

76TH INDEPENDENCE DAY CELEBRATION BY ANDAMAN AND NICOBAR COMMAND



To commemorate 76th Independence Day of India, a ceremonial parade was conducted at Netaji Stadium, Port Blair, Andaman and Nicobar Islands. The parade proceedings commenced with wreath laying by Hon'ble Lt Governor Admiral DK Joshi, PVSM, AVSM, YSM, NM, VSM (Retd) at the National Memorial at Cellular Jail. The Hon'able Governor then hoisted the National Flag and took the salute at the Independence Day Parade coordinated by the HQ Andaman and Nicobar Command and

comprising contingents from the Army, Navy, Air Force, Coast Guard and A&N Police. Each of the contingents was represented by one officer, one Junior Commissioned Officer (JCO) and fifteen other ranks. The parade was led by Wg Cdr Rahul Bohra.

The parade witnessed fly past by MI-17 helicopter along with showering of petals at the venue. In close proximity, the ships of Indian Navy, Coast Guard, DSS and Marine Police Boats, anchored off Flag Point were "Dressed Overall" with the

colourful flags including the tricolour giving a vibrant and spectacular overview which was visible from entire Marina Road. Synchronised performance of the Army Pipe Band with the marching contingent was another highlight of the event.

The Chief Secretary, A&N Administration, Shri Keshav Chandra, DGP, Shri Neeraj Thakur, and Senior Officers from Defence and Civil Administration were present on the occasion.

Financial assistance being provided for activities like dairy, poultry, aquaculture, sericulture including bees

Port Blair, Aug. 17 : The Ministry of Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises (MoMSME) has conveyed some modifications in the existing Prime Minister's Employment Generation scheme. The main objective of the PMEGP scheme is to generate employment

opportunities in rural as well as urban areas of the country through setting up of new self-employment ventures/projects/micro enterprises. The maximum cost of the project/unit admissible for margin money subsidy under manufacturing sector has been increased from Rs. 25 lakhs to

Rs. 50 lakhs whereas the same has been increased from Rs. 10 lakhs to Rs. 20 lakhs for Services/trading sector with a Govt. Subsidy upto 35% of the total project cost.

Any individual above 18 years of age is eligible to avail the

Building & Construction Workers Welfare Board conducts camps at various Panchayats



Port Blair, Aug. 17 : Andaman and Nicobar Islands Building and Other Construction Workers Welfare Board has initiated an annual calendar wherein Camps and Field visits will be held at each Panchayat in Andaman &

Nicobar Islands. As part of this, camps were held at Calicut, Bambooflat-I and Mayabunder Panchayat on Aug. 13 which was attended by around 150 persons. The endeavour of the Board is to register eligible construction

worker as defined under Section 12 of Building and Other construction Worker, (RE&CS), Act 1996 and extend various welfare scheme to registered construction workers in the Islands.

COVID-19 status in A&N Islands

Port Blair, Aug. 17 : Thirteen positive cases have been detected today in A&N Islands, of which, 2 were from incoming flight passengers who arrived here yesterday. Today, 10 flights with 1340 passengers arrived, out of which, 1176 passengers were

vaccinated with both doses while RT-PCR test was conducted on 124 passengers and the reports are awaited.

During RAT conducted on 14 passengers bound for North & Middle Andaman at Ferrargunj, no positive case has been

detected. At Phoenix Bay Jetty, 12 passengers were tested with RAT, no positive case has been detected. RAT was conducted on 29 passengers at Mohanpura Bus Terminus, no positive case has been detected.

Vaccination drive in A&N Islands

Port Blair, Aug. 17 : The vaccination drive is continuing smoothly in A&N Islands. As per data available, a total of 6,94,857 doses of vaccine have been administered to beneficiaries in the age group of 18 and above so far. Similarly, 23932 beneficiaries have been vaccinated in the age group of 15 to 18 years. 27,788 beneficiaries in the age group of 12 to 14 years have been administered both doses of vaccine. The number of beneficiaries administered

precautionary dose of vaccine so far stood at 180951.

