In a letter addressed to the Chief Secretary, the Member of Parliament pointed out that most of the people in Andaman & Nicobar Islands are from remote Islands and for them arranging money for eye operation in mainland hospitals is a difficult task. G B Pant Hospital is the only hope for most of the Islanders in Andaman &

Jolly Repeats His Request for Increasing the Number of Convoys on ATR

Port Blair, Nov. 8: Former State President, BJP, Shri. Vishal Jolly has once again requested to increase the convoy operating between Jirkatang to Middle Strait and from Middle Strait to Jirkatang which has been curtailed and restricted to a limited movement due to the COVID pandemic since March 2020. Vaccination Drive Updates

Port Blair, Nov. 8: A total of 5,08,848 doses of vaccines have been administered in the A&N Islands so far, out of the target beneficiaries of 2,81,603 (approx.). A total of 1,73,901 eligible people in the age group of 18 to 44 years have been vaccinated till date and a total of 3664 people were vaccinated today in A&N Islands.

2670 beneficiaries were vaccinated in South Andaman District, out of which 106 beneficiaries were in the age group of 18-44 years. Similarly, 928 beneficiaries were vaccinated in North & Middle Andaman District out of which 21 beneficiaries were in the age group of 18-44. 66 beneficiaries were vaccinated in Nicobar District out of which 8 beneficiaries were in the age group of 18-44.

Fuel price optics

The Centre finally decided last week to relent and act on the advice of monetary policymakers by cutting the excise duty on petrol and diesel by ?5 and ?10 a litre, respectively. The duty reduction, announced on the eve of Deepavali, immediately helped lower the retail prices of the two fuels by at least about 5% and 11%, respectively. And on the Government's urging, more than 20 States and Union Territories also reduced the VAT levied on the fuel products, thereby enhancing the relief provided to consumers from record pump prices. While the Centre asserted that the decision was to impart a fillip to the reviving economy, as well as easing inflationary pressure, the political significance of its timing was hard to overlook, coming a day after the ruling BJP suffered electoral reverses in some legislative and parliamentary bypolls. That the Government was keen to make political capital out of its belated reduction of levies was made obvious two days later, when it sought to call out the States — almost all ruled by Opposition parties — that were yet to make commensurate VAT reductions. With a clutch of crucial State elections, including to the prized U.P. Assembly, due early next year, the BJP is keen to regain control of the narrative, especially given the heightened public concern over inflation and the surge in fuel prices.

As far as the economy is concerned, the reduction in fuel bills is bound to have a salutary impact on inflation as diesel is the main fuel for freight carriage and impacts the cost of everything requiring to be transported. The softening in transportation costs ought to provide some cushion to the manufacturing sector, which has had to cope with surging input prices at a time when demand is still tenuous. The additional cash left in the wallets of consumers may also provide a small bump in consumption though the durability of this stimulus will hinge on how global oil prices behave in the coming weeks and months. Global oil prices have been on a boil this year and the World Bank group projected last month that average crude prices would end 2021 with a gain of about 70%. With the Indian crude basket having risen on average almost 62% in the 10 months through October and the historical trend suggesting a firming of prices towards the year-end when the northern hemisphere's winter usually pushes up energy demand, there is a real risk that Indian refiners may be left with little option but to continue raising retail prices. The onus would then be again on the Centre to make further cuts to the duty it had raised last year. States run by other parties should take the cue from Tamil Nadu and Punjab and bring down the prices at the outlets, and not hold back for political or revenue reasons.

Startups Eye Post-Pandemic 'Tele-Health' Revolution



From mental health apps to a hel met that can shock a patient's brain remotely, startups at this year's Web Summit are betting on a major shift towards "telemedicine" as the world emerges from the pandemic.

Using technology to treat patients virtually was a major theme at one of the world's largest tech conferences, which returned to Lisbon this week after Covid-19 forced it to move online in 2020.

"These days, most people use their phones for a lot of everyday needs — why shoul dn't healthcare be part of this?" said Johannes Schildt, whose company Kry lets patients book on-screen medical appointments.

"The pandemic has accelerated adoption of these new technologies," Schildt told AFP.

Sweden-based Kry, which operates in five European countries, is far from the only app designed to do away with the need to physically visit a doctor.

And not all of these startups focus on physical health. US-based Calmerry is among a growing number of e-counselling companies that offer video sessions with mental health therapists.

Most public healthcare systems offer limited access to such services, or none at all. With subscriptions starting at \$42 per week, Calmerry's co-founder Oksana Tolmachov a said a key goal was to make the rapy more affordable.

Confiding in robots

Other apps are taking a different approach to tackle the explosion in depression and anxiety seen worldwide during the pandemic.

Mental health chatbot Woebot also invites users to discuss their problems, but the replies come from artificial intelligence rather than a human therapist.

While some may be unnerved by the idea of pouring one's heart out to a piece of software, studies suggest that confiding in a virtual human could encourage people to open up.

Woebot's founder Alison Darcy, a clinical research psychologist, said the chatbot avoided the "baggage and social constructs" that come with human interactions — worrying that the other person will judge you, for instance.

And given the dearth of trained therapists compared with the number of people who need help with their mental health, Darcy argued that Al is a valid tool for approaching the problem.

"We need to be throwing everything at helping people get well," she said.

