What is a Coral?

Corals are tiny animals that have an outer stony skeleton and live in colonies in the sea. They belong to the same animals group as the sea anemones, and jelly fish. Each coral animal is called a polyp and lives inside a cup of carbonate (Limestone). It has a mouth at the top surrounded by tentacles. The tentacles help to capture food like plankton for the coral. While it is alive, a coral poly's tentacles protrude from the cups for feeding.In times of danger, the polyp can withdraw into its cup. This is similar to a turtle withdrawing into its shell when disturbed. A coral polyp cannot move and remains fixed to its cup throughout its life. Coral polyps can be of several species - in A&Nalone, 135 species are found.

Coral Colonies :Many thousands of coral polyps are connected together to form a coral colony. These colonies are of many shapes and colours. On a visit to a nearby coral reef, you can discover the kinds of coral in your area.

Necessary Pushback

The Supreme Court collegium has done well to push back against the Union government's attempts to block the appointment of some advocates as High Court judges. The three-member collegium, which makes recommendations for High Court appointments, has reiterated its decision to elevate lawyers Saurabh Kirpal to the Delhi High Court, R. John Sathyan to the Madras High Court and Somasekhar Sundaresan to the Bombay High Court. As it dealt in detail with the objections raised by the Centre in each individual case, the motives behind the government's ongoing contestation with the judiciary over appointments to constitutional courts stand exposed. Communications between the collegium and the Centre offer a glimpse into the untenable nature of the government's objections to proposed appointees, making it abundantly clear how badly the current regime wants to control judicial appointments. If the objection based on a candidate's sexual orientation smacks of a medieval-minded ideological bias, the effort to stall the elevation of a couple of advocates based on their social media activity exposes a mindset that sees appointments to the higher judiciary as a system of spoils meant for political loyalists. As the collegium has pointed out, neither the sexual orientation of Mr. Kirpal nor the airing of political views by the other two advocates will impinge on their suitability or integrity.

The government appears to think that potential candidates for judicial appointments should not have political views of their own, or that a tendency to make their views or opinion known will amount to a possible bias in their functioning as judges. Nothing can disprove this more than the fact that there are other names — to which the government seems to have no objections — that are closely associated with political parties. Indeed, one can say that the history of judicial appointments is replete with instances of government law officers, who invariably enjoy the confidence of the political leadership at the Centre or the States, and lawyers who represent political leaders being offered positions on both the Supreme Court and High Court Benches. The objection based on sexual orientation is particularly appalling, as it is contrary to the constitutional position against discrimination based on sex or sexual preferences. The viewpoint that the collegium system of appointments is flawed as it is opaque and tends to reduce the zone of consideration is valid. However, the manner in which the current regime is seeking to filter out candidates who, it suspects, may not further its political agenda will surely give the impression that allowing any sort of government interference will pose a threat to judicial independence.

British Royals Brace Themselves for Harry and Meghan Documentary

January 23 : London: Britain's monarchy is bracing for more bombshells to be lobbed over the palace gates Thursday as Netflix releases the first three episodes of a series that promises to tell the full truth about Prince Harry and Meghan's estrangement from the royal family.

Promoted with two dramatically edited trailers that hint at racism and a war against Meghan, the series Harry & Meghan is the couple's latest effort to tell the world why they walked away from royal life and moved to Southern California almost three years

It is expected to expand on criticism of the royal family and British media delivered in a series of interviews over the past 18 months.

No one knows the full truth, Harry says at the end of the latest trailer. We know the full truth.

The series comes at a crucial moment for the monarchy as King Charles III tries to show that the institution still has a role to play after the death of Queen Elizabeth II, whose personal popularity dampened criticism of the crown during her 70-year reign.

Charles is making the case that the House of Windsor can help unite an increasingly diverse nation by using the early days of his reign to meet with many of the ethnic groups and faiths that make up modern Britain.

Harry's 2018 marriage to the former Meghan Markle, a biracial American and onetime actress, was once seen as boosting the royal family's effort to move into the 21st century, making it more representative of a multicultural nation. But the fairy tale, which began with a star-studded ceremony at WindsorCastle, soonsoured amid stories that Meghan was self-centred and bullied her staff.

Harry and Meghan, the Dukeand Duchess of Sussex, stepped back from royal duties and moved to California, alleging racist attacks by Britain's tabloid media. Harry's criticism of the media was tinged with anger over the way the press treated his mother, Princess Diana, who died in a car



accident in 1997 while being followed photographers.

The couple's new life in America has been funded by lucrative contracts with Netflix and Spotify.

Race became a central issue for the monarchy following Harry and Meghan's interview with American talk show host Oprah Winfrey in March 2021. Meghan alleged that before their first child was born, a member of the royal family commented on how dark the baby's skin might

Prince William, the heir to the throne and Harry's older brother, defended the royal family after the interview, telling reporters, "We're very much not a racist family."

