he announced NMEO-OP.

The Prime Minister said the government will ensure that farmers get all facilities, from quality seeds to technology to promote farming to produce palm oil and other oil seeds.

It is to be noted here that India is dependent on imports of edible oil to meet the domestic demand. Of the total imports, palm oil constitutes about 55 per cent.

The country spent thousands of crores of rupees on edible oil imports, Shri Modi said, and added that this money rather should go to farmers. The Prime Minister said north-eastern States and Andaman and Nicobar Islands could be promoted for palm farming. (Source: Business Standard)

New Delhi, Aug. 9

Prime Minister, Shri Narendra Modi has said that the oceans are part of our common heritage and the sea routes are the lifeline of international trade. He said, the seas are very important for the future of our planet. Chairing a high-level United Nations Security Council Open Debate through video conferencing this evening, PM said, the shared maritime heritage is facing many challenges today as sea routes are being misused for piracy

and terrorism and there are maritime disputes between many countries.

He said, climate change and natural disasters are also related to maritime domain. The Prime Minister put five basic principles at the open debate. He said, we should remove barriers from legitimate maritime trade as the prosperity of all of us is dependent on the active flow of maritime trade. PM said, the bottlenecks in this can be a challenge for the entire global economy. He said, the

settlement of maritime disputes should be peaceful and on the basis of international law only. He added that it is very important for mutual trust and confidence. The Prime Minister said, this is the only way we can ensure global peace and stability. He said, we should face together natural disasters and maritime threats created by non-state actors. Shri Modi said, India has taken several steps to enhance regional cooperation

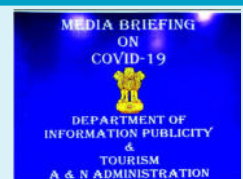

## Media briefed on COVID-19

People should strictly follow COVID appropriate behavior while commuting between Islands: Director (IP&T)

Port Blair, Aug. 9

The Director (IP&T), Shri Alok Kumar briefing the media persons on COVID-19 status in the Islands held in the conference hall of IP&T here this evening stated that during the RT-PCR test conducted on 526 flight passengers, who arrived here yesterday, no positive case has been detected. RAT test was conducted on 196



passengers bound for North & Middle Andaman at Ferrargunj and here too, no positive case was found. Today, 3 flights with 456 passengers arrived here and the result of RT-PCR reports are awaited.

Apart from this, RAT was conducted on 88 passengers proceeding to Swaraj Dweep at Phoenix Bay Jetty and all were found negative. The test was also conducted on 92 passengers sailing from Shaheed Dweep by MV Choudhary and no positive case was found. He appealed to the people to follow COVID appropriate

The Government of India has launched various self-employment Generation Schemes under National Rural Livelihood Mission (NRLM) a poverty alleviation project implemented by Ministry of Rural Development, Government of India. This scheme focuses on promoting self-employment and organization of rural poor women. The basic idea behind this programme is to organize the rural poor women into SHG (Self Help Groups) groups and make them



capable for self-employment.

With an aim to promote Rural Self Help Groups and provide them better marketing facilities for sale of their handmade products, the ANIRLM Cell has organized 'SHG Sunday Market' exclusively for the SHG Groups formed under DAY-NRLM. The SHG Members of Gram

Panchayats Sippighat, Calicut and Beodnabad under C.D. Block Prothrapur participated in the SHG Market.

The SHG Market has provided a handholding support to the Rural SHGs during the COVID-19 pandemic situation and has helped the SHG women in earning their livelihood. The SHGs were

provided an opportunity for sale of their handmade products i.e. bakery items, vegetables, bamboo & cane, local spices, poultry products, coir handicrafts and coir rope etc.

Altogether 14 SHG Groups formed under DAY-NRLM in Gram Panchayat Sippighat, Calicut and Beodnabad participated in the

aforesaid market and the SHG members had sold products to a tune of around Rs.17,000/-. The general public requested the SHG members of respective Gram Panchayats to continue the SHG Market every Sunday.

