Life in the ocean: From the shores or from a boat, the sea looks like a huge mass of uniform, inky blue water. It is not so actually. Life in the sea is amazingly different at different depths. From the surface to a few feet below, the ocean is a sunlit world. that changes from day to night. Below this, the ocean becomes cold, dim, and unchanging. And thousands of meters below the surface, the ocean is a region of nearfreezing temperatures, crushing pressure, and complete darkness.

Most marine plants and animals are adapted to living in one of three regions- the sunlight, twilight, or midnight zone. These zones are defined by the presence (or absence) of light. They differ from one another in temperature amount of pressure, and nutrient supply. We will mainly focus here on the sunlight zone where most of the familiar animals and plants are present.

### Battle for the Sena

In an interim order on Monday, the Election Commission of India (ECI) has allotted 'Balasahebanchi Shivsena' as the party name for the Eknath Shinde faction of the Shiv Sena, also asking it to furnish a fresh list of three symbols by Tuesday. The name and the 'bow and arrow' symbol had also been claimed by Mr. Shinde, the Maharashtra Chief Minister. The ECI's preceding decision to freeze the name and the symbol of the Shiv Sena has followed precedent — in earlier cases of splits in the All India Anna Dravida Munnetra Kazhagam and the Lok Janshakti Party, the commission had kept the symbols suspended until a final decision on the contesting claims of rival factions could be taken. Symbols are more than symbolism for political parties after years of mutual association. In some cases, symbols may even carry some political meaning — as in the case of the Rashtriya Janata Dal's 'lantern' and the Samajwadi Party's 'bicycle'. The Shiv Sena may have felt the 'bow and arrow' went well with its constant need to appear combative and strident. That inheritance is now the central element of the dispute between the two factions. Though the ECI has frozen it, the legal battle for the symbol and the name will continue. Both factions are marshalling facts and fiction in support of their claims and the ECI has a tough task in determining which side gets to own the Sena brand. Mr. Shinde is an ally of the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) that is in power at the Centre. Who gets to inherit the legacy of Bal Thackeray has a huge bearing on the political fortunes of

Though there is a legal battle for the name and symbol of the Shiv Sena, the inheritance will be fundamentally settled through politics. Whichever faction will be seen as the more real Shiv Sena by the public will win the battle, regardless of who gets to keep the symbol and the name. Therefore, both factions are leaving no stone unturned to demonstrate their public support. The Dussehra rally, the most notable event on the Sena annual calendar, had two iterations this year — one addressed by Mr. Thackeray at the traditional venue of Shivaji Park, and the other by Mr. Shinde six kilometres away. The first electoral test for the factions will be on November 3, the date of the Andheri East Assembly segment by-election. The Thackeray faction will be facing off with the BJP candidate who is backed by the Shinde faction. Mr. Thackeray has inherited the name of his father and Sena founder, Bal Thackeray, but his style and character may be a bit too modest for the party's reputation. Mr. Shinde on the other hand may lack the name, but is equipped for the street battles that have made the Sena. It is unlikely that both factions will survive over the long term: the symbol might not be enough to decide the winner, but it will have more than a symbolic value for the faction still standing after the slugfest.

His excessive demands and the endlessness of his longings comes into clash with the longings of other people. It also takes him to enter into conflict with the law of the land and with his relatives and society and even with his own self. This, therefore, becomes cause for his peacelessness. It is mainly because of this that the world, to-day, has millions of people whom the World Bank calls the 'Absolutely Poor'. It is this unchecked desire of man which has caused the class war or the conflict between the 'Haves' and 'Have-nots'. Besides these,man also has emotional needs, like he wants love, care, attention and understanding, he wants an honourable living. ## ISRO to Launch 5.4 Tonne Satellites, Payload to be India's Heaviest



October 11: Nellore: The Indian Space Research Organisation (Isro) hopes to set a record on October 22, when it has scheduled to launch 36 satellites cumulatively weighing about 5,400 kg. This would be the heaviest payload ever to be launched into space from Indian soil.

The satellites would be launched by the LVM3 (Launch Vehicle Mark 3), which can carry 10,000 kg to Low Earth Orbit.

The LVM3, previously called the GSLV Mark III, is scheduled for launch early on October 22 from the Satish Dhawan Space Centre, Sriharikota Range (Shar) in Andhra Pradesh.

The launch of the 36 broadband communication satellites is part of a deal between NewSpace India Limited (NSIL), the commercial arm of Isro, and Network Access Associated Limited (OneWeb). The 36 satellites, each weighing about 150 kg, will be placed in the low earth orbit.

This contract is stated to be a historic milestone for NSIL and Isro as the LVM3 is making its entry into the global commercial launch service market. India's Bharti Group is a major shareholder in OneWeb.

Isro officials said two solid fuel strap-on boosters and a liquid core stage of LVM3 had been integrated at the second launch pad at Satish Dhawan Space Centre. The satellites have been assembled with the dispenser unit.

In the coming days, the integration of the cryogenic upper stage of the rocket and the integration of payload fairing will take place.

## 5<sup>th</sup> A&N State Conference of AIKS Organised at Diglipur

Port Blair, Oct. 11: The 5th Andaman & Nicobar State Conference of All India Kisan Sabha was held at Diglipur, North Andaman on 8th October, 2022. 71 Delegates and observers including 15 women from different parts of Andaman & Nicobar Islands attended the Conference.