A total of 2381 eligible beneficiaries were vaccinated in A&N Islands while the beneficiaries administered precautionary dose of vaccine stood at 2308 today. As per the District wise data received from DHS, 1579 beneficiaries were vaccinated in South Andaman District, out of which, 7 beneficiaries were above 18 years and the number of beneficiaries administered precautionary dose

of vaccine stood at 1531.

In North & Middle Andaman District 603 beneficiaries were vaccinated, out of which and the number of beneficiaries administered precautionary dose of vaccine stood at 600.

In Nicobar District 199 beneficiaries were vaccinated, out of which, and the number of beneficiaries administered precautionary dose of vaccine stood at 177.

Member of Parliament demands to resume extraction of quarry products from quarries of N & M Andaman

The Member of Parliament of Andaman and Nicobar Islands, Shri. Kuldeep Rai Sharma has requested the Chief Secretary of Andaman and Nicobar Administration to resume extraction of quarry products from quarries of N & M Andaman to minimize the sufferings of the residents and give momentum to economic activities in the region. In a letter addressed to the Chief secretary the Member of Parliament mentioned that this has adversely affected the Construction Industry, as many of the Private and Govt. Contracts in the construction sector have no works, as a result of which, a sizable chunk of the population whose livelihood are dependent

on this sector, now remain unemployed.

He added that the entrepreneurs and the workers belonging to construction and other related sectors have already had a very difficult time in the recent past on account of recurrent lockdowns imposed by the Andaman & Nicobar Administration to contain the spread of Covid-19. They could barely overcome the constraints induced by the lockdown due to Covid-19 and now non-availability of quarry products has severely hampered their recovery phase towards normalcy.

The Member of Parliament mentioned that the residents of North & Middle Andaman district are facing tremendous

hardship to construct their own dwelling units due to high cost of stone aggregates importing from mainland as they are not able to bear such high cost for purchasing stone quarry which costs around Rs. 4000 – 5000 per Cbm of stone aggregates as of now, which appears to be much high compared with stone aggregates if import from locally stone quarry.

He said that this cost escalation has happened due to a ban on extraction of quarry products locally. Now quarry materials are not only beyond the reach of ordinary general public but the livelihood of the workers engaged in these sectors has also been adversely affected since Covid-19, the MP added.

दिल्ली में लौट रहा कोरोना! रोजाना 8 से 10 मौतें, अस्पतालों में बढ़ रहे मरीज



दिल्ली में कोरोना के बढ़ते मामलों ने फिर चिंता पैदा कर दी है। कोरोना से मरने वालों की संख्या पिछले कुछ दिनों से प्रतिदिन 8 से 10 है। कोरोना के मामले भी प्रतिदिन 2 हजार से ज्यादा दर्ज हो रहे हैं।

देश की राजधानी दिल्ली में कोरोना के बढ़ते मामलों ने फिर चिंता पैदा कर दी है। महानगर में कोरोना से मरने वालों की संख्या पिछले कुछ दिनों से प्रतिदिन 8 से 10 है। पिछले कुछ दिनों से कोरोना के मामले भी प्रतिदिन 2 हजार से ज्यादा दर्ज हो रहे हैं। कोरोना संक्रमण के बाद अस्पताल में भर्ती होने वालों की संख्या में भी इजाफा हुआ है। उपराज्यपाल विनय कुमार सक्सेना ने ट्वीट करते हुए लोगों से कोरोना संबंधी प्रोटोकॉल का पालन करने का आग्रह किया। स्वास्थ्य विभाग ने चेतावनी दी कि मास्क जरूर पहनें और कोरोना नियमों का पालन करते रहें। इस बीच दिल्ली सरकार ने सार्वजनिक स्थानों पर मास्क न पहनने पर जुर्माने की प्रक्रिया शुरू कर दी है। दिल्ली में कोरोना के बढ़ते मामलों ने केंद्र की भी चिंता बढ़ा दी है।

