Collective Stand

Commonwealth leaders succeeded in hammering out a consensus on key economic issues particularly on aid to developing nations like India hit hard by oil imports. Indications were that the 43 Commonwealth countries were in sight of a collective stand on bridging the gap between the rich and developing nations. The views of Prime Minister Indira Gandhi on the immediate economic problems of oilimporting countries received wide support during the informal discussions between the leaders. She pleaded for urgent financial assistance by international agencies for development of energy resources in the country. She drew the attention of other leaders to the burden imposed of oil imports. A collective Commonwealth stand on North South issues is considered important in view of the Cancun summit which is less than three weeks away. Cabinet Reshuffle

In a major reshuffle of portfolios of ministers in UP, Chief Minister Vishwanath Pratap Singh designated Swarup Kumari Bakshi, a relative of Prime Minister Indira Gandhi, as home minister in place of Naunihal Singh. Singh was allocated the education portfolio held by Bakshi. Some other ministers were stripped of additional portfolios which were allocated to ministers of state. The changes are believed to have been made under pressure from Delhi.

JAPAN'S PARLIAMENT ELECTS FORMER DIPLOMAT KISHIDA AS NEW

Japan's parliament on Monday elected Fumio Kishida as the new prime minister, who will tasked with quickly tackling the pandemic and security challenges before an imminent national election.

Kishida replaces Yoshihide Suga, who resigned with his Cabinet earlier in the day. Kishida and his Cabinet will be sworn in at a palace

Suga left after only one year in office after seeing his support plunge overhis government's handling of the pandemic and insistence on holding

pandemic and insistence on noting the Olympics as the virus spread. A former foreign minister, Kishida, 64, used to be known as a dovish moderate but turned hawkish apparently to win over influential

entrenched in the conservative establishment and his victory in the party election was a choice for

continuity and stability over change.
All but two of 20 Cabinet posts under Suga will be replaced, 13them appointed to ministerial posts for the first time, Japanese media reported. Most of the posts went to powerfu

Motegi and Defense Minister Nobuc Kishi are to be retained, ensuring continuity of Japan's diplomacy and security policies as the country seeks to closely work with Washington under the bilateral security pact in the face of China's rise and growing tensions

inthe region, including around Taiwan. Kishida supports stronger Japan-US security ties and partnerships with other like-minded democracies in Asia, Europe and Britain, in part to counte China and nuclear-armed North Korea Kishida is to create a new Cabinet

post aimed at tackling economic dimensions of Japan's national security. appointing 46-year-old Takayuk Kobayashi, who is relatively new to parliament. Japan faces growing nuclearand missile threats from North Korea, which last month test-fired ballistic missiles capable of hitting targets in Japan. Kishida also faces worsening ties with fellow US ally South Korea over history issues ever after he struck a 2015 agreement with Seoulto resolve arow over the issue of women who were sexually abused by Japan's military during World War II.

Kishida said last week that his top priority would be the economy. Kishida's new capitalism is largely a continuation of Abe's economic policies He aims to raise income of more people and create a cycle of growth and distribution. A third-generation politician, Kishida was first elected to Parliament in 1993 representing Hiroshima and is an advocate for nuclear dsarmament. He escorted former President Barack Obama during his 2016 visit to the city that, along with Nagasaki, was destroyed in U.S. atomic bombings in the closing days of World War II.

ANI AMONG FIVE STATES TO SCORE TOP ON **EDUCATION PERFORMANCE IN COUNTRY**

New Delhi Oct 4: The recent performance grading index (PGI) rankings, released by the Ministry of Education, which analyses the states' education performance on seventy discrete parameters has featured five states and Union Territories (UTs), namely Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Chandigarh, Kerala, Puniab, and Tamil Nadu on the top with scores ranging from 901 to 950 (Grade-II) outof 1000.

On the downswing side, one UT,

On the downswing side, one U1, namely Ladakh, is flaked in the lowest grade with scores ranging from 0 to 550 (grade-VI), precededby Meghalaya (601-650: Grade-V), Arunachal Pradesh, Chhattisgarh and Nagaland (651-700:

Grade-IV).

Overall, the PGIrankings of the eight Northeast states have emplaced Tripura at 20th rank, followed by Sikkim (24th rank), Manipur (25th rank), Assam (31st rank), Mizoram (32nd rank), Arunacha Pradesh (34th rank), Nagaland (35th) and Meghalaya (36th rank). The states, namely Meghalaya, Mizoram, Nagaland, Assam and Arunachal Pradesh have performe outrageously worst in the PGI rankings, 2019-20. Notwithstanding, states including Tripura, Sikkim and Manipur have

Among the Northeast states, Meghalay a ranked low est, scoring 649 megnalaya ranked lowest, scoring 649 points dut of 1000 whereas Trippua ranked topscoring 801 points, followed by Sikkim (772), Manipur (767), Assam (738), Mizoram (723), Arunachal Pradesh (698), and Nagaland (667).

