As the area is vast

and there are many encroachment pockets located very far from water sources putting all the blame on Administration is not fair but there is a need to plan laying of pipelines to the remote villages from now so that in next few years people of these villages can get fresh water through pipelines.

Thailand Princess remains unconscious weeks after collapsing due to heart ailment

Thailand's Princess Bajrakitiyabha remained unconscious more than three weeks after collapsing due to a heart problem, a palace statement said in an update on the health of the 44-year-old potential heir to the throne. The eldest child of Thai King Maha Vajiralongkorn lost consciousness on Dec. 15 due to severe heart arrhythmia resulting from inflammation following a mycoplasma infection, according to a statement issued by the palace late on Saturday.

The princess's "overall condition is that she remains unconscious," the palace said. "Doctors continue to provide medicine and use equipment to support the functions of the heart, lung and kidney as well as using antibiotics while monitoring her condition closely," it said.

Princess Bajrakitiyabha fell ill while



preparing her dogs for a competition in northeastern Nakhon Ratchasima province, where she was initially treated before being taken by helicopter to Bangkok. She is one of three children of King Vajiralongkorn who have formal titles, making her eligible for the throne under a palace succession law and the country's constitution. The king has yet to formally designate an heir and there has been no official discussion on the prospect of the princess taking the throne.

Princess Bajarakitiyabha, a trained lawyer with master and doctorate degrees from Cornell University, has served as Thai ambassador to Austria, Slovenia and Slovakia and in roles with the Attorney General's office, the Royal Security Command and as Thai ambassador to the United Nations Commission on Crime Prevention and Criminal Justice.

She was born on Dec. 7, 1978. Her mother is the king's first wife, Princess Soamsawali.

17 killed, 22 injured in road traffic accident in China: Report

Seventeen people were killed and 22 were injured Sunday in a road traffic accident in eastern China's Jiangxi province, state media reported. "The accident caused 17 deaths, 22 people were injured, the injured have been sent to the hospital," state broadcaster CCTV reported, citing local authorities.

The "major road traffic accident" took place just before 1 am (1700 GMT) in Nanchang County, it reported.

"The cause of the accident is under in-depth investigation," CCTV added.

Around an hour after the news emerged, Nanchang County traffic police issued travel tips to drivers saying the area was experiencing "foggy weather".

"Driving visibility is poor, there is low visibility, which can easily cause traffic accidents," it said.

"Please pay attention to fog lights... slow down, drive carefully, keep a safe distance from the car in front,

avoid pedestrians, do not change lanes and overtake," it added. Road accidents are common in China due to a lack of strict safety controls.

Last month, one person died during a highway pile-up in central China that involved hundreds of vehicles and was caused by low visibility in fog.

And in September, 27 passengers died after a bus transporting them to quarantine facilities in southwestern Guizhou province flipped over on a motorway.

At least 40 killed, dozens injured in bus collision in central Senegal

At least 40 people were killed and dozens injured in a bus crash in central Senegal, the country's president said Sunday. President Macky Sall said in a tweet that the accident happened in Gnivy village, in the Kaffrine region, at about 3:30 a.m. "I am deeply saddened by the tragic road accident today in Gniby causing 40 deaths and many serious injuries. I extend my heartfelt condolences to the families of the victims and wish a speedy recovery to

the injured," said Sall.

He declared three days of mourning starting Monday and said he will hold an inter-ministerial council to discuss road safety measures.

Public prosecutor Cheikh Dieng said the crash happened on National Road No. 1 when a public bus punctured a tire and veered across the road, colliding with another bus coming from the opposite direction. At least 78 people are injured some of them seriously, he

said. Images of the crash on social media show the damaged buses rammed into each other and a trail of debris along the road.

Motor accidents happen regularly in the West African nation due to poor roads, bad cars and drivers not adhering to the rules, say locals.

In 2017, at least 25 people were killed when two buses also crashed. Many of those people were heading toward the central town of Touba for the annual Muslim pilgrimage.