## Down memory lane through the eyes of an old settler .....

## Nonagenarian recounts path to freedom with nostalgic events dating back to British & Japanese imperialism

Port Blair, Aug. 9

Through the eyes of an old settler, memories of the British and Japanese imperialism comes alive. Meet 91 year old Shri John Lobo whose memories of yesteryears take us back to the pre-independence era. Born in 1930, Lobo can be called a walking encyclopedia, amassed with vast knowledge and historic incidents intact in his memories. In a tete-a tete with DT, Shri Lobo spoke at length on those dark days and is presented in a nutshell.

Narrating the events that took place during the British invasion, which were witnessed by him personally, Shri Lobo who was then a young twelve year old boy student of Govt. High School, South Point, saw the convicts constructing the roads from seashore Road to Phongyi Chong Pagoda. "They used to come early in the morning at 6 and start their work, attired in their convict uniform and shouted unanimously "Shabash Jawan, utha ke maro", he said. They gave their heart and soul relentlessly while constructing the roads with bricks and mortar, so that it is properly



rammed and become weather resistance, recalls Lobo adding that the convicts worked for 6 hours every day and by 12 noon, the British fired flares from erstwhile Ross Island (now Netaji Subhash Chandra Bose Island), indicating them to return to the jail, he added. "The road that we are using today is the effort of those convicts and some freedom fighters too", says Shri Lobo.

While speaking about the British regime, he recalled that there was no dearth of essential commodities. He said, "Everything was available in

plenty at reasonable price. Rice was 10 seer (kg) per rupee, cereals Rs. 2 per seer, eggs, bananas for 4 paise (per dozen), milk 16 pound per Rs. 1, ghee Rs. 2 per seer besides fish, mutton and chicken were in abundance and were affordable". However, he did not deny the fact that the British regime from 1858-1942, nearly a decade cannot be concluded as a peaceful period, since innumerable people had suffered the worst inhumane treatment under them.

The Islands also witnessed Japanese invasion, said Shri Lobo. Clouds of war were hovering over these Islands and evacuations were made by the British Administration. On January 2<sup>nd</sup> 1942, the vessel SS Maharaja left Port Blair for mainland followed by naval ship called 'Alanga', taking all the mainlanders, leaving behind only the permanent convicts, who had no contacts at mainland.

on this subject.

He said, India has been the first responder in maritime disasters related to cyclone, Tsunami and pollution. The Prime Minister said, we have to preserve the maritime environment and maritime resources. He said, the oceans have a direct impact on the climate and therefore, we have to keep the maritime environment free from pollution like plastics and oil spills. Shri Modi said, we should encourage responsible maritime connectivity.

For the first time, an Indian Prime Minister presided over UN Security Council Open Debate. This is the first time that maritime security was discussed in a holistic manner as an exclusive agenda item at such a high level.

A&N Islands. 1014 beneficiaries were vaccinated in South Andaman District, out of which 767 beneficiaries were in the age group of 18-44 years. Similarly, 67 beneficiaries were vaccinated in North & Middle Andaman District. In Nicobar

District, 12 beneficiaries were vaccinated out of which, 7 were in the age group of 18-44 years. A total of 98,403 eligible people in the age group of 18 to 44 years have been vaccinated till date, a press release from DHS said.

Landfall Island, which is the Northernmost Island of the Andaman & Nicobar Islands chain, will transit across the geographical extremities of the Andaman and Nicobar Islands during its movement through the Islands, a press release from PRO ANCHQ said.

## Down memory lane through the eyes...

Shri Lobo nostalgically remembers March 23rd, 1942, the day the Japanese forces landed in A&N Islands. "It was the darkest day in the history of these Islands", he said adding that the very next day, the Japanese forces were found loitering on the streets and hoarding goods of their choice.

While recalling the brutal assassination of Zulfikar Ali (alias) Sunny in the year 1942 by the Japanese force, soon after the second day of their landing in this Island Shri Lobo said, "I was a 12 year old boy then and that fateful day is still fresh even today. Me and my friends were playing near Netaji Ground in Aberdeen Bazaar, when we saw the brutal assassination of Zulfikar Ali by the Japanese in our bare eyes". Prior to that, the Japanese had entered Sunny's house. Suspecting some foul play and to protect his family, Sunny fired at one of the Japanese soldiers but missed his target, except causing some injuries. This incident infuriated the Japanese and they retaliated with throwing of hand grenades, setting ablaze 26 houses in the area, said Lobo with a dim voice. This gave rise to a commotion and people had to leave their house and take shelter at Dugnadab Coconut plantation, said Shri Lobo.