The top score in the domain relating to governance and management secured by Punjab (346), followed by Andaman and Nicobar Island (338), Tamil Nadu (336), Puducherry (335), Delhi (324), Kerala (322), Gujarat (320), Rajasthan (307), Chandigarh (305), Hary ana (305), Odisha

On the flip side, the states/UTs, i.e., Ladakh(76), Chhatisgarh (169), Nagaland (174), Meghalay a (197), Mizoram (203), Assam (207), Madhy a Pradesh (214), and Uttarakhand were among the worst performers.

In respect of the learning outcomes and quality (average scores and quality (average scores in mathematics, sciences, language, & social sciences), the state of Rajasthan has topped with the score of 168 points, followed by Chandigarh (160), Karnataka (160), Jharkhand (156), Kerala (154), Andhra Pordoh (154), and Civin (157) Pradesh (154), and Gujarat (152).

non-digital resources An inter-school library management systemmust be initiated to transfer learning materials among schools at distant locations at the districtor state levels.

To optimize the Learning outcomes the northeastern states must be propelled tow ards undertaking several multi-pronged interventions.

An investigation must be done to pinpoint the learning deficiencies and accordingly need to prioritize areas for interventions to ensure quality education, bracketed in the PGI report. A community-based education

management system is also a pressing need to establish for minimizing the knowledge gaps and monitoring students' inspiration as well as learning outcomes both at home and in schools.

NG AN HIV VACCINE UNOTHERAPY MAY REI

HIV can strengthen a patient's immune response against the virus even after they stop taking traditional traditional they stop taking traditional medications, according to a study published in the journal Science Immunology we co-led at the Amara Lab at Emory University, People with HIV take a combination of HIV medications to reduce the amount of virusthey have in their body. When taken varising naven interroay; mentaken as prescribed, these medications, collectively called antiretroviral therapy, can reduce the amount of virus in the body to undetectable levels. Antiretroviral therapy must be taken daily so the virus isless likely to mutate and become resistant to the drugs. While reducine the amount of virus.

While reducing the amount of virus in the body to undetectable levels means in the body to undeectable levels means it can no longer be transmitted, however, the most effective antiretroviral therapydrugs are unable to completely elimin ate the virus. This is because HIV hides in immune-privileged areas of the body, such as constituents of the hymbolistic such that certain parts of the lymphoid tissue, that are less accessible to the immune system to protect them from damage. Killer T cells, which search for and eliminate infected cells, are unable to

patrol these viral reservoirs that harbour HIV.

Constant exposure to the virus can push killer T cells into a state of exhaustion in which they don't work as well. Exhausted killer T cells display more of a protein called PD-1, which functions as an offswitch to its killing

exhaustion is to block the PD-1 off switch, but this does not boost the immune system's response to the virus.
Conversely, an HIV vaccine can significantly boost immunity against the

virus.

So we tested whether combining these two tactics could enhance HIV infection control. We administered a vaccine for SIV, a close cous in to HIV,

vaccine for M, a close cousin to HI, with a drug that blocks PD-1 in SIV-infected rhesus monkeys treated with antiretroviral therapy.

We found that our approach generated robust anti-viral response in multiple parts of the body, including invariant without the sixth and with the sixth and the s immune-privileged sites in the lymph nodes, and allowed killer T cells to infiltrate and purge viral reservoirs.



estimated that the lifetime amtirerroviral estimated that the lifetime antiretroviral estimated that the lifetime antirerroviral therapy cost for someone who acquires HIV at age 35 is US\$358,380. And many people don't have access to daily antirerroviral therapy. Around three-quarters of adults with HIV in sub-Saharan Africa do not reach persistent viral suppression due to lack of treatment availability. Finally, even though antiretroviral therapy can though antiretroviral therapy can though antiretroviral therapy can

though antiretroviral therapy can thoroughly suppress HIV infection, it does not cure it. There is always a risk that the virus may mutate to become resistant to existing drugs.

Completely wiping out HIV from the body is one way to eliminate the need for daily antiretroviral therapy. But a more achievable strategy is to put the infected call in wheek Curently only. infected cells in check. Currently, only 0.5% of HIV positive individuals are considered elite controllers who are considered etile controllers who are able to suppress infection without medication. While our study showed a potential pathway to control HIV, it is still in development and not ready for human patients. More research is necessary to understand how viral reservoirs form and why certain cells respond differently to different