In his address, the DC (SA) informed that this concept is the second initiative in A & N Islands and the Maternity Home has been constructed through the District Health Society (SA) under National Health Mission to provide accommodation at minimal fee to the poor pregnant women of Inter Island for better health care services. It was also informed that this initiative has been inspired from Nicobari Birth Home; the idea of Maternity Home incorporates Traditional Gyan with Post Modern Technologies. He also informed that the motto of this initiative is to reduce the Maternal Mortality Rate (MMR), which could improve the health indicators of A & N Islands.

Speaking on the occasion, the Director of Health Services appreciated the role of District Administration and the officials of the National Health Mission

for such innovative ideas. The Health Department could monitor the high risk poor pregnant women and refer them well in advance from Inter Islands to Port Blair to avoid any pregnancy related complications. Earlier, many poor residents avoided coming to Port Blair for advanced treatment due to financial constraints and accommodation.

The District Programme Manager, DHS (SA) informed that this Maternity Home has a capacity of 6 pregnant women with one attendant each. He also informed that another 10 bedded Maternity Home was also constructed at CHC Bambooflat and both Maternity Home will be managed by the Directorate of Health Services in coordination with the District Hospital & District Administration, South Andaman to provide allotment of accommodations at affordable fee to the pregnant women.

China chief epidemiologist's assurance on Covid stats amid criticism

In what is being viewed as statement in rebuttal to general criticism about data on coronavirus, Wu Zunyou, chief epidemiologist of the Chinese Center for Disease Control and Prevention, on Friday stressed that the country "has always worked to collect, analyse and assess statistics" on the pandemic as the details are key to tackling the pandemic. At a briefing on Friday, the state-run Global Times reported, the top expert shared how his nation has been following set patterns on collecting and analysing statistics ever since the first outbreak was reported in the city of Wuhan in 2019. "After the spread of the virus was brought under control in Wuhan, and until December 2022, sporadic outbreak in China were mainly caused by overseas imported cases and China quickly identified these outbreaks and extinguished them within a short space of time," Wu was quoted as saying in the report, stressing that the



information collected during this period is "very accurate".

China is in the midst of handling one of its worst-ever outbreak of coronavirus after millions contracted the virus in December. BF.7 was one of the subvariants which was linked to the outbreak as visuals of overcrowded hospitals flooded social media yet again, reminding the world of its challenging fight amid the pandemic. But the country has faced criticism for not being transparent with the data on the number of actual cases and deaths. The National Health Commission (NHC) had last month said it won't publish the daily figures days

after a report - by the agency - was said to have been leaked, which showed that about 18 per cent of the population had contracted the virus in the first three weeks of December.

Meanwhile, China is set to end its international isolation from 12 AM on Sunday, opening airports and ports for travel and trade, despite the fresh surge.

This comes as Saturday marked the first day of "chun yun", the 40-day period of Lunar New Year travel known pre-pandemic as the world's largest annual migration of people.

Ukraine shelling damages two power plants in Russia-controlled Donetsk: Report



Two thermal power plants were damaged by Ukrainian shelling in Russian-controlled parts of the country's Donetsk region, Moscow-installed officials said on Sunday. Preliminary information indicated injuries in the

shelling in Zuhres and Novyi Svit, the officials said on their Telegram monitoring channel.

Ukraine almost never publicly claims responsibility for attacks inside Russia or on Russian-controlled territory in Ukraine.

Thailand's Covid entry rules as China's borders reopen

Thailand will reintroduce Covid-19 entry requirements for foreigners flying into the country from Monday, the nation's transport minister said, as the Southeast Asian nation prepares for an expected wave of tourists from China. Adults must show proof of at least two vaccinations, or recovery from the virus since July, according to comments from Saksayam Chidchob published on the minister's political party's Website. Unvaccinated visitors will need a medical report justifying their lack of inoculations, a Civil Aviation Authority of Thailand statement posted on site said. The rules apply until Jan. 31.