But Buckingham Palace faced renewed allegations of racism only last week when a Black advocate for survivors of domestic abusesaid a senior member of the royal household interrogated her about her origins during a reception at the palace.

Coverage of the issue filled British media, overshadowing William anticipated visit to Boston, which the palace had their environmental credentials.

Media attention was also diverted by Netflix's trailer for Harry & Meghan in the middle of the trip.

The streaming giant has promised an unprecedented and indepth documentary series over six episodes in which Harry and Meghan share the other side of their highprofile love story."

The first three episodes will be released Thursday, with the second batch to be posted December 15.

The programme will be watched carefully in the UK, where even the teasers were criticised for offering misleading images to back up the emotive narration alleging misogyny, unfair media treatment and racism.

In one section of the footage, clips of paparazzi are spliced together with old footage of Princess Diana being followed by the media as Harry says in a voiceover: "The pain and suffering of women marrying into this institution, this feeding

"I was terrified, I didn't wanthistory to repeat itself."

However, one of the clips used to illustrate his words appears to show reporters and photographers waiting for TV star Katie Price arriving outside Crawley Magistrates Court, Sky News reported.

The second trailer also includes an indictment of the way palace officials use the press, which Harry described as a "dirty game."



Mohammed Shami: Can't Doubt this Indian Team After Results in Last 4-6 Years

January 23: India's player of the match against New Zealand in the second ODI felt like the team's performance in recent times hasn't warranted the scepticism that has followed the team in a World Cup year. In the aftermath of a thumping eightwicket win over the visitors on Saturday in Raipur, Mohammed Shami responded to being asked whether the Indian team is sure of its first choice XI for the upcoming World Cup.

"If people still doubt the Indian team despite the results it has given in the last four to six years...," Shami retorted. "The World Cup is still a long time away; we need to play a lot of games and need to try out more players before that."

Shami's comments came following India's seventh successive ODI series win at home, a run maintained since the 2-3 loss to Australia ahead of the 2019 World Cup.

Keeping in line with the World Cup talks, Shami further spoke on the matter of workload management, stating that his preference has always been on more game time than practice sessions.

"I always prefer playing matches over practice. It is always better to play maximum numbers of games to get ready



for a big event. Load is being managed and it is being managed properly. I just hope the main players stay in a good zone (pre-World Cup)."

Shami starred in the first innings during the second ODI as India pinned New Zealand down to just 108 runs, chasing the total with 29.5 overs to spare. The seamer registered bowling figures of 3/18 off six overs of bowling.

Featuring in the side as the senior-most bowler and in the absence of Jasprit Bumrah, Shami suggested that his role in the current side wasn't any more different to what he has been used to since the inception of his India career.

"My role hasn't changed since I have come into the team," he said while chuckling at the thought of it. "The only thing is to keep working on fitness and diet. We have got big events coming up so the aim is to contribute in every game."

The right arm pacer, though, added that part of his responsibilities was to keep sharing his inputs with others in the bowling unit. "As a new-ball bowler, it's important to assess the conditions and pass the message quickly to the other bowlers as well."'Relentless' Shami and SirajPartnering with Mohammed Siraj as India's new ball bowlers, Shami kept a check on the scoring rate in the initial overs on Saturday, conceding a mere 10 runs between them in the first eight overs. And picking three wickets during the same time period.

Cristiano Ronaldo Fails to Score on Al Nassr Debut

January 23: Cristiano Ronaldo made his much-anticipated debut for Al Nassr but failed to get on the scoresheet as his new side beat Ettifaq 1-0 in the Saudi Pro League

The 37-year-old had joined Al-Nassr last month on a reported £175million-a-year contract until 2025.

Ronaldo, who on Thursday scored twice for a Riyadh All Stars teamin a 5-4 defeat to Lionel Messi's PSG in an exhibition match, played the full 90 minutes for the league leaders against Ettifaq on Sunday but did not make a telling contribution.

Talisca headed the winner in the 31st minute when Abdulmajeed Al-Sulaiheem's cross was too high for Ronaldo, who didn't seem to mind as he wheeled around to celebrate with the Brazilian midfielder and the rest of his new teammates.

Al Nassr, which has played 14 games, moved a point ahead of defending champion Al Hilal, which has played a game more.

Ronaldo had been forced to wait for his debut due toreceiving a two-game FA suspension after smashingan Everton fan's phone last year.

As a consequence, Ronaldo missed Al-Nassr's 2-0 win against Al-Tai and their 0-0 draw with Al-Shabab.


The decision came due to the Saudi League rules stating that clubscan only register up to eight



foreign players per squad. Ronaldo, a five-time Ballon d'Or winner who starred for Real Madrid, Juventus and Manchester United, signed a deal to June 2025 with Al Nassr, apparently after rejecting offers from Europe, North America and beyond.

He also came off a disappointing World Cup where he was benched in the knockout rounds and left the field in tears after Portugal lost in the quarterfinals to Morocco.