He said, Sunny was in a hideout and the Japanese Govt. issued a declaration that he should be handed over, failing which; people have to face further atrocities and disaster. Sunny was later handed over to the Japanese. On March 25<sup>th</sup> 1942, he was brought by the British to the Browning Club ground (Netaji Ground) and was subjected to the Japanese martial art Jujutsu and was shot dead by the firing squad with pool of blood squirting from his body. He was then cremated in the corner of the ground where lies his grave today. This was the first Japanese atrocities witnessed by Shri John Lobo and his friends.

The clever Japanese govt. tried to gain the confidence of people and they constituted a 15 member Peace committee comprising of eminent citizens to run the local administration. This was followed by setting up of a civil administration, but was under the control of Japanese officer, Col. Bucho. The Japanese started the fortification of the Islands. People of Indonesia and Malaysia were brought to the Islands, as there was acute shortage of labourers. The entire areas from Marine sea shore to Rangachang were lined up with barbed wire and mines were laid. Pillars were constructed all over the area; the remnants are still there in some places. Anti aircraft guns were installed in certain places, one atop the Mt. Harriet as well, he said.

The Japanese govt. started a Japanese School at Ross Island with ten young local boys called 'Khai Yo Shonan Jiku', in order to interpret Japanese languages. They had also published a book called 'Nippon Go-Annac' to make people learn their language and scripts. The Japanese had three scripts, Khata Khana, Hira Khana and Khanji. The later was complicated and only the former were used.

Another eye witness episode was the killing of seven Indian National Army (INA) personnel. They were from different department and were civil employees. Mistaken by the Japanese as British Spies, the seven INA personnel were shot dead at Dugnadab, Sea Shore road, echoed Shri Lobo.

Shri John Lobo nostalgically recalled those days when he witnessed the hoisting of the first Indian National Flag by Netaji Subash Chandra Bose on December 30<sup>th</sup>, 1943 in Isles. Netaji was given guard of honour at the airport upon his arrival by the INA Volunteers, where he too was present as the youngest member of INA.

Those days, he said, education was affiliated to Rangoon University in Burma and they followed the Rangoon University syllabus. The main subjects taught those days were English, Urdu, Persian, Maths, Algebra, Geometry and Science. A separate Burmese School was also established near Middle Point. Later in 1930, the education system got affiliated to Calcutta University. The first school of these isles was situated at South Point known as Govt. High School. Later, the Govt. High School, South Point was shifted to Middle Point and it started functioning in 1946, though it was interrupted for three years during the Japanese occupation.

Sharing his experience about the Japanese Imperialism in these islands, Shri Lobo said, there was extreme shortage of food, medicine and ration articles, because of the blockade of A&N Islands by the allied forces. People succumbed to various diseases such as Malaria, Dysentery, Beri beri etc. They also had shortage of clothes and had to wear gunny sacks while their bodies were full of scabies. Rice produced by them was taken away by the Japanese. Shri Lobo recalled the hardship of those days where people had to survive on tapioca, sweet potato, locally grown vegetables such as poi bhaji, nali bhaji, tubers and leaves of colocasia. There was no salt at that time, people had to make salt on their own from sea water, he added.

The Japanese finally surrendered in 1945 and were taken as prisoners of war. The surrender ceremony was performed in the historic Gymkhana Ground. The Japanese head of the govt. Shiraikaan laid down his arms with badges along with other officers to Brigadier Solomon. Loka, the Tribal Head of the Great Andamanese tribe was honoured in the presence of public for the service rendered by Macarthy and party for espionage during Japanese regime.

Thus, the era of Japanese atrocities, brutalities, humiliation and tortures came to an end. People heaved a sigh of relief and the assurance of a fresh morning blossomed in their hearts. As the saying goes 'dawn dispel darkness', similarly, there arrived the dawn of a new chapter called 'Pastures Anew', a fresh start from the scratch, the nonagenarian remarked.

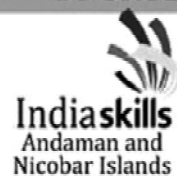