Additionally, visitors from countries that require Covid tests for arrivals from Thailand must have health insurance during their stay, the statement said. Among nations that recently reimposed

Covid entry rules, India this month began mandatory Covid-19 tests for fliers from China, Hong Kong, Japan, South Korea, Singapore and Thailand. The reintroduction of entry requirements aimed at stemming the spread of Covid-19 comes as China rapidly dismantles its zero-tolerance policies, reopening the country to the world and scrapping quarantine for arrivals from Jan. 8. Thailand expects 300,000 Chinese visitors in the first quarter of this year, after it reached a target of 10 million foreign arrivals last year in a better-than-expected recovery of its vital tourism sector.

Airlines are required to screen visitors' eligibility to enter Thailand under the reimposed rules, while people suspected of displaying symptoms of Covid will be advised to get tested on arrival. Passengers transiting to other destinations are exempt, the statement said.

Record-breaking winter temperatures warm Europe: What it means

Europe has seen "extreme" warm winter weather in recent days, experts have said, with 2023 already posting record temperatures for January across the region. As temperatures rise globally because of human-caused climate change, scientists say heatwaves and spells of warmer-than-average weather are becoming more common throughout the year.

After experiencing searing summer heat and a drought unprecedented in centuries, a wave of warm weather across Europe this winter has melted the snow from ski slopes in the Alps and Pyrenees, and seen temperatures above 20 degrees Celsius (68 degrees Fahrenheit) even in normally-freezing central regions.

Several European countries saw record-breaking heat on New Year's Eve and New Year's Day, according to the World Meteorological Organization (WMO).

Hundreds of weather stations across Europe have recorded all-time highest daily temperatures for the months of December or January, it said this week. Freja Vamborg, Senior Scientist at Europe's Copernicus Climate Change Service (C3S), said the cur-



rent winter heatwave is an "extreme" heat event in Europe in terms of how far temperatures have deviated from what is expected at this time of year.

Here Vamborg answers some key questions about the heatwave:

What caused these high temperatures?

"On the 1st of January there was strong flow of air from the southwest across the affected area, which would have brought warmer air further north and penetrated unusually far east, reaching even to Belarus. Minimal snow cover was very probably another relevant factor."

"The circulation of any given weather situation and climate change are not two independent things. Climate change itself also has an impact on the circulation, and

will also impact how warm those moving air masses are. This is what makes it so complex to disentangle just simply a weather event, from the level to which climate change influenced such an event." How is climate change involved?

"With increasing global temperatures, heatwaves and warm spells are becoming more frequent and intense -- this is not restricted to the summer months."

"While the warming trend in Europe is on average stronger in the warmer seasons, winters are also becoming warmer as a result of global temperatures."

"Northern Europe has warmed more strongly in winter than in summer, while in the south the warming trend is more apparent in summer."

Algeria tragic car crash kills 8 people from same family including 5 children

Eight people from the same family, including five children, have been killed in a car crash in eastern Algeria, the civil defence said Saturday. The children, aged four to 13, their parents and an aunt died after their vehicle collided late Friday with a semi-trailer near the city of Batna, a statement said, without elaborating on the

cause of the crash. In 2021, Algeria recorded nearly 22,000 traffic accidents that killed 3,061 people and left 29,763 injured, according to the authorities. The toll for 2022 has yet to be announced.

Speed is the main cause of crashes in the North African country, according to a government road safety agency.



Himachal Pradesh govt raises VAT on diesel by Rs 7.40 per litre

The Himachal Pradesh government announced on Sunday that value added tax (VAT) on diesel would be raised by Rs 7.40 per litre.

After this increase, the diesel prices in the state would be Rs 86 per litre.

This was informed in a notification issued by the department of state taxes and excise government of Himachal Pradesh.

On Sunday, Chief Minister Sukhvinder Singh Sukhu expanded his Cabinet

and inducted seven new ministers. The swearing-in ceremony of the new ministers took place at the Raj Bhavan in Shimla. Vikramaditya Singh, the son of Virbhadra Singh, had also taken the oath today.