स्वास्थ्य विशेषज्ञ डॉ. सुनीला गर्ग का कहना है कि कोरोना से रिकवरी की दर हालांकि अच्छी है, लेकिन मामले बढ़ रहे हैं और अस्पताल में भर्ती होने वाले मरीजों की संख्या में तेजी आई है। दिल्ली में 9,000 से अधिक कोविड बिस्तरों पर इस समय मरीज भर्ती हैं। 2,129 आईसीयू बेड में से 20 पर मरीज भर्ती हैं वहीं 65 मरीज वेंटिलेटर पर हैं। हालांकि उन्होंने कहा कि घबराने की जरूरत है, बल्कि सावधानी बरतने की जरूरत है। क्या कहते हैं आंकड़े

स्वास्थ्य विभाग द्वारा साझा किए गए आंकड़ों के अनुसार, दिल्ली ने सोमवार को आठ मौतों के साथ 14.57 प्रतिशत की सकारात्मकता दर के साथ 1,227 नए कोविड -19 मामले दर्ज किए। इससे पहले, दिल्ली में पिछले 12 दिनों तक रोजाना 2,000 से अधिक मामले दर्ज किए गए थे। राजधानी में 2,162 कोरोना मामले और पांच मौतें रविवार को हुई थीं। इससे एक दिन पहले, 2,031 नए केसों के साथ नौ मौतें दर्ज हुई थी। 12 अगस्त को, दिल्ली में कोरोना से 10 मौतें हुईं, जो छह महीने में सबसे ज्यादा रही। इसी दिन 2,136 मामलों के साथ सकारात्मकता दर 15.02 प्रतिशत रही। 13 फरवरी को कोरोना के कारण 12 मौतें दर्ज की गईं।

गौरतलब है कि राजधानी दिल्ली में बीते 13 जनवरी को कोरोना के 28,867 नए मामले दर्ज हुए थे। जो दिल्ली में सर्वकालिक सबसे ज्यादा थे। जबकि 30.6 प्रतिशत की सकारात्मकता दर रिकॉर्ड हुई थी।

Member of Parliament demands re-engage of these 100 Security Guard personnel of Directorate of Health Services

The Member of Parliament of Andaman and Nicobar Islands, Shri. Kuldeep Rai Sharma has requested the Chief Secretary of Andaman and Nicobar Administration to re-engage 100 Security Guard personnel of Directorate of Health Services till finalization of the next tender process to safeguard the interest of the health institutions and also taking into consideration the welfare of the unemployed youths.

In a letter addressed to the Chief Secretary, the Member of Parliament mentioned that

the Health Department of Andaman and Nicobar Administration had earlier engaged all together 100 Security Guards and deployed them at various health centers including GB Pant Hospital (68 for GB

Pant Hospital and 32 for other PHCs/CHCs) across A&N Islands on contract basis through outsourcing for safety and security of health department and patients including medical Doctors/staff.

He added that presently the contract period of these Security Guards has expired and in view of non finalization of next tender process before expiry of validity of last tender which is pending for finalization by the competent authority, the services of these 100 Security Guards have been discontinued w.e.f. 1st July 2022. He said that due to sudden discontinuation of the contract there are no security personnel in the premises of G B Pant Hospital and other Health Centers. The Member of Parliament mentioned that because of non

availability of security persons since 1st July 2022, the G B Pant Hospital as well as other Health Center managements are facing huge challenges in controlling visitors as well as traffic inside G B Pant Complex.

He pointed out that absence of security guards is also causing great disturbances for the medical staff while discharging their duties in the operation theatres, laboratory and other isolated places.

He added that due to discontinuation of their service, these 100 Security Guards have also become jobless and their livelihood has been affected since 1st July 2022 as they have no other source of income for their livelihood rather than the job now they are performing for many years.