Inaugurating Conference, Shri Vijoo Krishnan, All India Joint Secretary of All India Kisan Sabha said that thousands of farmers are committing suicide in the country every year due to anti-farmer policies of the Modi government. He said that none of the promises made by the BJP to the farmers before the Parliament election 2019 has been fulfilled so far. He said that the central government is not ready even to hear the problems of the farmers, but they are helping the corporate led by Adani and Ambani. Corona pandemic was an excuse for speeding up all the antifarmer and anti-people policies. Referring to the three anti-farmer Laws passed by Parliament, Shri Vijoo Krishnan, who was in the forefront of leading the oneyear massive protest of farmers, said that the BJP government had to surrender before the farmers and



withdrew the legislations. He said that more than 750 farmers had died during the agitation. He said that the double-engine government of Narendra Modi derailed before the united agitation of the farmers. He called upon the farmers of Andaman & Nicobar Islands to strengthen the All India Kisan Sabha to solve their problems and issues.

Speaking on the occasion. D. Ayyappan, Secretary, CPI (M) Ándaman & Nicobar State Organising Committee explained in brief the difficulties being faced by farmers in the islands and said that the A&N Administration failed to meet even the minimum requirements of farmers and referred to the non-availability of fertilizers, pesticides, seeds and agriculture implements for farmers from the Administration. Conference and extended CITU's greetings.



# The Slow Weight-Transfer Problem in Shubman Gill's Batting Technique

October 11: Shubman Gill has just one problem with his batting: the slow weight transfer onto the front foot. Twice this ODI series, he has paid for that mistake off Kagiso Rabada. In the past, in Indian conditions again, Kyle Jamieson (twice), James Anderson and Mohammed Shami (in the IPL) have penalised Shubman Gill for the same error, cleaning up the sticks.

It's fascinating how this seemingly small problem has remained unrectified for a few years now. Gill has such a lovely all-round game, so adept against bounce and super b against spin -R Ashwin rates him one of the toughest batsmen to bowl to - that many commentators turn wishywashy when addressing this issue. It does feel a small matter to bring up on air, or print, but it's there, staring at us all. It still doesn't seem a big deal, not an insurmountable problem, but it's also fascinating to track how a young talented batsman deals with it. It's sort of a problem that once you see it as an observer, it becomes difficult to unsee. It's been written on these pages before but here is a brief reminder. It stems from his childhood training on cement tracks. On cement, the backfoot becomes an instinctive play, and the front foot something to be worked on. Batting is about transferring weight and being still when playing a shot. At the top level one needs to be strong on the back foot but still have the balance and skill to play under the eyes, and be in a position to transfer the weight forward.Gill's first move is to step back, then the front foot side-steps to his right and often opens up a little, before he presses down into his stance, crouches a little - for balance, ready to spring out. Even when the ball is relatively full, he doesn't move forward that much. He can occasionally push his hands at the ball without actually transferring his weight forward, especially against pacers. It's a potential area of weakness that good bowlers will target on less bouncy surfaces. The key is to draw him forward as he likes to sit back on the back foot. It helps him on pitches with bounce, as we saw in Australia where he unfurled a couple of dreamy knocks. There seems to be a reluctance in him or rather a decision arrived at after



considerable thought that the status quo is better. This is how he put it to this newspaper recently.

"There are one or two important elements. Like your shoulder should be aligned towards the ball, you should be a little side-on while playing, you should be in a good position even if your feet are not moving that well. If you are positioned well in relation to the ball, you will manage... When we play in India, there isn't that much bounce. Most deliveries stay low. That (reducing the shuffle) was one adjustment I made after talking to our batting coach. I felt I should restrict my initial movement a bit. The ball doesn't swing much in India either, so the lesser the movement in your body, the better it will be for you."Vulnerable to incoming deliveryThe important bit in there for our context is: "You should be in a good position even if your feet are not moving that well. If you are positioned well in relation to the ball, you will manage..." And he tries to manage by letting his hands go through or punch the ball. When the ball seams in a touch then it becomes a problem.

Like Rabada got one to sneak in through the bat-and-pad gap in the first ODI and then in the second, Gill's hands came through well ahead of the body without the leanin of the upper body, and unsurprisingly the ball flew in the air back to the bowler. It's a tradeoff that batsmen accept when they change things. The things they do well might not be easy to achieve if they alter the way they move in the crease. Is it worth disrupting the technique built? Would this let's say leaning forward or taking an initial movement out – disrupt the entire balance and affect all other areas of the game? Isn't it better to manage this with the

hands?In theory, good batsmen talk about how they look to press forward as this gives the ability to press back as well with good speed of foot movement. Gill has certainly shortened his back-and-across movement but perhaps the next step would be to restrict the depth of that movement: shorter and quicker as this can still give the springboard to push forward quickly. As of now, the quick pacers who tail the ball in challenge him because of the slowness of his movement. Resultantly, he can occasionally push his hands at the ball without actually transferring his weight forward. The main focus is on staying still so he doesn't like to upset that balance by leaning onto his front foot, and he trusts his hands to do the jail-break for him.From most accounts, from the people who know him well like his mentor at Kolkata Knight Riders, Abhishek Nayar, Gill is a very self-aware batsman who has pieced his technique minutely and is also a problem-solver. "As a player you should know what things you need to work on, and where the opposition is looking to get you out. If you know that, it becomes easier to tackle," Gill had said. "I don't make any big changes to my technique without talking to my father... In cricket, there is no technique that can be termed 'out-proof.'" Clearly, he does see the weight transfer as an issue as he has tried to offset it by reducing his back-foot initial movements. Also, for a brief while in the past, he would stand with a noticeable leanin of the front shoulder. So he has tinkered around.

It might not pose any problem if pitches are belters and he sees off the new ball, but it's an issue that does hang around him. Not a biggie, as they might say, but it's there alright, and it should be interesting to see how the talented youngster nails this issue in the near future.