Former Georgia President Saakashvili Moved to Jail Hospital Weeks into **Hunger Strike**

Tbilisi, Nov. 8: Former Georgian President Mikheil Saakashvili was transferred to a prison hospital on Monday, authorities said, just over five weeks after he declared a hunger strike in

Saakashvili, 53, was arrested on Oct. 1 this year after returning to Georgia on the eve of local elections to rally the opposition, in what he described as a mission to save the country

He was jailed in the town of Rustavi, south of the capital Tbilisi, where he declared a hunger strike.

He faces six years in prison after being convicted in absentia in 2018 of abusing his office during his rule as president of the former Soviet republic from



2004 to 2013 -charges he rejected as politically motivated.


President Salome Zourabichvili said last week Saakashvili had returned in order to destabilise Georgian politics and that he could never be pardoned.

But she said that given the strong public interest in hi scase, he must be recognised as a special prisoner and authorities should take all possible measures "so the deterioration of his health is not used for political speculation destabilisation".

As Zika Cases Rise in U.P., Doctors Urge Travel Curbs

With a rise in the number of Zika virus cases in Uttar Pradesh, doctors have advised that people should avoid all non-essential travel to areas reporting cases. Currently close to 90 persons, including 17 children, have tested positive for the virus from the State

According to information released by the World Health Organisation (WHO), a majority of those infected with Zika virus disease either remain asymptomatic (up to 80%) or show mild symptoms of fever, rash, conjunctivitis, body ache, joint pains. The mosquito that transmits the Zika virus, the Aedes Aegypti, also transmits the dengue virus and is widely prevalent in India.

With no vaccine or drug available to prevent or treat Zika virus disease at present, doctors have said that Zika infections should be suspected in patients reporting with acute onset of fever, maculo-papular rash, among those individuals who travelled to areas with ongoing transmission during the two weeks preceding the onset of illness. Based on the available information of previous outbreaks, severe forms of disease requiring hospitalisation uncommon and fatalities are





The National Centre for Disease Control (NCDC) had in its previous travel advisory said nonessential travel to the affected areas/countries should be deferred/ cancelled and pregnant women or women who are trying to become pregnant should defer/ cancel their travel to the affected areas. Encouraging the use of protective measures, especially during day, the NCDC added that persons with comorbid conditions (diabetes, hypertension, chronic respiratory illness, immune disorders etc) should seek advice from the nearest health facility, prior to travel to an affected country.

Delhi Medical Association member Dr. Anil Bansal said, "There is no specific medicine for Zika virus disease and selfmedication should be avoided. Also people should avoid using aspirin for treating fever and use paracetamol. Travel to areas that are seeing a rise in Zika cases is best avoided."

The Union Health Ministry has also advised that people should prevent/control mosquito breeding and for personal protection should use bed-net at home and hospital to prevent mosquito bite so as to interrupt transmission.

On 8 July 2021, a single Zika virus (ZIKV) infection case was laboratory-confirmed in Kerala. Later that same month Maharashtra also reported its first Zika laboratory-confirmed case from Pune district.

Mexico City Grand Prix | Verstappen Wins to Stretch F1 Lead

Red Bull's Max Verstappen celebrated a dominant win in the Mexico City Grand Prix on Sunday to surge 19 points clear of Lewis Hamilton in the Formula One championship with four races remaining.

Seven-times world champion Hamilton was second for Mercedes, holding off Red Bull's Sergio Perez who became the first Mexican to stand on his home podium at a jubilant Autodromo Hermanos Rodriguez.

Red Bull closed the gap to Mercedes in the constructors' standings to one point.

"It's still a long way to go but it's of course looking good, but also it can turn around very quickly," said Verstappen, 24, of his big step forward in the championship battle.

The championship leader seized the lead into the first corner from third on the grid, after going three abreast with the two Mercedes, and gave Hamilton no chance to hit back once an initial safety car period was out of the way.

"I gave it absolutely everything and it was a greatfight with Sergio at the end, I was able to at least get second," said Hamilton.

Perez was hoisted high on the shoulders of his mechanics as he waved the Mexican flag to salute



the crowd before the podium

"Of course I wanted more, I wanted to get a one-two for the team but I didn't have a single chance to get through," he said after his third podium in a rowafter third places in Texas and Turkey.

Verstappen took the chequered flag 16.555 seconds clear of Hamilton to seal his ninth victory of the season, third in Mexico and 19th of his career.

The safety car was deployed until lap four after a collision at the start between Haas' Mick Schumacher

and AlphaTauri's Yuki Tsunoda. while McLaren's Daniel Ricciardo tagged the back of Valtteri Bottas's Mercedes and lost his front wing.

Bottas, who had taken a surprise pole position on Saturday, was spun around and dropped to 18th place after an immediate pitstop.

The Finn ended up 15th but pitted for fresh tyres to snatch the fast est lap from Verstappen at the end, denying the Dutchman a precious bonus point without it coming to Mercedes since he was outside the top 10.

Inches Towards Top Four Arsenal

London, Nov. 8: Arsenal closed in on the Premier League top four after a second-half goal from Emile Smith-Rowe gave it a 1-0 home win over Watford on Sunday in manager Mikael Arteta's 100th league and cup game in charge.

The result lifted Arsenal lifted one place up to fifth on 20 points from 11 games.

Antonio Conte's first Premier League game in charge of Tottenham Hotspur ended in a scrappy 0-0 draw at Everton on Sunday, as a crucial VAR intervention helped it scrape a

The pivotal moment in a game of few clear chances came just past the hour mark when referee Chris Kavanagh awarded a penalty against Tottenham keeper Hugo Lloris for a foul on Richarlison but changed his mind afterchecking the pitchside monitor.


